New England and North West Employment Region

Overview


In February 2025, there were around 106,000 people employed in the New England and North West Employment Region. The 5 largest employing industries in the region were Agriculture, Forestry and Fishing, Education and Training, Retail Trade, Health Care and Social Assistance, and Public Administration and Safety. Together these 5 industries accounted for 63% of employment in the region.

Over the year to February 2025, employment in:

- Agriculture, Forestry and Fishing rose by 22.5% to stand at 23,600
- Education and Training rose by 39.5% to stand at 13,800
- Retail Trade fell by 22.2% to stand at 12,100.

In Agriculture, Forestry and Fishing in the New England and North West Employment Region, 67% of workers were employed full-time; 66% were male; and the median age of the workforce was 51.

Employment by industry, February 2025 and February 2024














Employment characteristics by Industry
