Overview


In February 2024, there were around 130,500 people employed in the Townsville Employment Region. The 5 largest employing industries in the region were Health Care and Social Assistance, Public Administration and Safety, Construction, Retail Trade, and Education and Training. Together these 5 industries accounted for 56% of employment in the region.

Over the year to February 2024, employment in:

- Health Care and Social Assistance rose by 1.3% to stand at 22,100
- Public Administration and Safety rose by 6.2% to stand at 13,500
- Construction fell by 3.5% to stand at 13,300.

In Health Care and Social Assistance in the Townsville Employment Region, 67% of workers were employed full-time; 79% were female; and the median age of the workforce was 41.




Employment characteristics by Industry

Which industries are youth (aged 15-24) employed in?





Which industries are mature age persons (aged 55+) employed in?




