# **Employment Region Industry profile**

## **Somerset Employment Region**

#### Overview


In August 2023, there were around 576,000 people employed in the Somerset Employment Region. The 5 largest employing industries in the region were Health Care and Social Assistance, Professional, Scientific and Technical Services, Retail Trade, Construction, and Education and Training. Together these 5 industries accounted for 53% of employment in the region.

Over the year to August 2023, employment in:

- Health Care and Social Assistance fell by 0.2% to stand at 92,200
- Professional, Scientific and Technical Services fell by 7.7% to stand at 63,300
- Retail Trade rose by 2.4% to stand at 54,900.

In Health Care and Social Assistance in the Somerset Employment Region, 61% of workers were employed full-time; 76% were female; and the median age of the workforce was 40.




