# Industry profile

## Northern Territory

### Overview

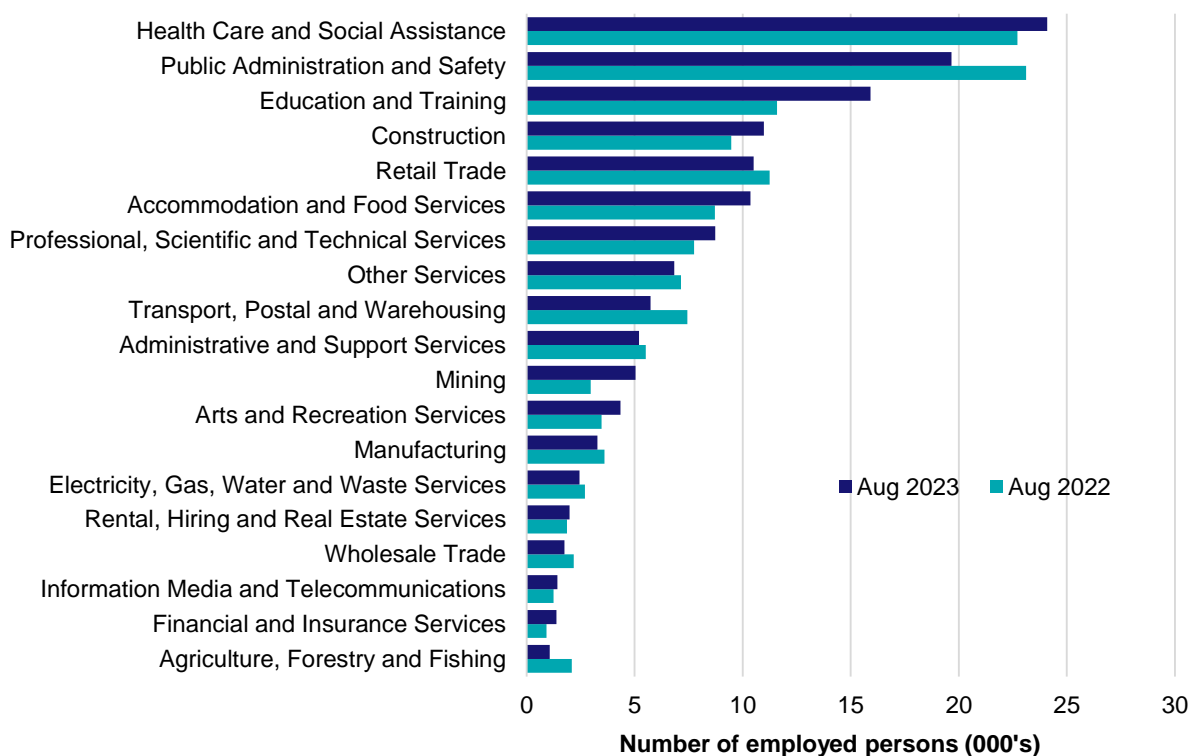
In August 2023, there were around 140,800 people employed in Northern Territory. The 5 largest employing industries in Northern Territory were Health Care and Social Assistance, Public Administration and Safety, Education and Training, Construction and Retail Trade. Together these 5 industries accounted for 58% of all employment.

Over the year to August 2023, employment in:

- Health Care and Social Assistance rose by 6.1% to stand at 24,100
- Public Administration and Safety fell by 15.0% to stand at 19,700
- Education and Training rose by 37.3% to stand at 15,900.

In Health Care and Social Assistance in Northern Territory, 77% of workers were employed full-time; 70% were Female; and the median age of the workforce was 38. Around 53% of employed persons in this industry were located in Greater Darwin.

### Employment by industry, August 2023 and August 2022

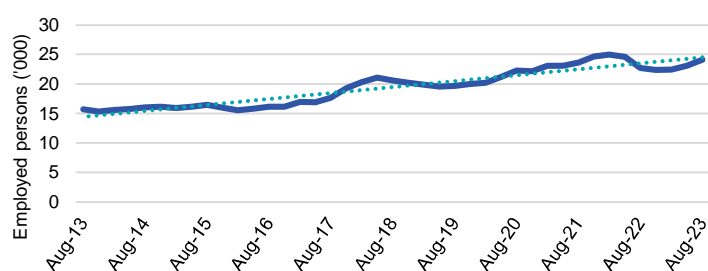

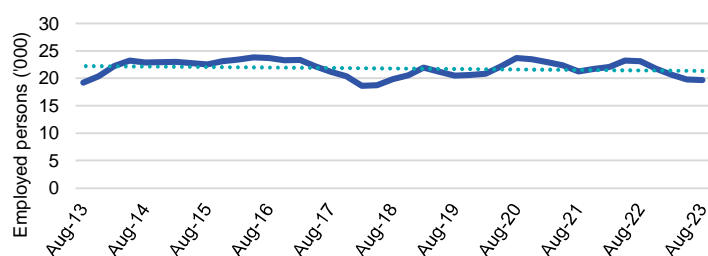

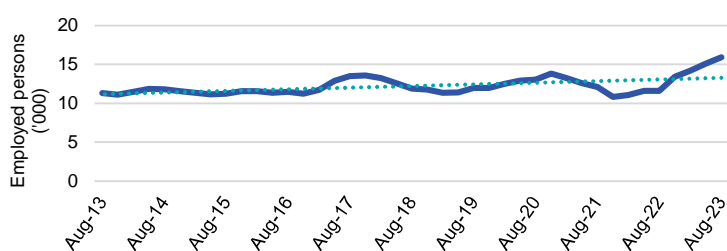

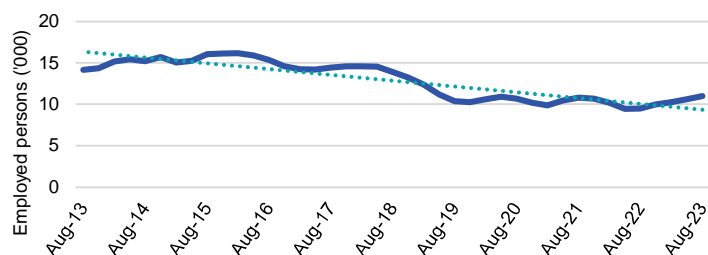

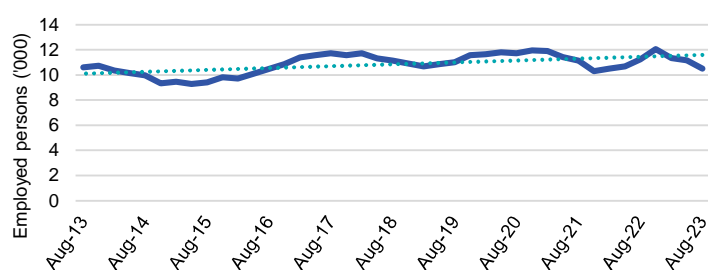

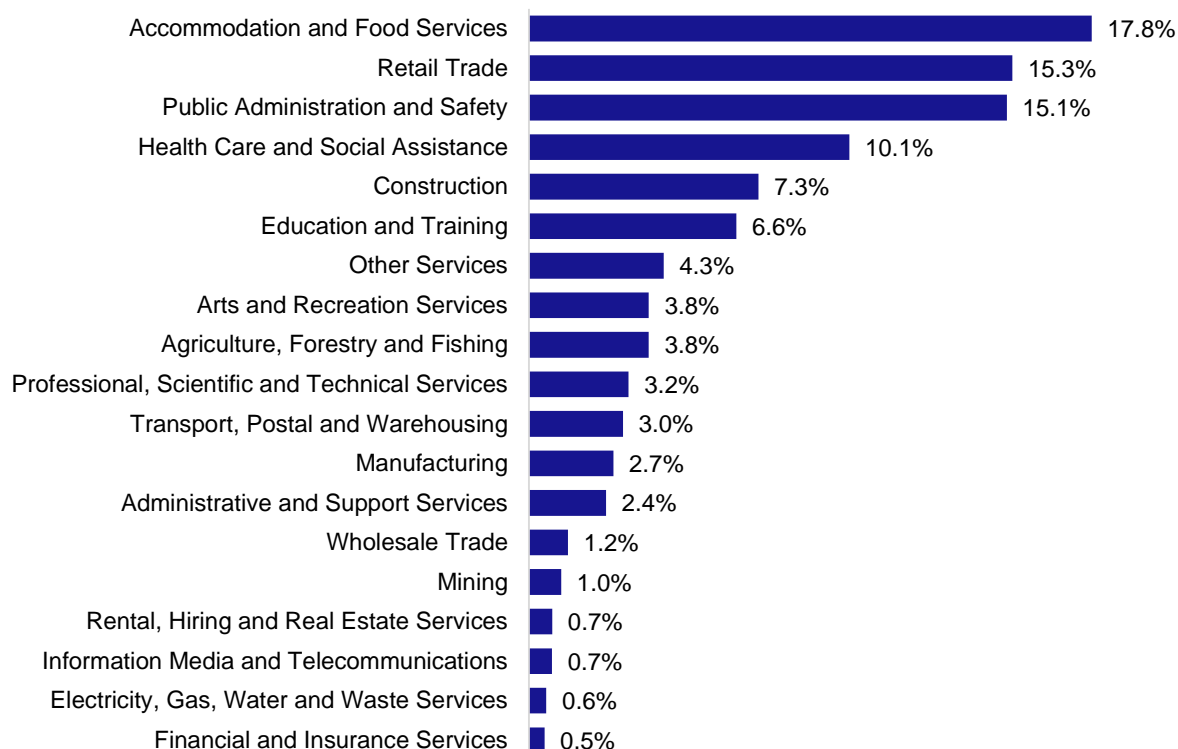

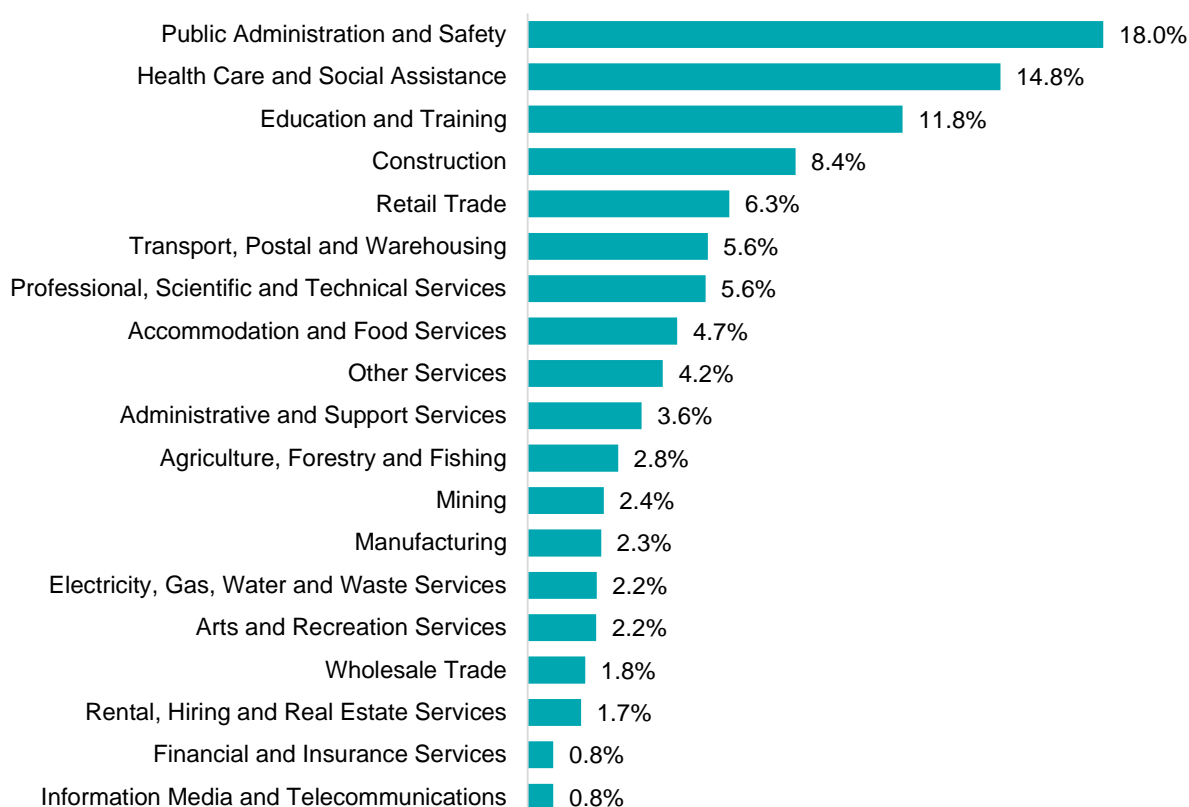

### Which industries are youth (aged 15-24) employed in?



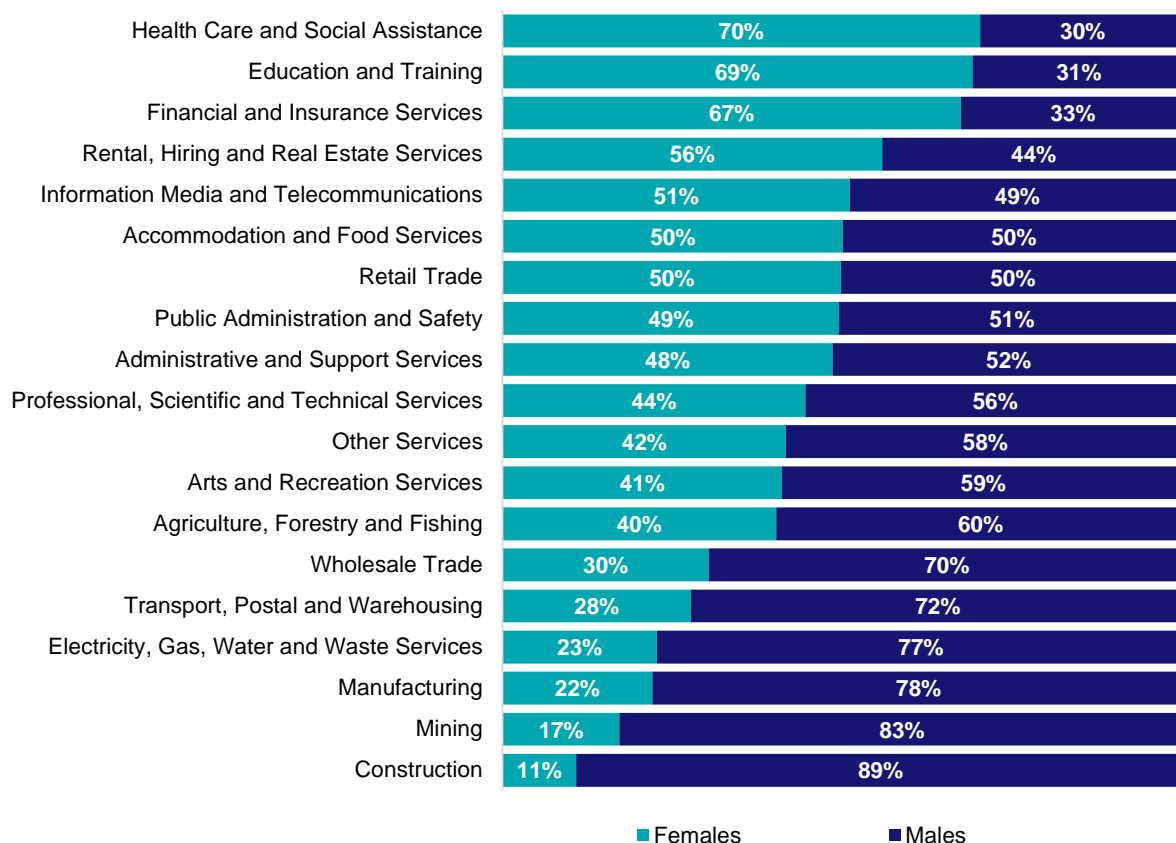

### Which industries are mature age persons (aged 55+) employed in?



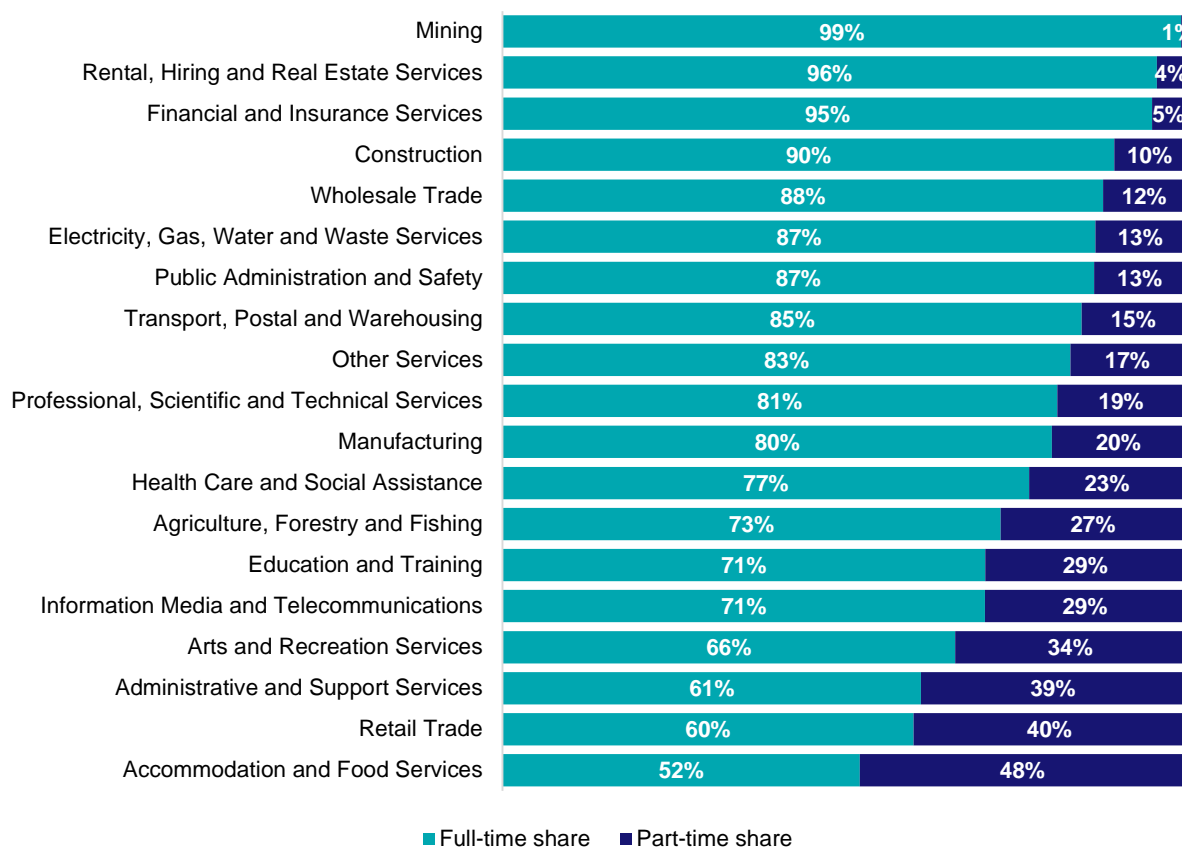

# Employment Region Industry profile

## Darwin Employment Region

Release date: 27 October 2023

### Overview

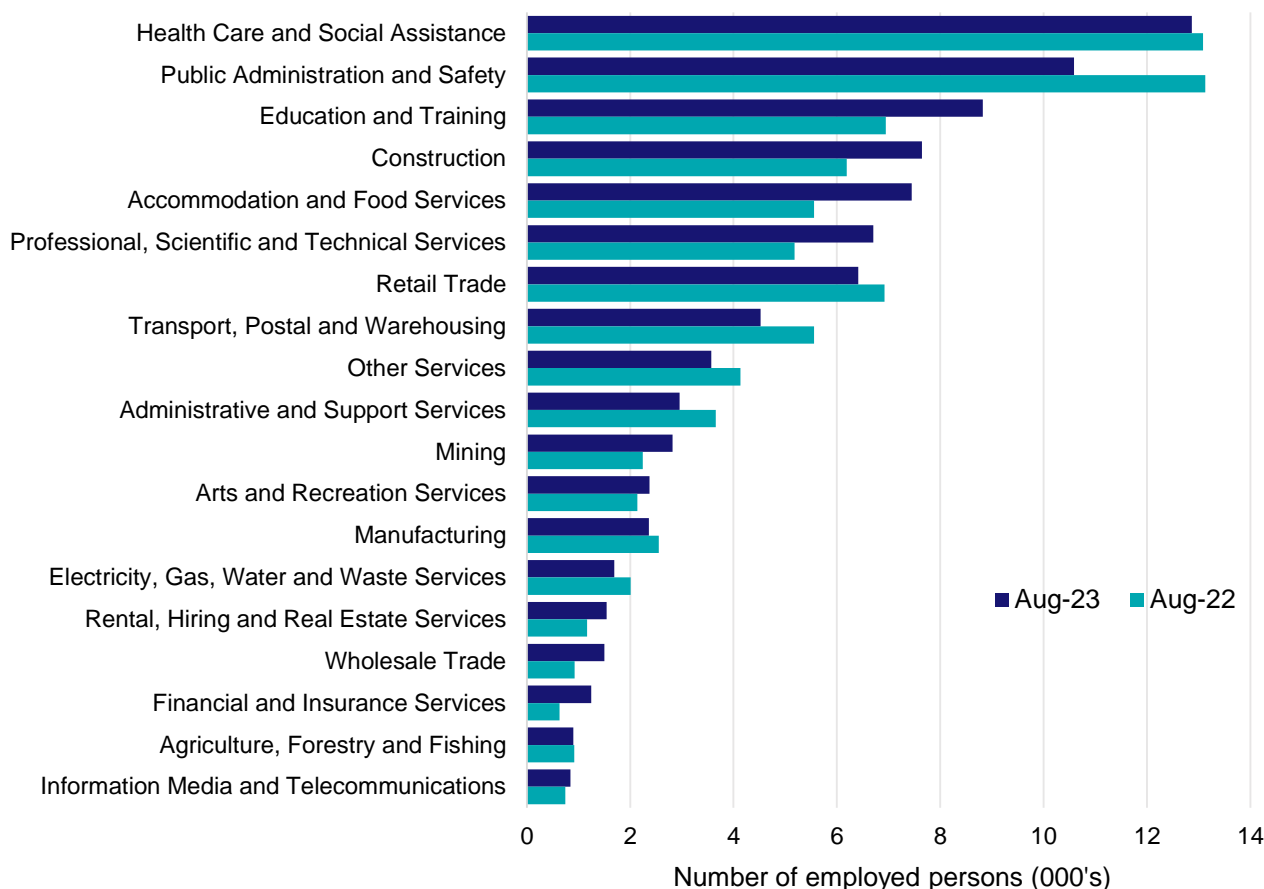
In August 2023, there were around 86,800 people employed in the Darwin Employment Region. The 5 largest employing industries in the region were Health Care and Social Assistance, Public Administration and Safety, Education and Training, Construction, and Accommodation and Food Services. Together these 5 industries accounted for 55% of employment in the region.

Over the year to August 2023, employment in:

- Health Care and Social Assistance fell by 1.6% to stand at 12,900
- Public Administration and Safety fell by 19.4% to stand at 10,600
- Education and Training rose by 27.0% to stand at 8,800.

In Health Care and Social Assistance in the Darwin Employment Region, 77% of workers were employed full-time; 73% were female; and the median age of the workforce was 37.

### Employment by industry, August 2023 and August 2022



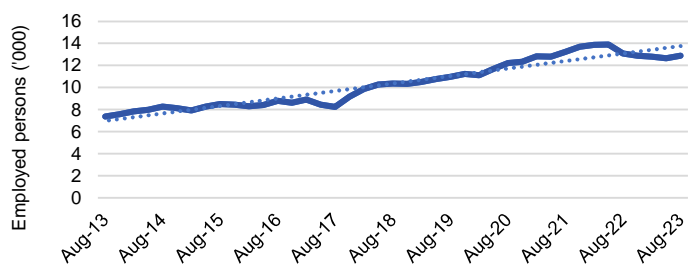

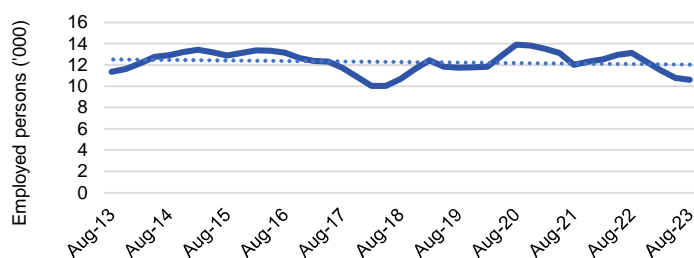

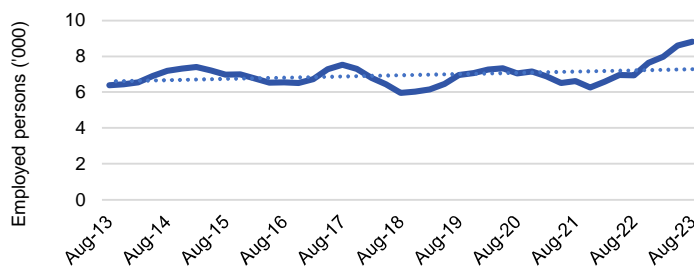

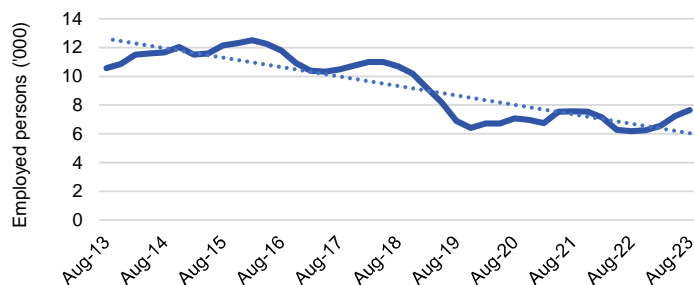

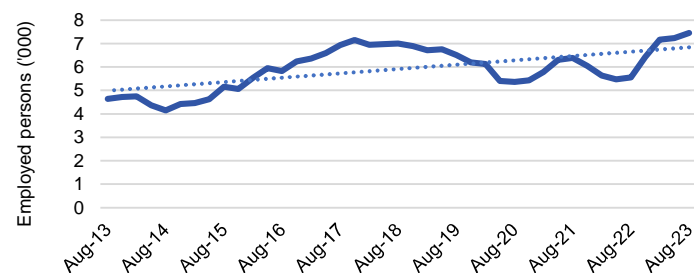

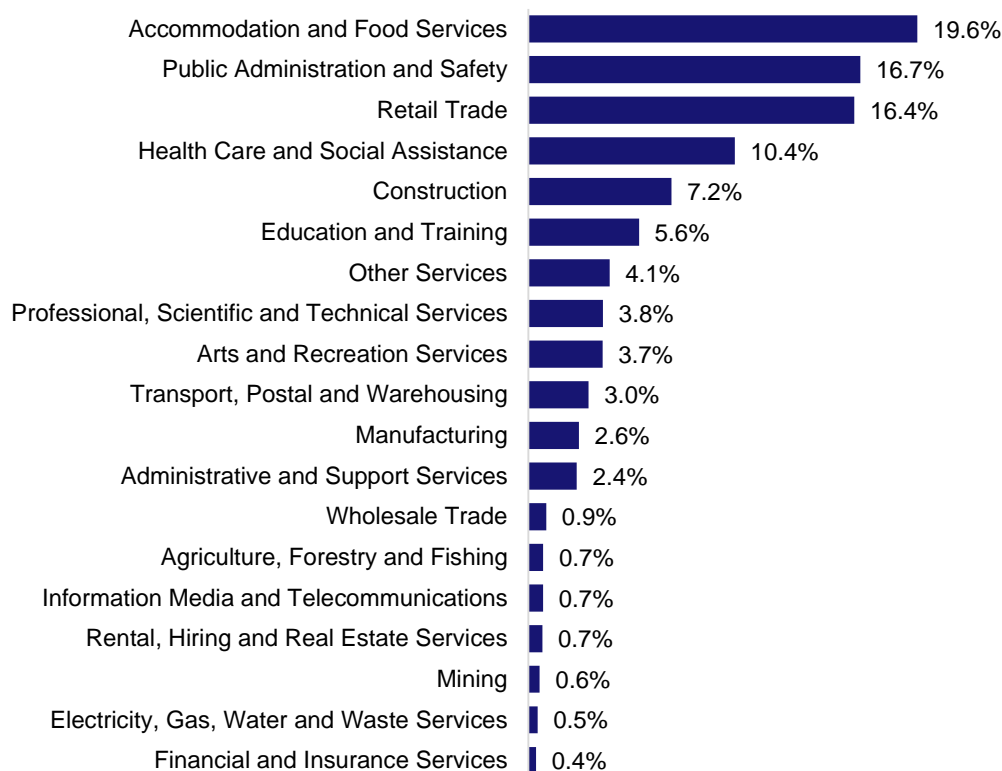

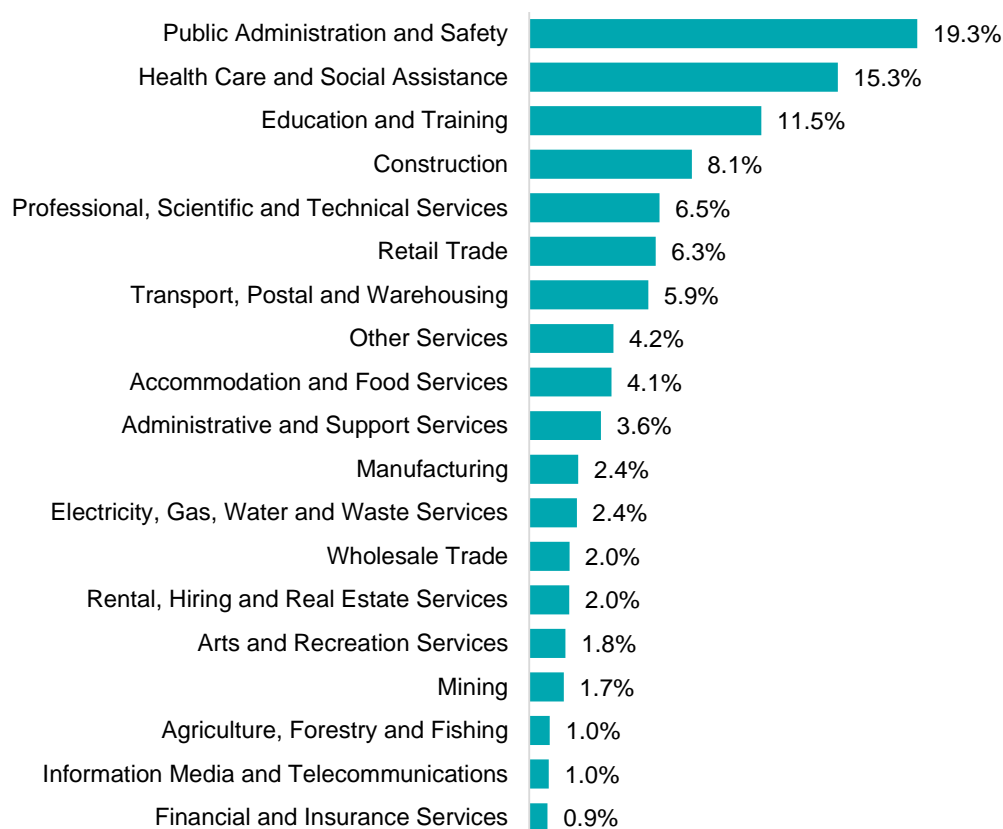

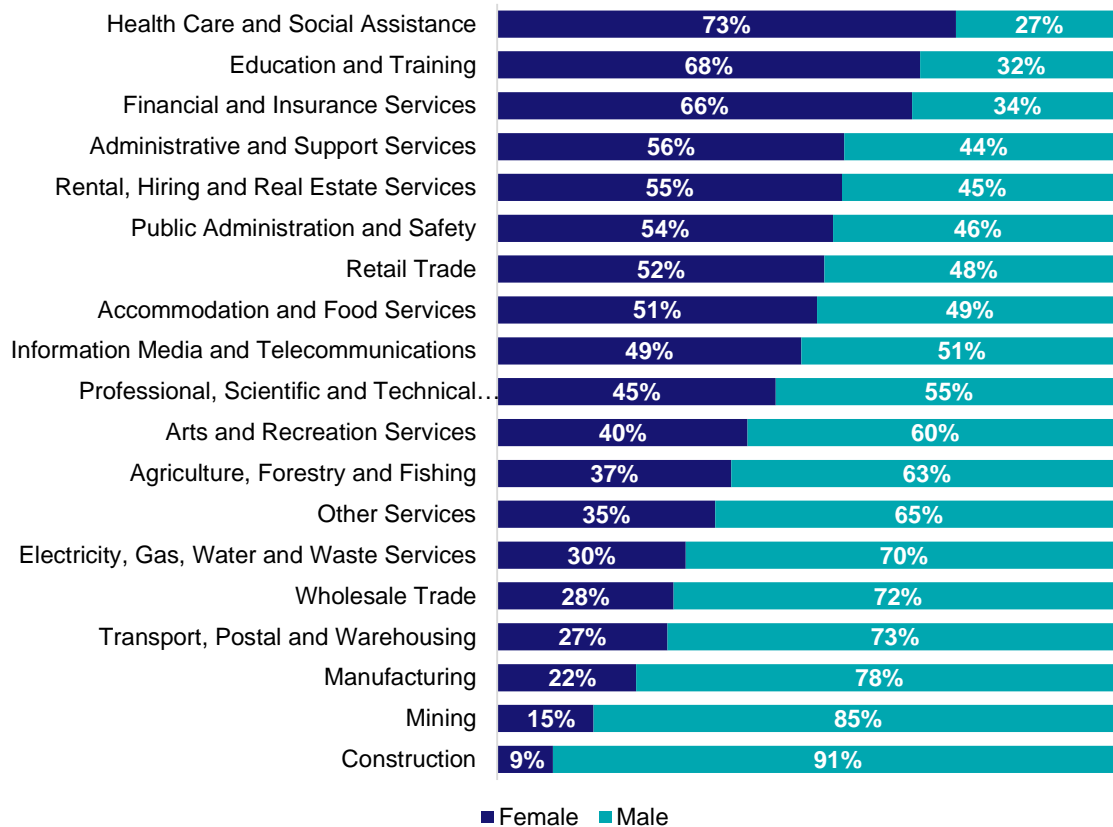
### Which industries are mature age persons (aged 55+) employed in?

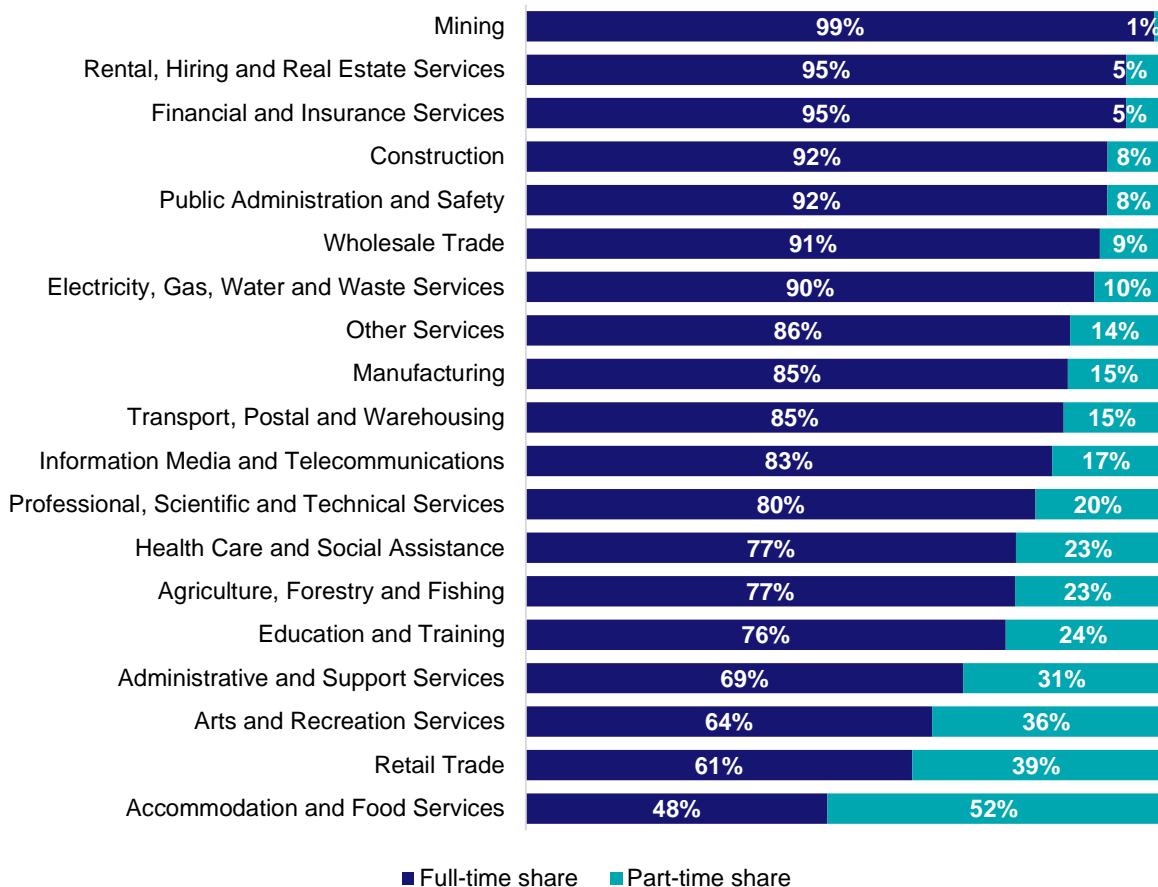


## Gender share by industry
