# **New England and North West Employment Region**

#### Overview


In August 2023, there were around 95,700 people employed in the New England and North West Employment Region. The 5 largest employing industries in the region were Agriculture, Forestry and Fishing, Health Care and Social Assistance, Retail Trade, Education and Training, and Construction. Together these 5 industries accounted for 64% of employment in the region.

Over the year to August 2023, employment in:

- Agriculture, Forestry and Fishing rose by 24.1% to stand at 19,300
- Health Care and Social Assistance rose by 3.3% to stand at 16,000
- Retail Trade rose by 115.9% to stand at 11,100.

In Agriculture, Forestry and Fishing in the New England and North West Employment Region, 83% of workers were employed full-time; 75% were male; and the median age of the workforce was 51.





### Which industries are youth (aged 15-24) employed in?





## Which industries are mature age persons (aged 55+) employed in?




