# Industry profile

### **Overview**


In February 2025, there were around 4,455,800 people employed in New South Wales. The 5 largest employing industries in New South Wales were Health Care and Social Assistance, Professional, Scientific and Technical Services, Construction, Retail Trade and Education and Training. Together these 5 industries accounted for 53% of all employment.

Over the year to February 2025, employment in:

- Health Care and Social Assistance rose by 5.6% to stand at 689,800
- Professional, Scientific and Technical Services fell by 0.6% to stand at 451,600
- Construction rose by 0.5% to stand at 414,600.

In Health Care and Social Assistance in New South Wales, 59% of workers were employed fulltime; 76% were Female; and the median age of the workforce was 42. Around 63% of employed persons in this industry were located in Greater Sydney.


#### Employment by industry, February 2025 and February 2024

## Five largest employing industries: key statistics




