Overview


In August 2023, there were around 155,600 people employed in the Gippsland Employment Region. The 5 largest employing industries in the region were Health Care and Social Assistance, Construction, Retail Trade, Agriculture, Forestry and Fishing, and Education and Training. Together these 5 industries accounted for 57% of employment in the region.

Over the year to August 2023, employment in:

- Health Care and Social Assistance rose by 14.8% to stand at 25,900
- Construction rose by 159.9% to stand at 20,100
- Retail Trade rose by 10.6% to stand at 16,000.

In Health Care and Social Assistance in the Gippsland Employment Region, 51% of workers were employed full-time; 77% were female; and the median age of the workforce was 45.




Employment characteristics by Industry
