Central West Employment Region

Overview

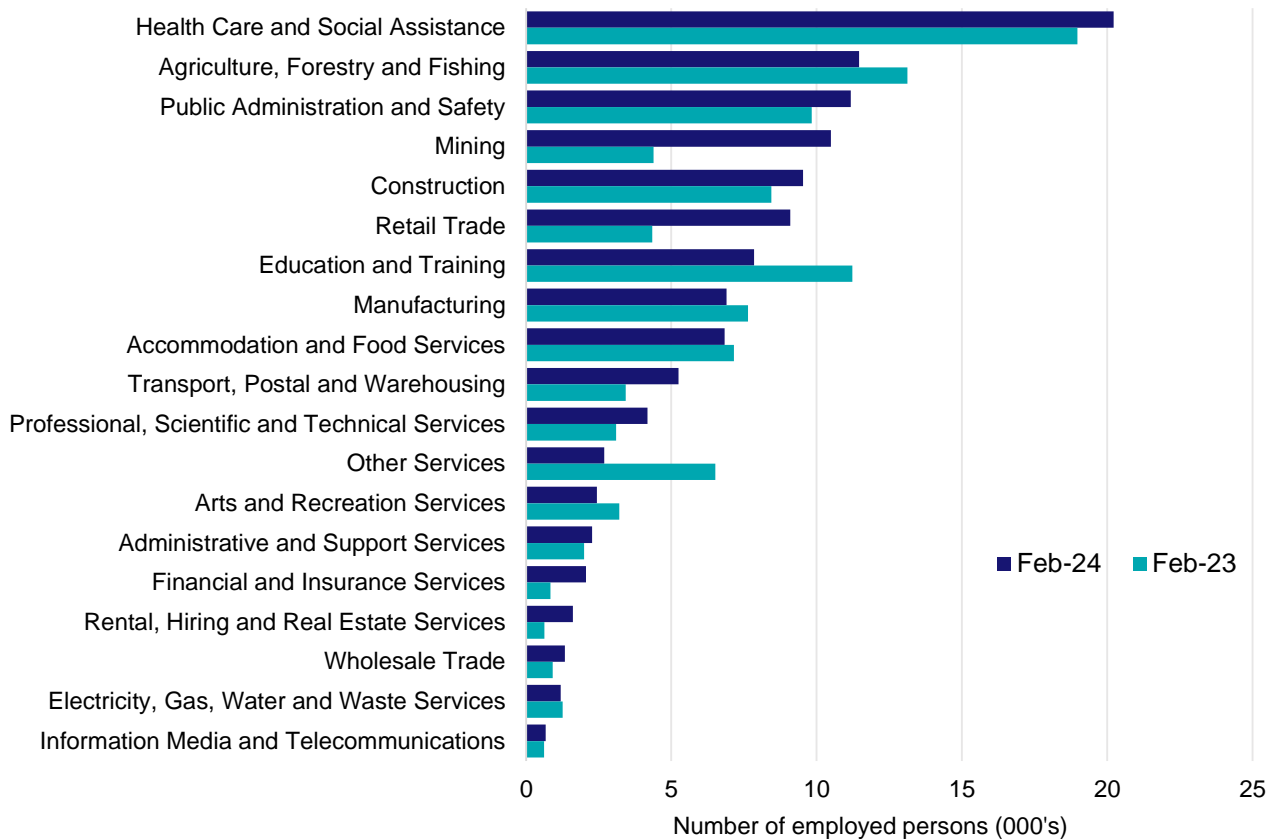
In February 2024, there were around 117,300 people employed in the Central West Employment Region. The 5 largest employing industries in the region were Health Care and Social Assistance, Agriculture, Forestry and Fishing, Public Administration and Safety, Mining, and Construction. Together these 5 industries accounted for 54% of employment in the region.

Over the year to February 2024, employment in:

- Health Care and Social Assistance rose by 6.6% to stand at 20,200
- Agriculture, Forestry and Fishing fell by 12.7% to stand at 11,500
- Public Administration and Safety rose by 13.7% to stand at 11,200.

In Health Care and Social Assistance in the Central West Employment Region, 51% of workers were employed full-time; 79% were female; and the median age of the workforce was 43.

Employment by industry, February 2024 and February 2023



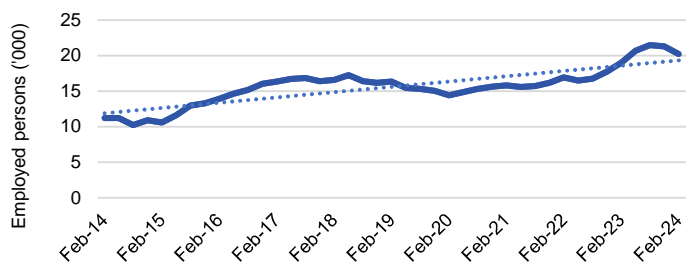

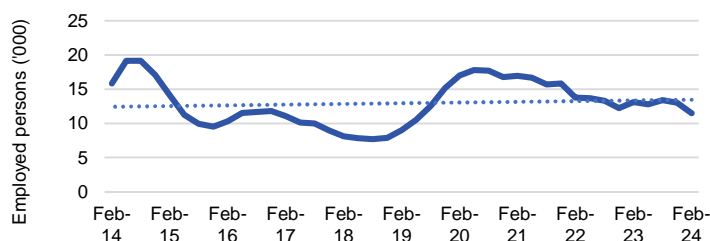

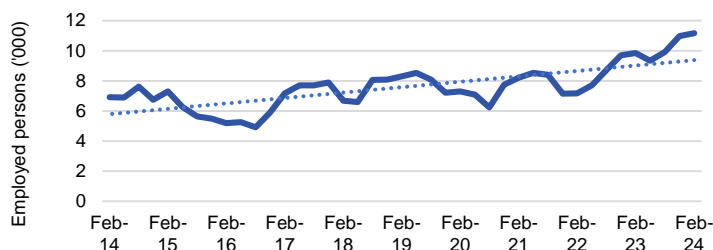

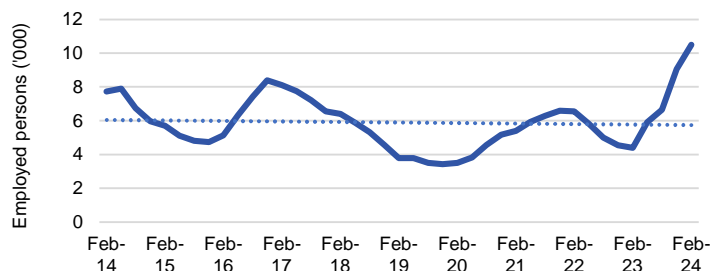

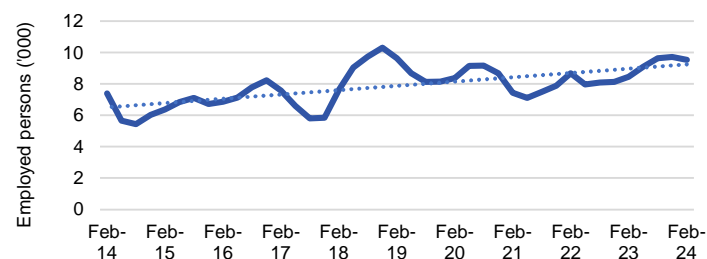

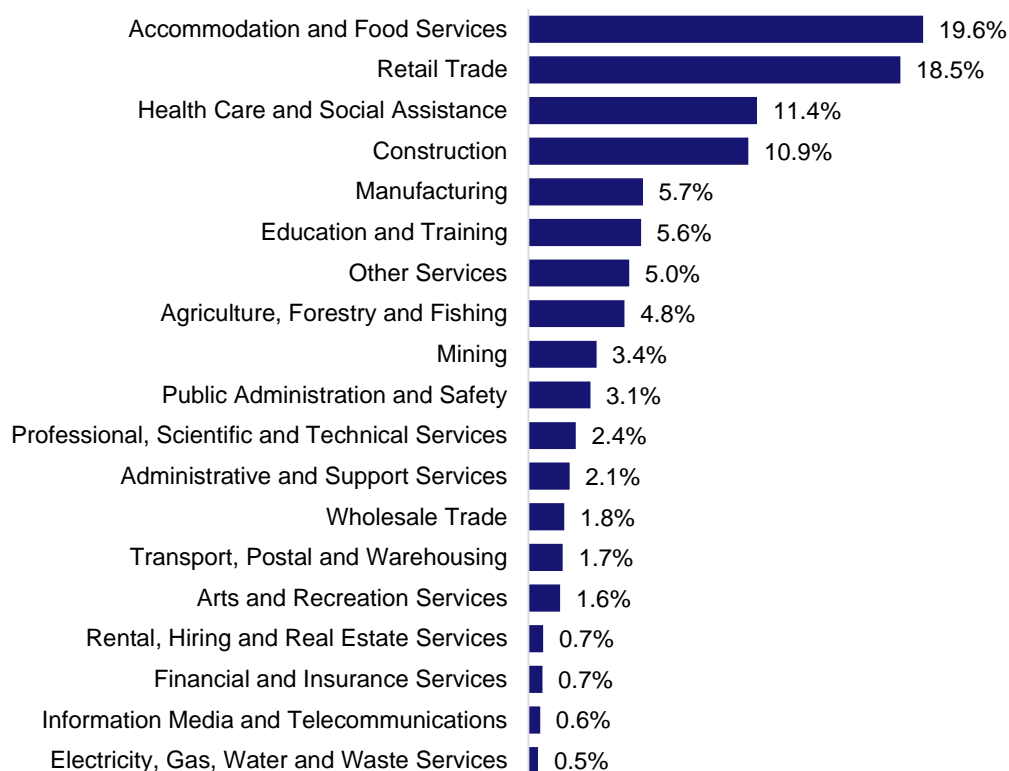

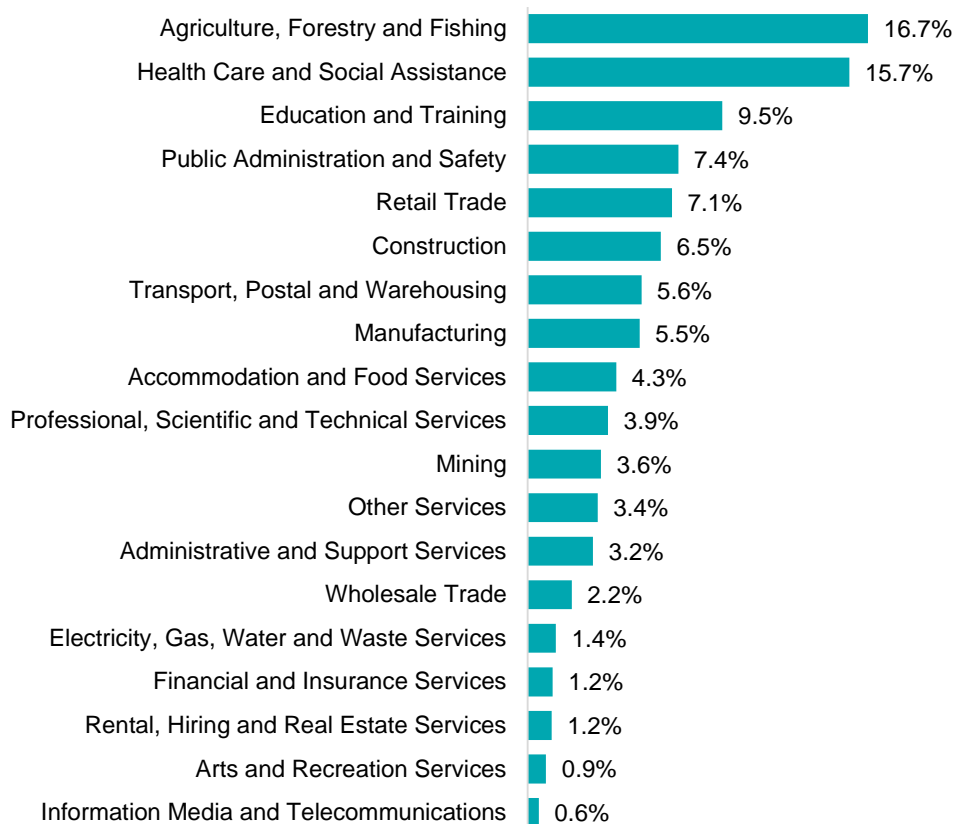
Employment characteristics by Industry

Which industries are youth (aged 15-24) employed in?



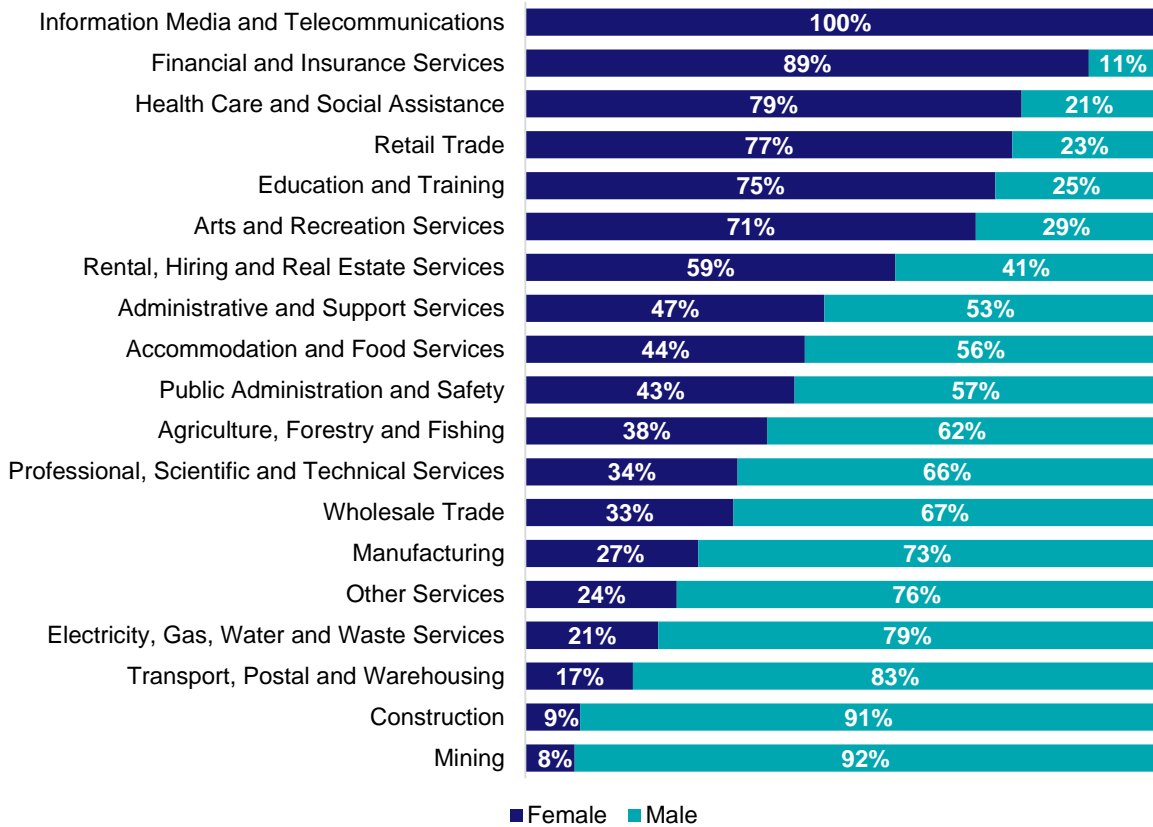

Which industries are mature age persons (aged 55+) employed in?



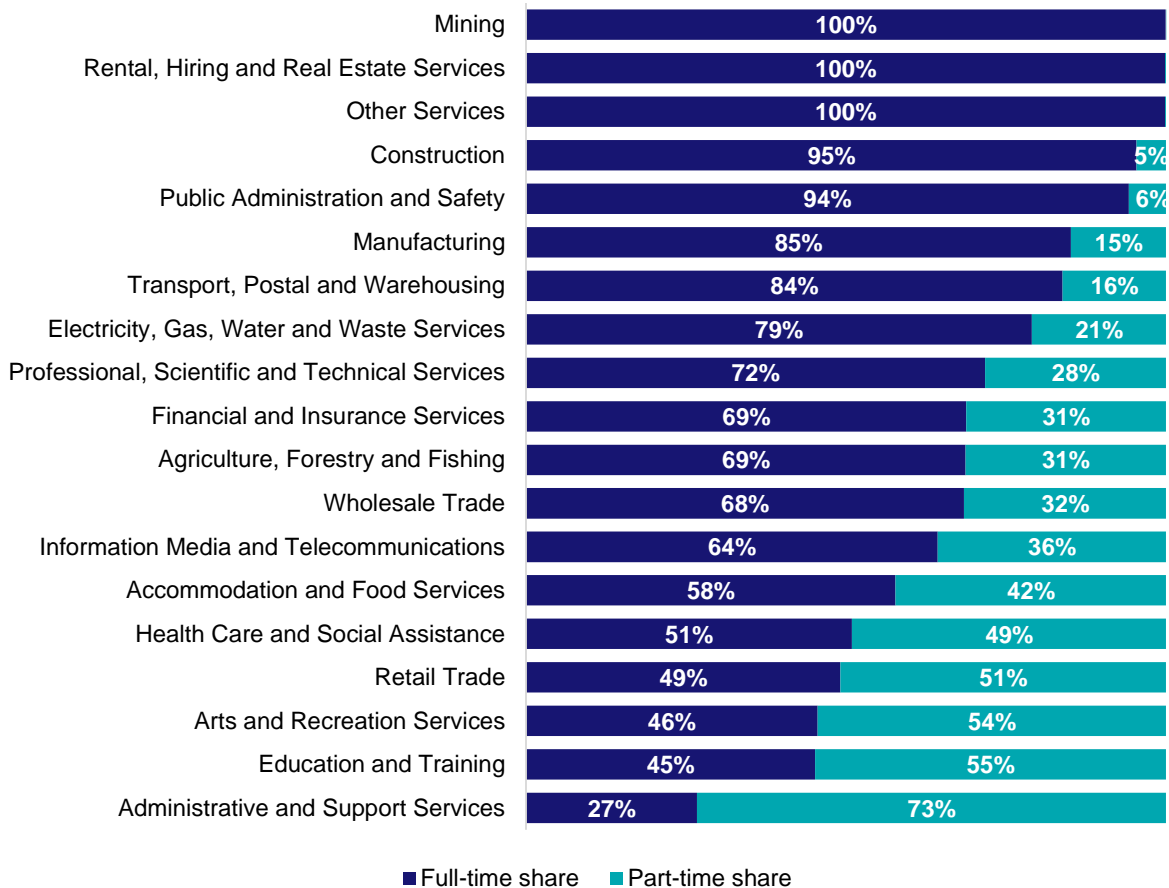
