Far West Orana Employment Region

Overview


In August 2025, there were around 52,100 people employed in the Far West Orana Employment Region. The 5 largest employing industries in the region were Health Care and Social Assistance, Public Administration and Safety, Construction, Retail Trade, and Accommodation and Food Services. Together these 5 industries accounted for 61% of employment in the region.

Over the year to August 2025, employment in:

- Health Care and Social Assistance rose by 42.0% to stand at 13,400
- Public Administration and Safety fell by 7.6% to stand at 5,400
- Construction fell by 9.1% to stand at 4,600.

In Health Care and Social Assistance in the Far West Orana Employment Region, 56% of workers were employed full-time; 85% were female; and the median age of the workforce was 41.




Employment characteristics by Industry

Which industries are youth (aged 15-24) employed in?





Which industries are mature age persons (aged 55+) employed in?




