## **New South Wales**

### Overview


In February 2023, there were around 4,287,300 people employed in New South Wales. The 5 largest employing industries in New South Wales were Health Care and Social Assistance, Professional, Scientific and Technical Services, Retail Trade, Construction and Education and Training. Together these 5 industries accounted for 52% of all employment.

Over the year to February 2023, employment in:

- Health Care and Social Assistance rose by 6.7% to stand at 615,800
- Professional, Scientific and Technical Services rose by 4.3% to stand at 439,400
- Retail Trade rose by 11.3% to stand at 432,300.

In Health Care and Social Assistance in New South Wales, 60% of workers were employed full-time; 75% were Female; and the median age of the workforce was 42. Around 61% of employed persons in this industry were located in Greater Sydney.


### Employment by industry, February 2023 and February 2022





### Which industries are youth (aged 15-24) employed in?





### Which industries are mature age persons (aged 55+) employed in?





# **Central West Employment Region**

Release date: 28 April 2023

#### Overview


In February 2023, there were around 111,800 people employed in the Central West Employment Region. The 5 largest employing industries in the region were Health Care and Social Assistance, Agriculture, Forestry and Fishing, Education and Training, Public Administration and Safety, and Construction. Together these 5 industries accounted for 57% of employment in the region.

Over the year to February 2023, employment in:

- Health Care and Social Assistance rose by 14.2% to stand at 19,300
- Agriculture, Forestry and Fishing fell by 0.2% to stand at 13,700
- Education and Training rose by 11.2% to stand at 11,700.

In Health Care and Social Assistance in the Central West Employment Region, 55% of workers were employed full-time; 87% were female; and the median age of the workforce was 43.





### Which industries are youth (aged 15-24) employed in?





### Which industries are mature age persons (aged 55+) employed in?





### Overview


In February 2023, there were around 58,900 people employed in the Far West Orana Employment Region. The 5 largest employing industries in the region were Health Care and Social Assistance, Education and Training, Agriculture, Forestry and Fishing, Accommodation and Food Services, and Retail Trade. Together these 5 industries accounted for 56% of employment in the region.

Over the year to February 2023, employment in:

- Health Care and Social Assistance fell by 13.1% to stand at 11,300
- Education and Training rose by 6.0% to stand at 5,800
- Agriculture, Forestry and Fishing fell by 15.5% to stand at 5,400.

In Health Care and Social Assistance in the Far West Orana Employment Region, 65% of workers were employed full-time; 78% were female; and the median age of the workforce was 41.





### Which industries are youth (aged 15-24) employed in?













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

### Which industries are youth (aged 15-24) employed in?








In February 2023, there were around 245,900 people employed in the Illawarra South Coast Employment Region. The 5 largest employing industries in the region were Health Care and Social Assistance, Construction, Education and Training, Retail Trade, and Accommodation and Food Services. Together these 5 industries accounted for 57% of employment in the region.

Over the year to February 2023, employment in:

- Health Care and Social Assistance rose by 29.3% to stand at 42,800
- Construction rose by 56.3% to stand at 28,200
- Education and Training fell by 1.9% to stand at 25,700.

In Health Care and Social Assistance in the Illawarra South Coast Employment Region, 60% of workers were employed full-time; 72% were female; and the median age of the workforce was 44.





### Which industries are youth (aged 15-24) employed in?





### Which industries are mature age persons (aged 55+) employed in?







### Employment by industry, February 2023 and February 2022







### Which industries are youth (aged 15-24) employed in?





### Which industries are mature age persons (aged 55+) employed in?











### Which industries are youth (aged 15-24) employed in?












### Which industries are youth (aged 15-24) employed in?


### Which industries are mature age persons (aged 55+) employed in?






### Which industries are youth (aged 15-24) employed in?


### Which industries are mature age persons (aged 55+) employed in?






### Which industries are youth (aged 15-24) employed in?


### Which industries are mature age persons (aged 55+) employed in?






### Which industries are youth (aged 15-24) employed in?


### Which industries are mature age persons (aged 55+) employed in?

#### Overview


In February 2023, there were around 808,400 people employed in the Sydney North & West Employment Region. The 5 largest employing industries in the region were Professional, Scientific and Technical Services, Health Care and Social Assistance, Retail Trade, Financial and Insurance Services, and Construction. Together these 5 industries accounted for 56% of employment in the region.

Over the year to February 2023, employment in:

- Professional, Scientific and Technical Services rose by 7.9% to stand at 131,300
- Health Care and Social Assistance rose by 17.5% to stand at 115,900
- Retail Trade rose by 9.5% to stand at 75,300.

In Professional, Scientific and Technical Services in the Sydney North & West Employment Region, 83% of workers were employed full-time; 59% were male; and the median age of the workforce was 42.






### Which industries are youth (aged 15-24) employed in?


### Which industries are mature age persons (aged 55+) employed in?

### Overview


In February 2023, there were around 388,100 people employed in the Sydney South West Employment Region. The 5 largest employing industries in the region were Health Care and Social Assistance, Retail Trade, Construction, Transport, Postal and Warehousing, and Manufacturing. Together these 5 industries accounted for 54% of employment in the region.

Over the year to February 2023, employment in:

- Health Care and Social Assistance rose by 6.4% to stand at 52,000
- Retail Trade rose by 20.3% to stand at 47,500
- Construction rose by 8.1% to stand at 44,600.

In Health Care and Social Assistance in the Sydney South West Employment Region, 63% of workers were employed full-time; 77% were female; and the median age of the workforce was 40.


### Employment by industry, February 2023 and February 2022






### Which industries are youth (aged 15-24) employed in?


### Which industries are mature age persons (aged 55+) employed in?
