Overview


In August 2023, there were around 4,358,300 people employed in New South Wales. The 5 largest employing industries in New South Wales were Health Care and Social Assistance, Professional, Scientific and Technical Services, Retail Trade, Construction and Education and Training. Together these 5 industries accounted for 52% of all employment.

Over the year to August 2023, employment in:

- Health Care and Social Assistance rose by 7.2% to stand at 637,500
- Professional, Scientific and Technical Services rose by 4.4% to stand at 444,100
- Retail Trade rose by 4.3% to stand at 433,700.

In Health Care and Social Assistance in New South Wales, 59% of workers were employed full-time; 76% were Female; and the median age of the workforce was 42. Around 62% of employed persons in this industry were located in Greater Sydney.


Employment by industry, August 2023 and August 2022





Which industries are youth (aged 15-24) employed in?





Which industries are mature age persons (aged 55+) employed in?





Central West Employment Region

Overview


In August 2023, there were around 111,300 people employed in the Central West Employment Region. The 5 largest employing industries in the region were Health Care and Social Assistance, Agriculture, Forestry and Fishing, Public Administration and Safety, Construction, and Education and Training. Together these 5 industries accounted for 57% of employment in the region.

Over the year to August 2023, employment in:

- Health Care and Social Assistance rose by 21.2% to stand at 20,900
- Agriculture, Forestry and Fishing fell by 2.6% to stand at 13,400
- Public Administration and Safety rose by 10.9% to stand at 10,100.

In Health Care and Social Assistance in the Central West Employment Region, 55% of workers were employed full-time; 87% were female; and the median age of the workforce was 43.





Which industries are youth (aged 15-24) employed in?





Which industries are mature age persons (aged 55+) employed in?





Overview


In August 2023, there were around 57,800 people employed in the Far West Orana Employment Region. The 5 largest employing industries in the region were Health Care and Social Assistance, Accommodation and Food Services, Education and Training, Retail Trade, and Transport, Postal and Warehousing. Together these 5 industries accounted for 56% of employment in the region.

Over the year to August 2023, employment in:

- Health Care and Social Assistance fell by 10.2% to stand at 10,600
- Accommodation and Food Services rose by 37.0% to stand at 6,600
- Education and Training rose by 14.6% to stand at 5,900.

In Health Care and Social Assistance in the Far West Orana Employment Region, 68% of workers were employed full-time; 76% were female; and the median age of the workforce was 41.



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
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
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Which industries are mature age persons (aged 55+) employed in?





Overview


In August 2023, there were around 381,900 people employed in the Hunter Employment Region. The 5 largest employing industries in the region were Health Care and Social Assistance, Retail Trade, Education and Training, Accommodation and Food Services, and Construction. Together these 5 industries accounted for 54% of employment in the region.

Over the year to August 2023, employment in:

- Health Care and Social Assistance rose by 9.3% to stand at 64,300
- Retail Trade rose by 23.8% to stand at 39,500
- Education and Training rose by 23.7% to stand at 35,800.

In Health Care and Social Assistance in the Hunter Employment Region, 56% of workers were employed full-time; 78% were female; and the median age of the workforce was 41.

Employment by industry, August 2023 and August 2022





Which industries are youth (aged 15-24) employed in?









Employment by industry, August 2023 and August 2022







Which industries are youth (aged 15-24) employed in?









Employment by industry, August 2023 and August 2022






Employment characteristics by Industry

Which industries are youth (aged 15-24) employed in?







Employment by industry, August 2023 and August 2022







Which industries are youth (aged 15-24) employed in?










Employment by industry, August 2023 and August 2022






Which industries are youth (aged 15-24) employed in?






Employment by industry, August 2023 and August 2022






Which industries are youth (aged 15-24) employed in?






Employment by industry, August 2023 and August 2022




Which industries are youth (aged 15-24) employed in?


Which industries are mature age persons (aged 55+) employed in?




Employment by industry, August 2023 and August 2022






Which industries are youth (aged 15-24) employed in?


Which industries are mature age persons (aged 55+) employed in?






Which industries are youth (aged 15-24) employed in?


Which industries are mature age persons (aged 55+) employed in?




Employment by industry, August 2023 and August 2022






Which industries are youth (aged 15-24) employed in?


