# Industry profile

## Victoria

### Overview

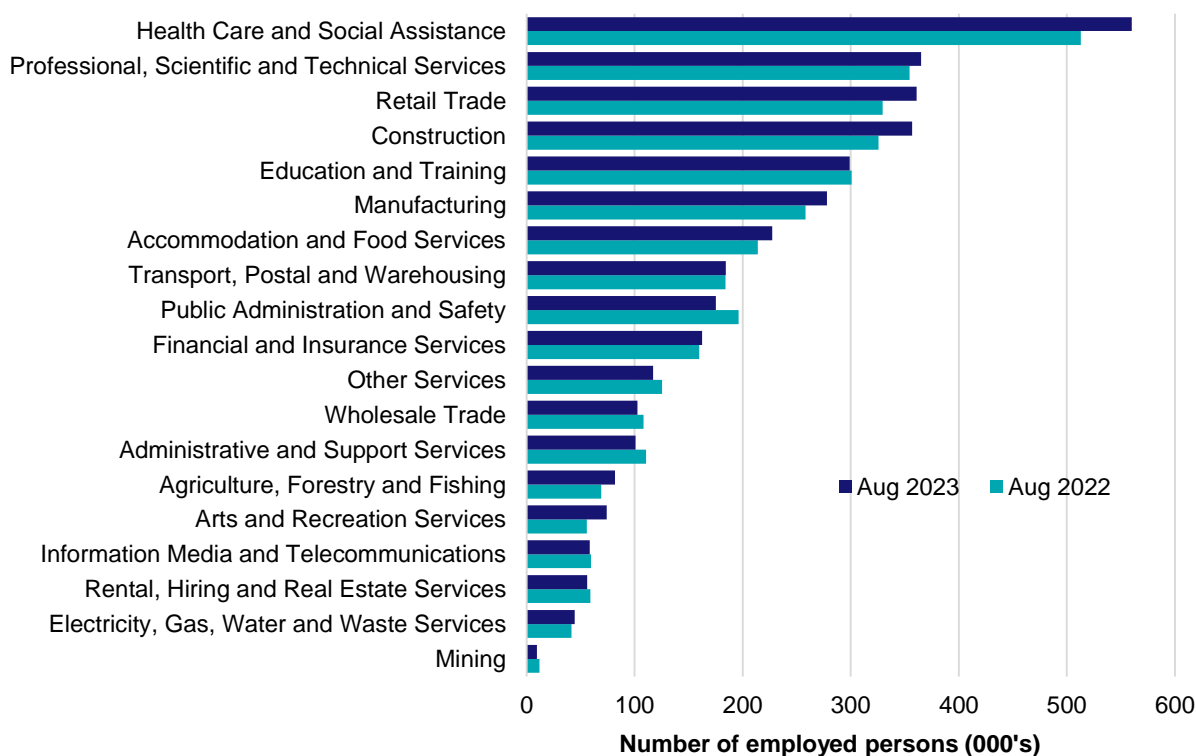
In August 2023, there were around 3,615,000 people employed in Victoria. The 5 largest employing industries in Victoria were Health Care and Social Assistance, Professional, Scientific and Technical Services, Retail Trade, Construction and Education and Training. Together these 5 industries accounted for 54% of all employment.

Over the year to August 2023, employment in:

- Health Care and Social Assistance rose by 9.1% to stand at 560,100
- Professional, Scientific and Technical Services rose by 3.0% to stand at 365,200
- Retail Trade rose by 9.5% to stand at 361,100.

In Health Care and Social Assistance in Victoria, 55% of workers were employed full-time; 77% were Female; and the median age of the workforce was 41. Around 73% of employed persons in this industry were located in Greater Melbourne.

### Employment by industry, August 2023 and August 2022

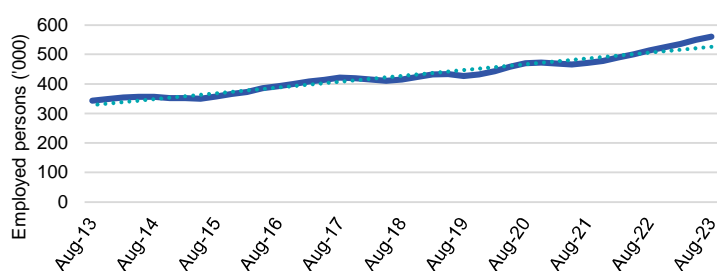

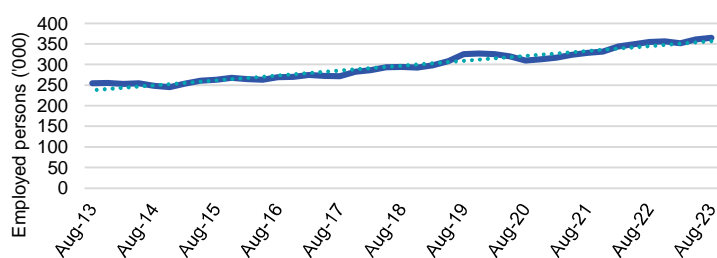

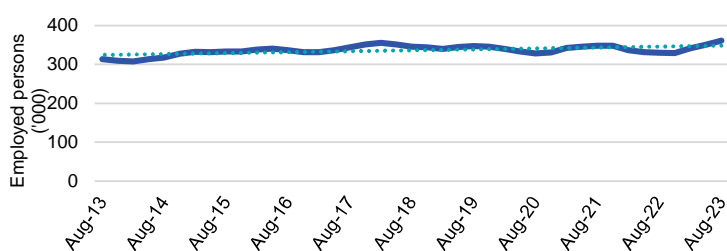

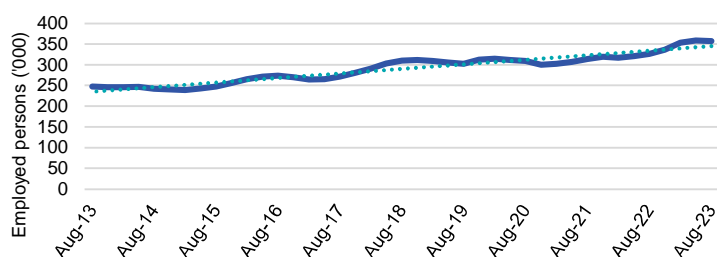

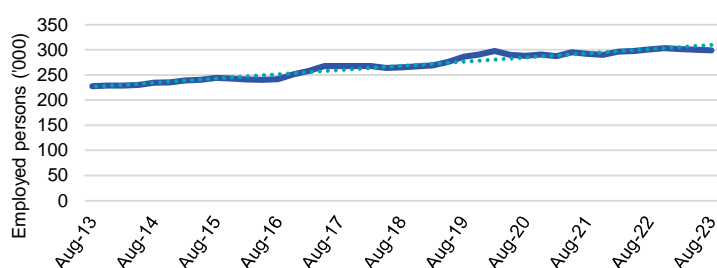

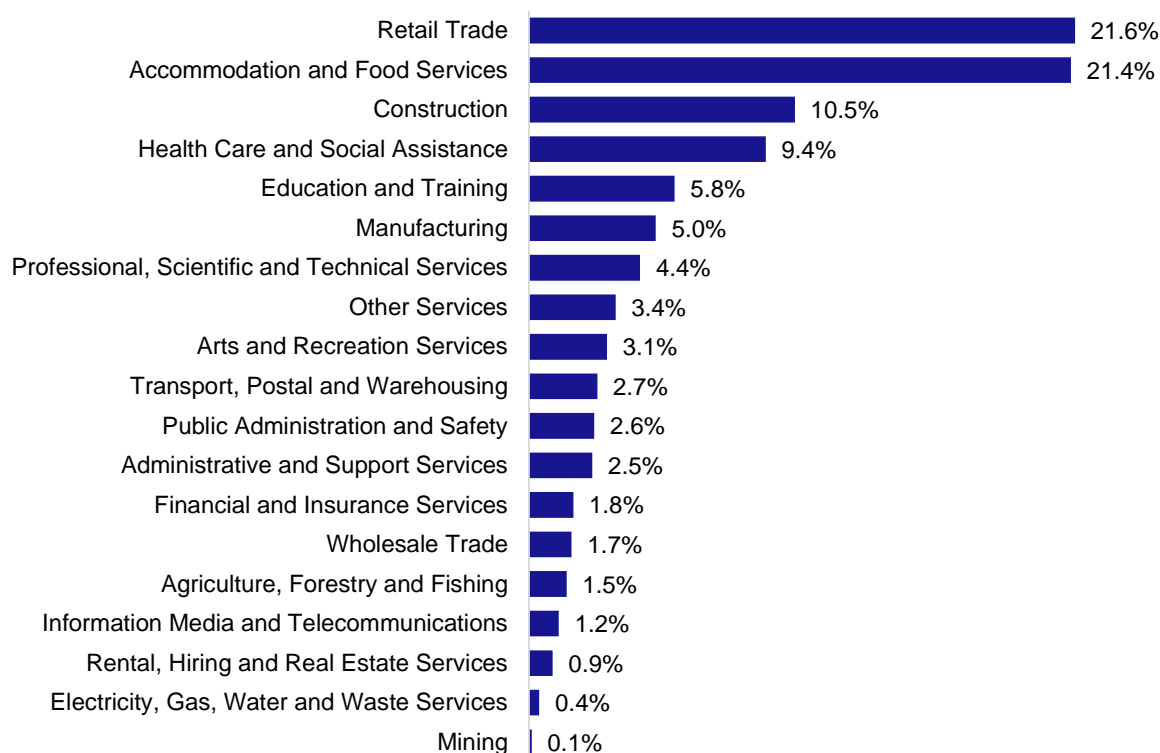

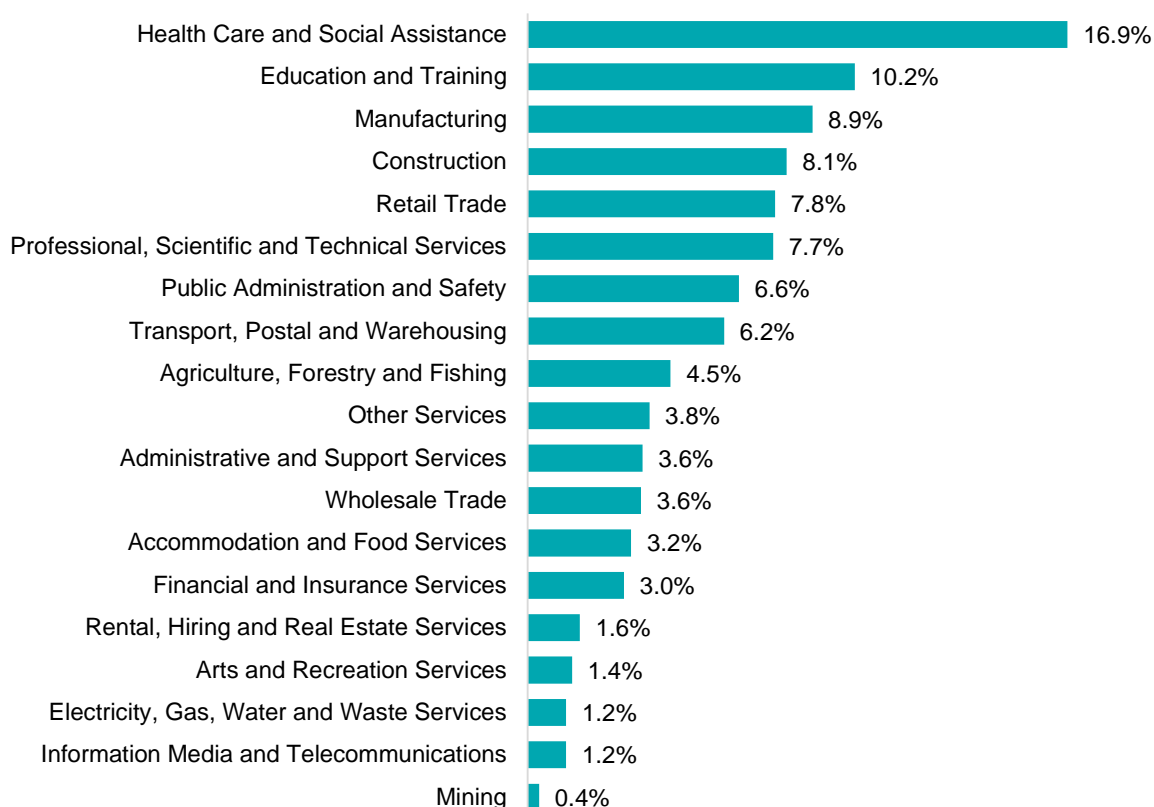

### Which industries are youth (aged 15-24) employed in?



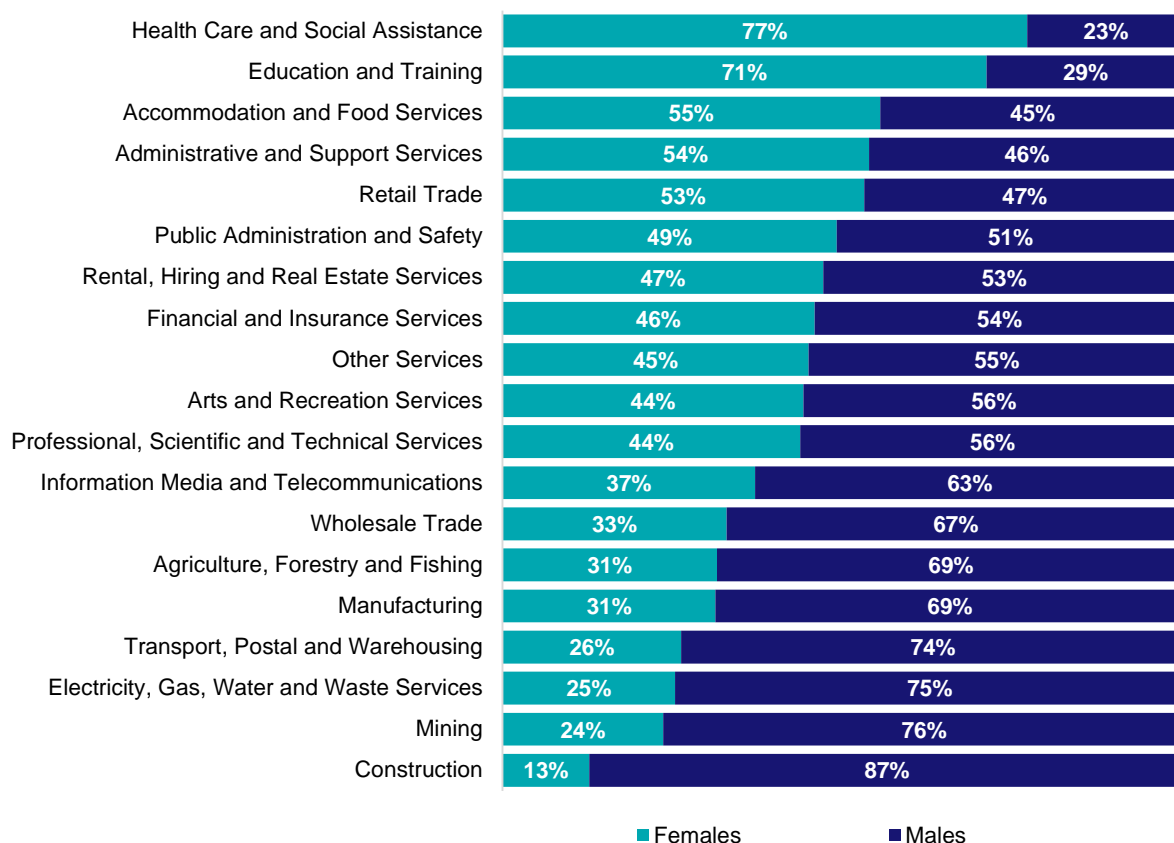

### Which industries are mature age persons (aged 55+) employed in?



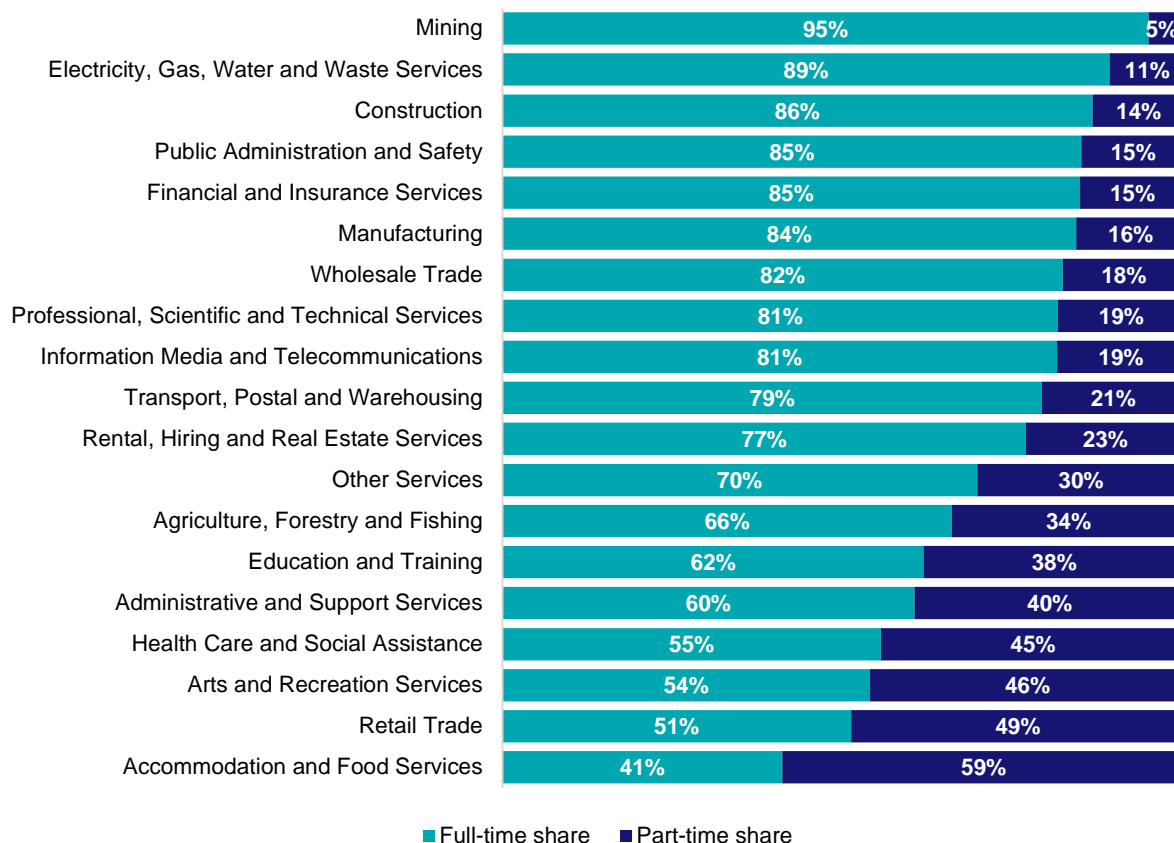

## Ballarat Employment Region

### Overview

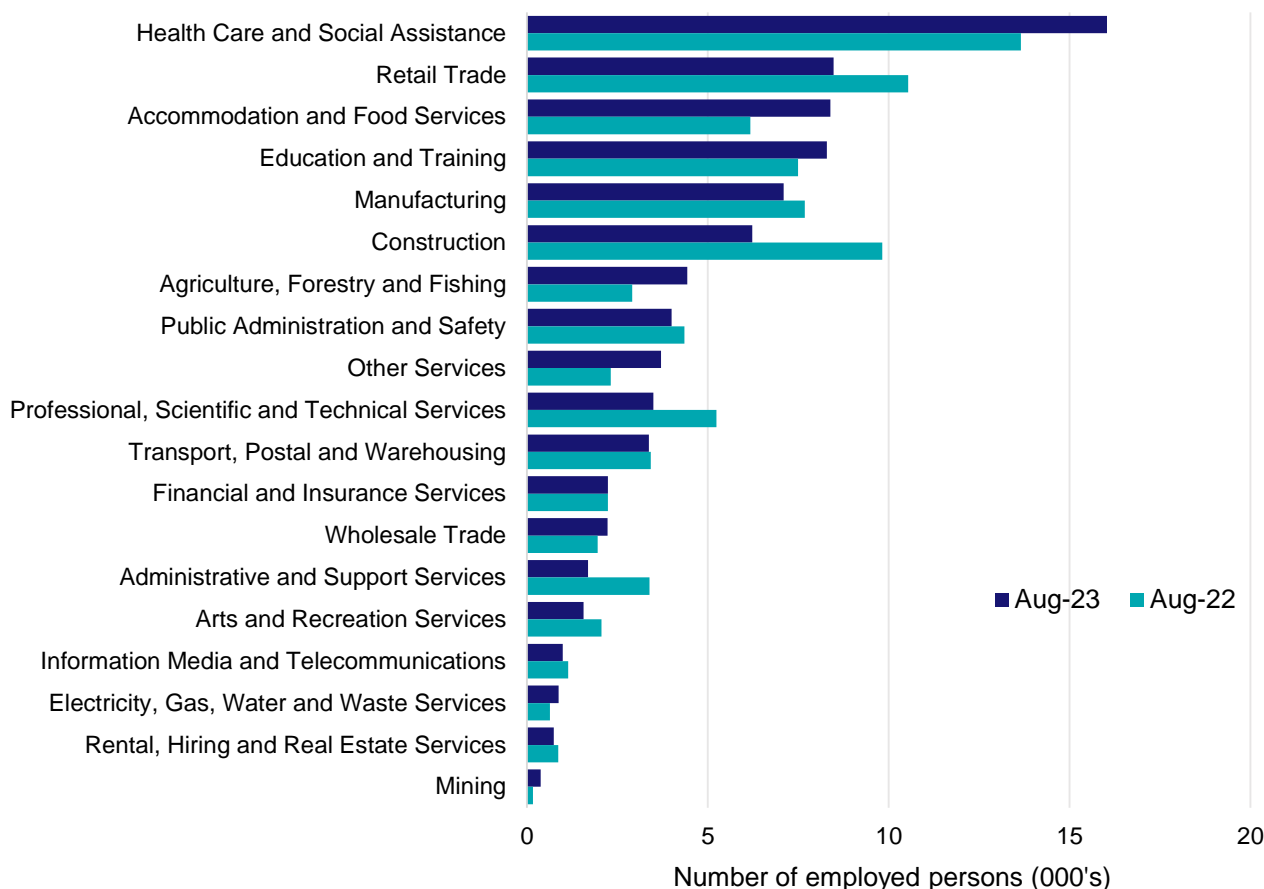
In August 2023, there were around 84,300 people employed in the Ballarat Employment Region. The 5 largest employing industries in the region were Health Care and Social Assistance, Retail Trade, Accommodation and Food Services, Education and Training, and Manufacturing. Together these 5 industries accounted for 57% of employment in the region.

Over the year to August 2023, employment in:

- Health Care and Social Assistance rose by 17.5% to stand at 16,000
- Retail Trade fell by 19.5% to stand at 8,500
- Accommodation and Food Services rose by 35.9% to stand at 8,400.

In Health Care and Social Assistance in the Ballarat Employment Region, 64% of workers were employed full-time; 71% were female; and the median age of the workforce was 44.

### Employment by industry, August 2023 and August 2022



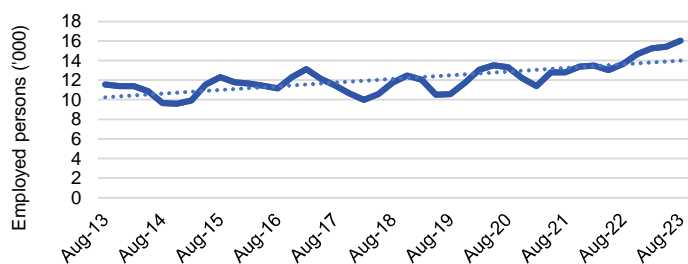

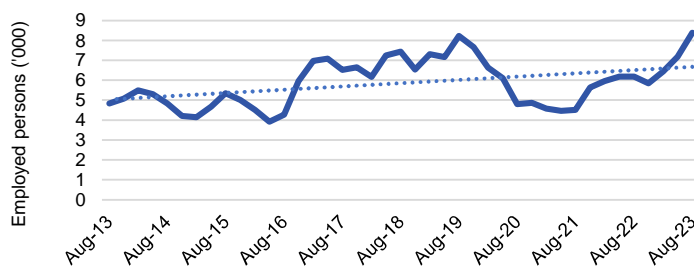

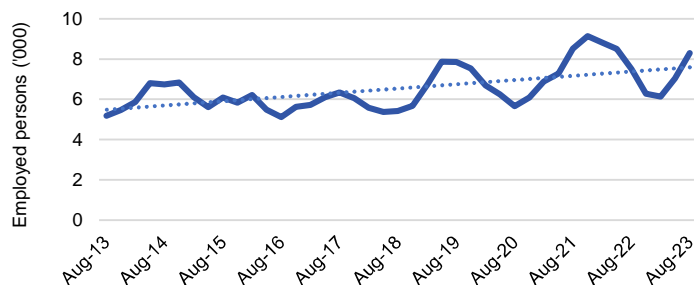

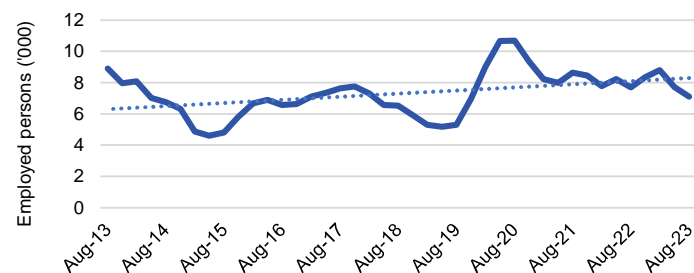

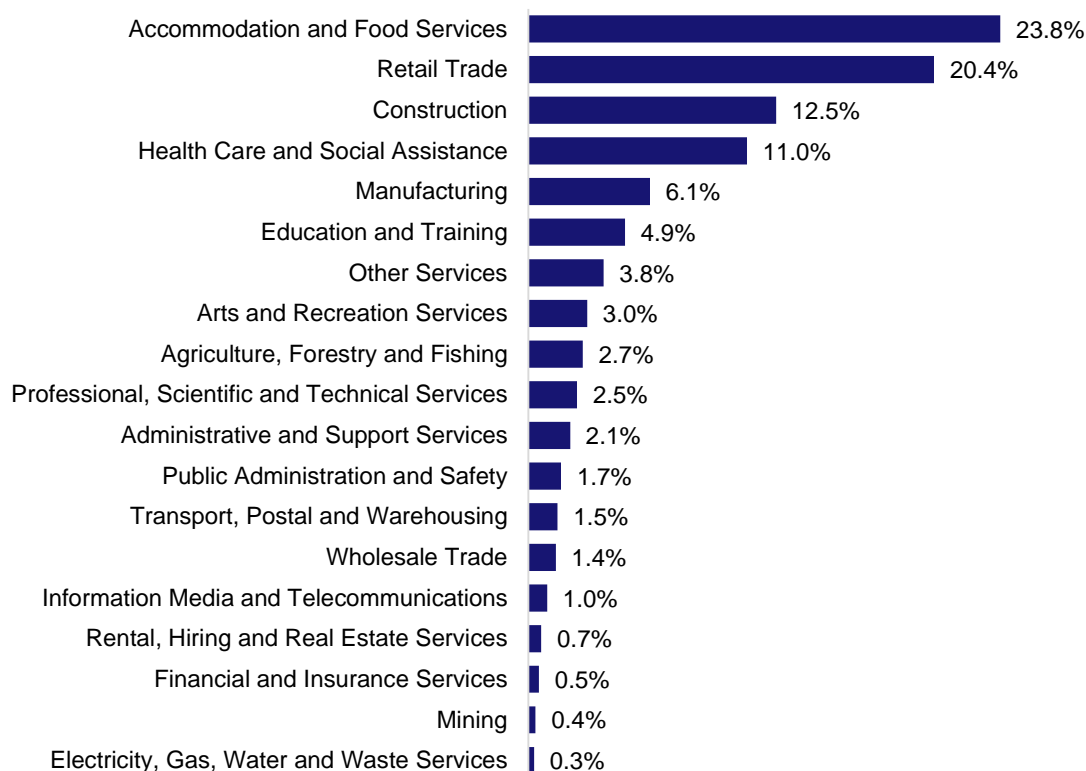

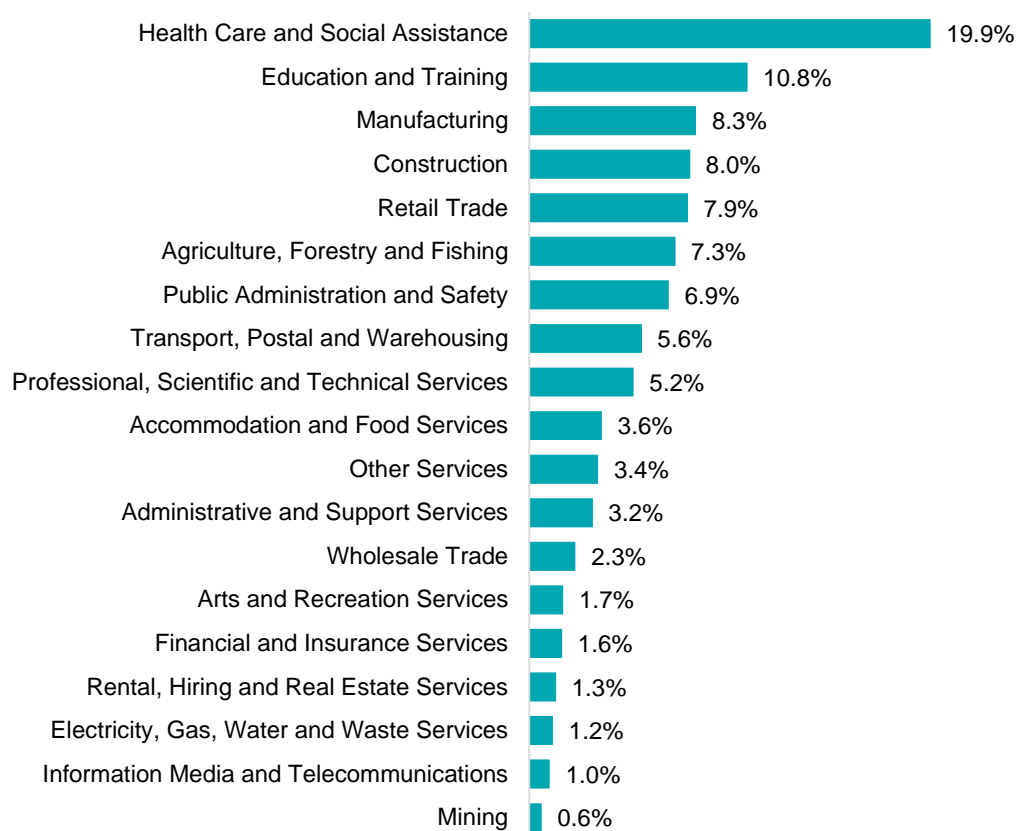

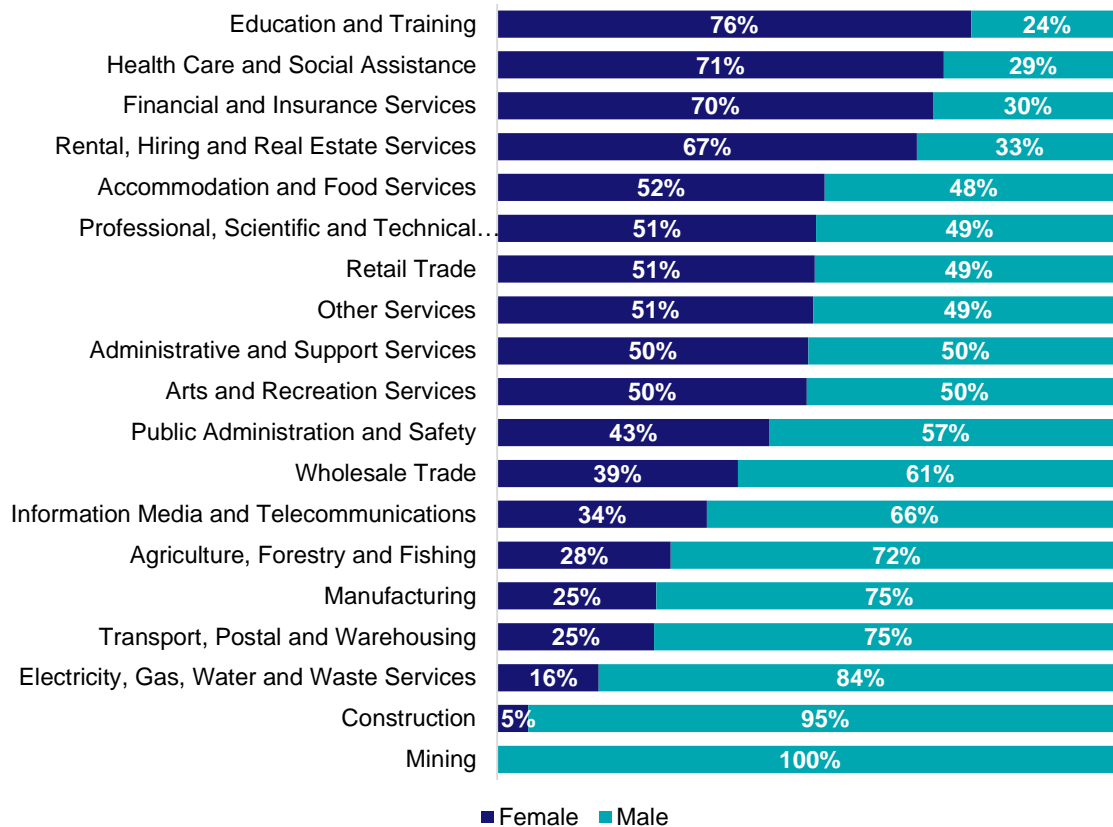
### Which industries are mature age persons (aged 55+) employed in?

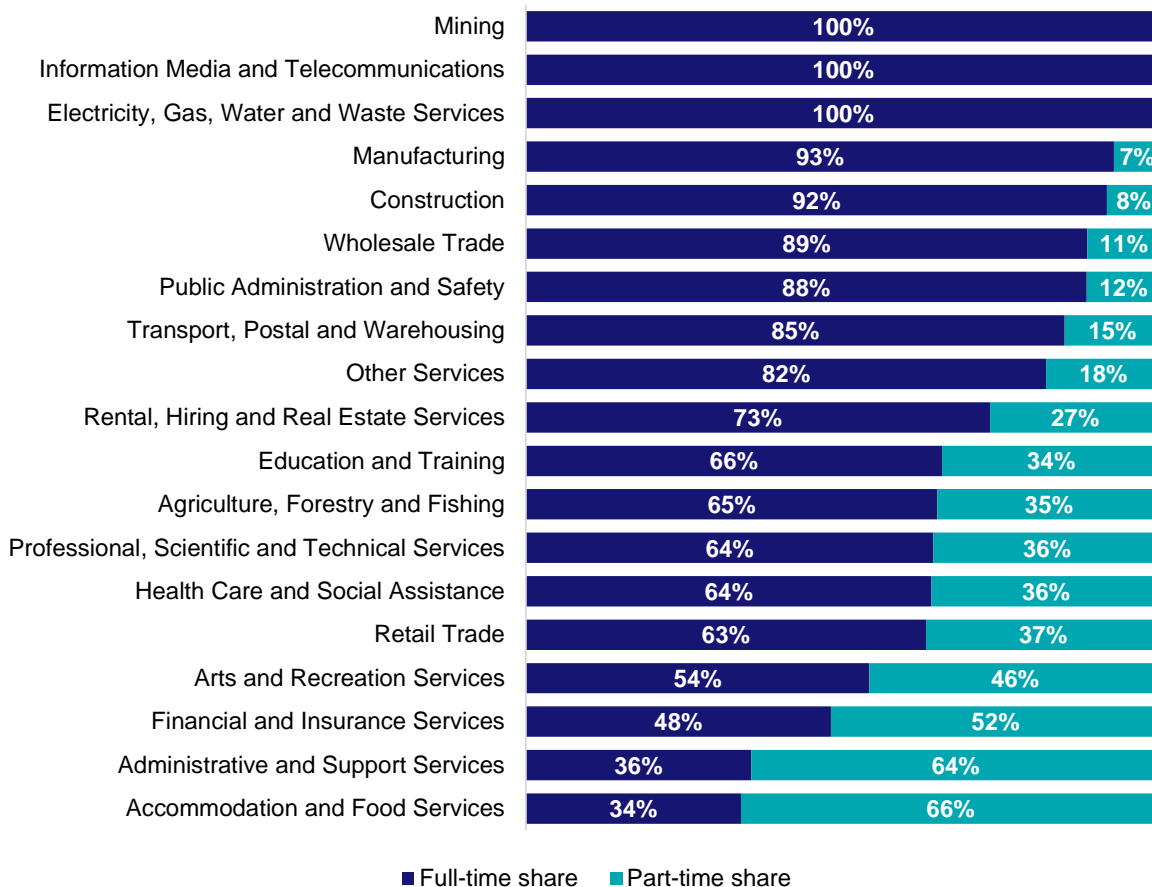


## Gender share by industry

### Overview

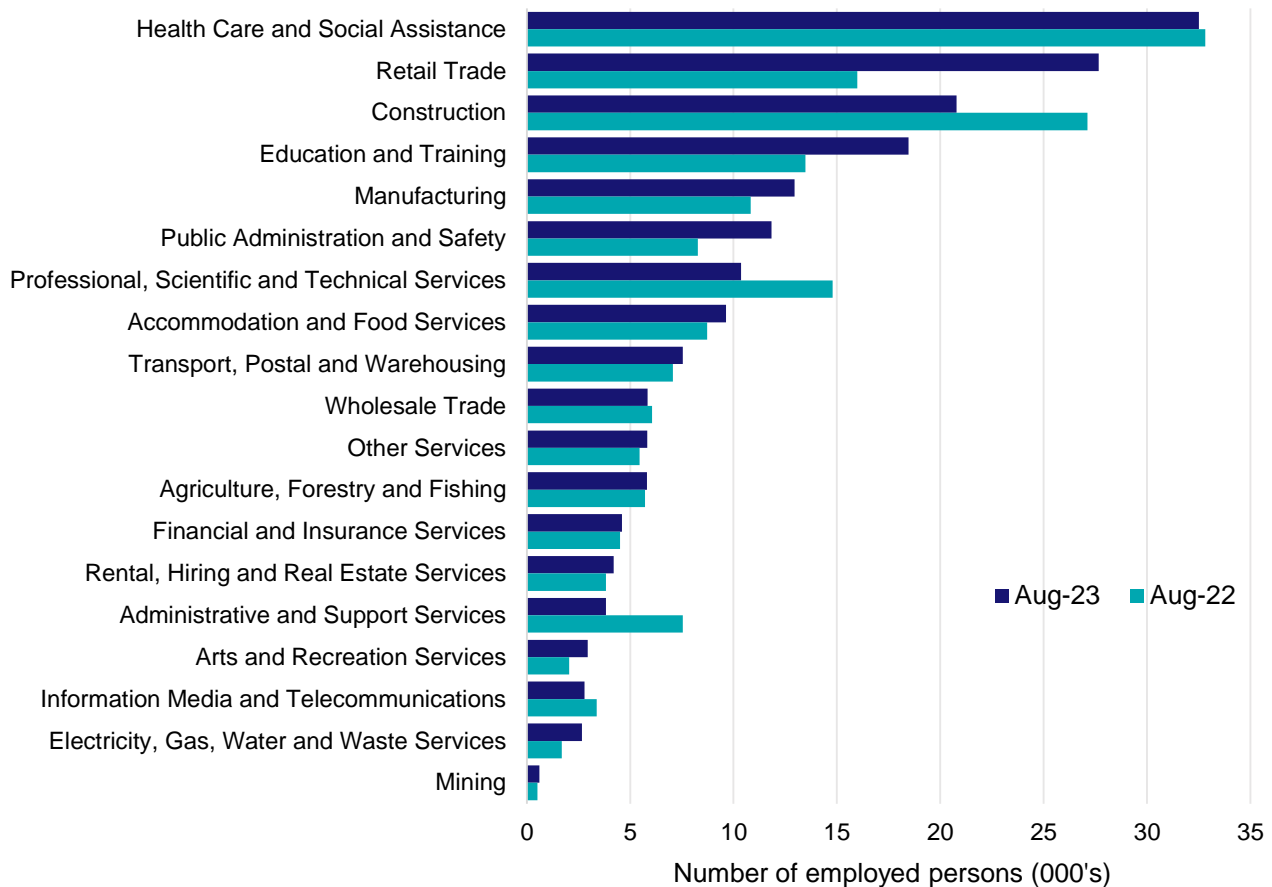
In August 2023, there were around 190,900 people employed in the Barwon Employment Region. The 5 largest employing industries in the region were Health Care and Social Assistance, Retail Trade, Construction, Education and Training, and Manufacturing. Together these 5 industries accounted for 59% of employment in the region.

Over the year to August 2023, employment in:

- Health Care and Social Assistance fell by 1.0% to stand at 32,500
- Retail Trade rose by 73.1% to stand at 27,700
- Construction fell by 23.4% to stand at 20,800.

In Health Care and Social Assistance in the Barwon Employment Region, 53% of workers were employed full-time; 81% were female; and the median age of the workforce was 42.

### Employment by industry, August 2023 and August 2022



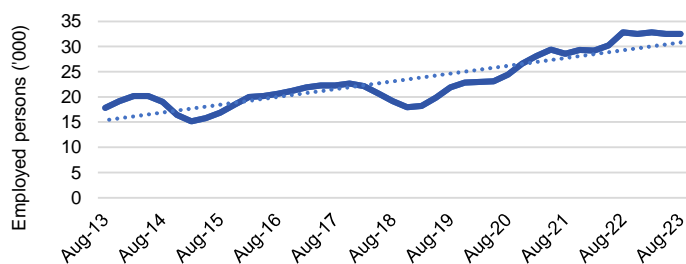

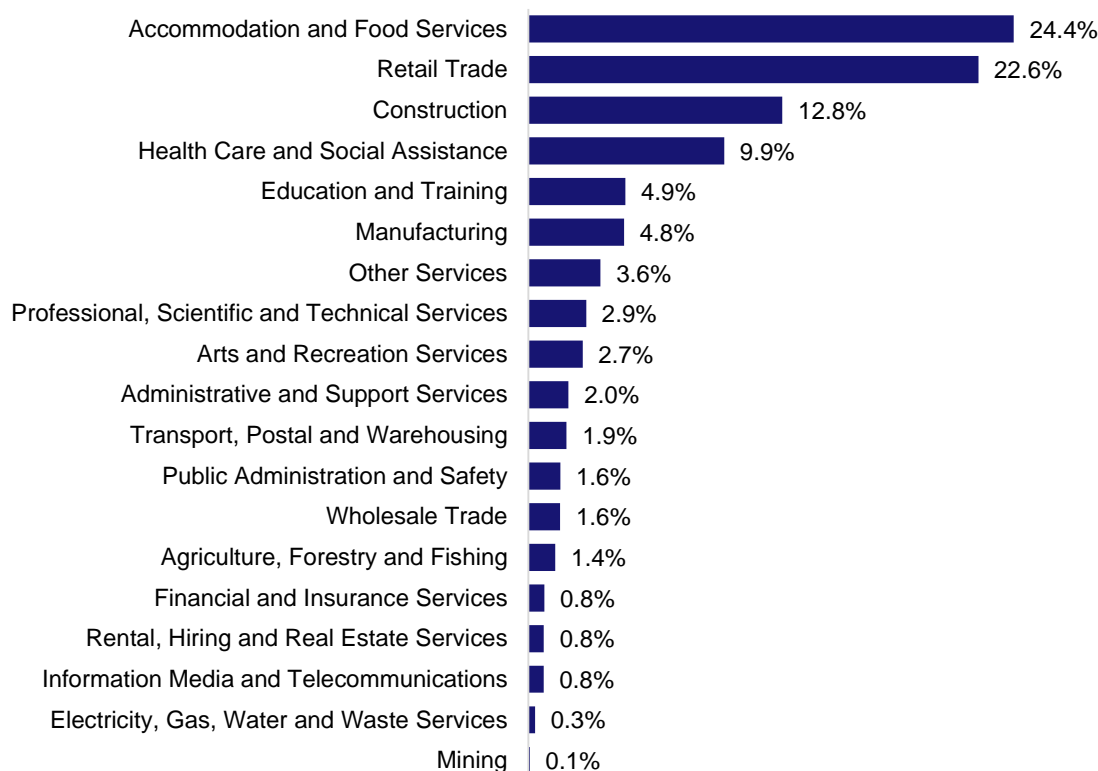

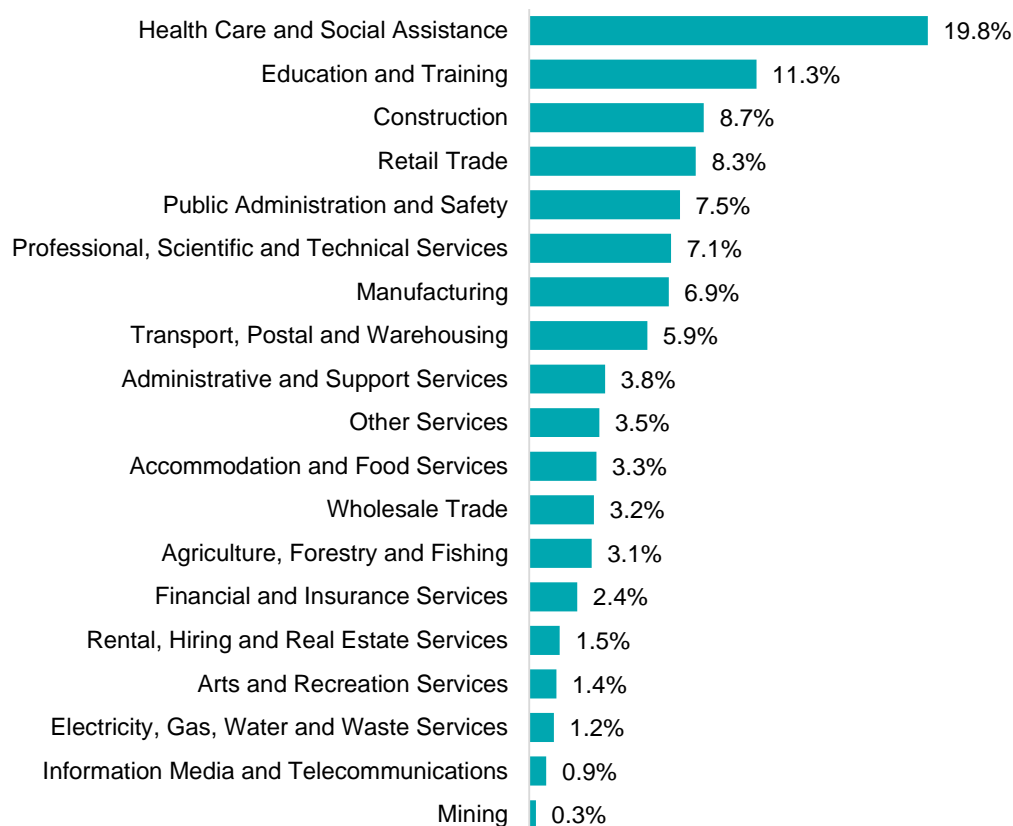

### Which industries are youth (aged 15-24) employed in?



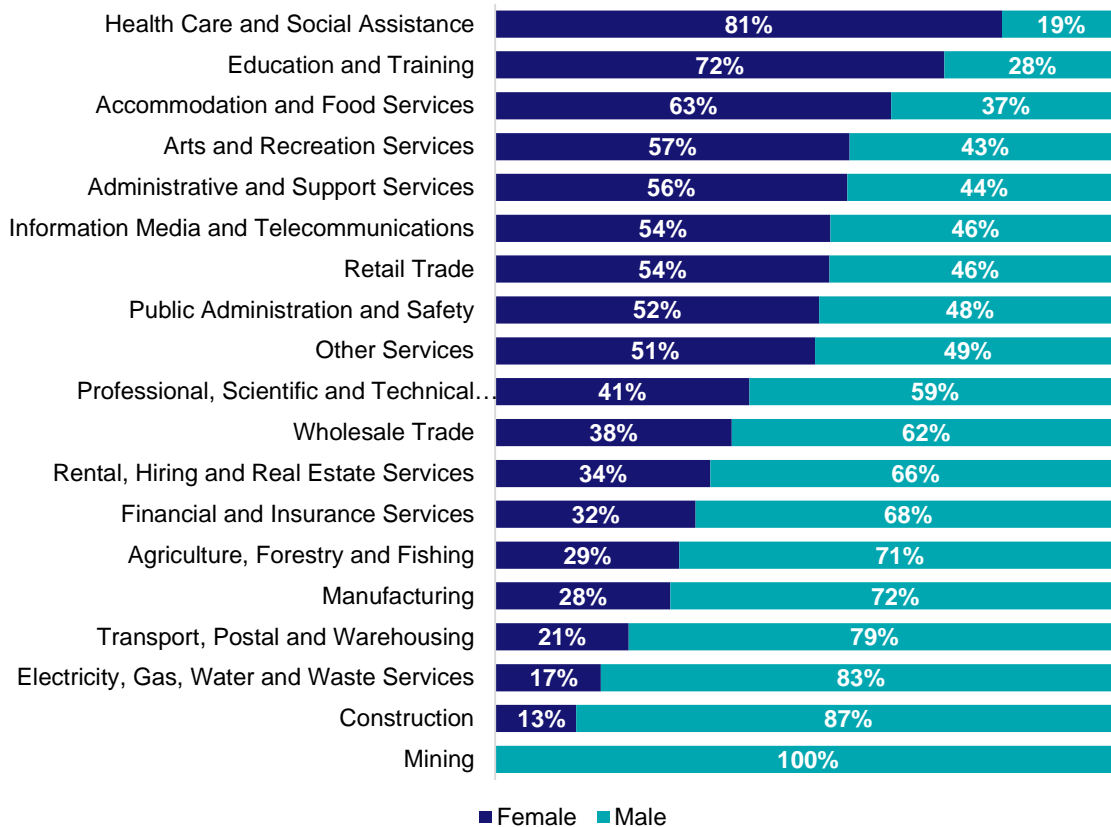

### Which industries are mature age persons (aged 55+) employed in?



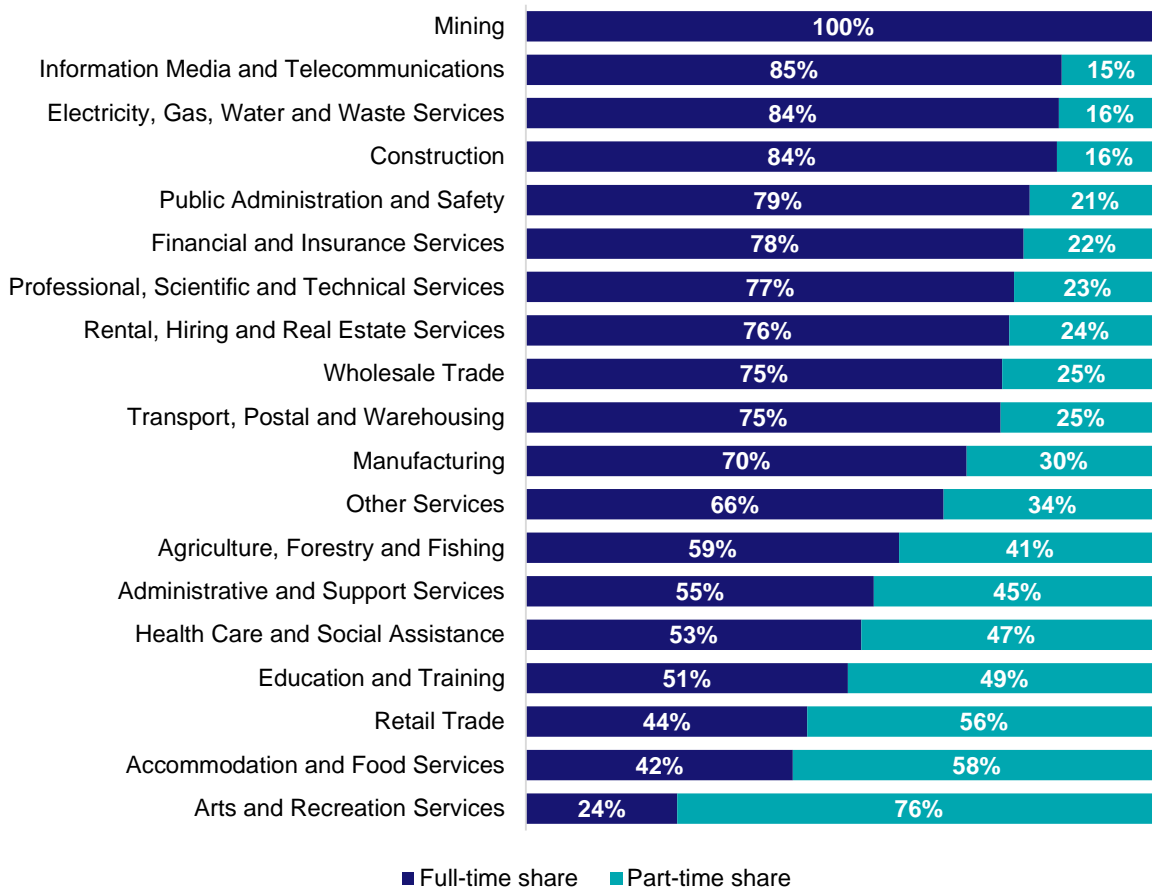

### Overview

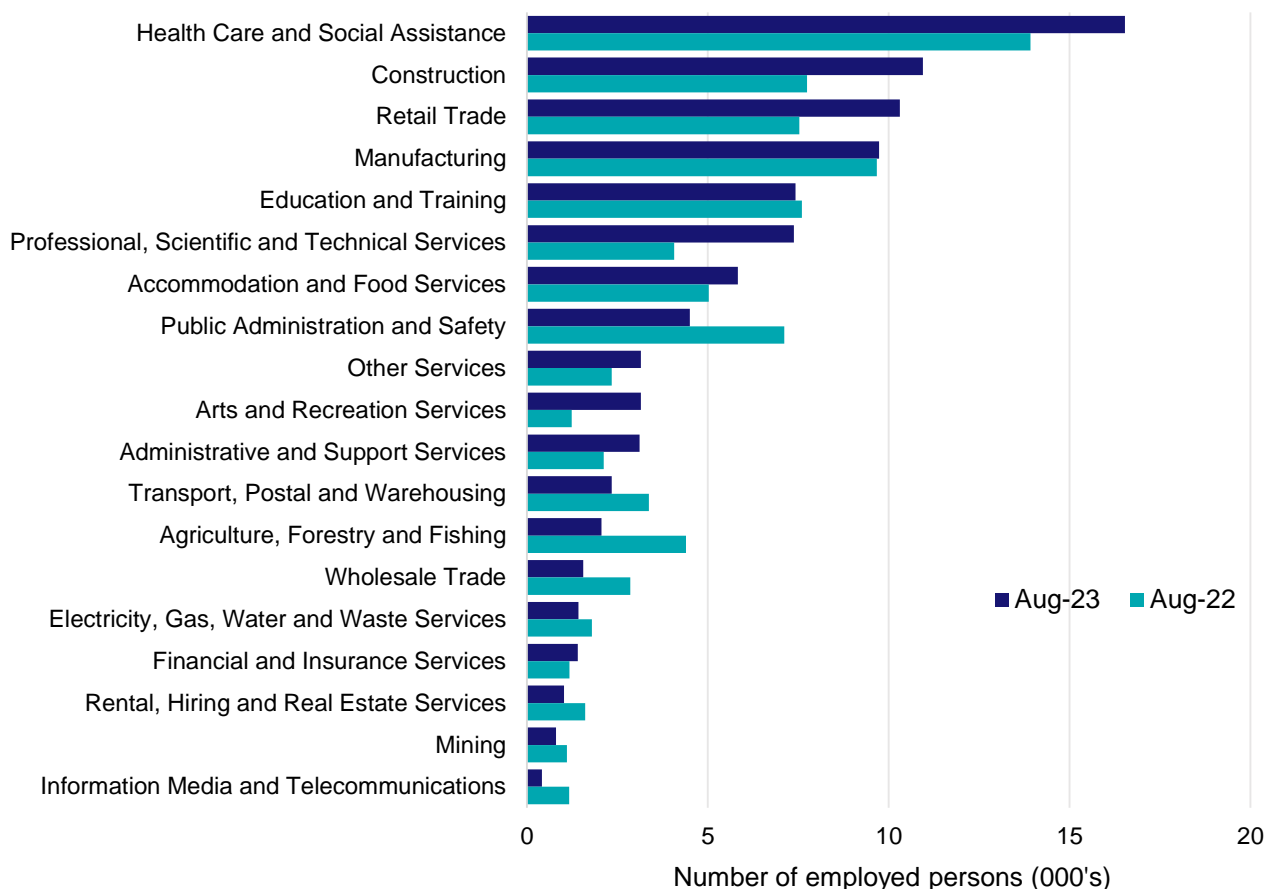
In August 2023, there were around 93,200 people employed in the Bendigo Employment Region. The 5 largest employing industries in the region were Health Care and Social Assistance, Construction, Retail Trade, Manufacturing, and Education and Training. Together these 5 industries accounted for 59% of employment in the region.

Over the year to August 2023, employment in:

- Health Care and Social Assistance rose by 18.7% to stand at 16,500
- Construction rose by 41.3% to stand at 11,000
- Retail Trade rose by 36.9% to stand at 10,300.

In Health Care and Social Assistance in the Bendigo Employment Region, 53% of workers were employed part-time; 83% were female; and the median age of the workforce was 44.

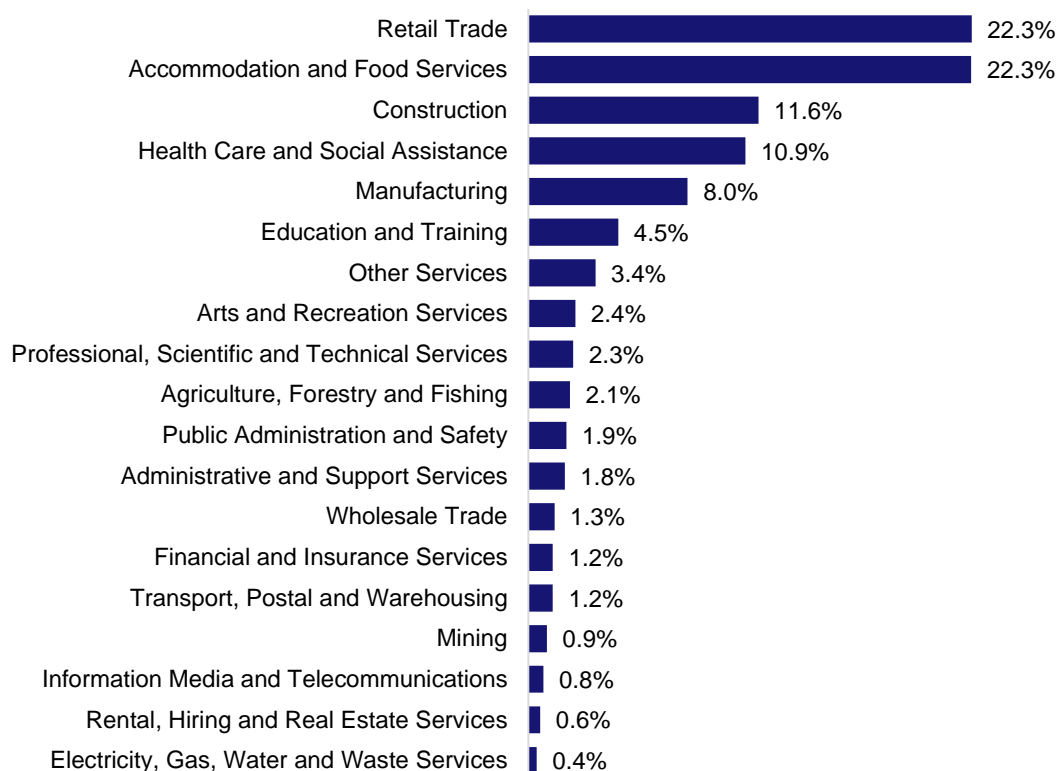

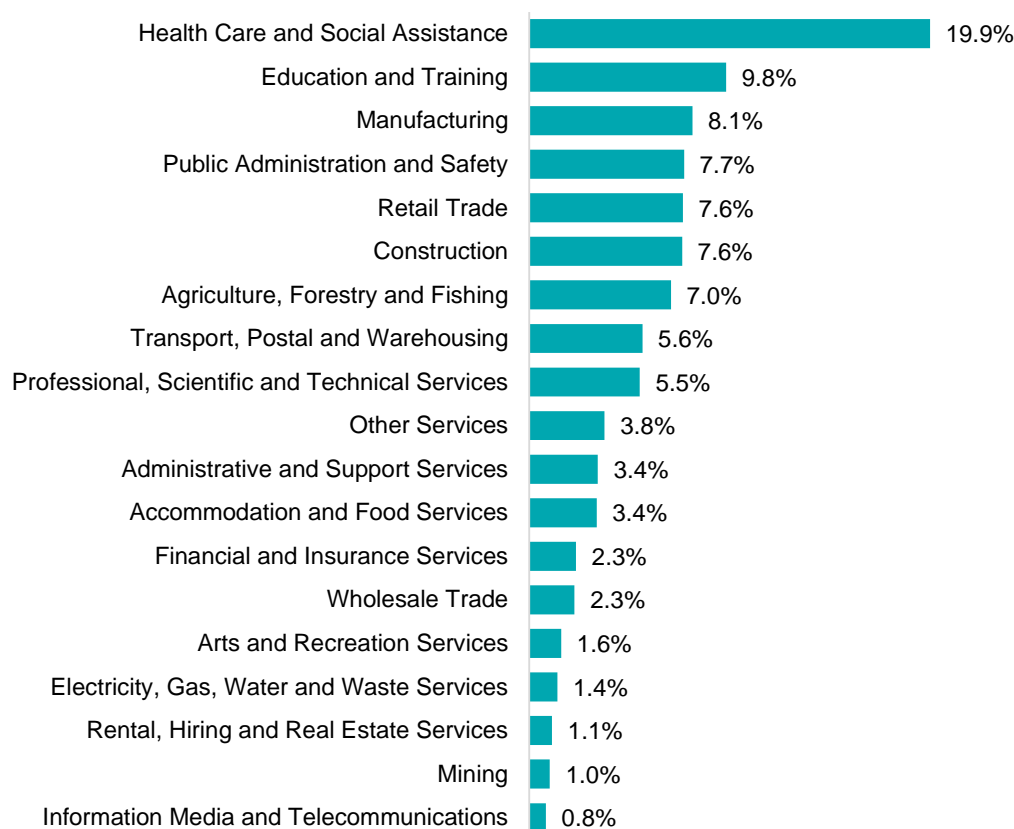

### Which industries are youth (aged 15-24) employed in?



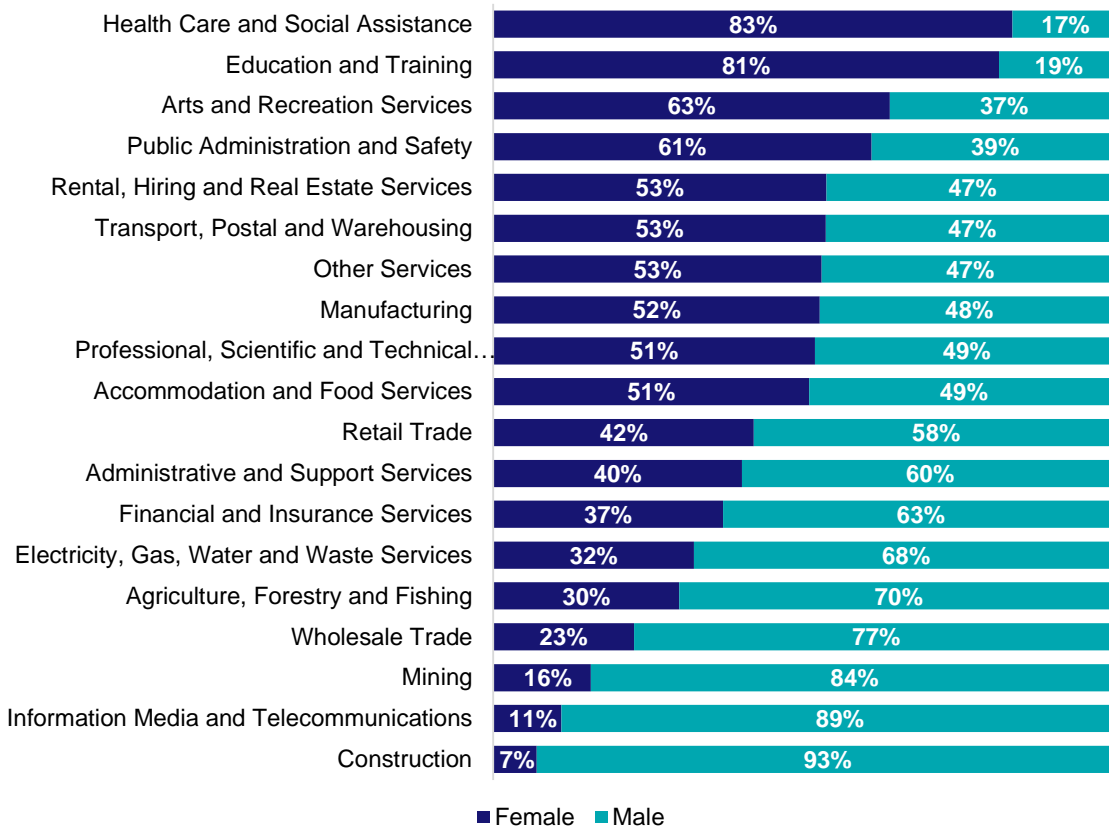

### Which industries are mature age persons (aged 55+) employed in?



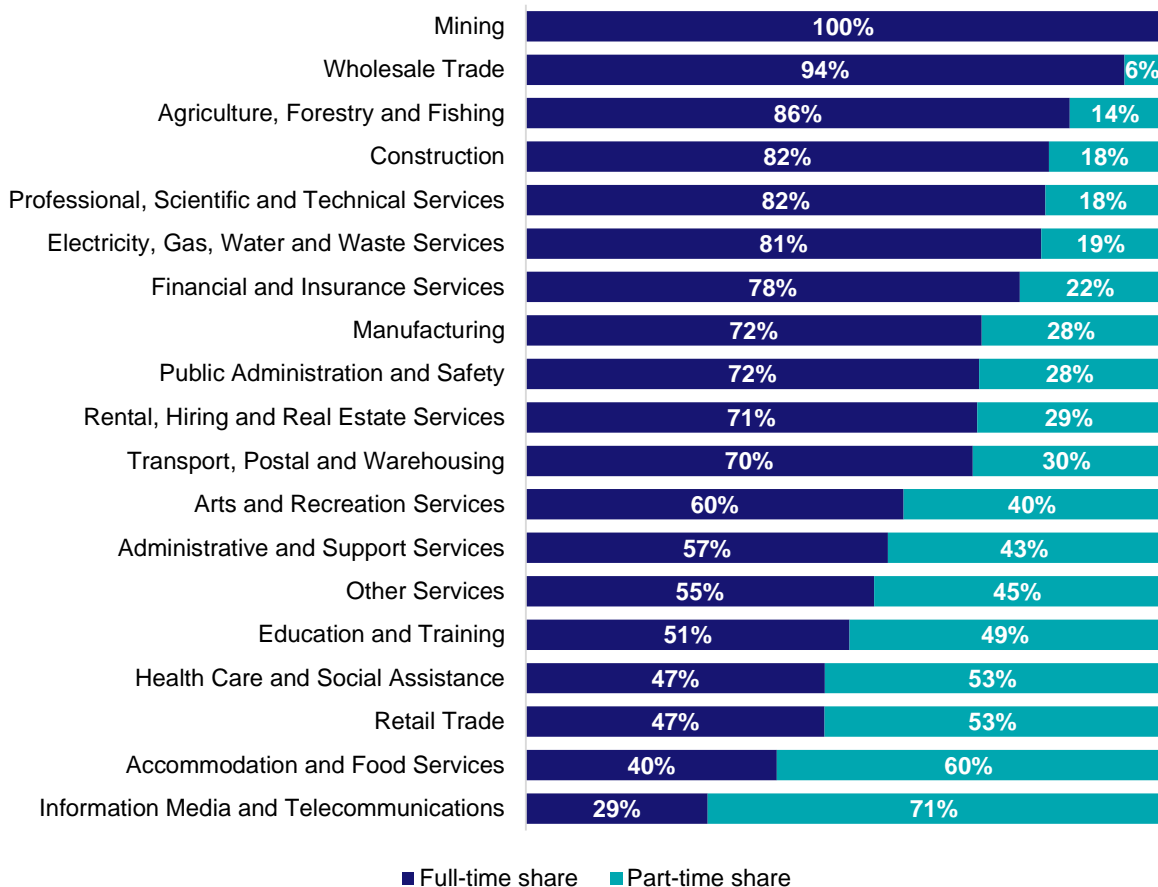

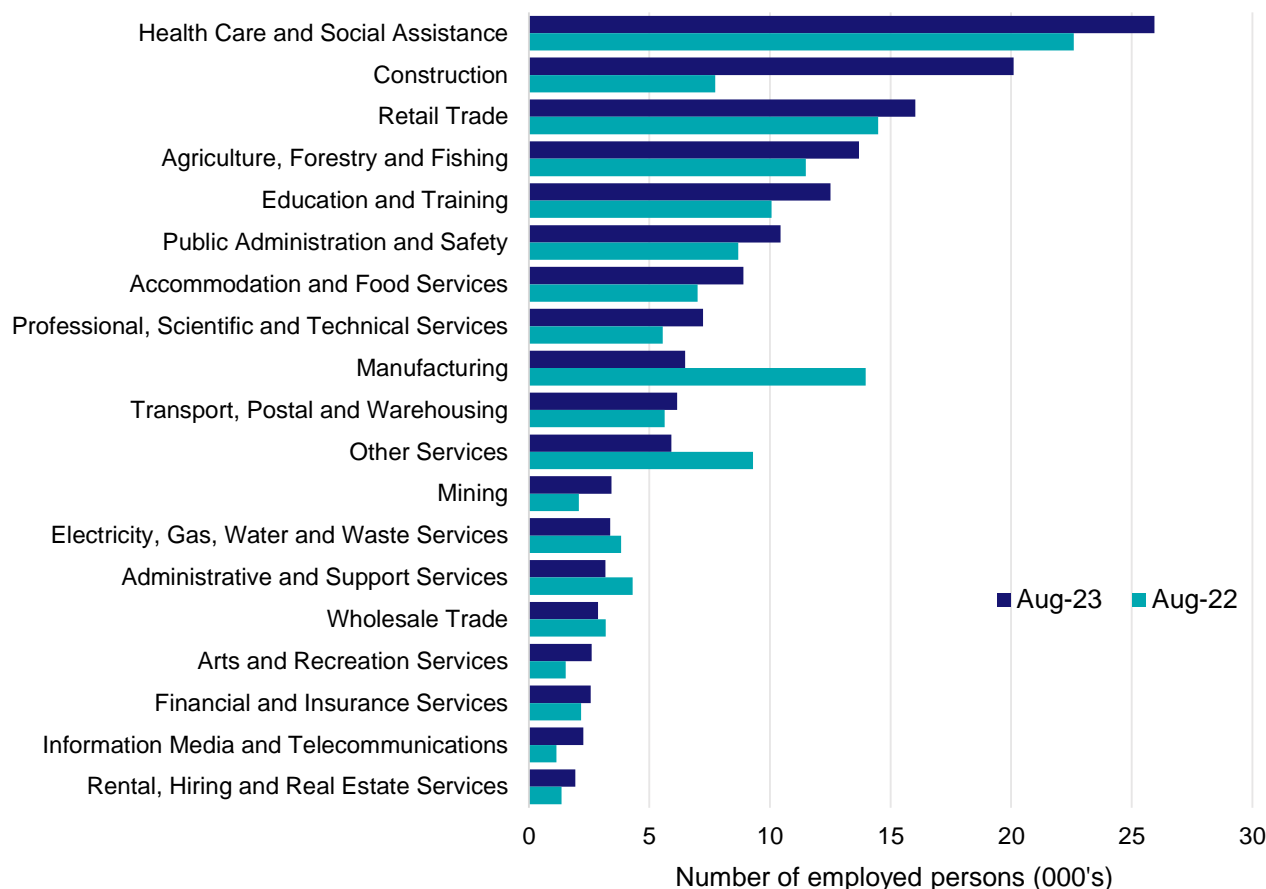

### Employment by industry, August 2023 and August 2022



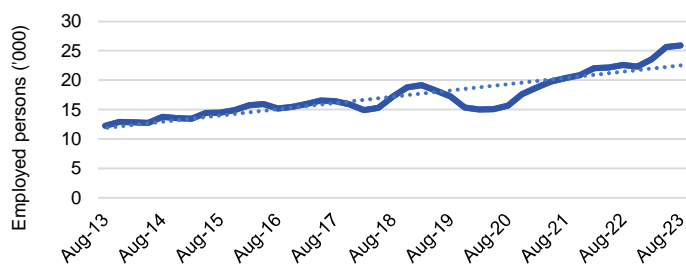

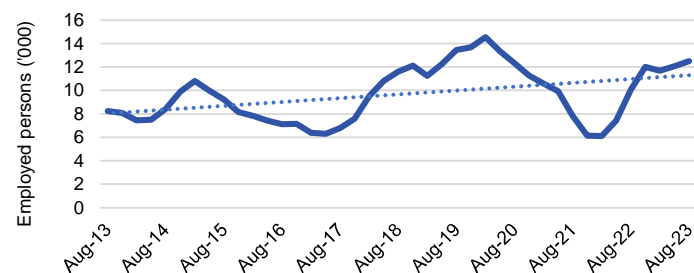

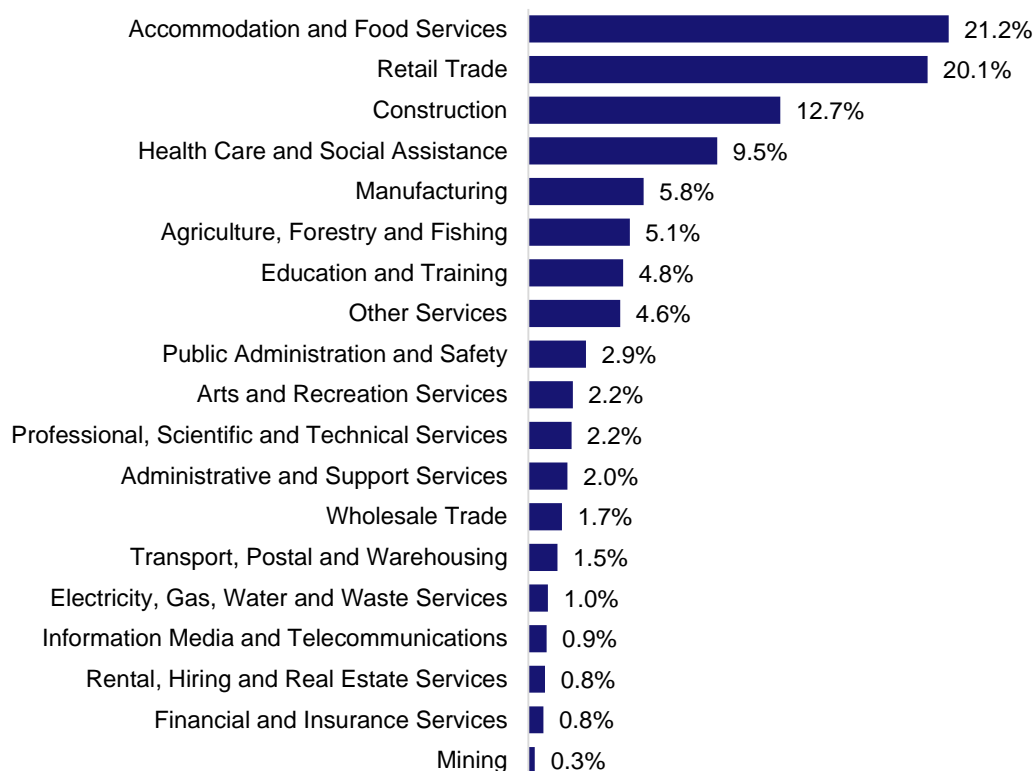

### Which industries are youth (aged 15-24) employed in?



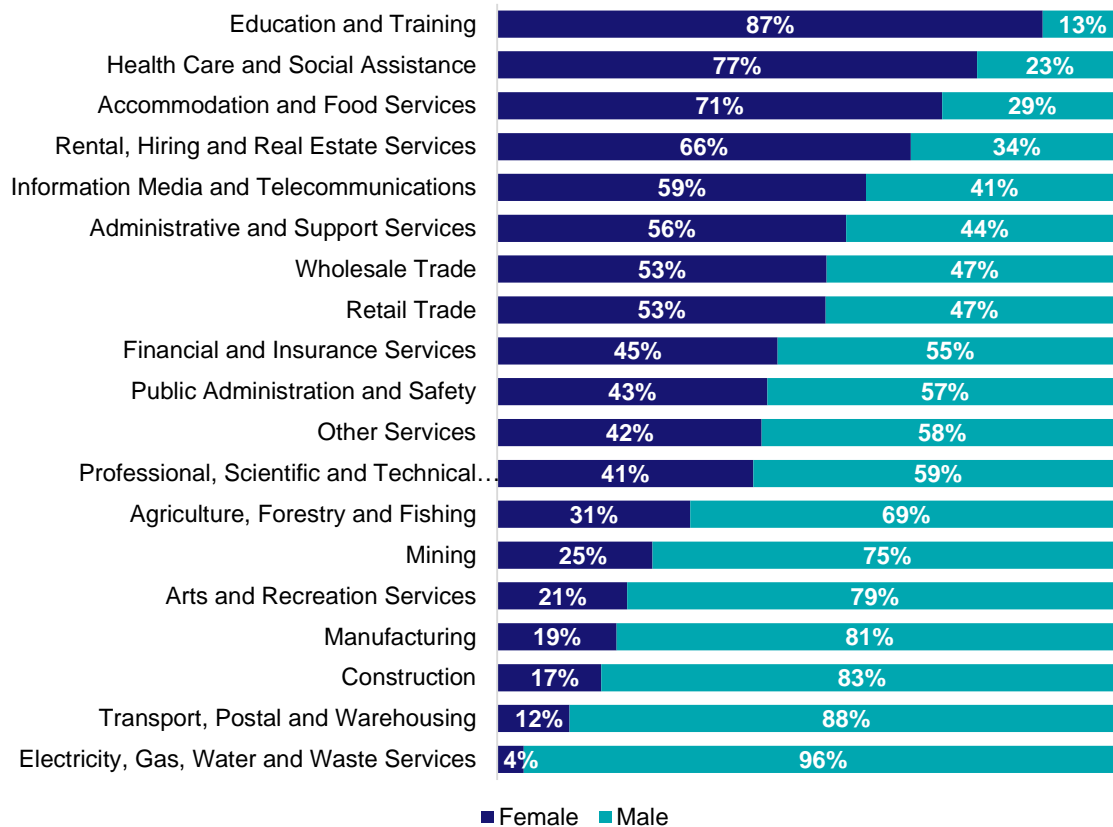

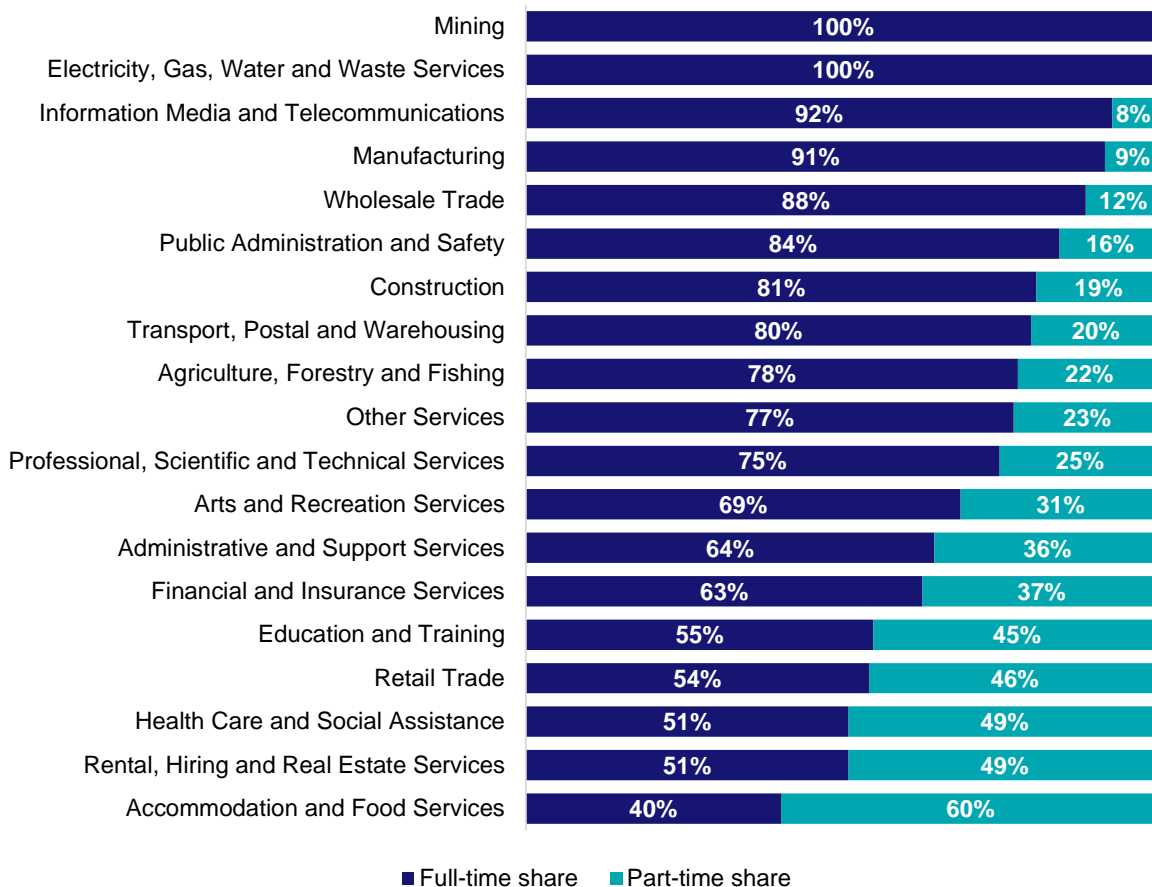

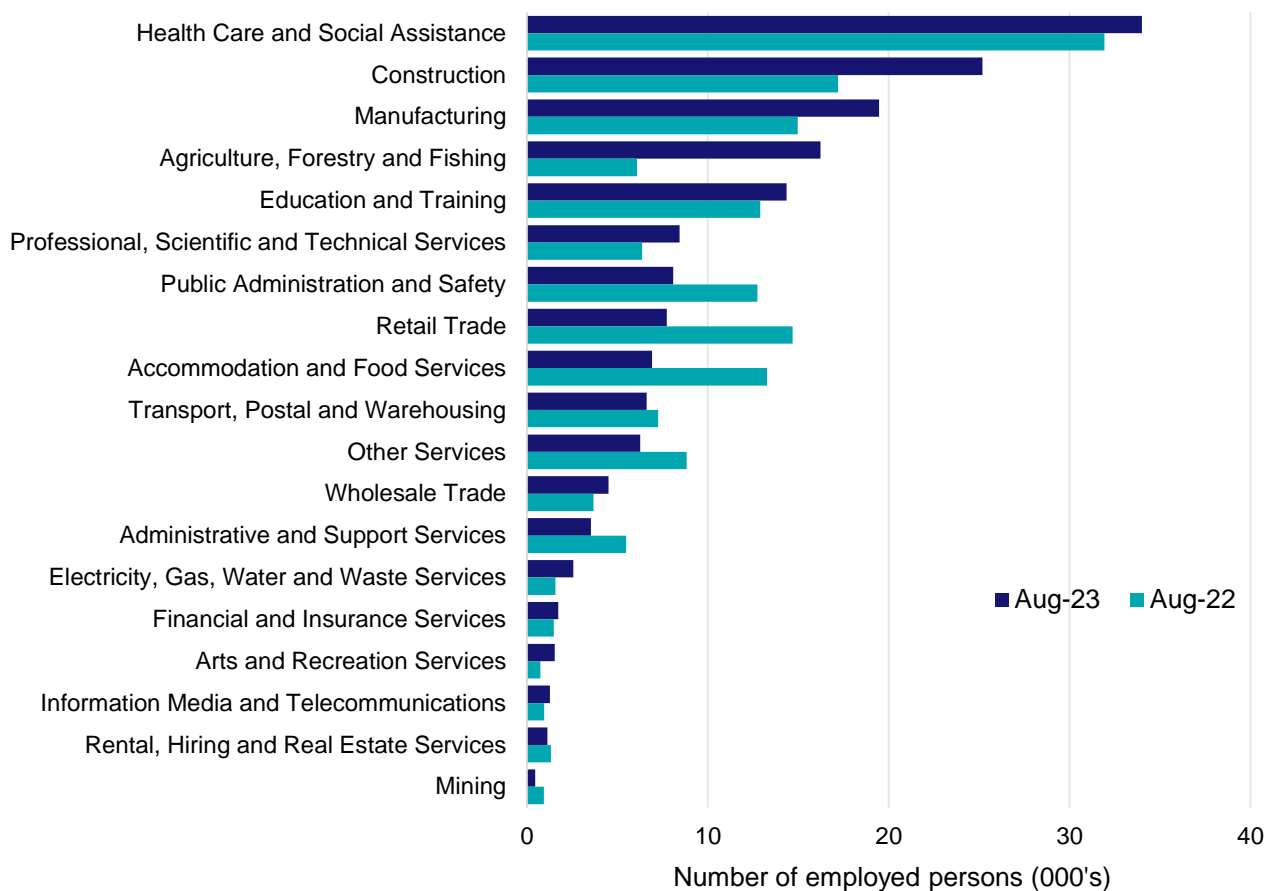

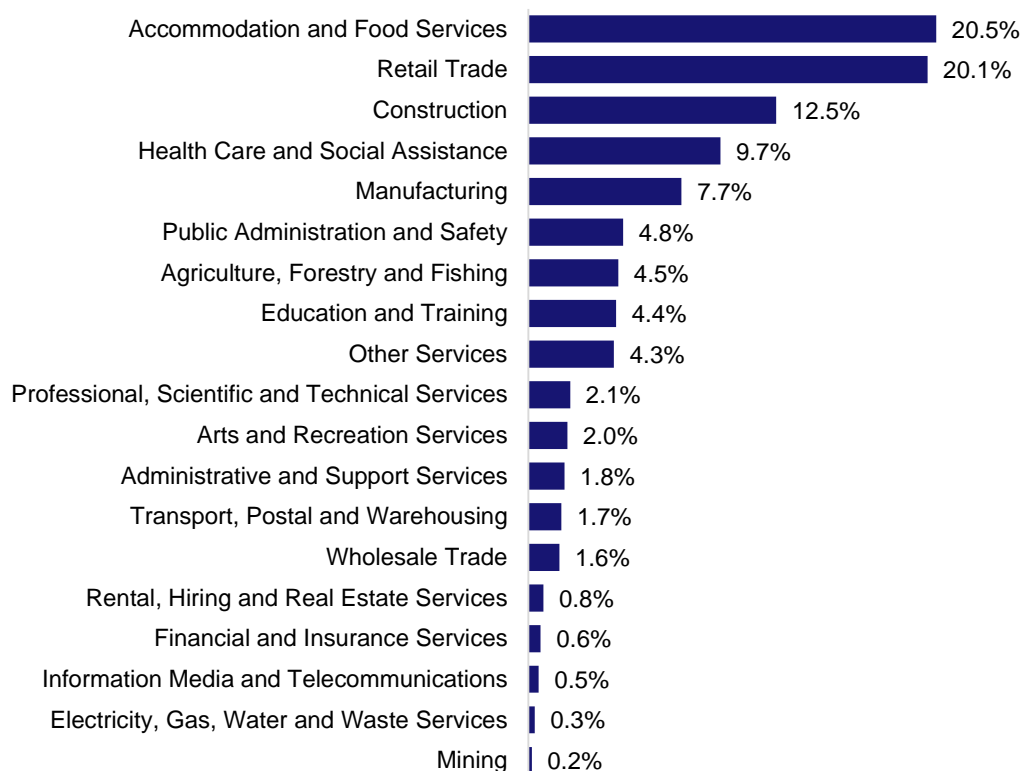

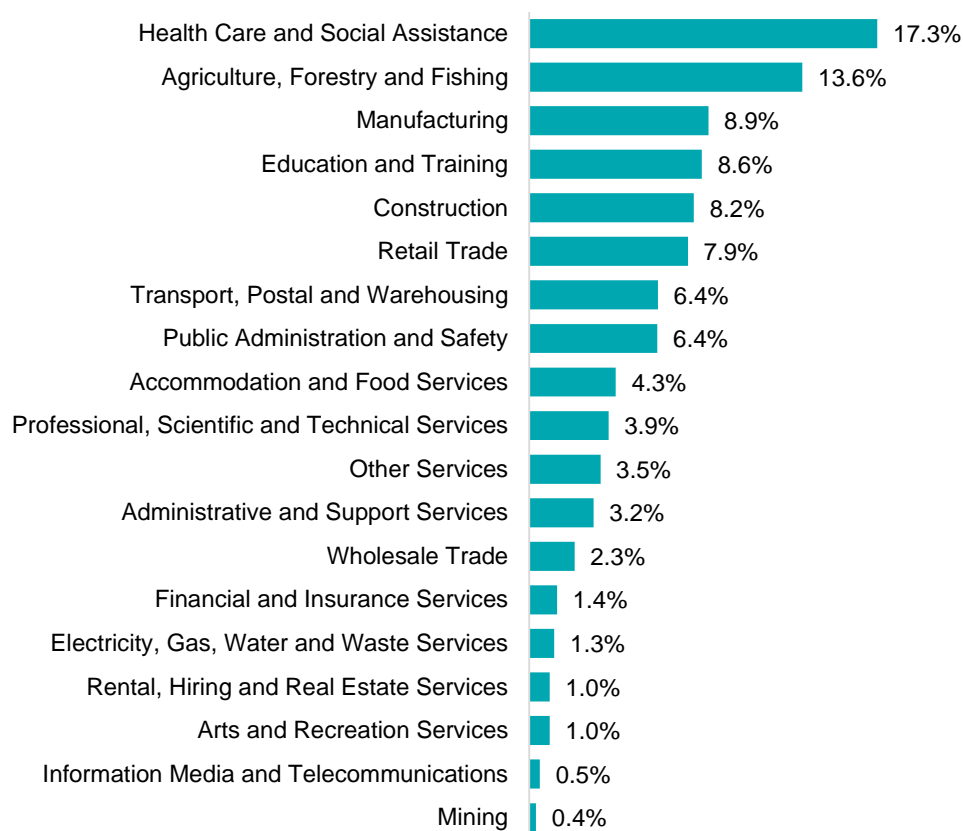

### Which industries are youth (aged 15-24) employed in?



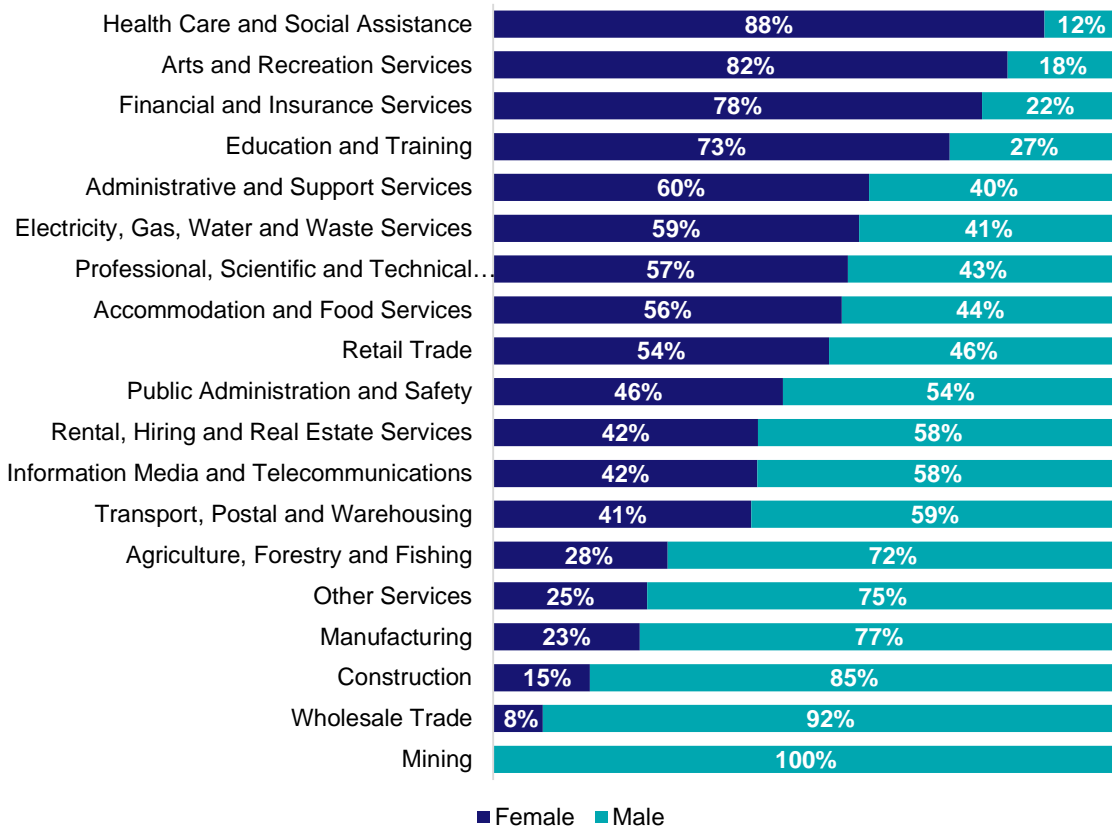

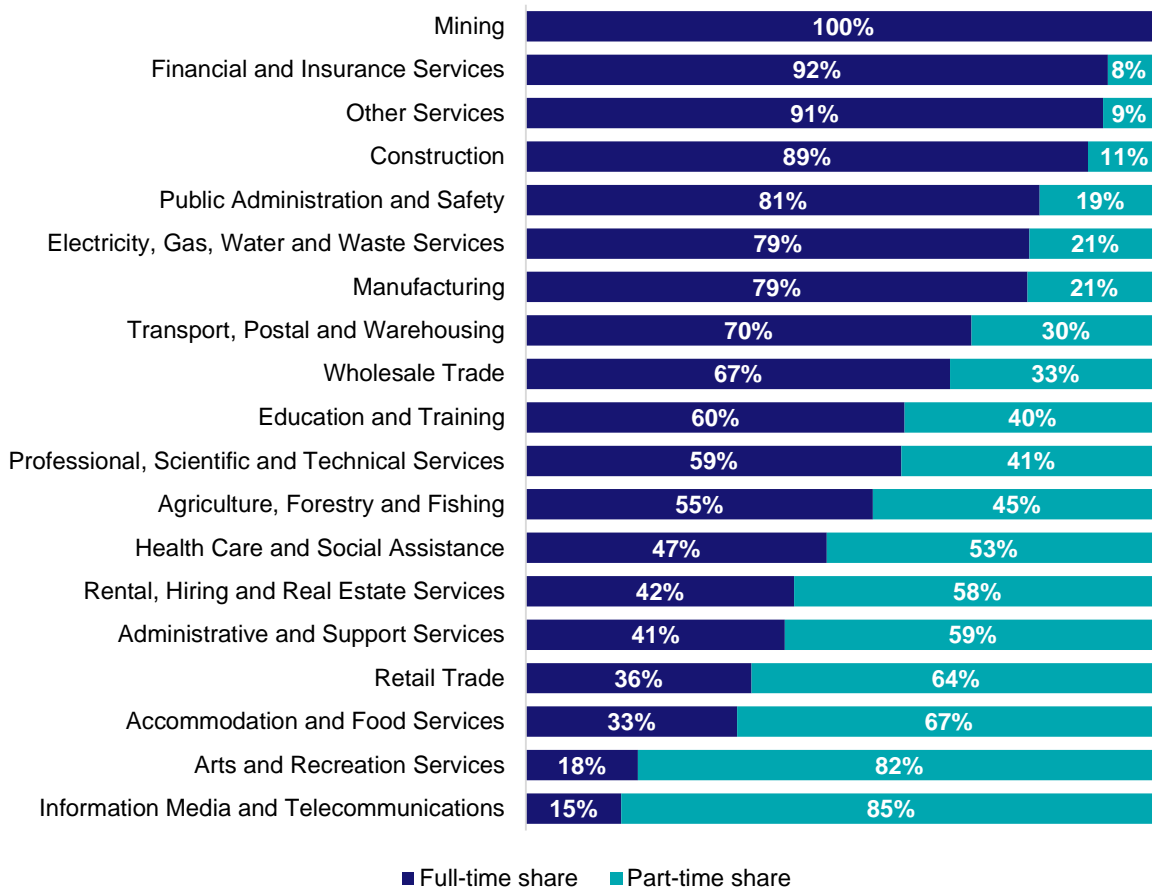

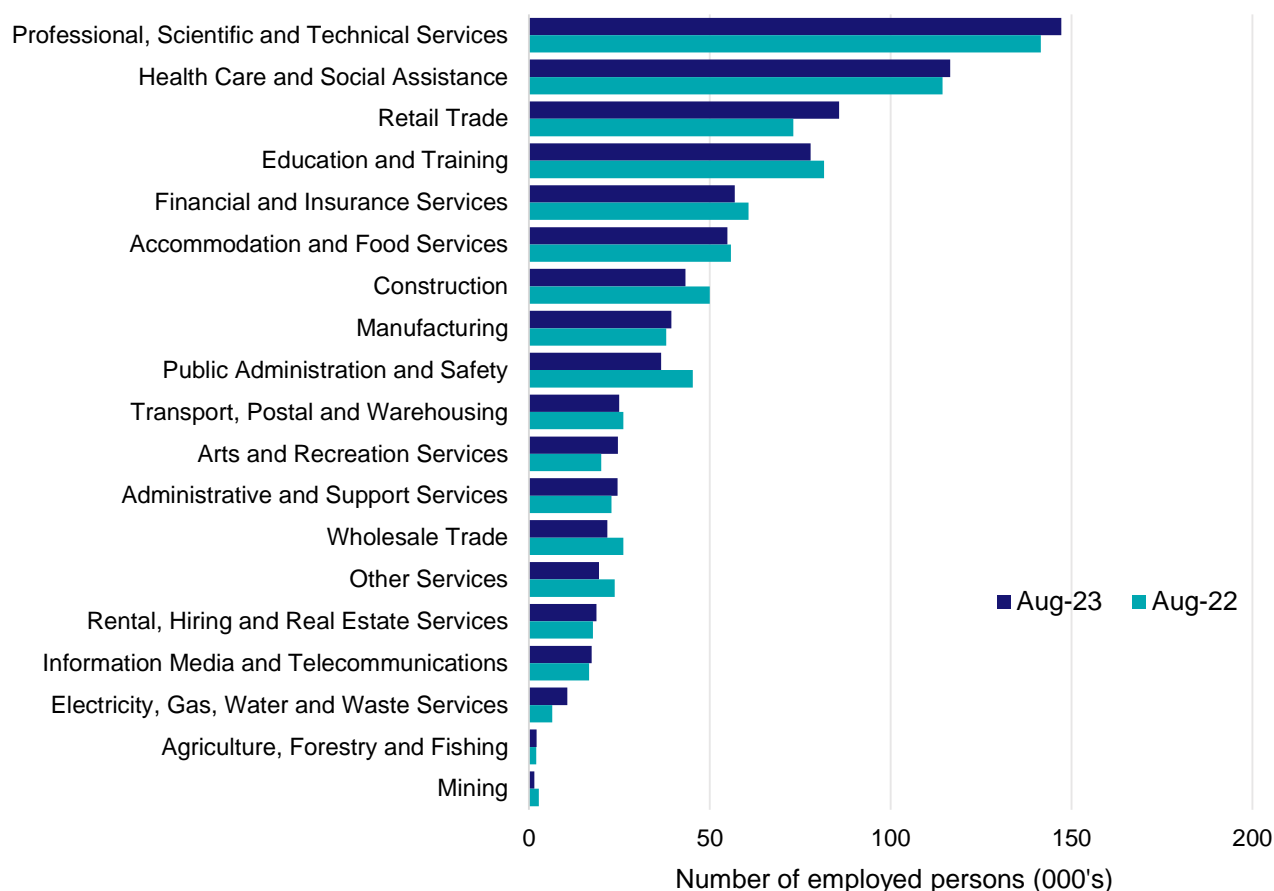

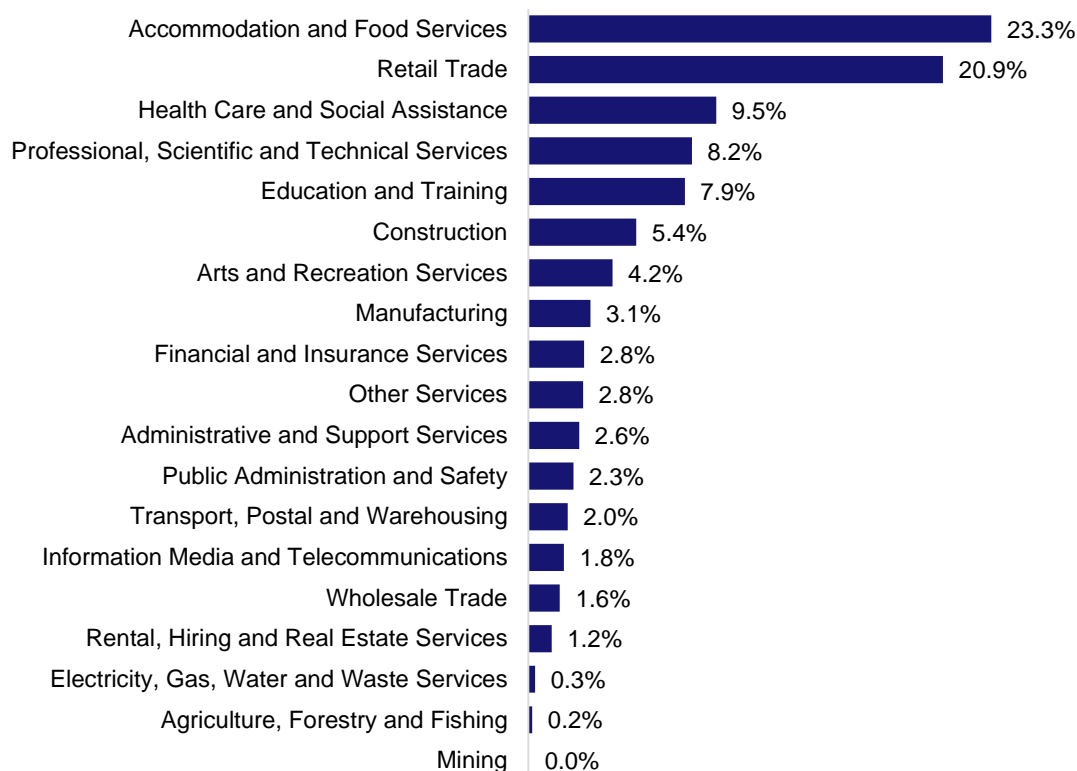

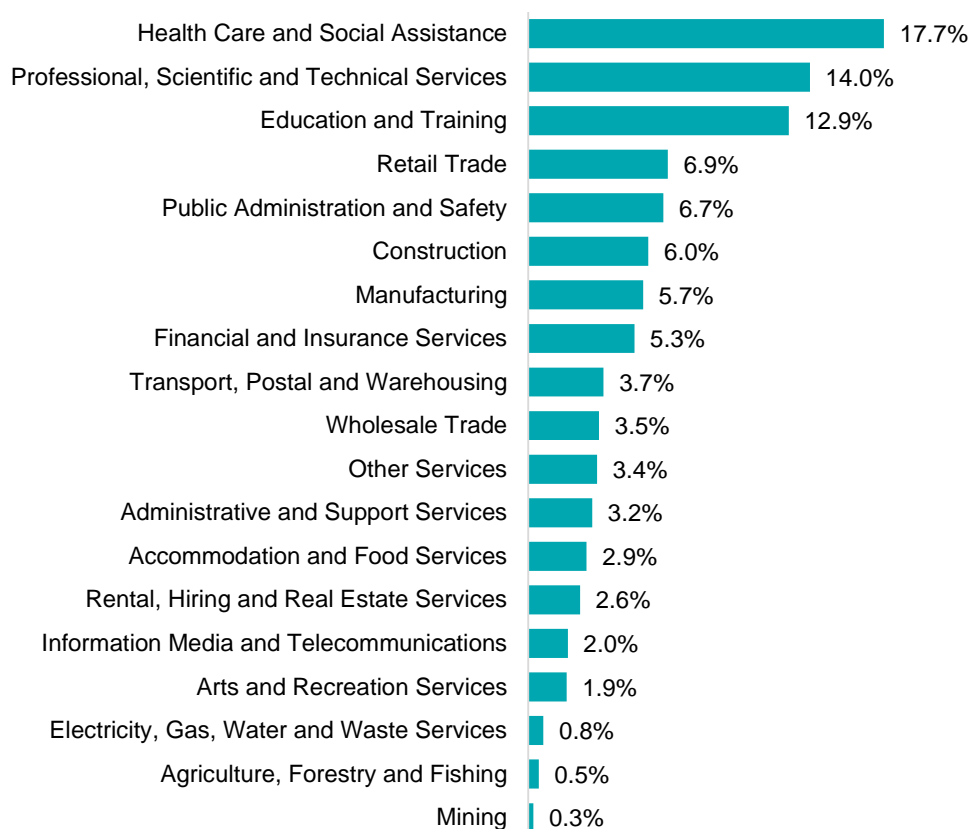

### Which industries are youth (aged 15-24) employed in?



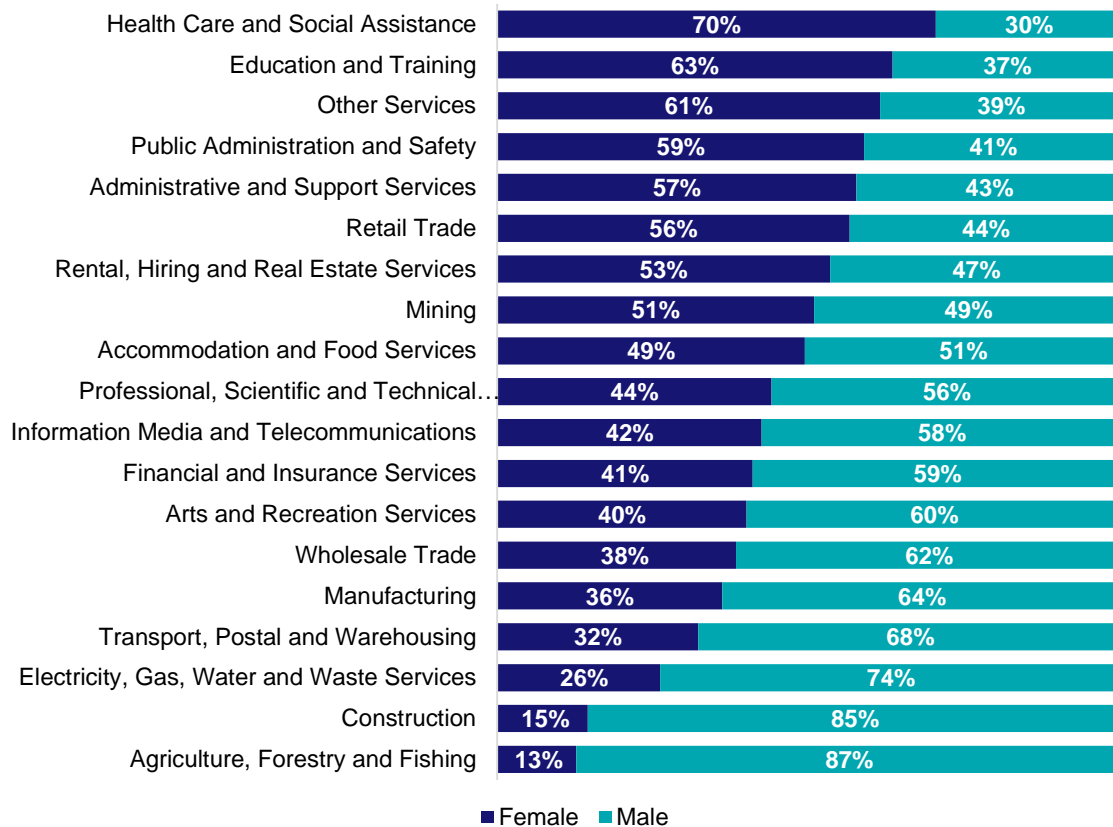

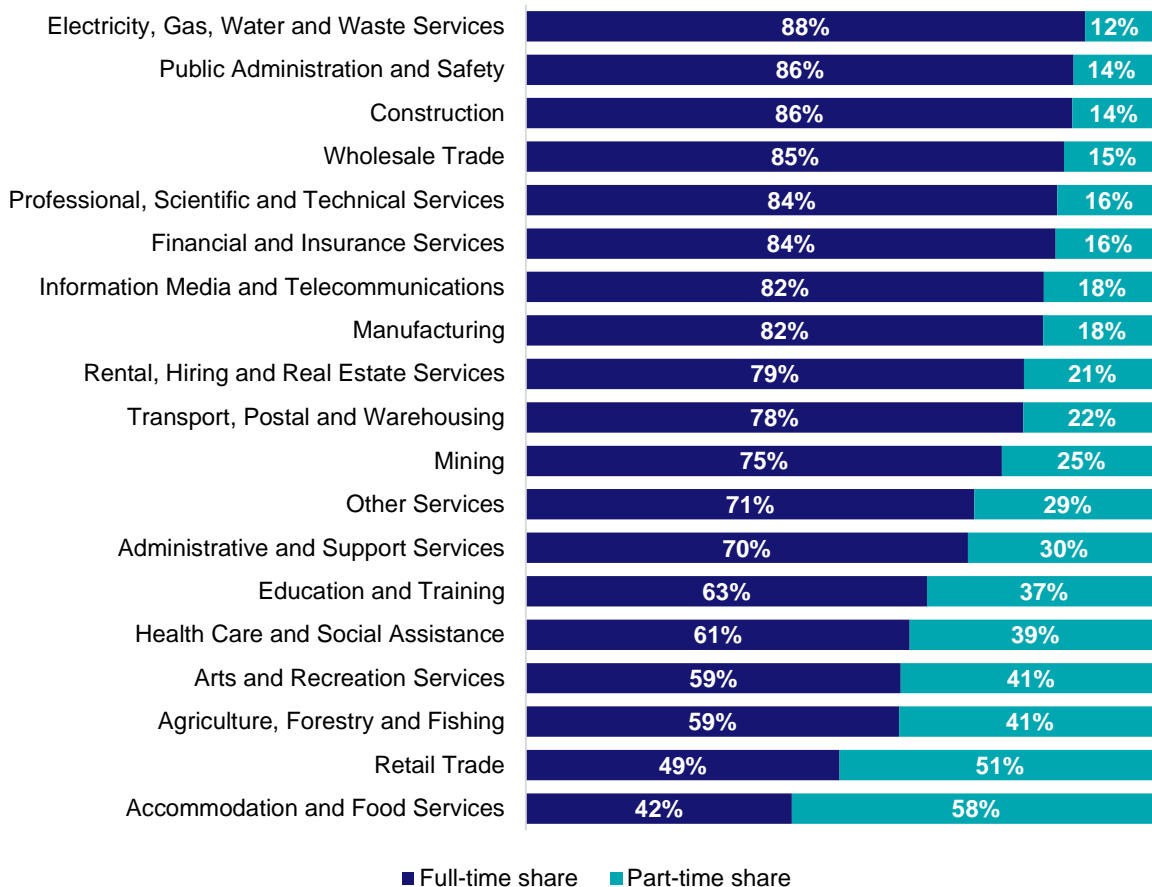

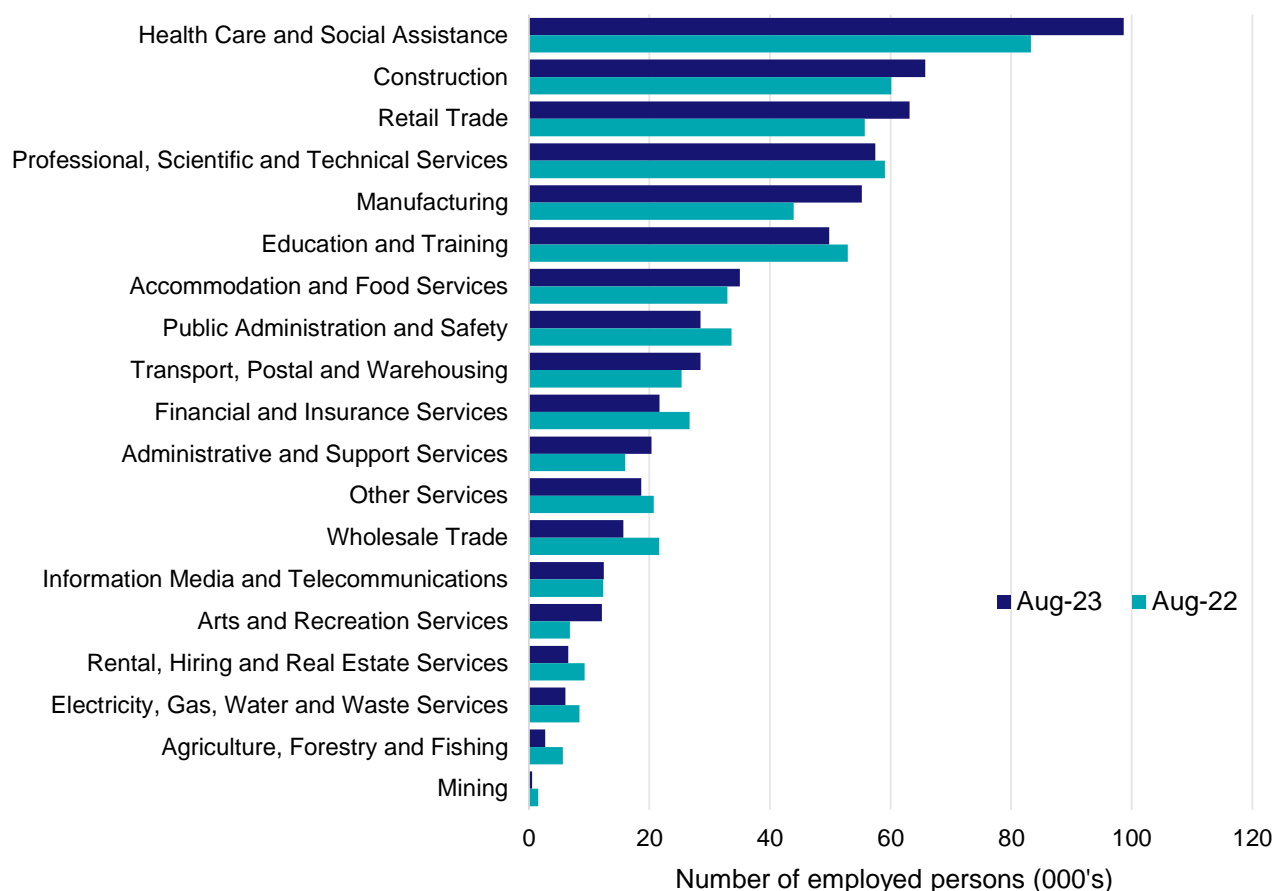

### Which industries are youth (aged 15-24) employed in?



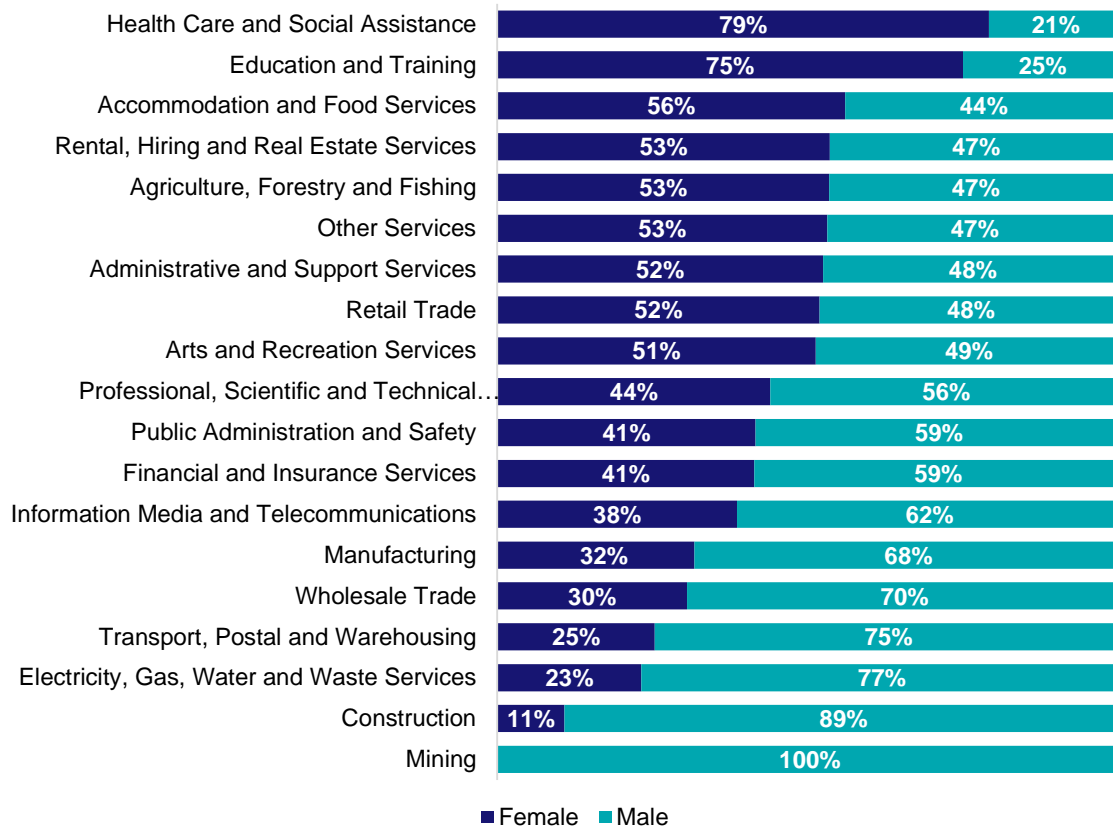

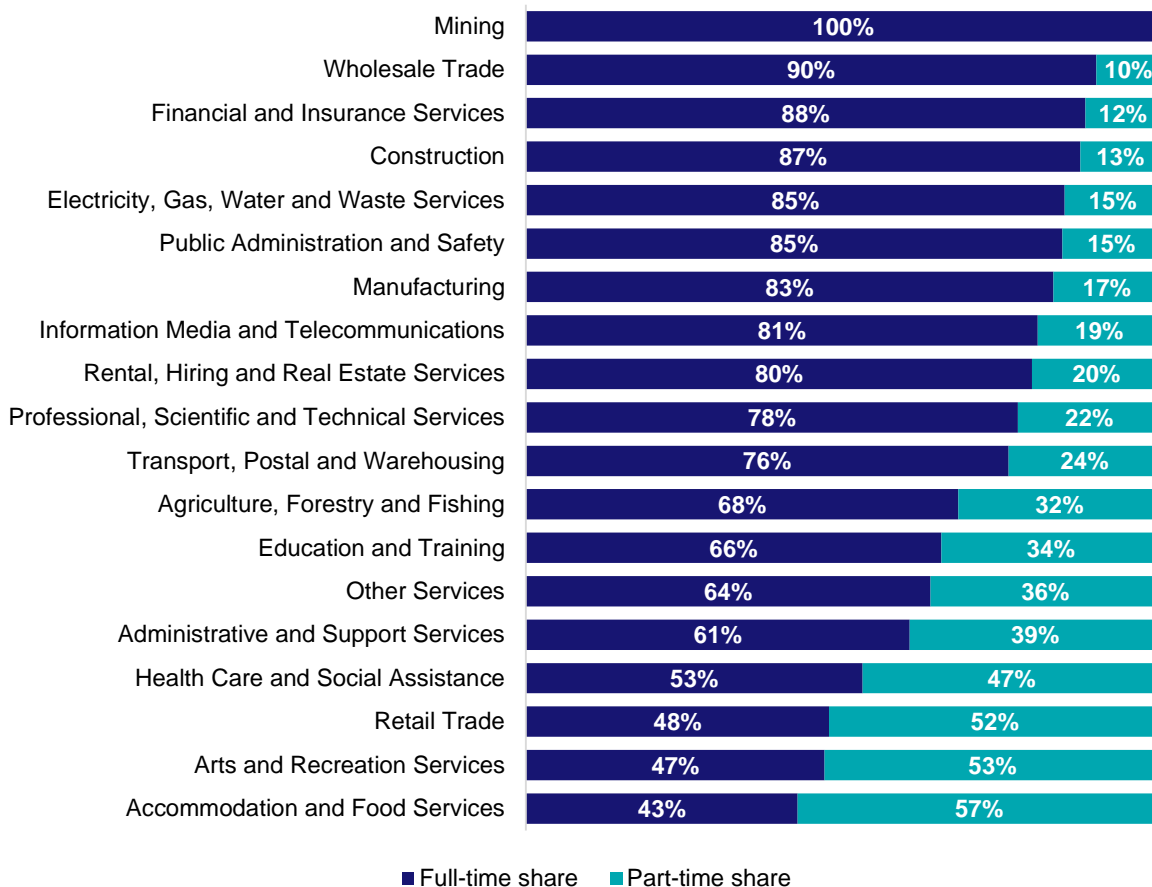

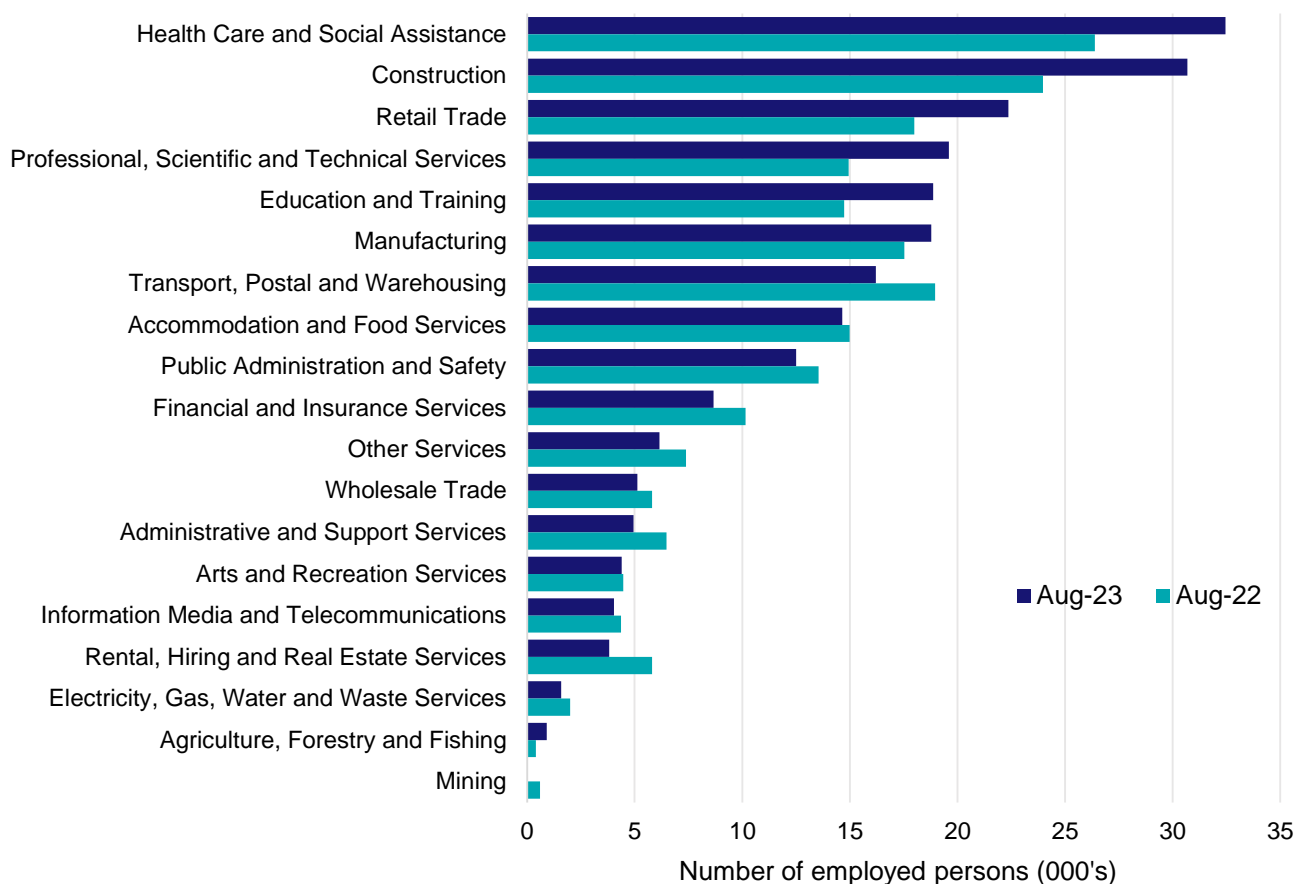

### Employment by industry, August 2023 and August 2022



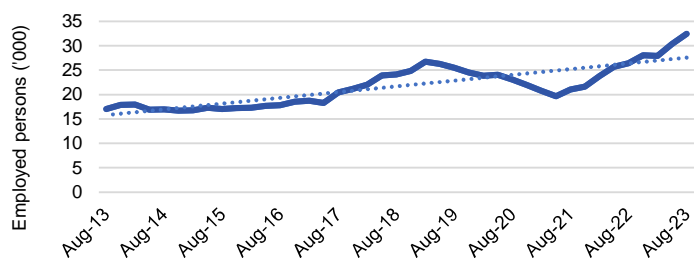

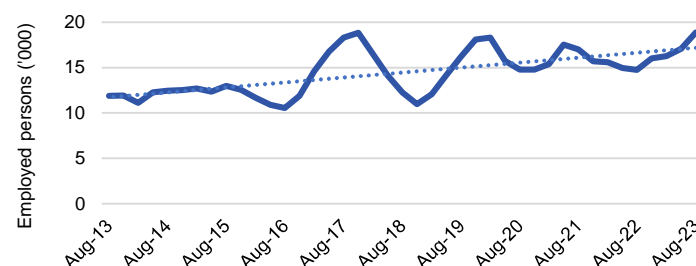

### Which industries are youth (aged 15-24) employed in?



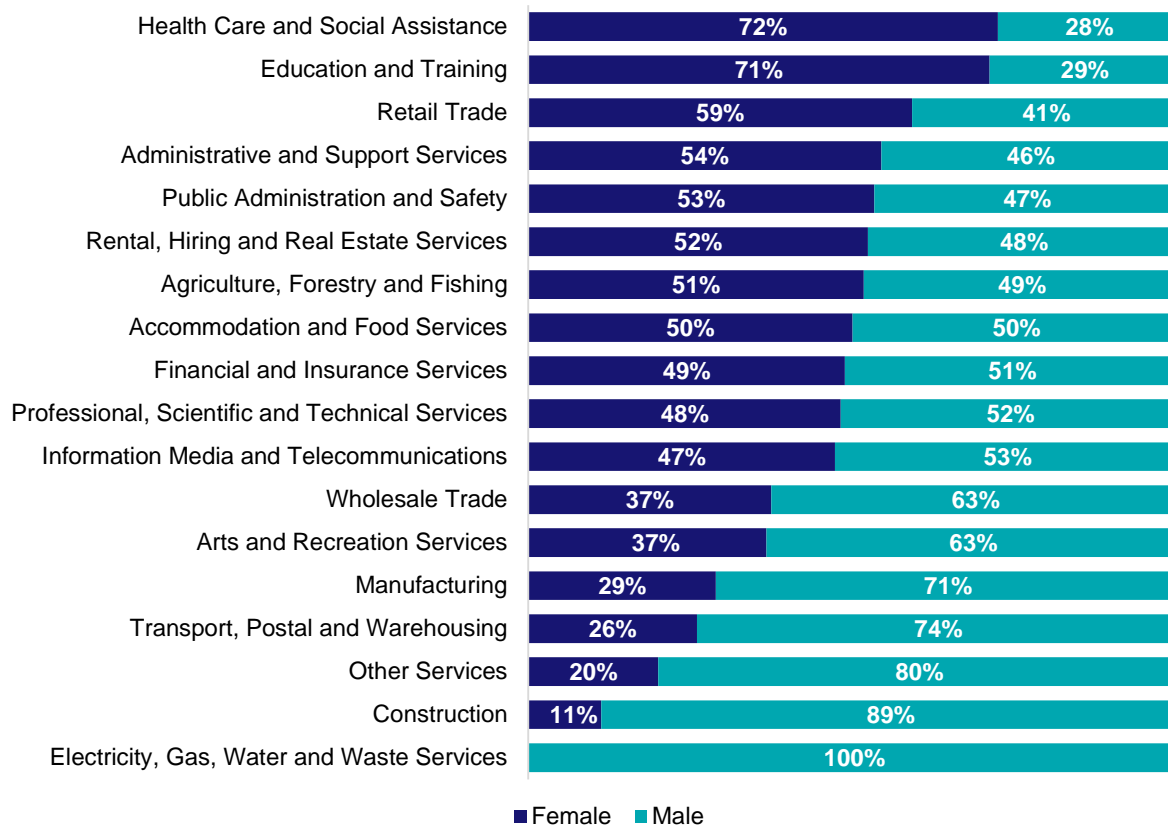

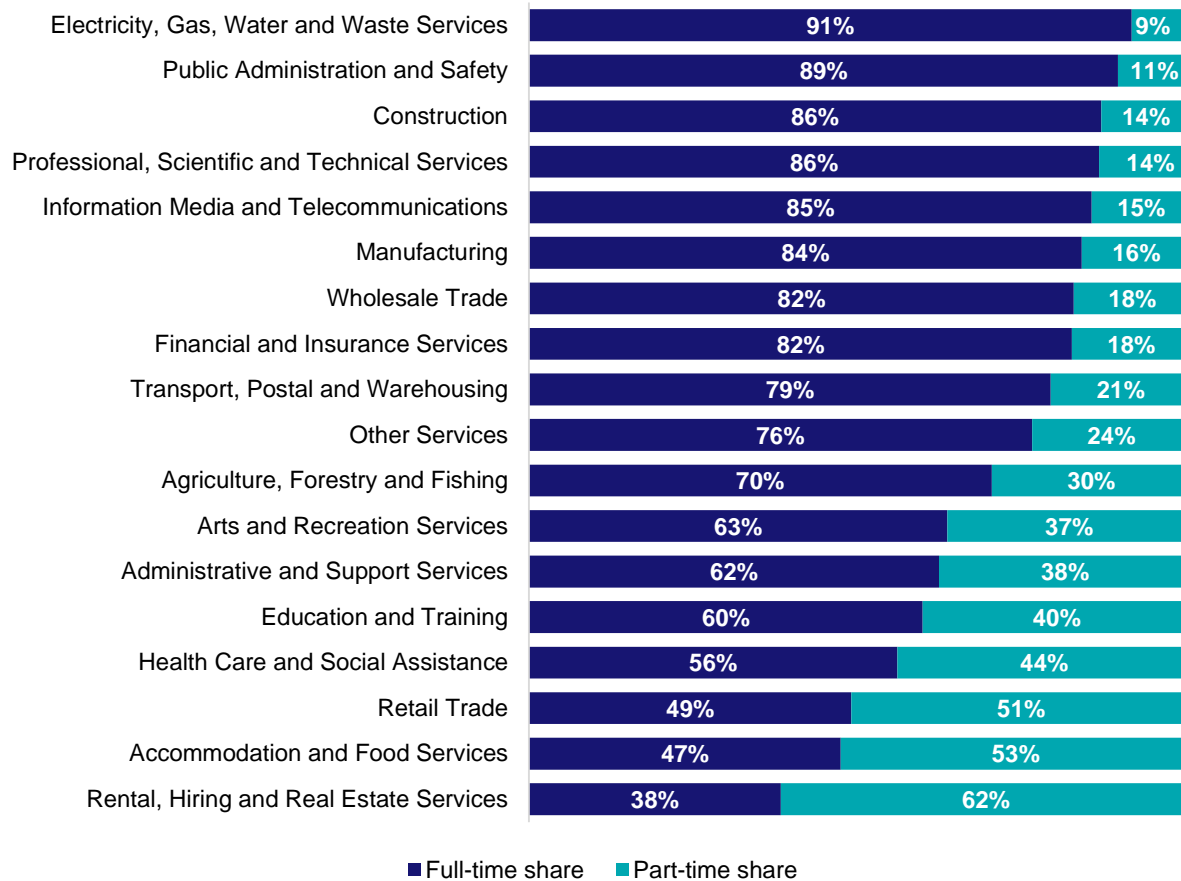

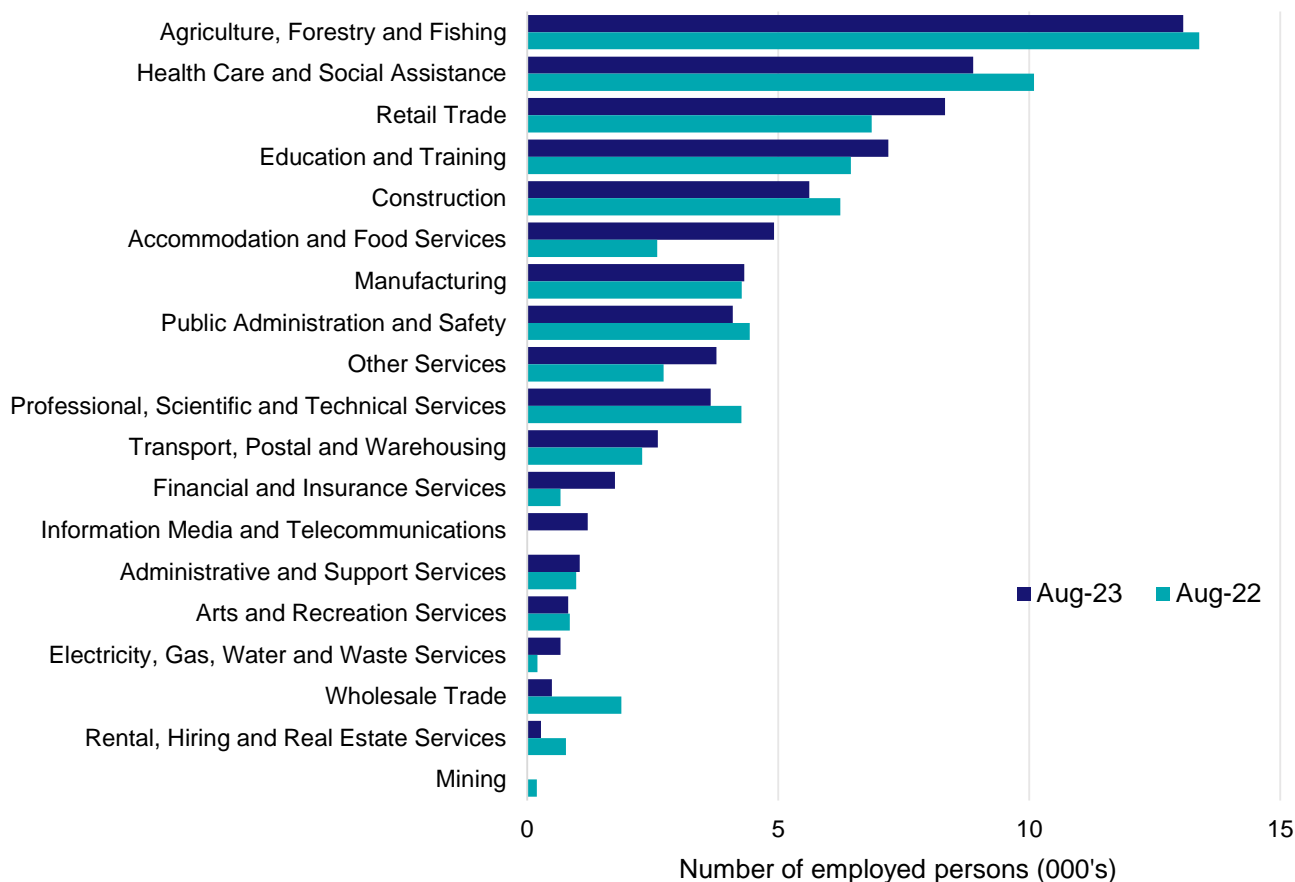

### Employment by industry, August 2023 and August 2022



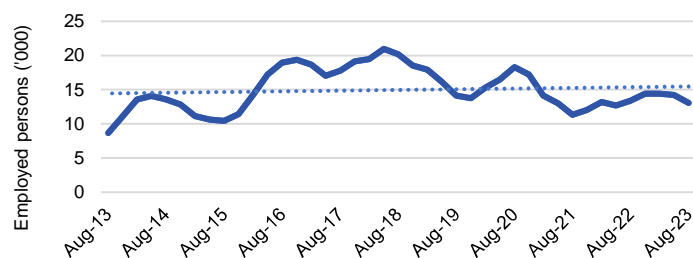

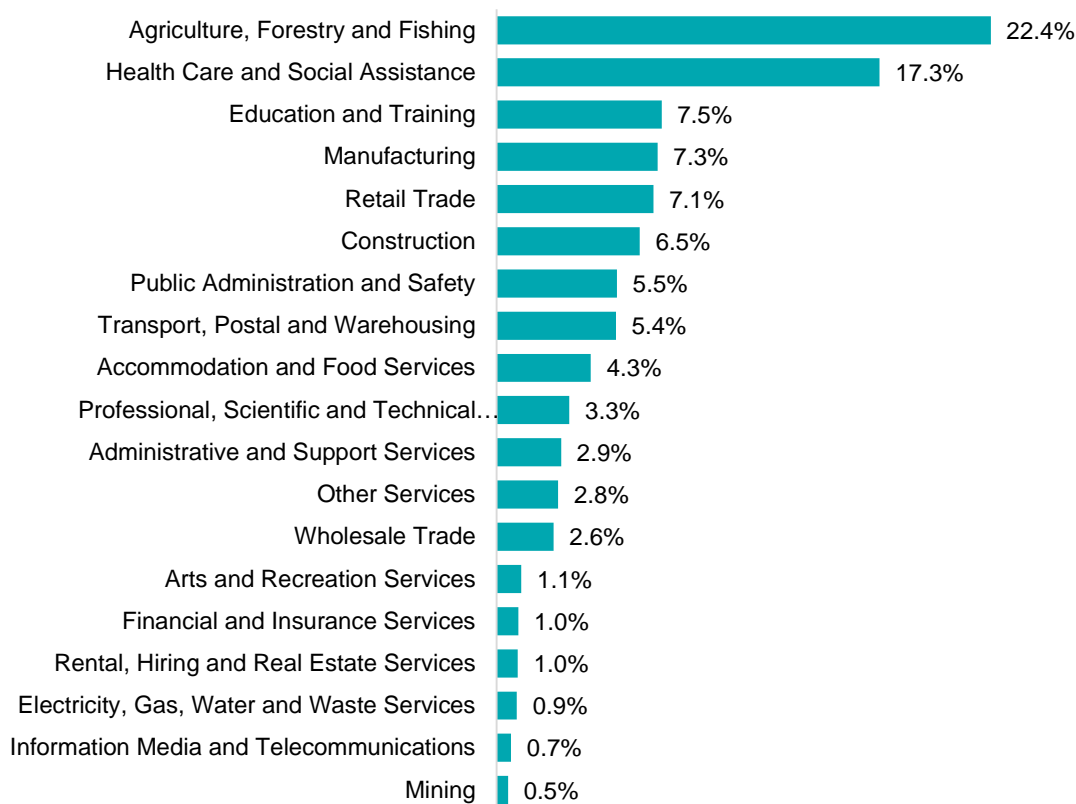

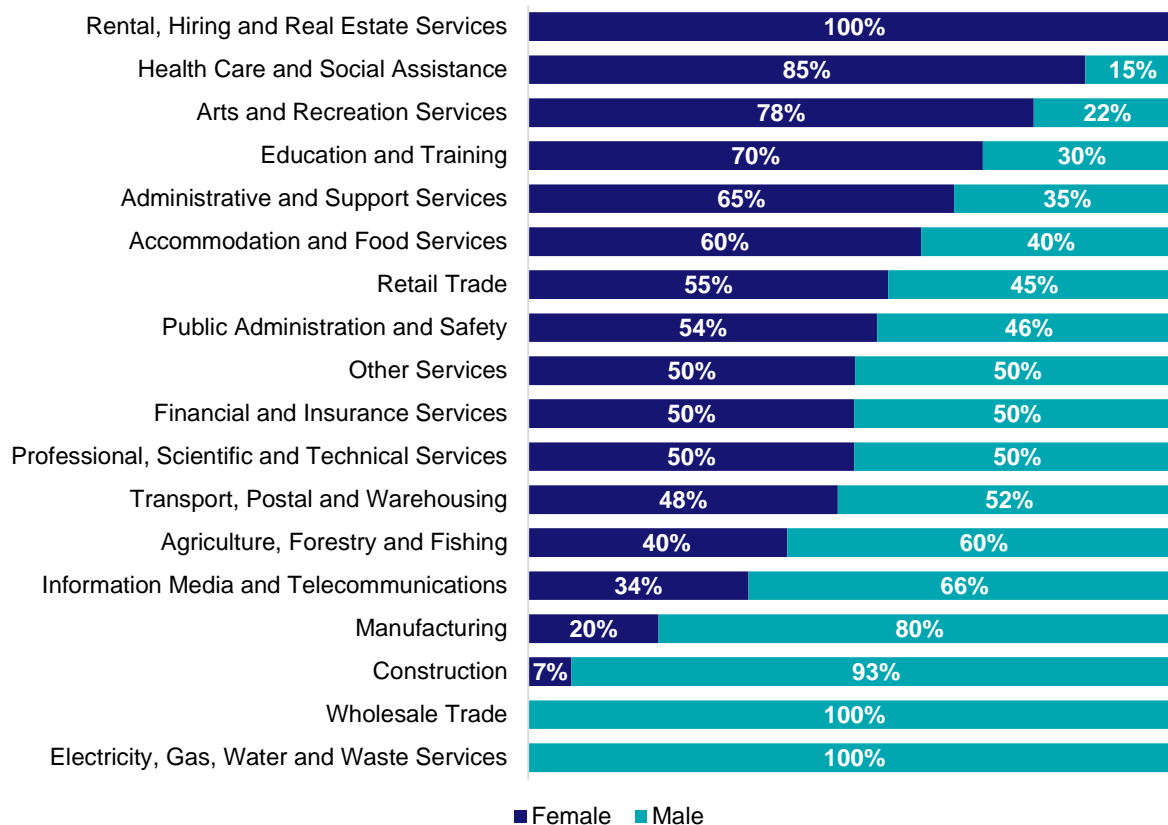
### Which industries are mature age persons (aged 55+) employed in?

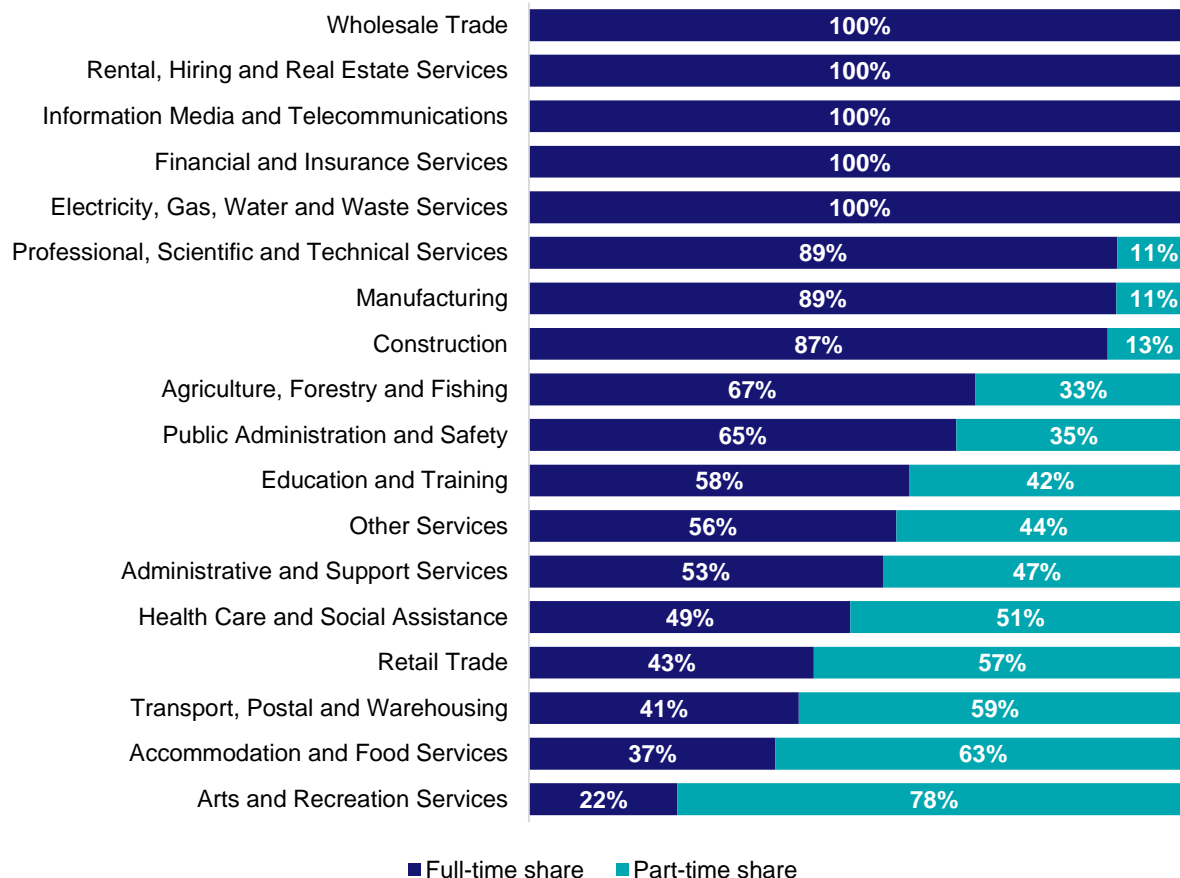


## Gender share by industry

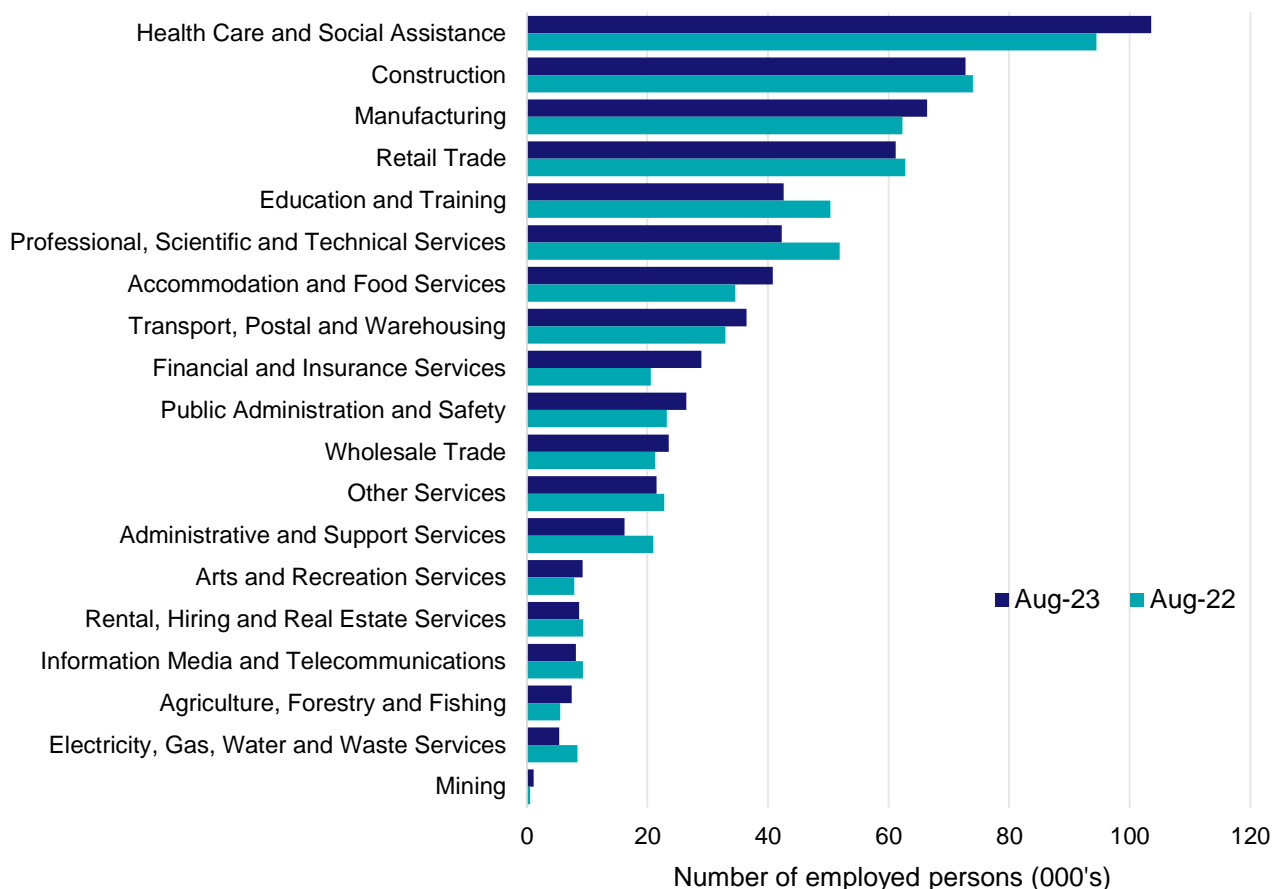

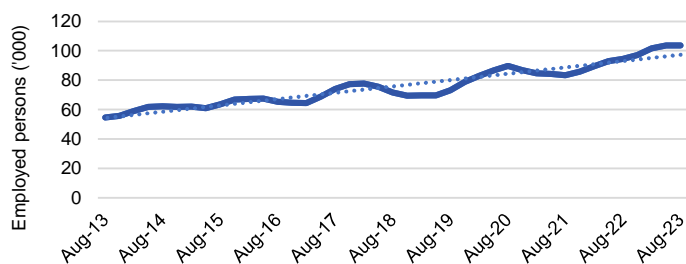

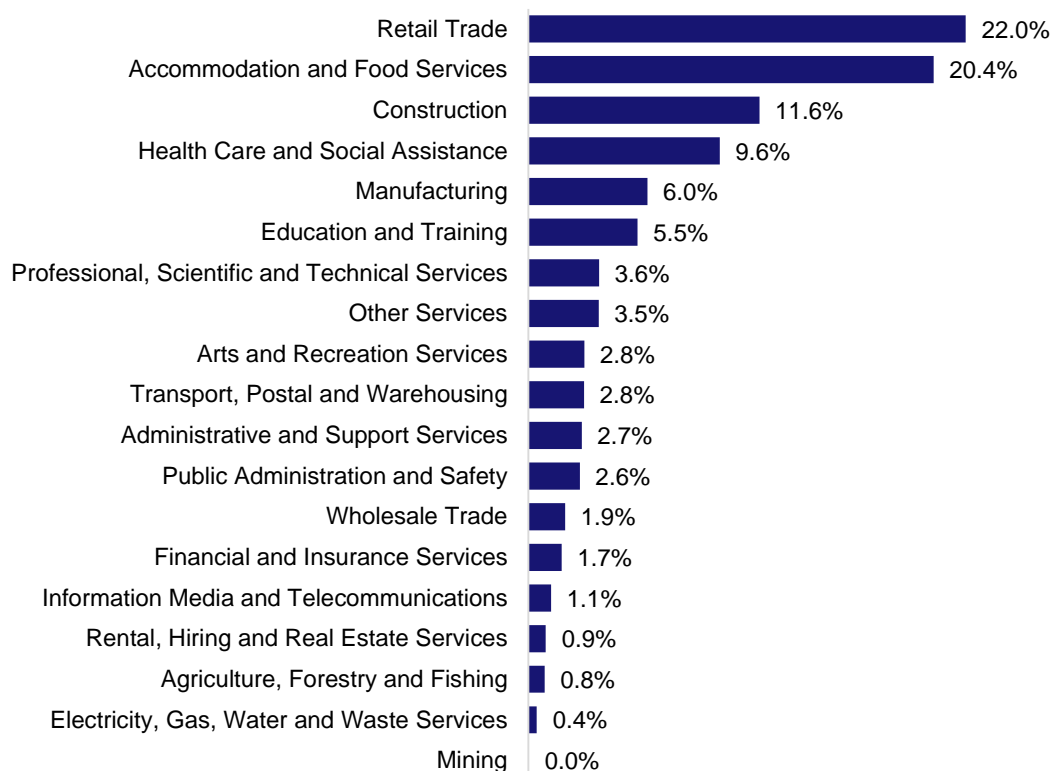

### Which industries are youth (aged 15-24) employed in?



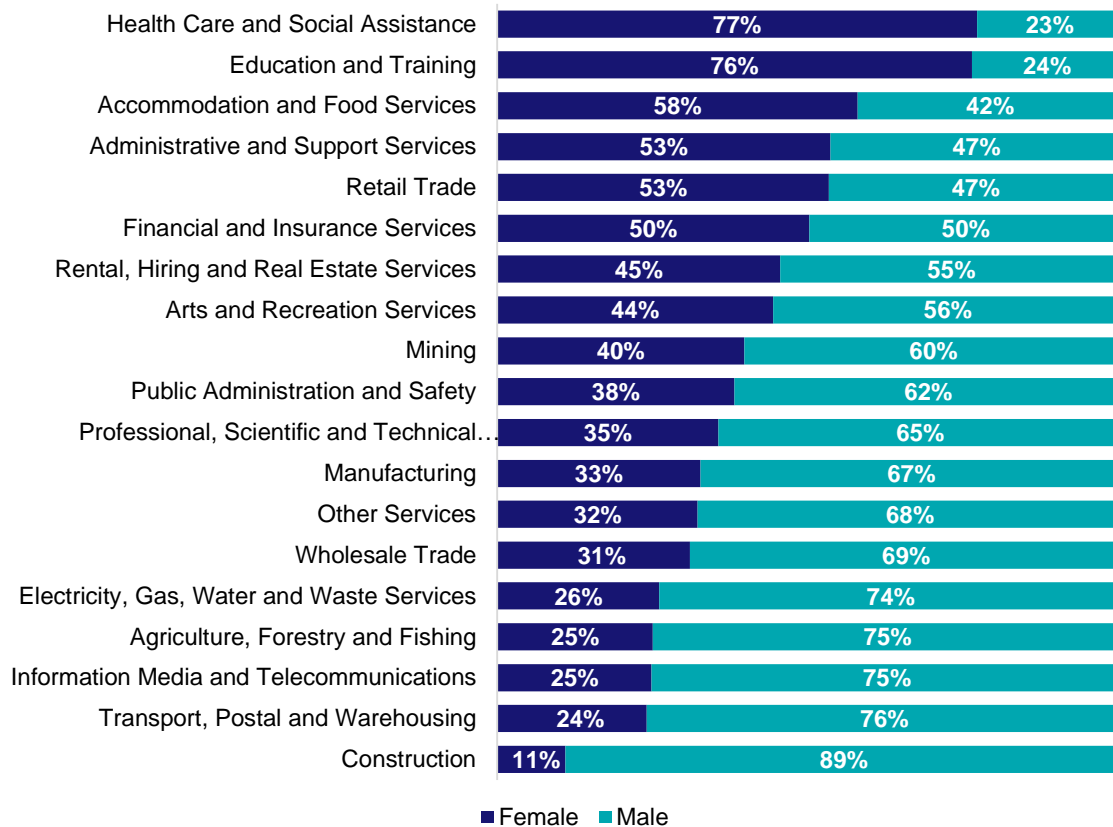

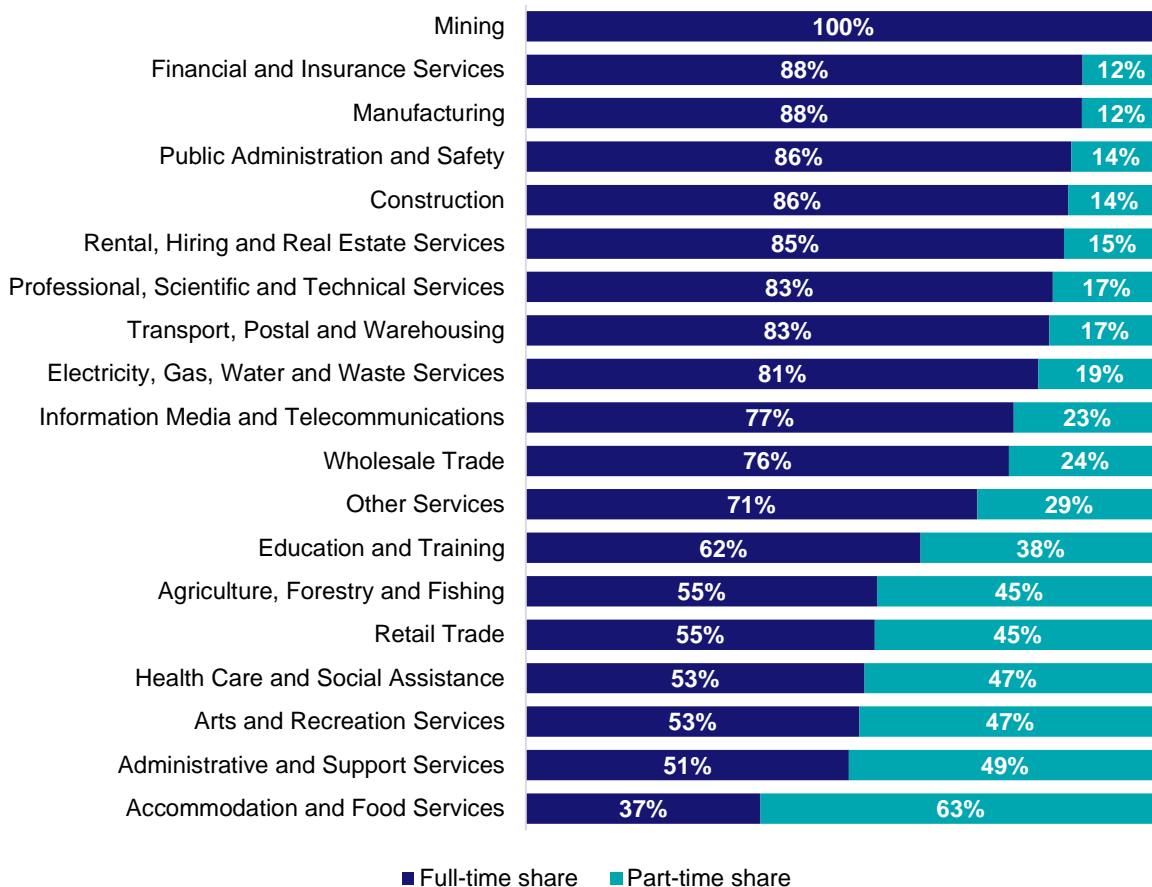

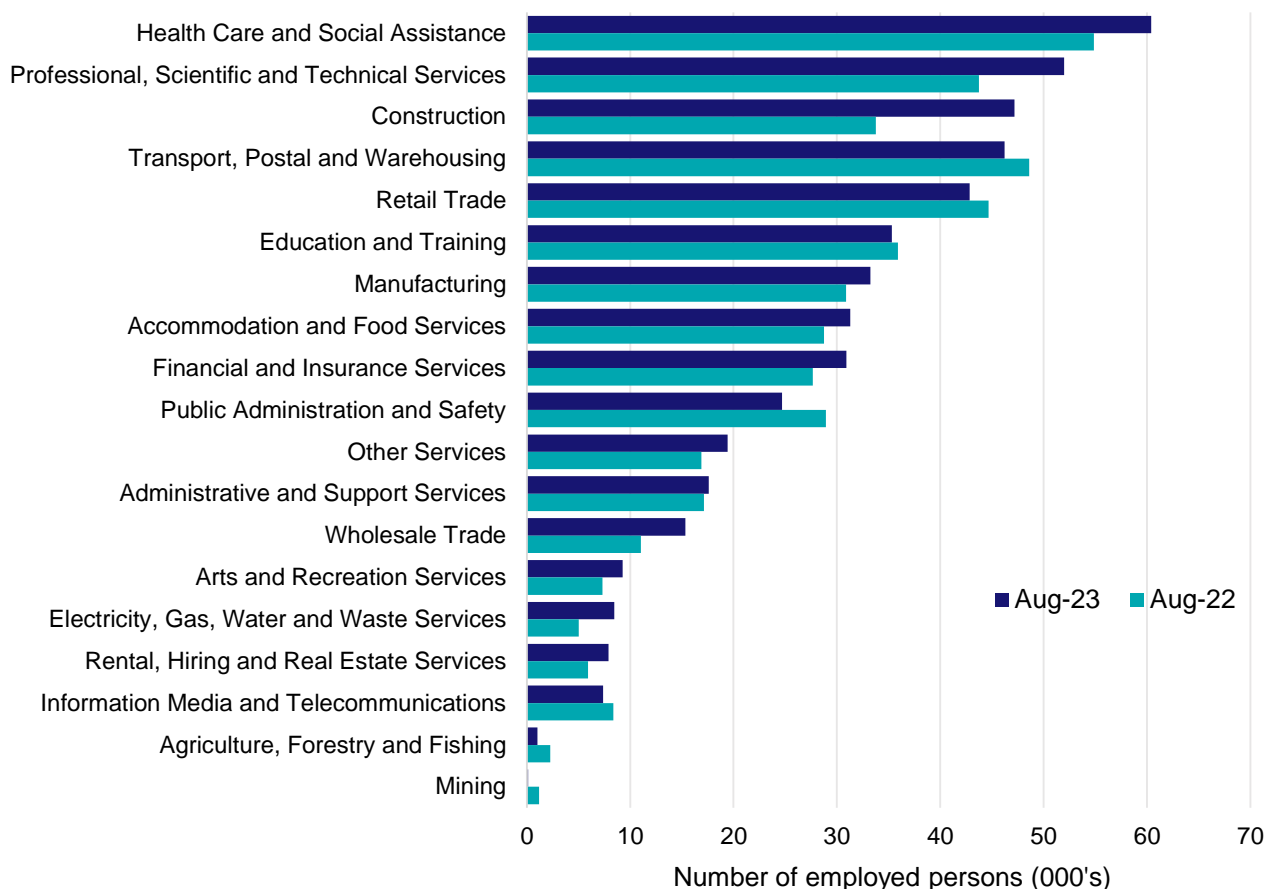

The 5 largest employing industries in the region were Health Care and Social Assistance, Professional, Scientific and Technical Services, Construction, Transport, Postal and Warehousing, and Retail Trade. Together these 5 industries accounted for 51% of employment in the region.

Over the year to August 2023, employment in:

- Health Care and Social Assistance rose by 10.1% to stand at 60,400
- Professional, Scientific and Technical Services rose by 18.8% to stand at 52,000
- Construction rose by 39.7% to stand at 47,200.

In Health Care and Social Assistance in the Western Melbourne Employment Region, 59% of workers were employed full-time; 80% were female; and the median age of the workforce was 39.

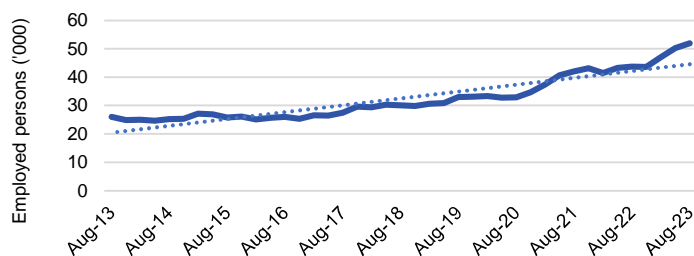

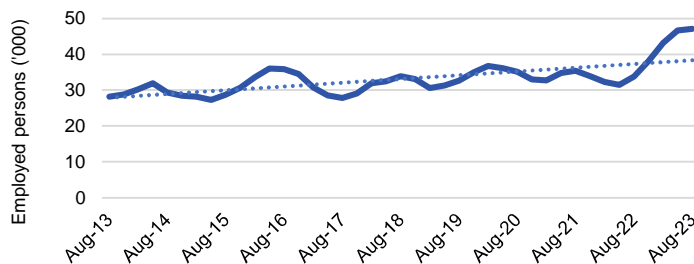

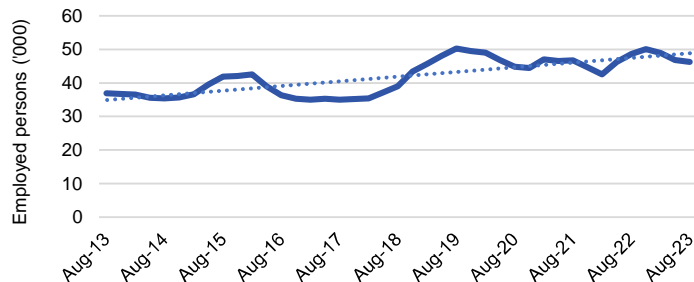

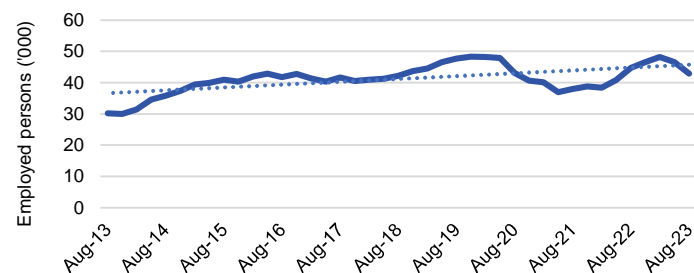

### Which industries are youth (aged 15-24) employed in?



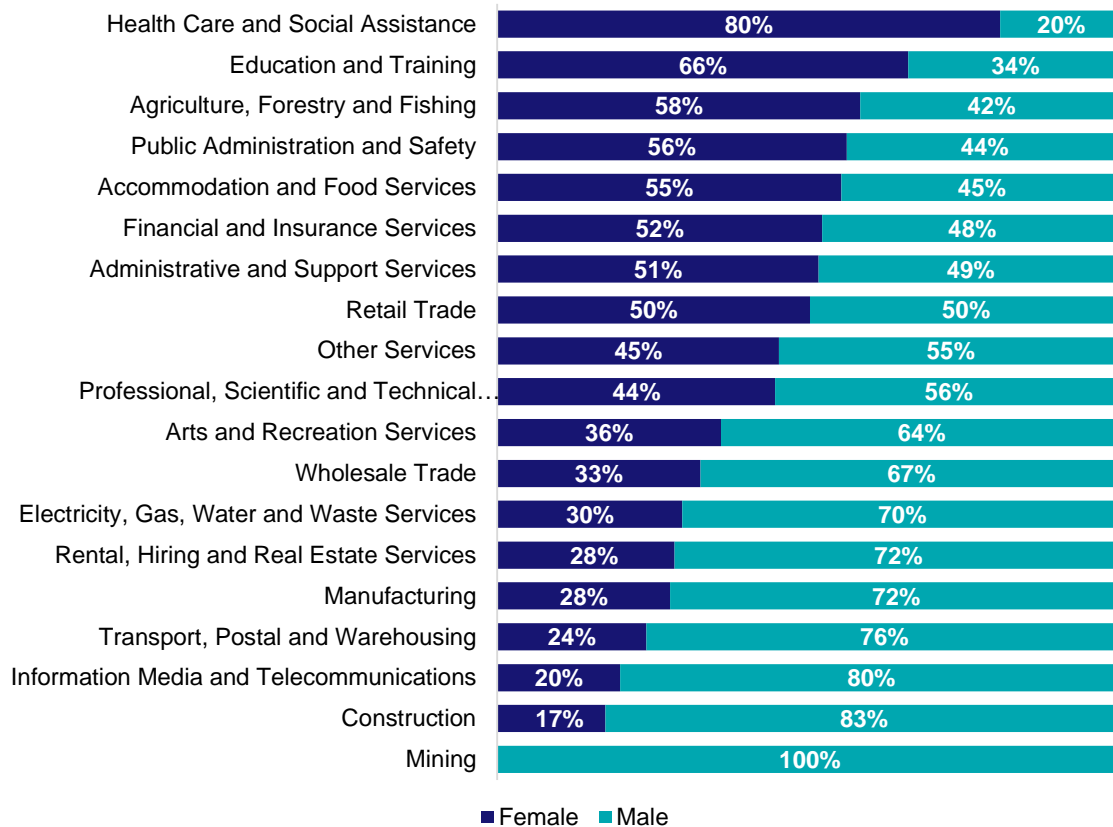

### Which industries are mature age persons (aged 55+) employed in?



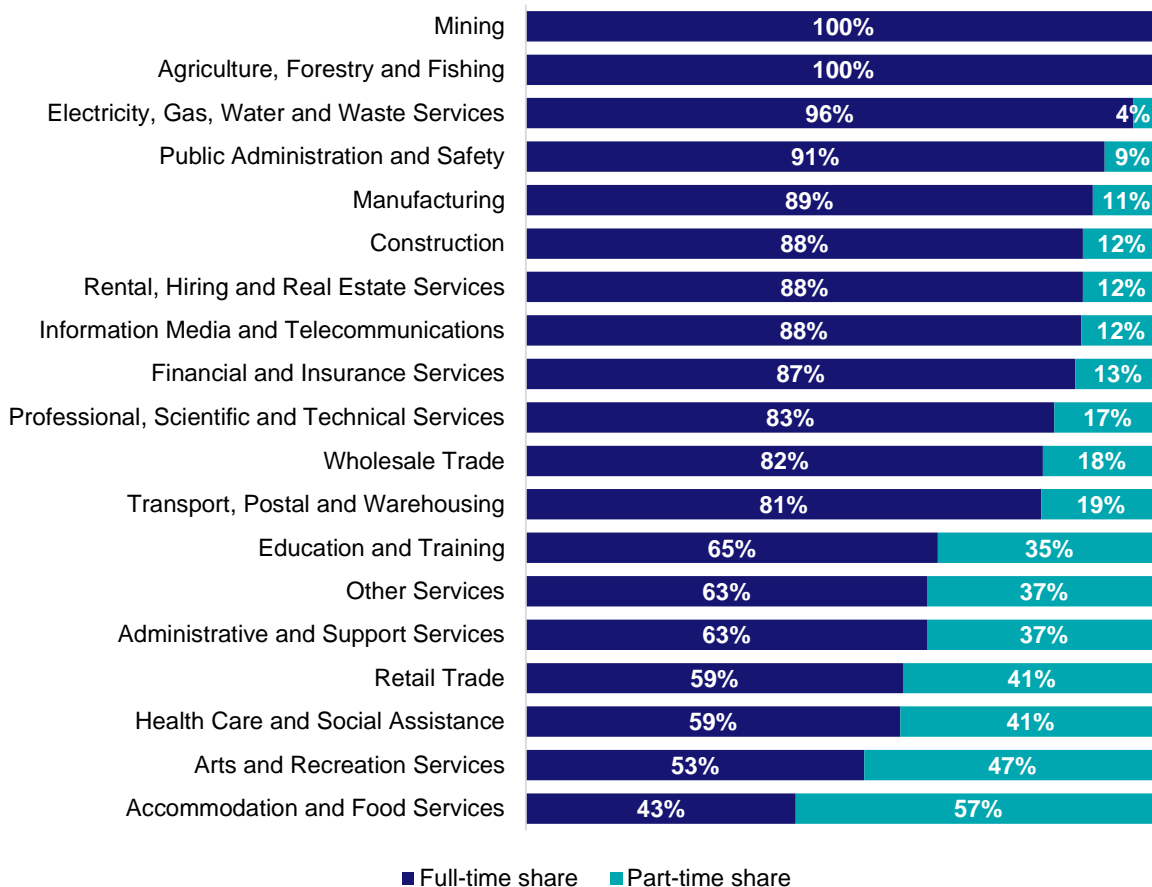

### Overview

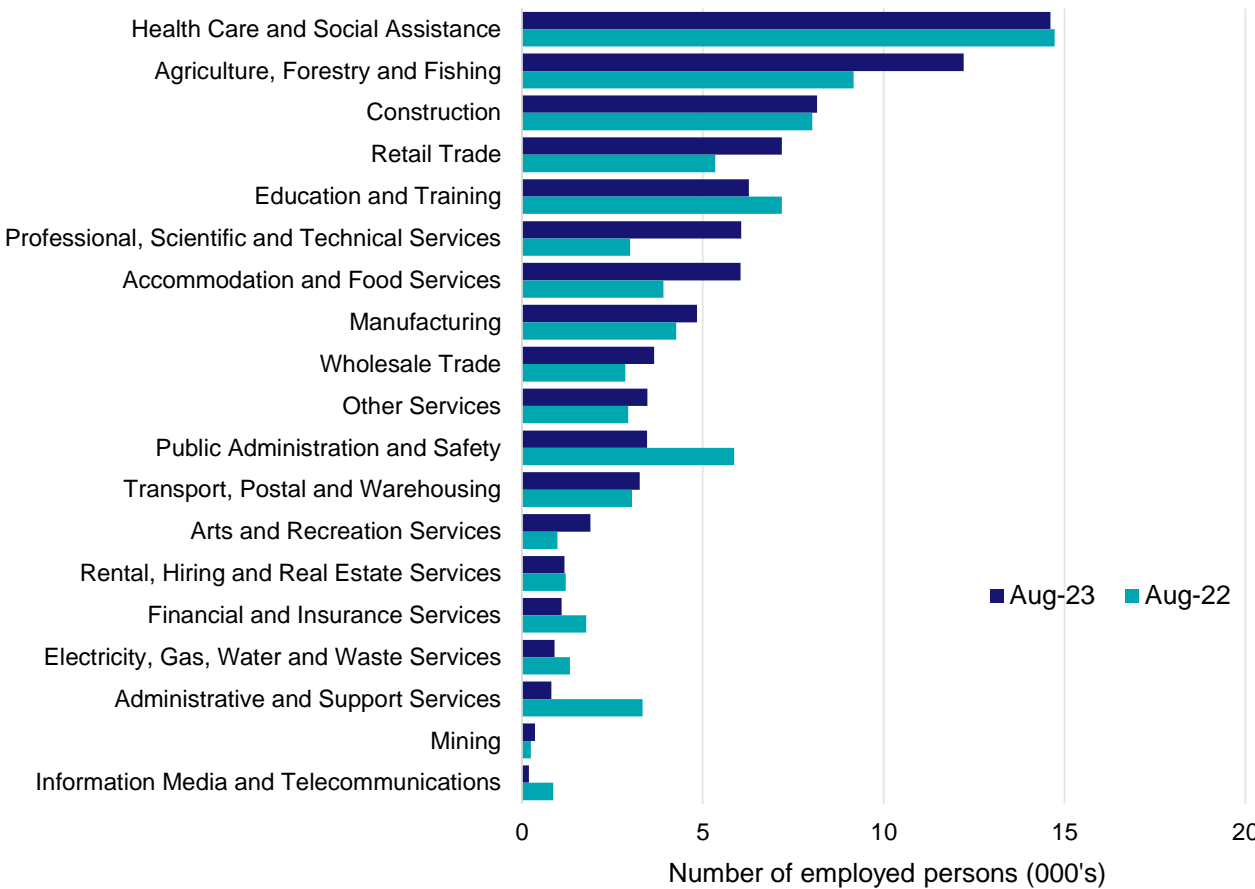
In August 2023, there were around 85,700 people employed in the Wimmera/Mallee Employment Region. The 5 largest employing industries in the region were Health Care and Social Assistance, Agriculture, Forestry and Fishing, Construction, Retail Trade, and Education and Training. Together these 5 industries accounted for 57% of employment in the region.

Over the year to August 2023, employment in:

- Health Care and Social Assistance fell by 0.8% to stand at 14,600
- Agriculture, Forestry and Fishing rose by 33.2% to stand at 12,200
- Construction rose by 1.7% to stand at 8,200.

In Health Care and Social Assistance in the Wimmera/Mallee Employment Region, 67% of workers were employed full-time; 73% were female; and the median age of the workforce was 45.

### Employment by industry, August 2023 and August 2022



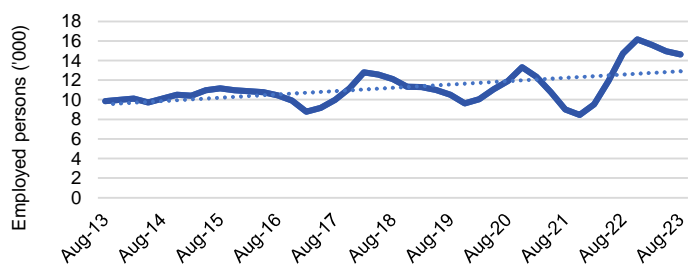

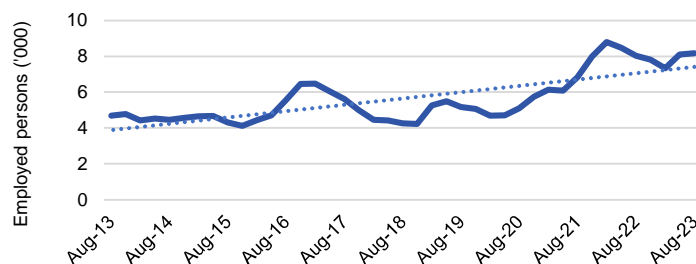

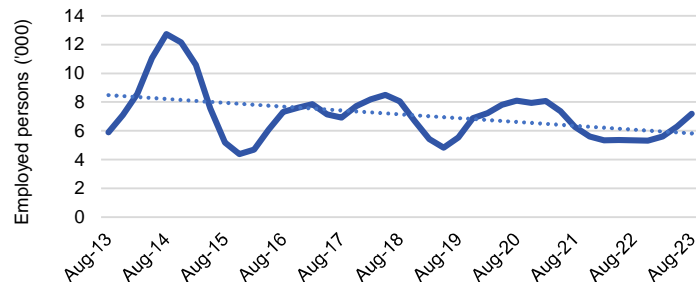

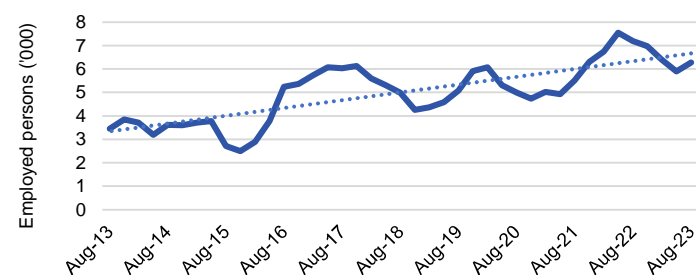

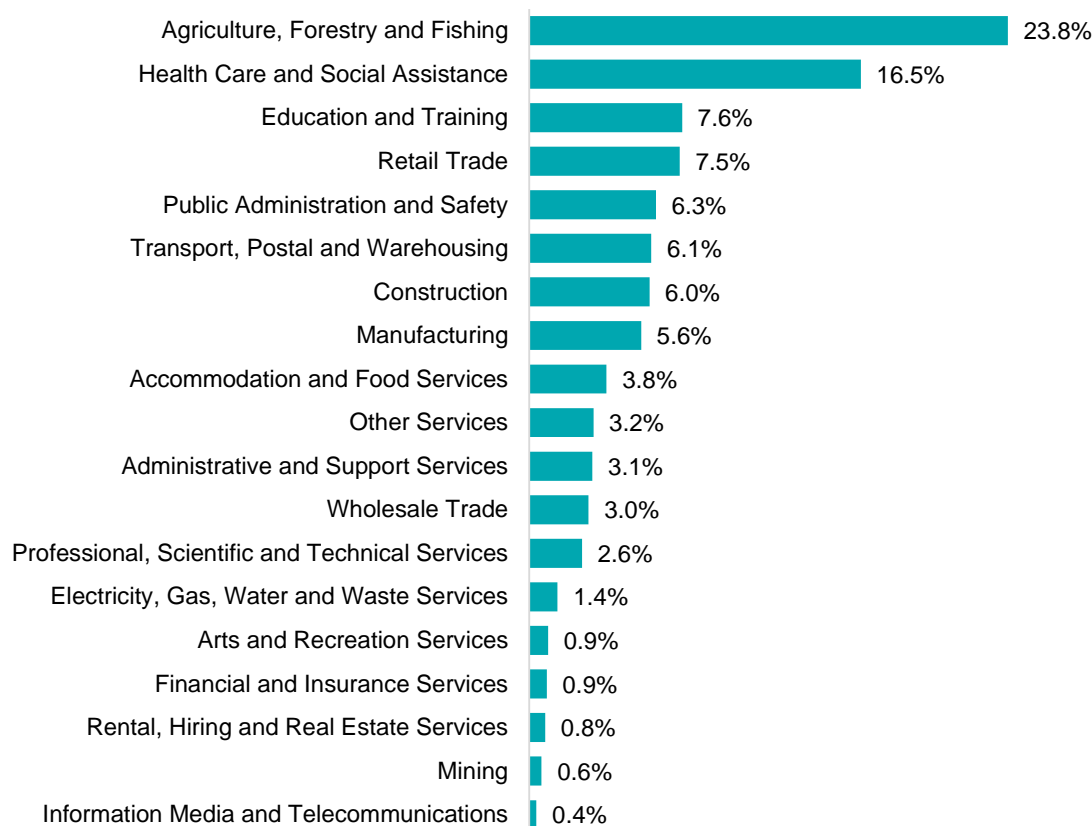

### Which industries are youth (aged 15-24) employed in?



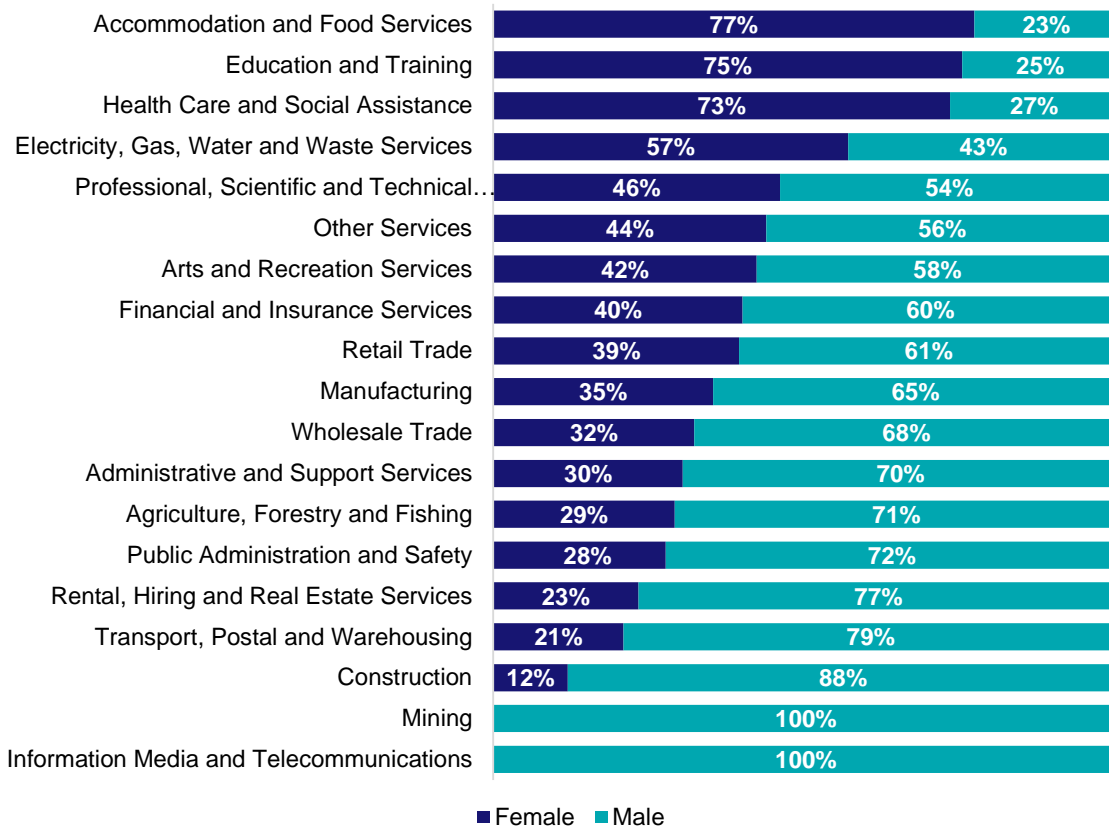

### Which industries are mature age persons (aged 55+) employed in?



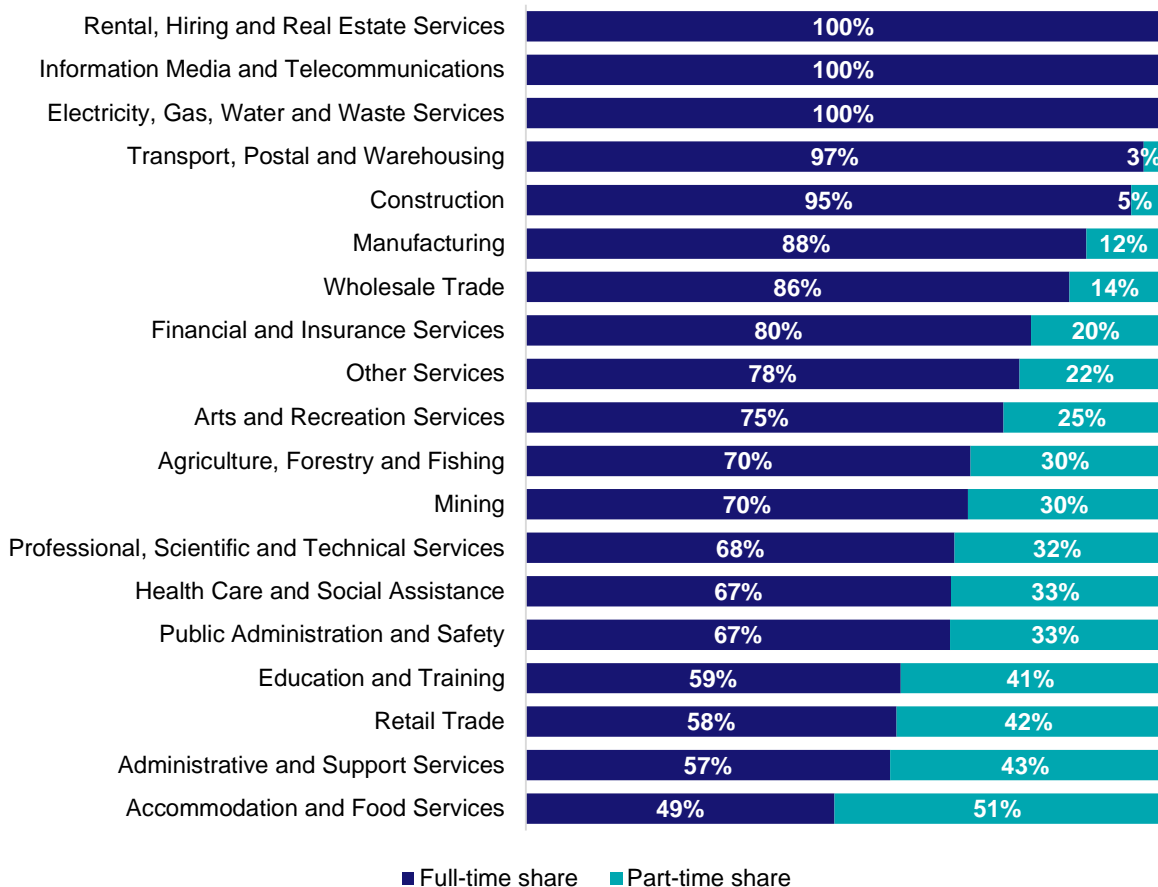
