Overview


In February 2023, there were around 992,600 people employed in the Sydney East Metro Employment Region. The 5 largest employing industries in the region were Professional, Scientific and Technical Services, Health Care and Social Assistance, Retail Trade, Education and Training, and Construction. Together these 5 industries accounted for 53% of employment in the region.

Over the year to February 2023, employment in:

- Professional, Scientific and Technical Services rose by 1.4% to stand at 146,400
- Health Care and Social Assistance rose by 1.8% to stand at 117,200
- Retail Trade rose by 14.3% to stand at 94,200.

In Professional, Scientific and Technical Services in the Sydney East Metro Employment Region, 83% of workers were employed full-time; 59% were male; and the median age of the workforce was 37.





Which industries are youth (aged 15-24) employed in?





Which industries are mature age persons (aged 55+) employed in?




