

Note regarding labour force data for the Broome, Esperance, Geraldton and Kalgoorlie Employment Regions

These Employment Regions fall within the Western Australia – Outback (North and South) SA4. This SA4 is very large and covers much of regional and remote WA, including Broome, Esperance, Geraldton and Kalgoorlie. The WA Outback SA4 is a poor fit for these Employment Regions but is the only data readily available for the labour force. As a result, the labour force data for the Western Australia – Outback (North and South) SA4 is presented for each of these Employment Regions. Other data sources are being investigated for appropriateness.

Overview


In February 2023, there were around 1,521,100 people employed in Western Australia. The 5 largest employing industries in Western Australia were Health Care and Social Assistance, Mining, Construction, Retail Trade and Professional, Scientific and Technical Services. Together these 5 industries accounted for 48% of all employment.

Over the year to February 2023, employment in:

- Health Care and Social Assistance rose by 3.8% to stand at 203,900
- Mining rose by 13.6% to stand at 147,800
- Construction rose by 3.8% to stand at 137,600.

In Health Care and Social Assistance in Western Australia, 54% of workers were employed fulltime; 77% were Female; and the median age of the workforce was 42. Around 84% of employed persons in this industry were located in Greater Perth.


Employment by industry, February 2023 and February 2022




Employment characteristics by Industry

Overview


In February 2023, there were around 126,400 people employed in the Broome Employment Region. The 5 largest employing industries in the region were Mining, Public Administration and Safety, Health Care and Social Assistance, Accommodation and Food Services, and Transport, Postal and Warehousing. Together these 5 industries accounted for 55% of employment in the region.

Over the year to February 2023, employment in:

- Mining rose by 23.9% to stand at 24,300
- Public Administration and Safety fell by 5.8% to stand at 13,100
- Health Care and Social Assistance rose by 15.7% to stand at 10,900.

In Mining in the Broome Employment Region, 95% of workers were employed full-time; 81% were male; and the median age of the workforce was 38.


Employment by industry, February 2023 and February 2022










Employment characteristics by Industry




Employment by industry, February 2023 and February 2022










Employment by industry, February 2023 and February 2022





Employment by industry, February 2023 and February 2022
















Employment by industry, February 2023 and February 2022







Employment by industry, February 2023 and February 2022








In February 2023, there were around 605,100 people employed in the Perth - South Employment Region. The 5 largest employing industries in the region were Health Care and Social Assistance, Retail Trade, Mining, Construction, and Education and Training. Together these 5 industries accounted for 49% of employment in the region.

Over the year to February 2023, employment in:

- Health Care and Social Assistance fell by 4.7% to stand at 79,900
- Retail Trade fell by 2.5% to stand at 56,900
- Mining rose by 14.9% to stand at 56,400.

In Health Care and Social Assistance in the Perth - South Employment Region, 53% of workers were employed full-time; 75% were female; and the median age of the workforce was 41.







Employment by industry, February 2023 and February 2022






