# **Australian Capital Territory**

#### Overview


In August 2023, there were around 266,200 people employed in Australian Capital Territory. The 5 largest employing industries in Australian Capital Territory were Public Administration and Safety, Professional, Scientific and Technical Services, Health Care and Social Assistance, Education and Training and Retail Trade. Together these 5 industries accounted for 69% of all employment.

Over the year to August 2023, employment in:

- Public Administration and Safety rose by 5.5% to stand at 74,200
- Professional, Scientific and Technical Services fell by 3.0% to stand at 37,000
- Health Care and Social Assistance fell by 8.1% to stand at 30,100.

In Public Administration and Safety in Australian Capital Territory, 91% of workers were employed full-time; 52% were Female; and the median age of the workforce was 41.


### Employment by industry, August 2023 and August 2022





### Which industries are youth (aged 15-24) employed in?





### Which industries are mature age persons (aged 55+) employed in?





# **Capital Region Employment Region**

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#### Overview


In August 2023, there were around 393,800 people employed in the Capital Region Employment Region. The 5 largest employing industries in the region were Public Administration and Safety, Professional, Scientific and Technical Services, Health Care and Social Assistance, Education and Training, and Retail Trade. Together these 5 industries accounted for 64% of employment in the region.

Over the year to August 2023, employment in:

- Public Administration and Safety rose by 12.4% to stand at 96,100
- Professional, Scientific and Technical Services fell by 0.2% to stand at 44,500
- Health Care and Social Assistance fell by 13.8% to stand at 43,800.

In Public Administration and Safety in the Capital Region Employment Region, 90% of workers were employed full-time; 52% were female; and the median age of the workforce was 41.

### Employment by industry, August 2023 and August 2022







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

### Which industries are mature age persons (aged 55+) employed in?




