Perth - South Employment Region

Overview


In August 2023, there were around 621,500 people employed in the Perth - South Employment Region. The 5 largest employing industries in the region were Health Care and Social Assistance, Mining, Construction, Education and Training, and Retail Trade. Together these 5 industries accounted for 51% of employment in the region.

Over the year to August 2023, employment in:

- Health Care and Social Assistance rose by 8.6% to stand at 88,100
- Mining rose by 10.3% to stand at 61,000
- Construction rose by 15.8% to stand at 58,800.

In Health Care and Social Assistance in the Perth - South Employment Region, 56% of workers were employed full-time; 77% were female; and the median age of the workforce was 41.




Employment characteristics by Industry
