Overview


In August 2023, there were around 300,400 people employed in the Wivenhoe Employment Region. The 5 largest employing industries in the region were Health Care and Social Assistance, Education and Training, Professional, Scientific and Technical Services, Manufacturing, and Retail Trade. Together these 5 industries accounted for 52% of employment in the region.

Over the year to August 2023, employment in:

- Health Care and Social Assistance rose by 8.1% to stand at 46,500
- Education and Training fell by 2.7% to stand at 29,700
- Professional, Scientific and Technical Services rose by 16.9% to stand at 28,400.

In Health Care and Social Assistance in the Wivenhoe Employment Region, 61% of workers were employed full-time; 73% were female; and the median age of the workforce was 41.




Employment characteristics by Industry
