Great Southern - Wheatbelt Employment Region

Overview


In August 2023, there were around 77,300 people employed in the Great Southern - Wheatbelt Employment Region. The 5 largest employing industries in the region were Agriculture, Forestry and Fishing, Manufacturing, Health Care and Social Assistance, Education and Training, and Accommodation and Food Services. Together these 5 industries accounted for 52% of employment in the region.

Over the year to August 2023, employment in:

- Agriculture, Forestry and Fishing fell by 17.1% to stand at 10,700
- Manufacturing rose by 74.1% to stand at 9,100
- Health Care and Social Assistance rose by 12.7% to stand at 8,300.

In Agriculture, Forestry and Fishing in the Great Southern - Wheatbelt Employment Region, 83% of workers were employed full-time; 82% were male; and the median age of the workforce was 50.




