Overview


In February 2023, there were around 2,787,300 people employed in Queensland. The 5 largest employing industries in Queensland were Health Care and Social Assistance, Retail Trade, Construction, Education and Training and Professional, Scientific and Technical Services. Together these 5 industries accounted for 52% of all employment.

Over the year to February 2023, employment in:

- Health Care and Social Assistance rose by 13.2% to stand at 457,000
- Retail Trade rose by 10.6% to stand at 288,700
- Construction rose by 7.7% to stand at 256,500.

In Health Care and Social Assistance in Queensland, 61% of workers were employed full-time; 76% were Female; and the median age of the workforce was 42. Around 50% of employed persons in this industry were located in Greater Brisbane.


Employment by industry, February 2023 and February 2022





Which industries are youth (aged 15-24) employed in?







Overview


In February 2023, there were around 524,700 people employed in the Brisbane - South East Employment Region. The 5 largest employing industries in the region were Health Care and Social Assistance, Construction, Retail Trade, Education and Training, and Professional, Scientific and Technical Services. Together these 5 industries accounted for 53% of employment in the region.

Over the year to February 2023, employment in:

- Health Care and Social Assistance rose by 16.4% to stand at 88,200
- Construction rose by 12.3% to stand at 51,200
- Retail Trade rose by 4.0% to stand at 50,000.

In Health Care and Social Assistance in the Brisbane - South East Employment Region, 60% of workers were employed full-time; 78% were female; and the median age of the workforce was 40.

Employment by industry, February 2023 and February 2022







Which industries are youth (aged 15-24) employed in?







Overview


In February 2023, there were around 142,600 people employed in the Cairns Employment Region. The 5 largest employing industries in the region were Health Care and Social Assistance, Retail Trade, Construction, Education and Training, and Accommodation and Food Services. Together these 5 industries accounted for 55% of employment in the region.

Over the year to February 2023, employment in:

- Health Care and Social Assistance rose by 19.9% to stand at 25,800
- Retail Trade fell by 2.2% to stand at 15,800
- Construction rose by 28.1% to stand at 14,600.

In Health Care and Social Assistance in the Cairns Employment Region, 66% of workers were employed full-time; 74% were female; and the median age of the workforce was 44.



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

Which industries are youth (aged 15-24) employed in?









Together these 5 industries accounted for 55% of employment in the region.

Over the year to February 2023, employment in:

- Health Care and Social Assistance fell by 7.3% to stand at 20,600
- Agriculture, Forestry and Fishing rose by 23.7% to stand at 18,900
- Retail Trade fell by 2.5% to stand at 14,300.

Employment by industry, February 2023 and February 2022



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







Which industries are youth (aged 15-24) employed in?












Employment characteristics by Industry

Which industries are youth (aged 15-24) employed in?





Which industries are mature age persons (aged 55+) employed in?







Employment by industry, February 2023 and February 2022






Employment characteristics by Industry

Which industries are youth (aged 15-24) employed in?





Which industries are mature age persons (aged 55+) employed in?







Employment by industry, February 2023 and February 2022








Which industries are youth (aged 15-24) employed in?


Which industries are mature age persons (aged 55+) employed in?








Which industries are youth (aged 15-24) employed in?


Which industries are mature age persons (aged 55+) employed in?


In February 2023, there were around 336,600 people employed in the Wide Bay and Sunshine Coast Employment Region. The 5 largest employing industries in the region were Health Care and Social Assistance, Retail Trade, Construction, Education and Training, and Accommodation and Food Services. Together these 5 industries accounted for 57% of employment in the region.

Over the year to February 2023, employment in:

- Health Care and Social Assistance rose by 14.1% to stand at 64,900
- Retail Trade rose by 28.7% to stand at 34,400
- Construction fell by 8.5% to stand at 33,300.

In Health Care and Social Assistance in the Wide Bay and Sunshine Coast Employment Region, 55% of workers were employed full-time; 72% were female; and the median age of the workforce was 45.


Employment by industry, February 2023 and February 2022






Which industries are youth (aged 15-24) employed in?


Which industries are mature age persons (aged 55+) employed in?



In Health Care and Social Assistance in the Wivenhoe Employment Region, 62% of workers were employed full-time; 75% were female; and the median age of the workforce was 41.


Employment by industry, February 2023 and February 2022






Which industries are youth (aged 15-24) employed in?


Which industries are mature age persons (aged 55+) employed in?
