Overview


In February 2023, there were around 132,500 people employed in the Townsville Employment Region. The 5 largest employing industries in the region were Health Care and Social Assistance, Construction, Education and Training, Public Administration and Safety, and Retail Trade. Together these 5 industries accounted for 55% of employment in the region.

Over the year to February 2023, employment in:

- Health Care and Social Assistance rose by 14.3% to stand at 22,100
- Construction rose by 124.9% to stand at 14,000
- Education and Training rose by 0.3% to stand at 12,600.

In Health Care and Social Assistance in the Townsville Employment Region, 63% of workers were employed full-time; 79% were female; and the median age of the workforce was 41.

Employment by industry, February 2023 and February 2022





Note: In each chart, the solid line is the level of employment and the dotted line is a simple linear trend line for the 10 year period.


Employment characteristics by Industry
