





# Insights from the Recruitment Experiences and Outlook Survey

Mid North SA

Information on this page is based on the Recruitment Experiences and Outlook Survey, which is an ongoing survey of employers across Australia run by JSA. The survey collects insights on a range of topics, including recruitment activity, recruitment difficulty and employers' future staffing expectations. Data are for the year to September 2023, unless otherwise indicated.


#### **Recruitment activity and experiences**

In Mid North SA, there were 136 responding employers in the 12 months to September 2023, of whom 55% were recruiting or had recruited in the past month. Of these recruiting businesses, 60% had difficulty recruiting. By comparison, 51% of employers were recruiting in Rest of SA over the same period, of whom 61% had difficulty recruiting.

Employers in Mid North SA were most likely to report the following reasons for recruitment difficulty:


- · Lack of applicants
- Location, eg remote or regional
- · Lack of suitable applicants
- Applicants lack technical skills.

A chart showing reasons for recruitment for Mid North SA and Rest of SA is included to the right.






- Newly created positions only

Due to small sample sizes for regional data, caution should be exercised interpreting these results. Unweighted data are used for Mid North SA, while weighted data are used for Rest of SA. Number of responses for each item varies depending on whether employers recruited or not. Reasons for recruitment difficulty data are only available for employers who have completed recruitment.
