Overview


In August 2023, there were around 2,828,300 people employed in Queensland. The 5 largest employing industries in Queensland were Health Care and Social Assistance, Construction, Retail Trade, Education and Training and Professional, Scientific and Technical Services. Together these 5 industries accounted for 52% of all employment.

Over the year to August 2023, employment in:

- Health Care and Social Assistance rose by 3.2% to stand at 456,200
- Construction rose by 12.5% to stand at 275,600
- Retail Trade rose by 0.4% to stand at 269,400.

In Health Care and Social Assistance in Queensland, 60% of workers were employed full-time; 76% were Female; and the median age of the workforce was 42. Around 50% of employed persons in this industry were located in Greater Brisbane.


Employment by industry, August 2023 and August 2022





Which industries are youth (aged 15-24) employed in?





Which industries are mature age persons (aged 55+) employed in?





Brisbane - South East Employment Region

Overview


In August 2023, there were around 542,400 people employed in the Brisbane - South East Employment Region. The 5 largest employing industries in the region were Health Care and Social Assistance, Construction, Education and Training, Retail Trade, and Professional, Scientific and Technical Services. Together these 5 industries accounted for 53% of employment in the region.

Over the year to August 2023, employment in:

- Health Care and Social Assistance rose by 4.2% to stand at 88,000
- Construction rose by 21.2% to stand at 56,900
- Education and Training rose by 28.5% to stand at 53,400.

In Health Care and Social Assistance in the Brisbane - South East Employment Region, 54% of workers were employed full-time; 77% were female; and the median age of the workforce was 40.

Employment by industry, August 2023 and August 2022







Which industries are youth (aged 15-24) employed in?







Overview


In August 2023, there were around 139,800 people employed in the Cairns Employment Region. The 5 largest employing industries in the region were Health Care and Social Assistance, Construction, Retail Trade, Accommodation and Food Services, and Education and Training. Together these 5 industries accounted for 56% of employment in the region.

Over the year to August 2023, employment in:

- Health Care and Social Assistance rose by 19.7% to stand at 26,700
- Construction rose by 10.1% to stand at 14,300
- Retail Trade fell by 16.7% to stand at 13,700.

In Health Care and Social Assistance in the Cairns Employment Region, 63% of workers were employed full-time; 73% were female; and the median age of the workforce was 44.

Employment by industry, August 2023 and August 2022







Which industries are youth (aged 15-24) employed in?








In August 2023, there were around 145,400 people employed in the Darling Downs Employment Region. The 5 largest employing industries in the region were Health Care and Social Assistance, Agriculture, Forestry and Fishing, Education and Training, Construction, and Retail Trade. Together these 5 industries accounted for 54% of employment in the region.

Over the year to August 2023, employment in:

- Health Care and Social Assistance fell by 10.9% to stand at 19,500
- Agriculture, Forestry and Fishing rose by 0.2% to stand at 17,900
- Education and Training rose by 49.9% to stand at 15,600.

In Health Care and Social Assistance in the Darling Downs Employment Region, 51% of workers were employed full-time; 80% were female; and the median age of the workforce was 42.



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

Which industries are youth (aged 15-24) employed in?




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Which industries are mature age persons (aged 55+) employed in?





Overview


In August 2023, there were around 130,100 people employed in the Fitzroy Employment Region. The 5 largest employing industries in the region were Health Care and Social Assistance, Retail Trade, Mining, Construction, and Education and Training. Together these 5 industries accounted for 52% of employment in the region.

Over the year to August 2023, employment in:

- Health Care and Social Assistance fell by 8.1% to stand at 19,300
- Retail Trade rose by 32.2% to stand at 13,400
- Mining rose by 30.8% to stand at 13,100.

In Health Care and Social Assistance in the Fitzroy Employment Region, 62% of workers were employed full-time; 82% were female; and the median age of the workforce was 41.

Employment by industry, August 2023 and August 2022







Which industries are youth (aged 15-24) employed in?









Employment by industry, August 2023 and August 2022






Employment characteristics by Industry

Which industries are youth (aged 15-24) employed in?





Which industries are mature age persons (aged 55+) employed in?







Employment by industry, August 2023 and August 2022







Which industries are youth (aged 15-24) employed in?





Which industries are mature age persons (aged 55+) employed in?








Employment by industry, August 2023 and August 2022






Which industries are youth (aged 15-24) employed in?


Which industries are mature age persons (aged 55+) employed in?








Which industries are youth (aged 15-24) employed in?


Which industries are mature age persons (aged 55+) employed in?

Overview


In August 2023, there were around 356,300 people employed in the Wide Bay and Sunshine Coast Employment Region. The 5 largest employing industries in the region were Health Care and Social Assistance, Construction, Retail Trade, Accommodation and Food Services, and Education and Training. Together these 5 industries accounted for 58% of employment in the region.

Over the year to August 2023, employment in:

- Health Care and Social Assistance rose by 12.4% to stand at 68,700
- Construction rose by 0.6% to stand at 37,500
- Retail Trade rose by 37.8% to stand at 35,800.

In Health Care and Social Assistance in the Wide Bay and Sunshine Coast Employment Region, 56% of workers were employed full-time; 73% were female; and the median age of the workforce was 45.


Employment by industry, August 2023 and August 2022






Which industries are youth (aged 15-24) employed in?


Which industries are mature age persons (aged 55+) employed in?

Overview


In August 2023, there were around 300,400 people employed in the Wivenhoe Employment Region. The 5 largest employing industries in the region were Health Care and Social Assistance, Education and Training, Professional, Scientific and Technical Services, Manufacturing, and Retail Trade. Together these 5 industries accounted for 52% of employment in the region.

In Health Care and Social Assistance in the Wivenhoe Employment Region, 61% of workers were employed full-time; 73% were female; and the median age of the workforce was 41.


Employment by industry, August 2023 and August 2022






Which industries are youth (aged 15-24) employed in?


Which industries are mature age persons (aged 55+) employed in?
