



Number of online job advertisements over the ten years to February 2025





Data are for the year to February 2025, unless otherwise indicated.

Recruitment activity and experiences


In Northern Territory, there were 479 responding employers in the 12 months to February 2025, of whom 64% were recruiting or had recruited over the past month. Of these recruiting businesses, 57% had difficulty recruiting. By comparison, 44% of employers were recruiting in Australia over the same period, of whom 51% had difficulty recruiting.

Employers in Northern Territory were most likely to report the following reasons for recruitment difficulty:

- · Location, eg remote or regional
- Lack of suitable applicants
- · Applicants lack experience
- Undesirable working conditions/hours.






Recruitment activity and experiences


In Darwin, there were 369 responding employers in the 12 months to February 2025, of whom 64% were recruiting or had recruited in the past month. Of these recruiting businesses, 54% had difficulty recruiting. By comparison, 64% of employers were recruiting in Northern Territory over the same period, of whom 57% had difficulty recruiting.


Employers in Darwin were most likely to report the following reasons for recruitment difficulty:

- · Lack of suitable applicants
- · Location, eg remote or regional
- · Applicants lack experience
- · Undesirable working conditions/hours.
