South West WA Employment Region

Overview


In August 2023, there were around 111,100 people employed in the South West WA Employment Region. The 5 largest employing industries in the region were Health Care and Social Assistance, Mining, Construction, Retail Trade, and Education and Training. Together these 5 industries accounted for 51% of employment in the region.

Over the year to August 2023, employment in:

- Health Care and Social Assistance rose by 13.4% to stand at 13,900
- Mining rose by 17.8% to stand at 12,600
- Construction rose by 15.6% to stand at 11,600.

In Health Care and Social Assistance in the South West WA Employment Region, 51% of workers were employed full-time; 85% were female; and the median age of the workforce was 46.




