Overview


In August 2025, there were around 143,800 people employed in Northern Territory. The 5 largest employing industries in Northern Territory were Health Care and Social Assistance, Public Administration and Safety, Education and Training, Construction and Retail Trade. Together these 5 industries accounted for 62% of all employment.

Over the year to August 2025, employment in:

- Health Care and Social Assistance rose by 7.6% to stand at 28,500
- Public Administration and Safety fell by 0.5% to stand at 22,000
- Education and Training rose by 6.3% to stand at 15,300.

In Health Care and Social Assistance in Northern Territory, 79% of workers were employed full-time; 69% were Female; and the median age of the workforce was 38. Around 53% of employed persons in this industry were located in Greater Darwin.





Which industries are youth (aged 15-24) employed in?





Which industries are mature age persons (aged 55+) employed in?





Employment Region Industry profile

Darwin Employment Region

Release date: 25 September 2025

Overview


In August 2025, there were around 90,400 people employed in the Darwin Employment Region. The 5 largest employing industries in the region were Health Care and Social Assistance, Public Administration and Safety, Education and Training, Construction, and Retail Trade. Together these 5 industries accounted for 59% of employment in the region.

Over the year to August 2025, employment in:

- Health Care and Social Assistance rose by 3.5% to stand at 15,200
- Public Administration and Safety rose by 1.8% to stand at 13,600
- Education and Training rose by 11.0% to stand at 8,400.

In Health Care and Social Assistance in the Darwin Employment Region, 78% of workers were employed full-time; 71% were female; and the median age of the workforce was 37.

Employment by industry, August 2025 and August 2024






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

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
