Overview


In August 2023, there were around 289,500 people employed in Tasmania. The 5 largest employing industries in Tasmania were Health Care and Social Assistance, Retail Trade, Education and Training, Construction and Public Administration and Safety. Together these 5 industries accounted for 52% of all employment.

Over the year to August 2023, employment in:

- Health Care and Social Assistance rose by 11.6% to stand at 49,400
- Retail Trade fell by 5.3% to stand at 28,000
- Education and Training rose by 0.7% to stand at 26,200.

In Health Care and Social Assistance in Tasmania, 51% of workers were employed part-time; 79% were Female; and the median age of the workforce was 43. Around 47% of employed persons in this industry were located in Greater Hobart.


Employment by industry, August 2023 and August 2022





Hobart and Southern Tasmania Employment Region

Overview


In August 2023, there were around 154,000 people employed in the Hobart and Southern Tasmania Employment Region. The 5 largest employing industries in the region were Health Care and Social Assistance, Public Administration and Safety, Retail Trade, Education and Training, and Construction. Together these 5 industries accounted for 53% of employment in the region.

Over the year to August 2023, employment in:

- Health Care and Social Assistance rose by 15.8% to stand at 25,500
- Public Administration and Safety rose by 17.7% to stand at 14,900
- Retail Trade rose by 0.2% to stand at 14,500.

In Health Care and Social Assistance in the Hobart and Southern Tasmania Employment Region, 51% of workers were employed part-time; 79% were female; and the median age of the workforce was 41.





Overview


In August 2023, there were around 135,500 people employed in the North and North Western Tasmania Employment Region. The 5 largest employing industries in the region were Health Care and Social Assistance, Retail Trade, Education and Training, Manufacturing, and Construction. Together these 5 industries accounted for 54% of employment in the region.

Over the year to August 2023, employment in:

- Health Care and Social Assistance rose by 7.4% to stand at 23,900
- Retail Trade fell by 10.5% to stand at 13,500
- Education and Training rose by 4.1% to stand at 12,300.

In Health Care and Social Assistance in the North and North Western Tasmania Employment Region, 50% of workers were employed full-time; 80% were female; and the median age of the workforce was 44.




