North Eastern Melbourne Employment Region

Overview


In August 2023, there were around 598,900 people employed in the North Eastern Melbourne Employment Region. The 5 largest employing industries in the region were Health Care and Social Assistance, Construction, Retail Trade, Professional, Scientific and Technical Services, and Manufacturing. Together these 5 industries accounted for 57% of employment in the region.

Over the year to August 2023, employment in:

- Health Care and Social Assistance rose by 18.4% to stand at 98,600
- Construction rose by 9.3% to stand at 65,800
- Retail Trade rose by 13.3% to stand at 63,100.

In Health Care and Social Assistance in the North Eastern Melbourne Employment Region, 53% of workers were employed full-time; 79% were female; and the median age of the workforce was 42.




Employment characteristics by Industry
