Overview


In February 2023, there were around 166,000 people employed in the Goulburn/Murray Employment Region. The 5 largest employing industries in the region were Health Care and Social Assistance, Construction, Manufacturing, Education and Training, and Agriculture, Forestry and Fishing. Together these 5 industries accounted for 62% of employment in the region.

Over the year to February 2023, employment in:

- Health Care and Social Assistance rose by 23.2% to stand at 35,200
- Construction rose by 31.1% to stand at 20,600
- Manufacturing rose by 26.2% to stand at 19,400.

In Health Care and Social Assistance in the Goulburn/Murray Employment Region, 52% of workers were employed part-time; 83% were female; and the median age of the workforce was 45.

Employment by industry, February 2023 and February 2022





Note: In each chart, the solid line is the level of employment and the dotted line is a simple linear trend line for the 10 year period.


Employment characteristics by Industry
