# Industry profile

## Tasmania

Release date: 24 April 2024

### Overview

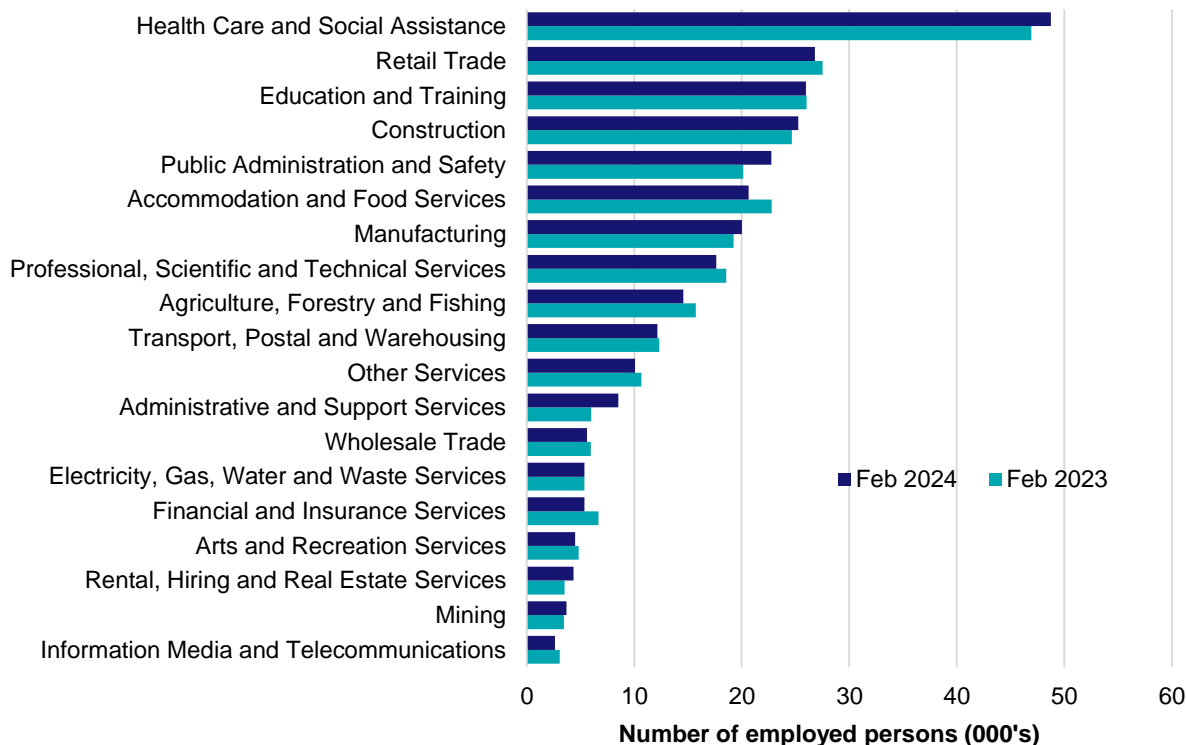
In February 2024, there were around 284,700 people employed in Tasmania. The 5 largest employing industries in Tasmania were Health Care and Social Assistance, Retail Trade, Education and Training, Construction and Public Administration and Safety. Together these 5 industries accounted for 53% of all employment.

Over the year to February 2024, employment in:

- Health Care and Social Assistance rose by 3.9% to stand at 48,800
- Retail Trade fell by 2.5% to stand at 26,800
- Education and Training fell by 0.3% to stand at 26,000.

In Health Care and Social Assistance in Tasmania, 50% of workers were employed part-time; 80% were Female; and the median age of the workforce was 43. Around 48% of employed persons in this industry were located in Greater Hobart.

### Employment by industry, February 2024 and February 2023

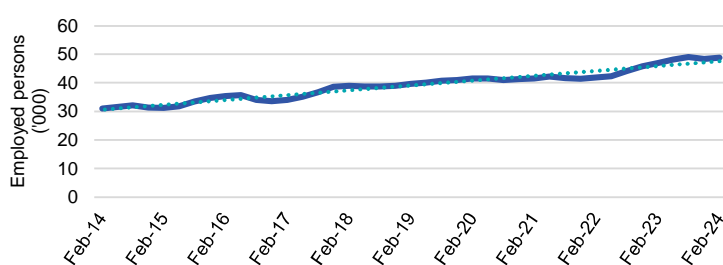

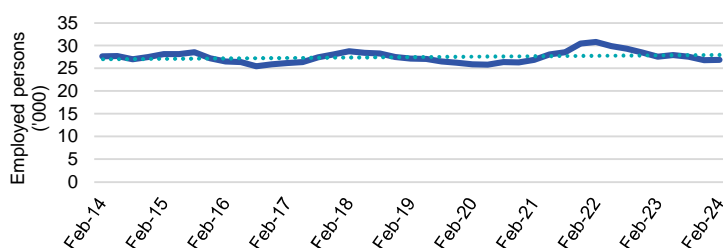

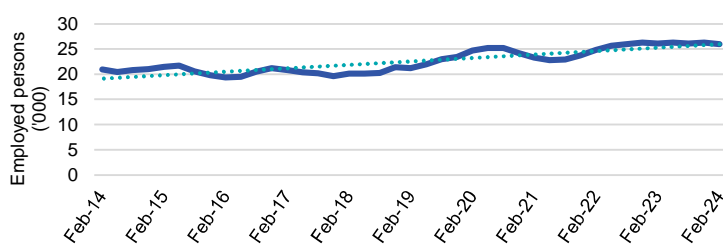

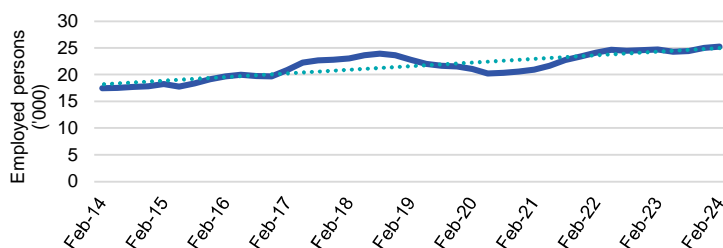

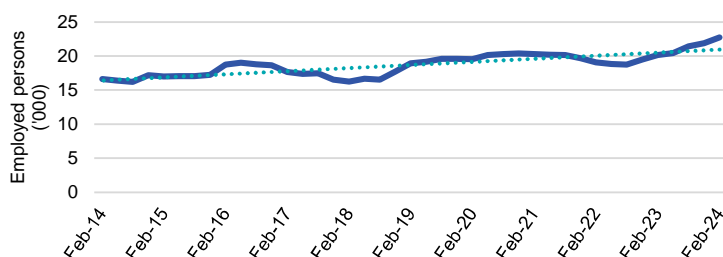

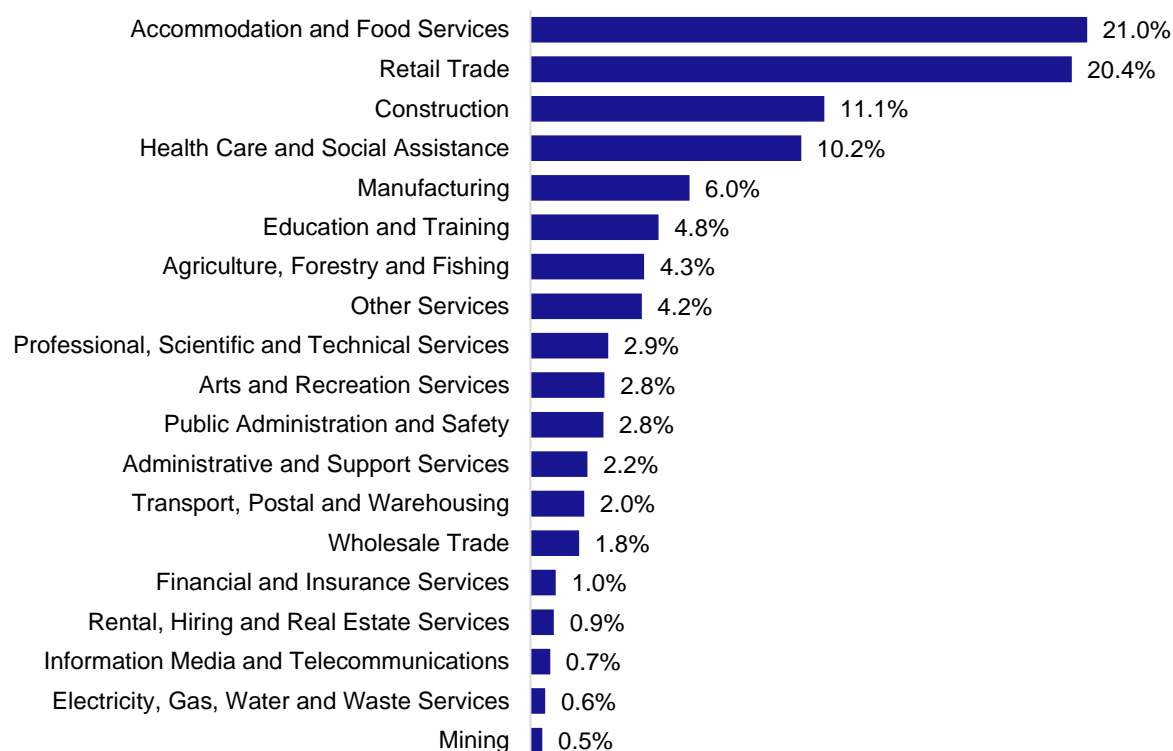

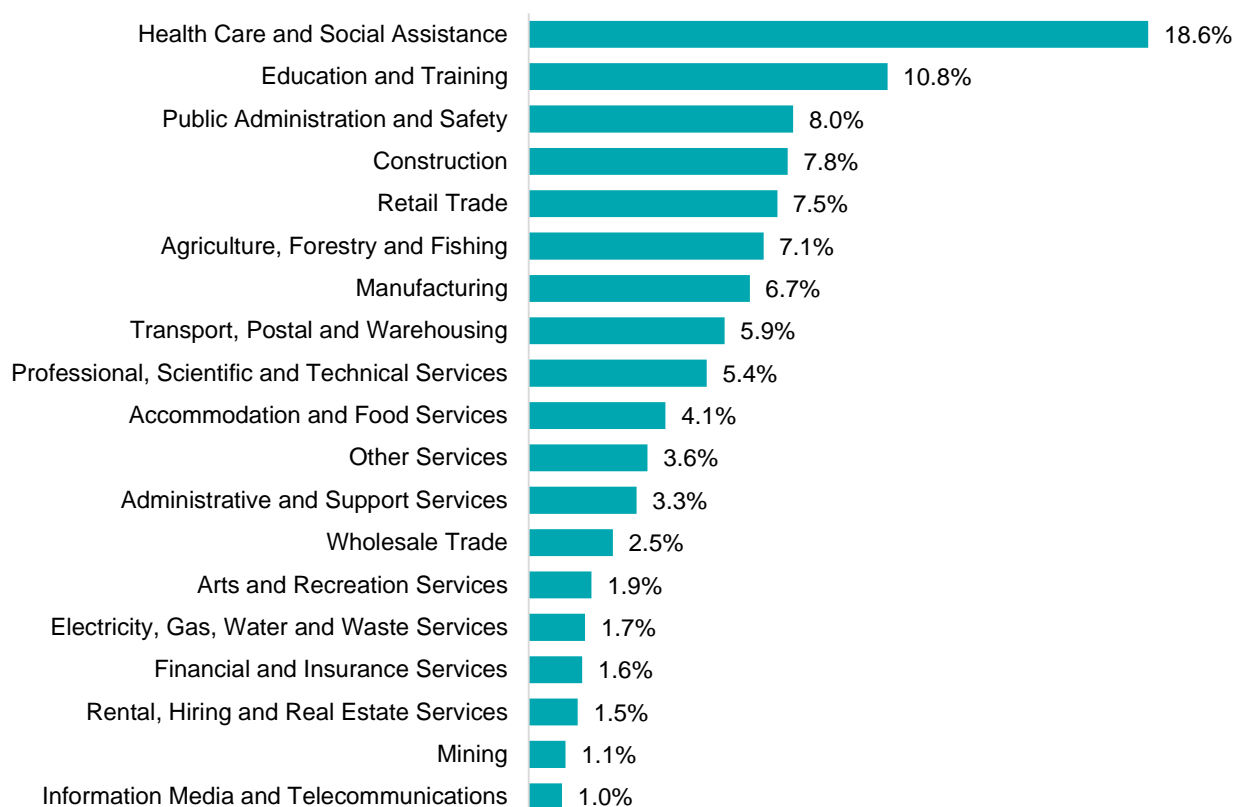

### Which industries are youth (aged 15-24) employed in?



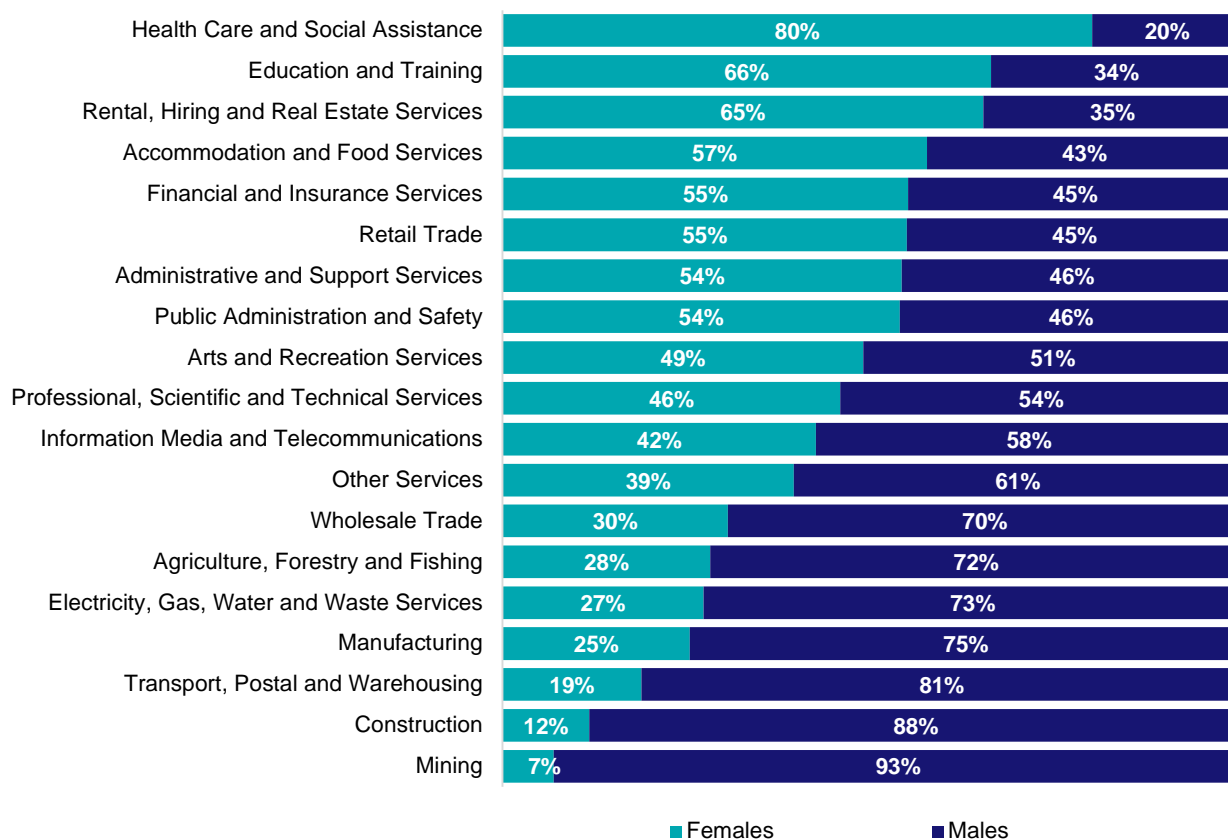

### Which industries are mature age persons (aged 55+) employed in?



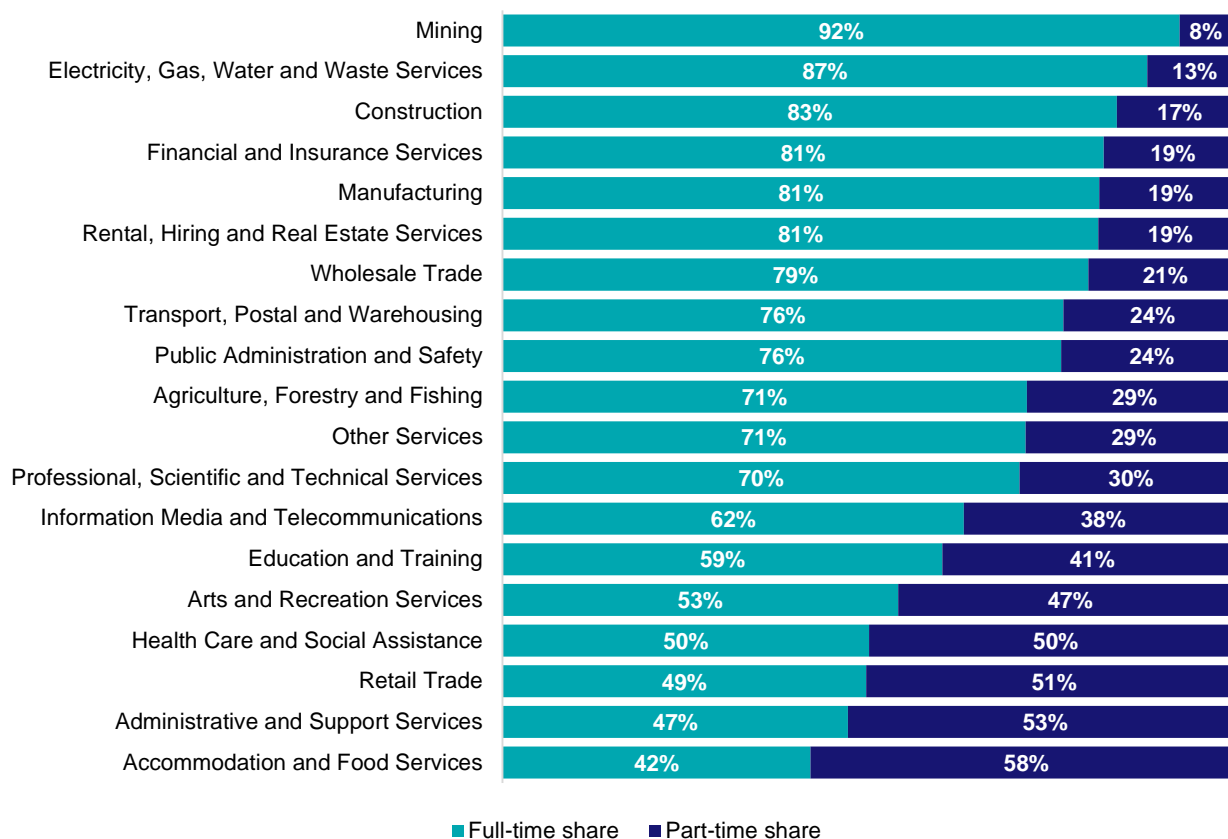

# Employment Region Industry profile

## Hobart and Southern Tasmania Employment Region

Release date: 24 April 2024

### Overview

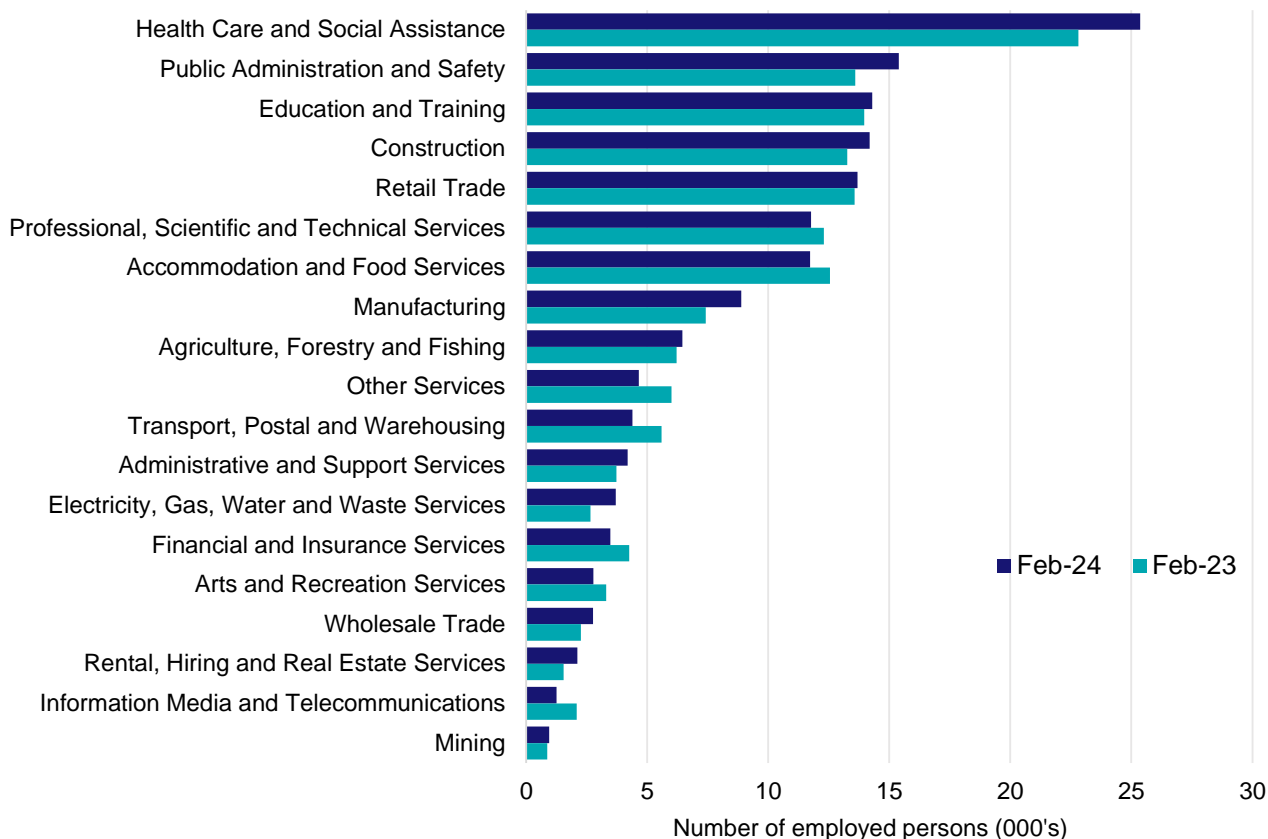
In February 2024, there were around 152,100 people employed in the Hobart and Southern Tasmania Employment Region. The 5 largest employing industries in the region were Health Care and Social Assistance, Public Administration and Safety, Education and Training, Construction, and Retail Trade. Together these 5 industries accounted for 55% of employment in the region.

Over the year to February 2024, employment in:

- Health Care and Social Assistance rose by 11.2% to stand at 25,400
- Public Administration and Safety rose by 13.2% to stand at 15,400
- Education and Training rose by 2.3% to stand at 14,300.

In Health Care and Social Assistance in the Hobart and Southern Tasmania Employment Region, 51% of workers were employed part-time; 79% were female; and the median age of the workforce was 41.

### Employment by industry, February 2024 and February 2023



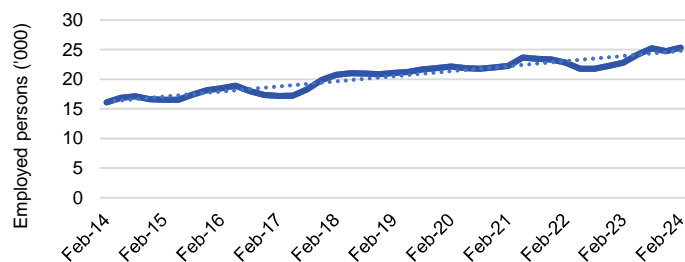

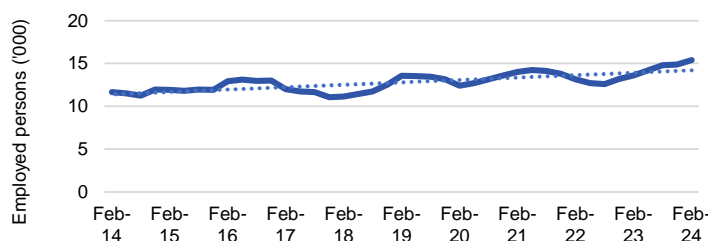

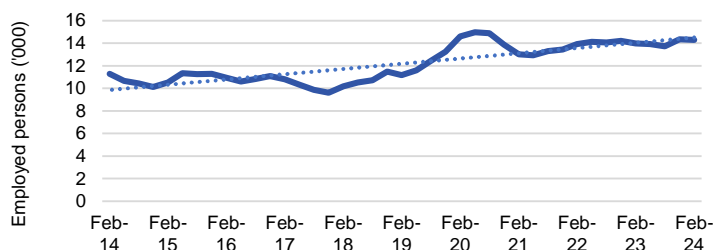

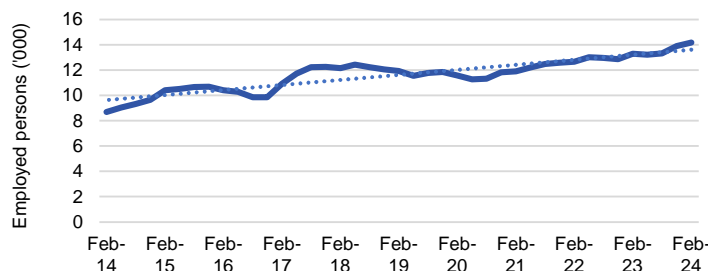

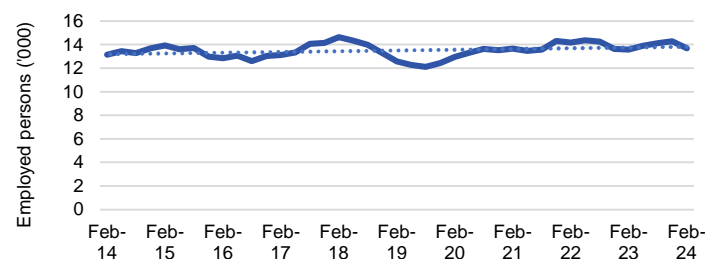

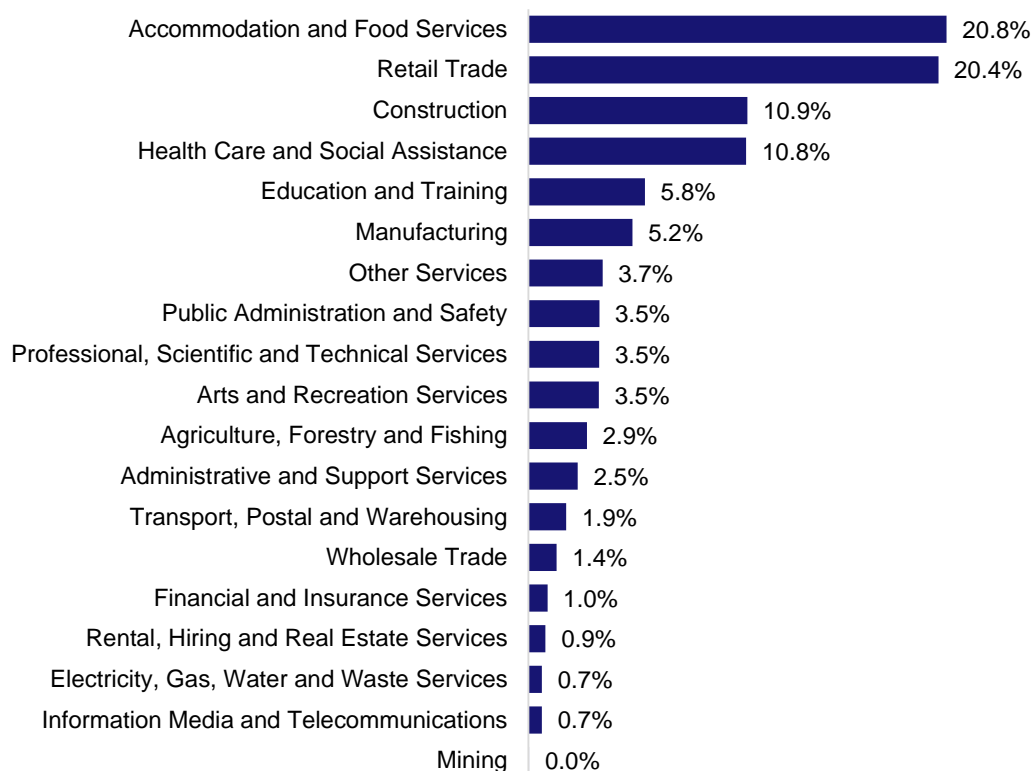

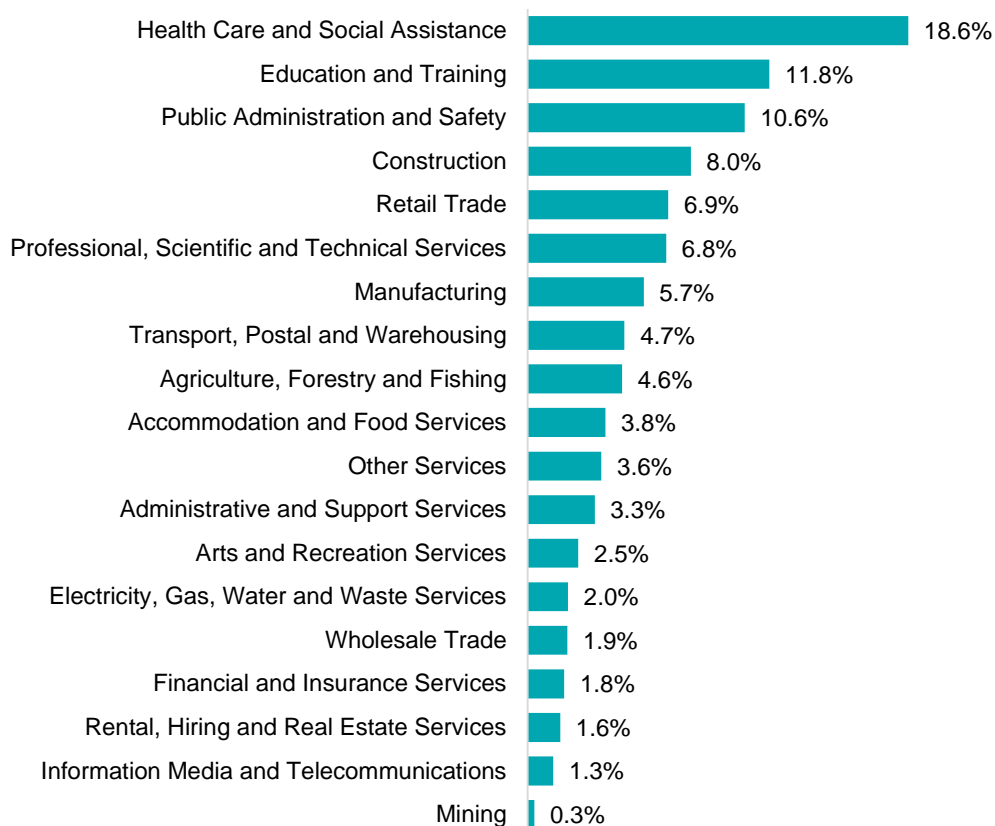

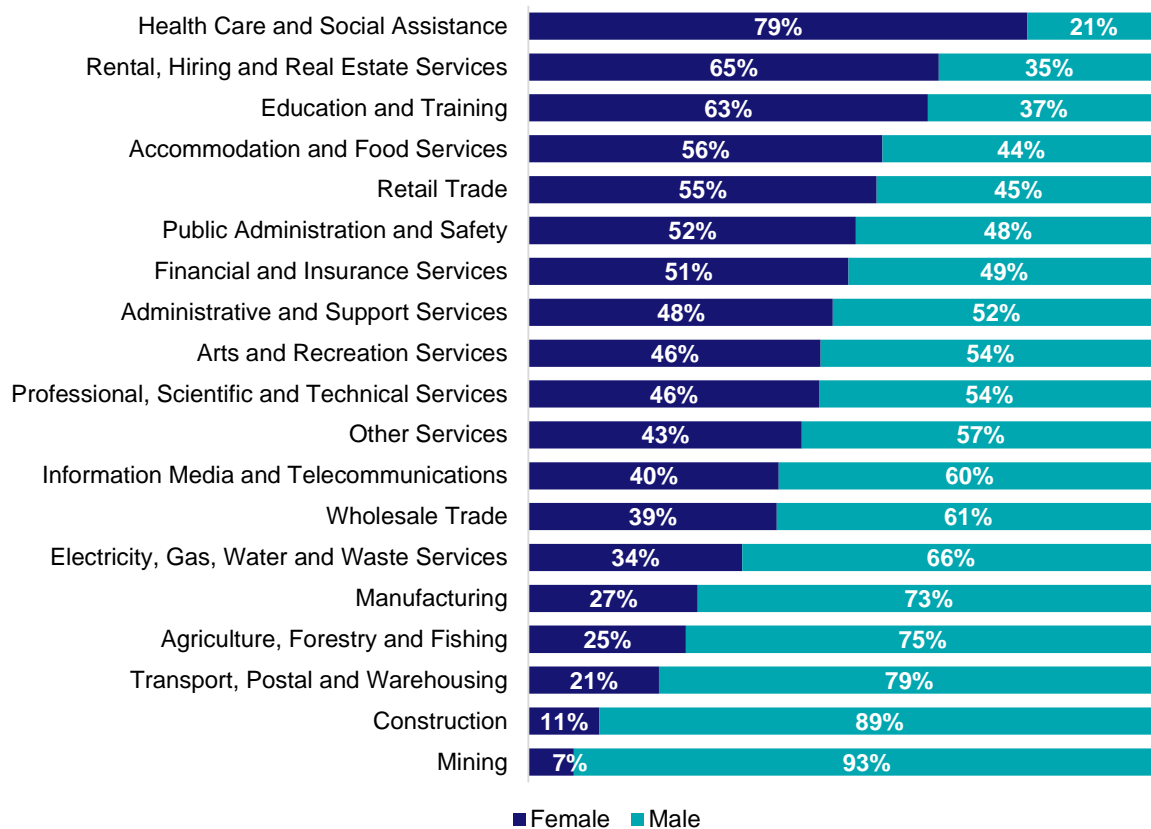
### Which industries are mature age persons (aged 55+) employed in?

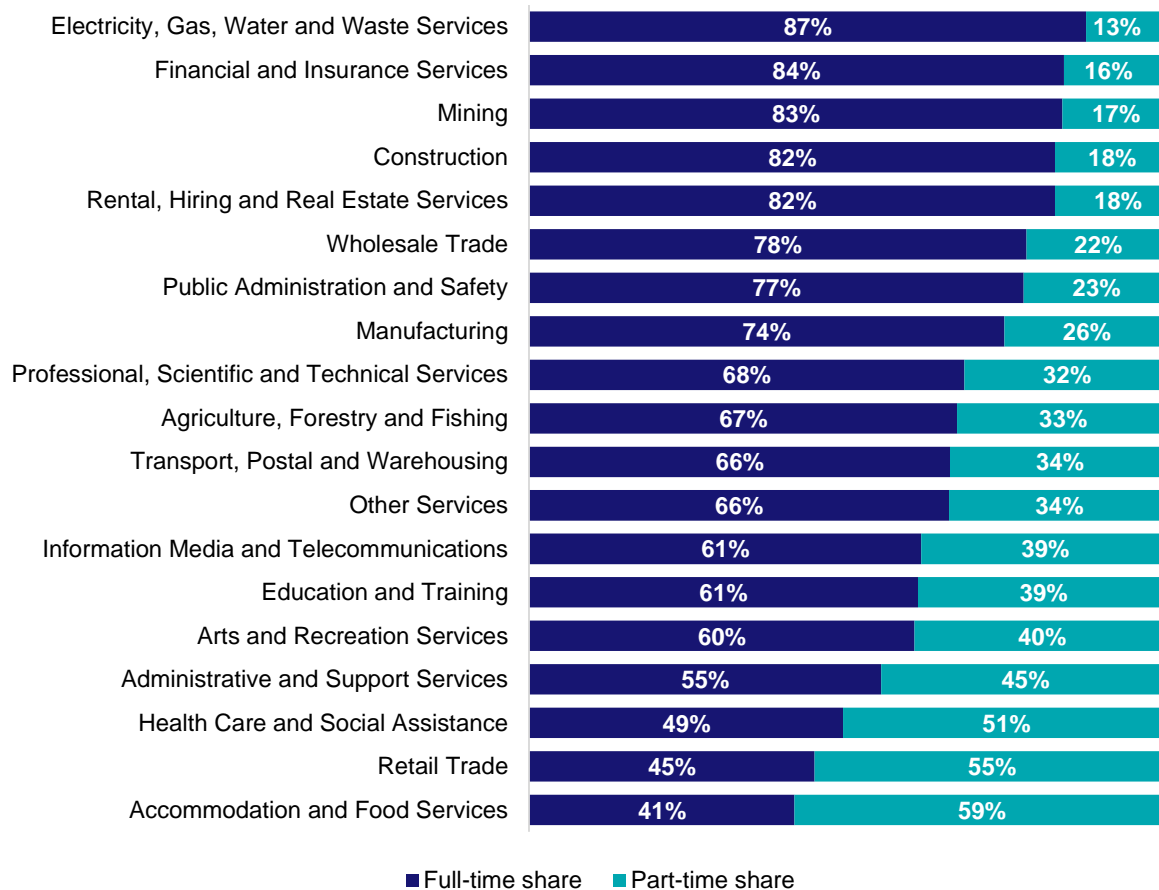


## Gender share by industry

## North and North Western Tasmania Employment Region

### Overview

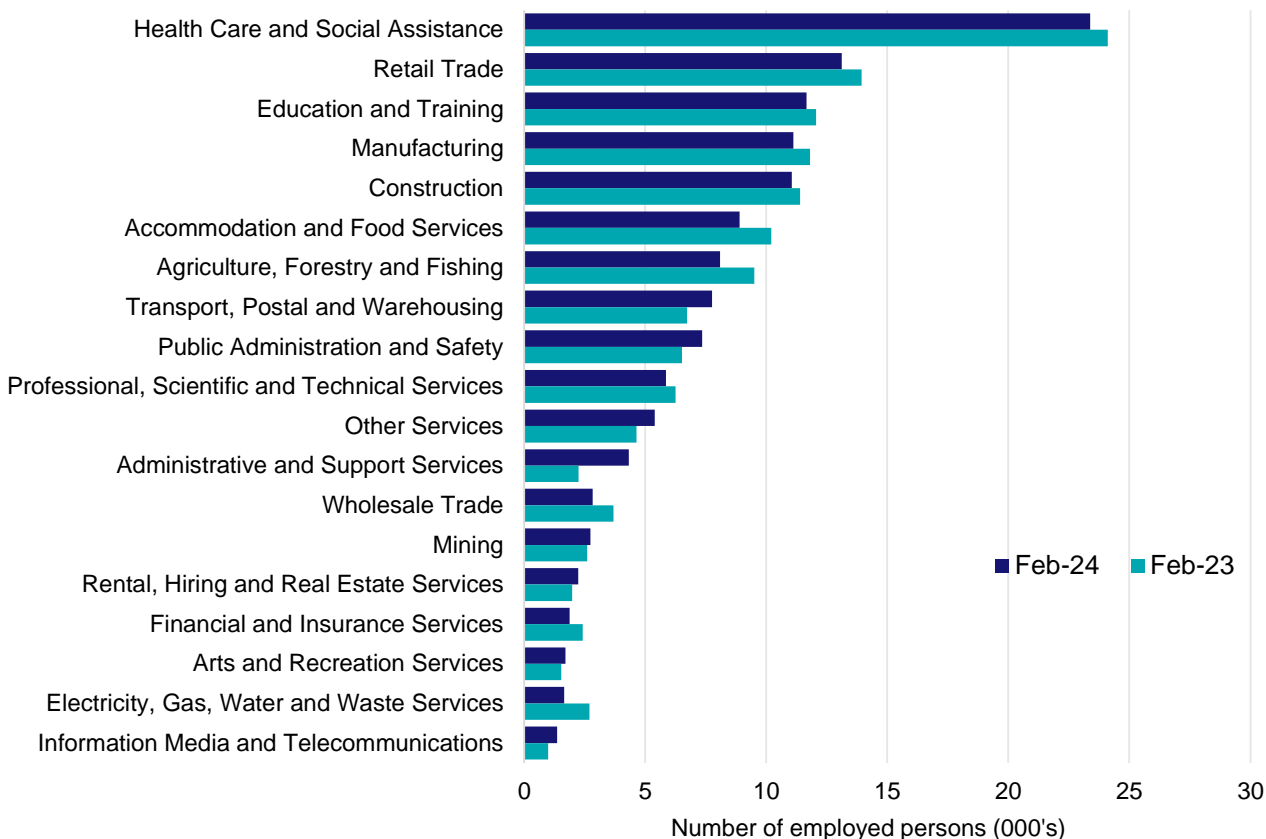
In February 2024, there were around 132,500 people employed in the North and North Western Tasmania Employment Region. The 5 largest employing industries in the region were Health Care and Social Assistance, Retail Trade, Education and Training, Manufacturing, and Construction. Together these 5 industries accounted for 53% of employment in the region.

Over the year to February 2024, employment in:

- Health Care and Social Assistance fell by 3.0% to stand at 23,400
- Retail Trade fell by 5.9% to stand at 13,100
- Education and Training fell by 3.3% to stand at 11,700.

In Health Care and Social Assistance in the North and North Western Tasmania Employment Region, 50% of workers were employed full-time; 80% were female; and the median age of the workforce was 44.

### Employment by industry, February 2024 and February 2023



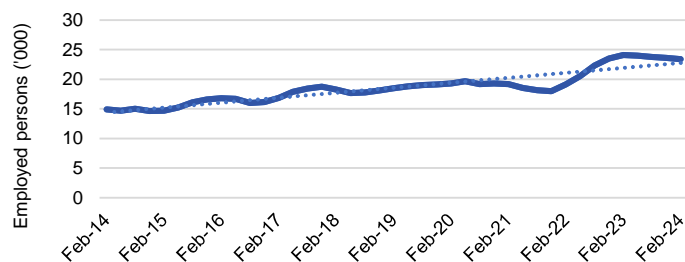

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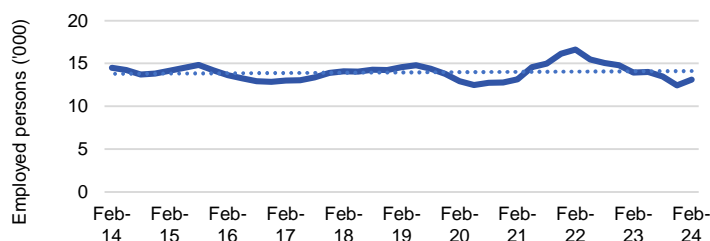

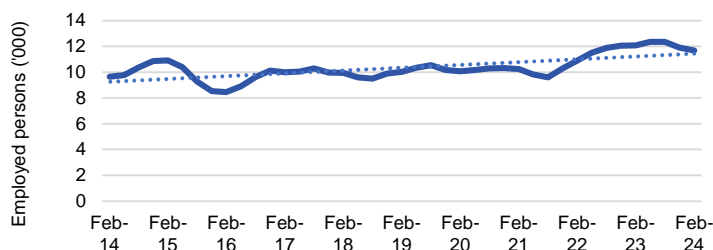

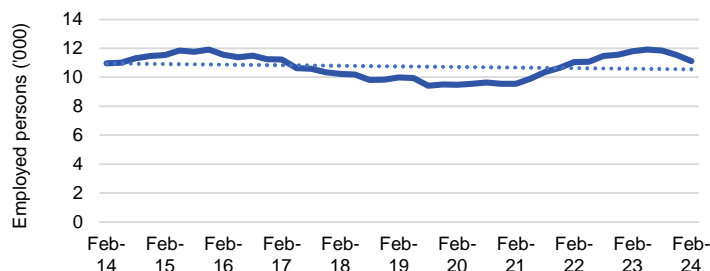

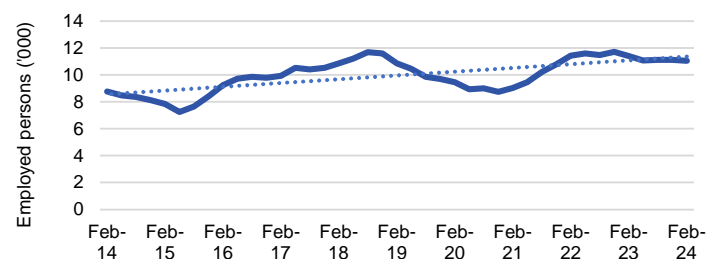

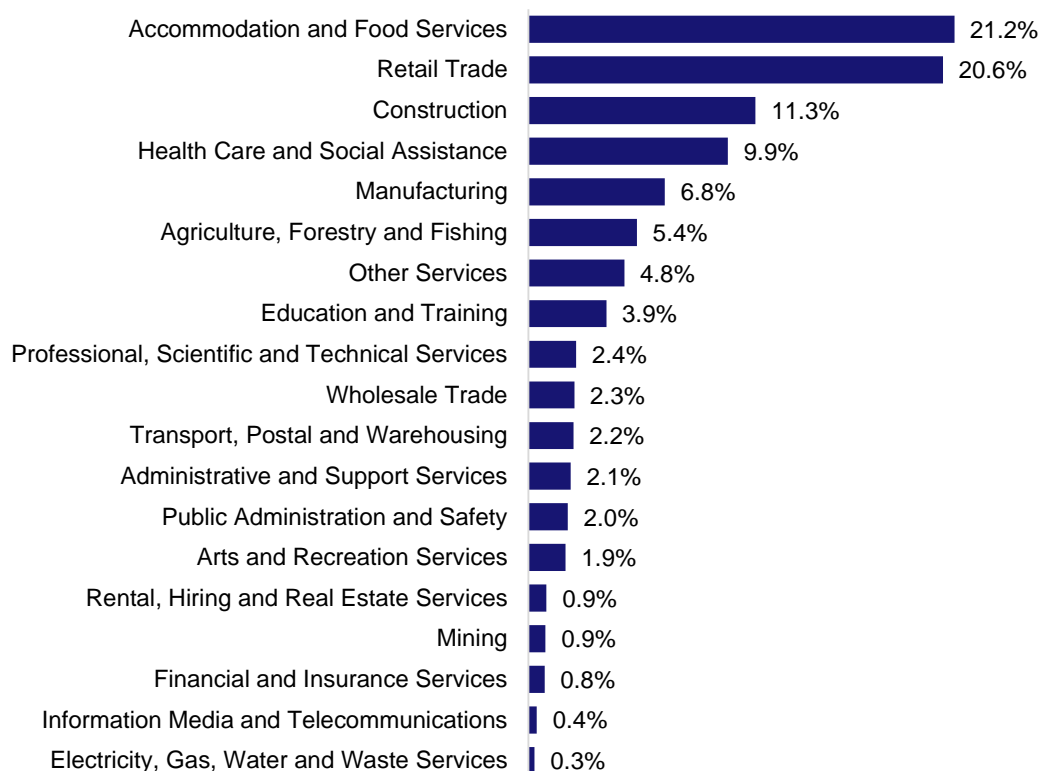

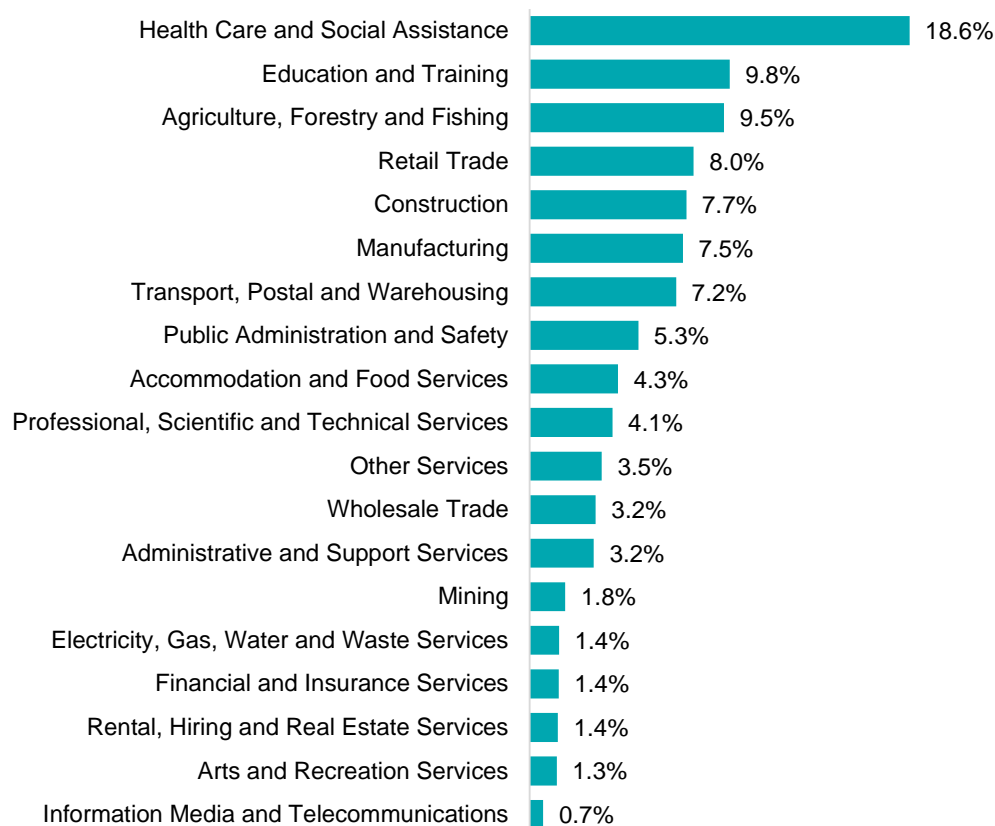

### Which industries are youth (aged 15-24) employed in?



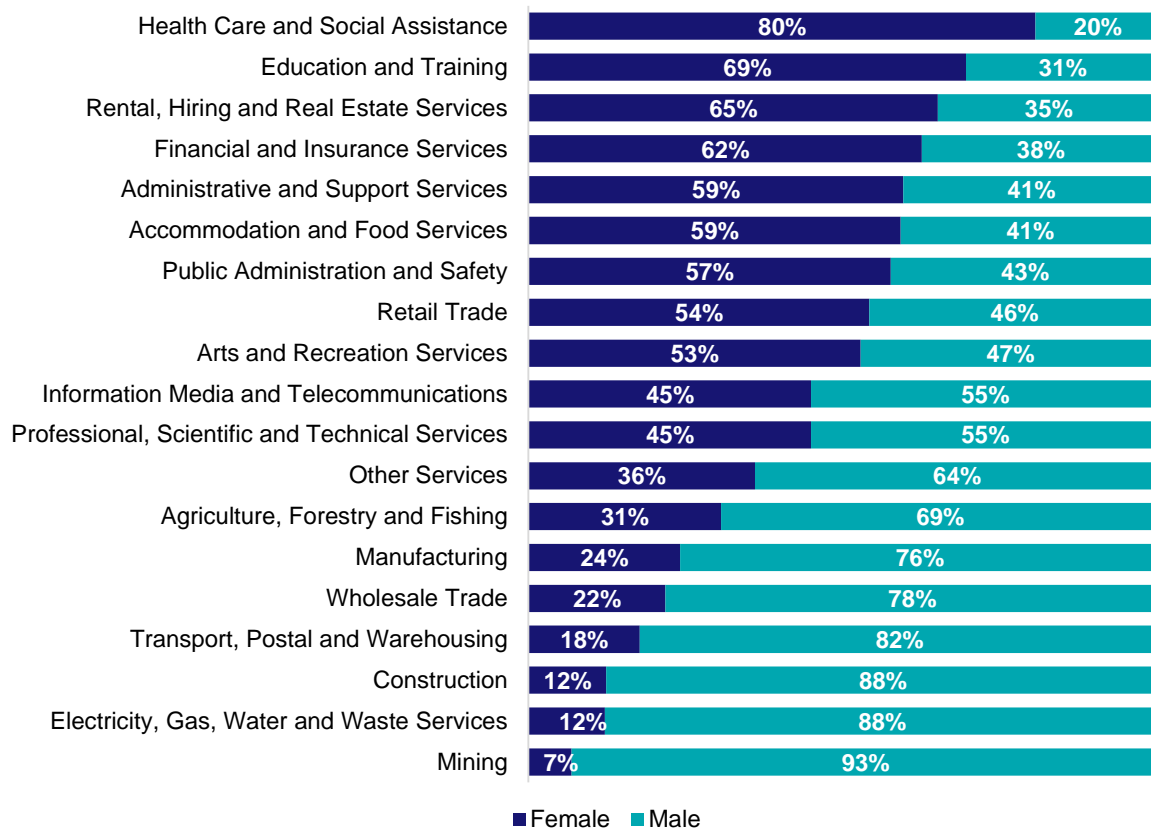

### Which industries are mature age persons (aged 55+) employed in?



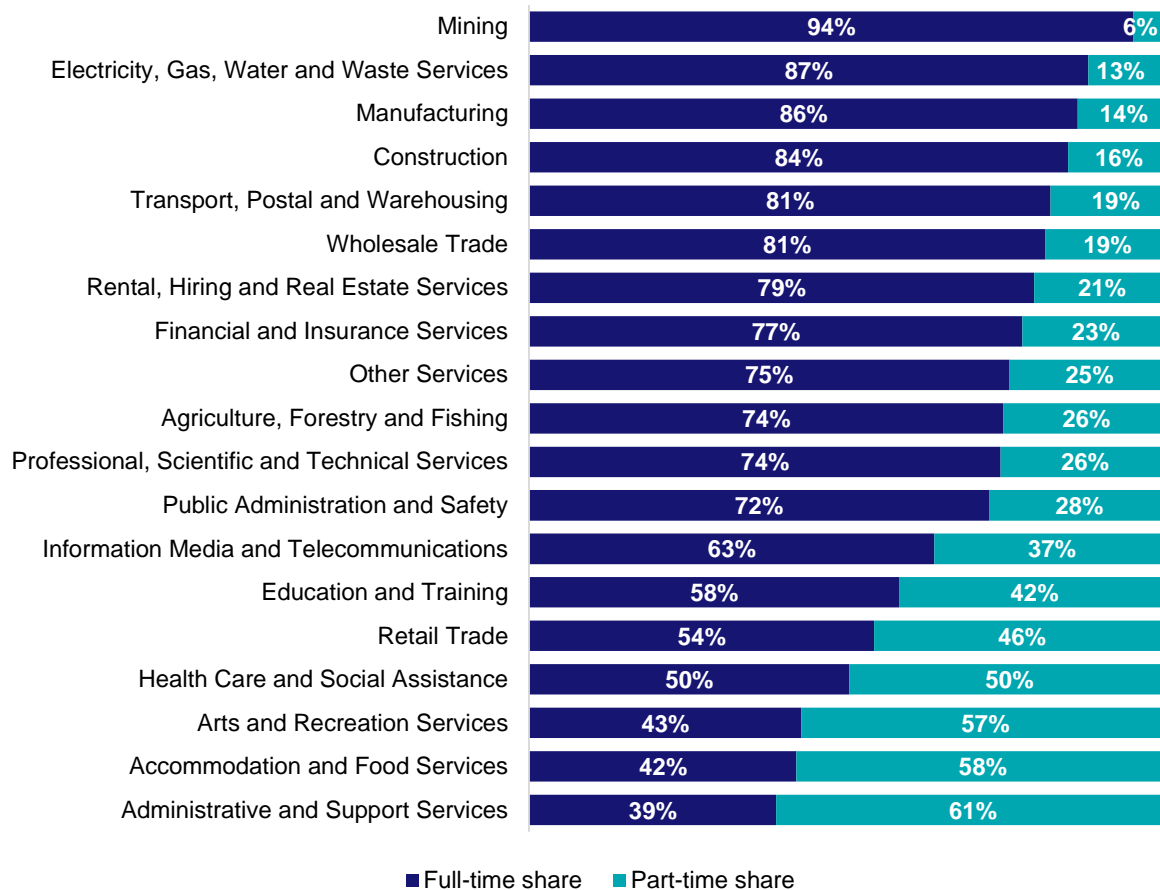
