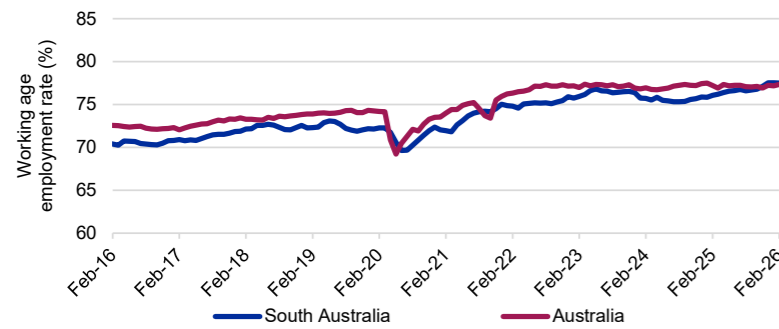

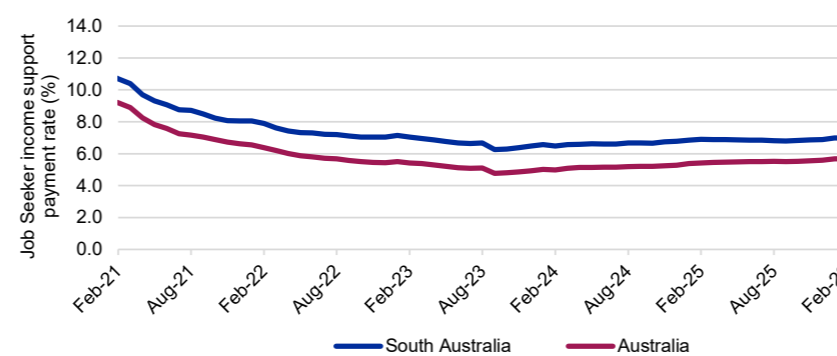

Working age employment rate

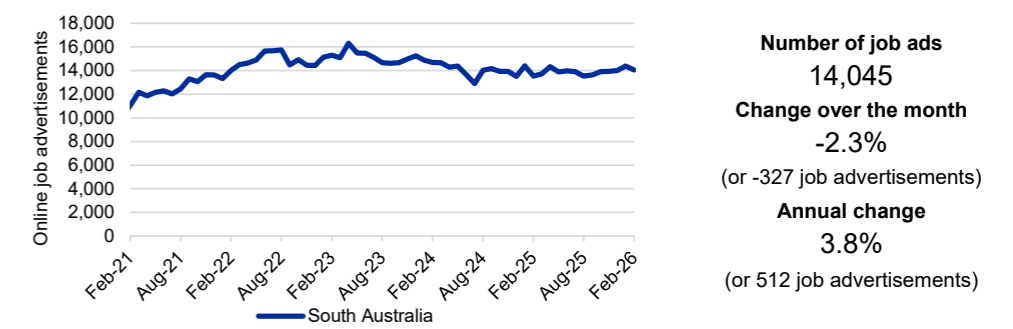

% of 15-64 year olds* on job seeker income support payments



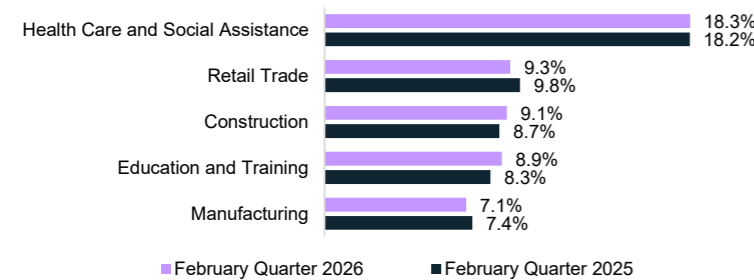

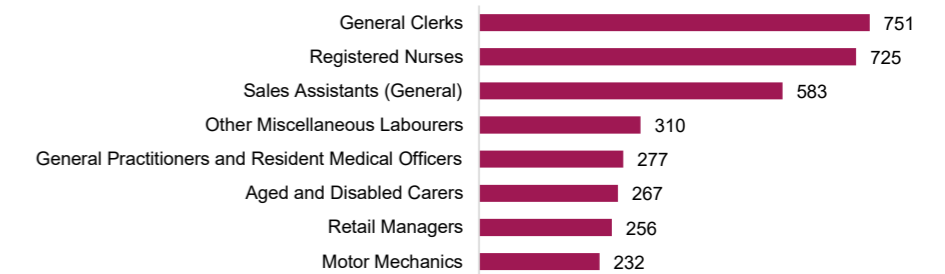

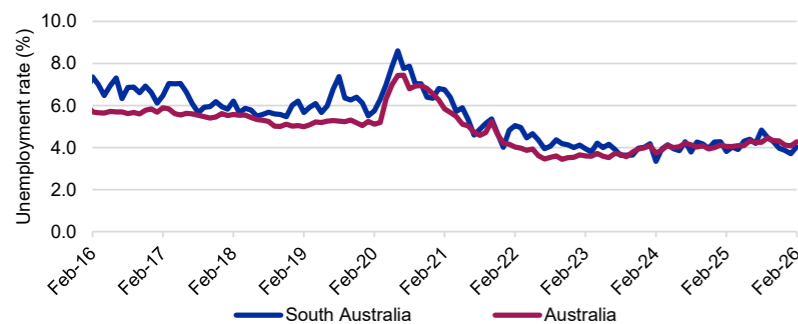

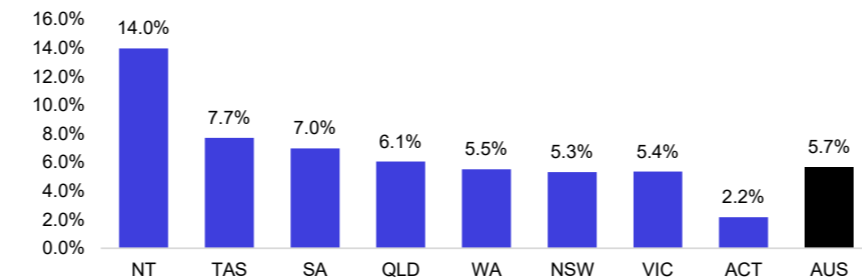

Unemployment rate



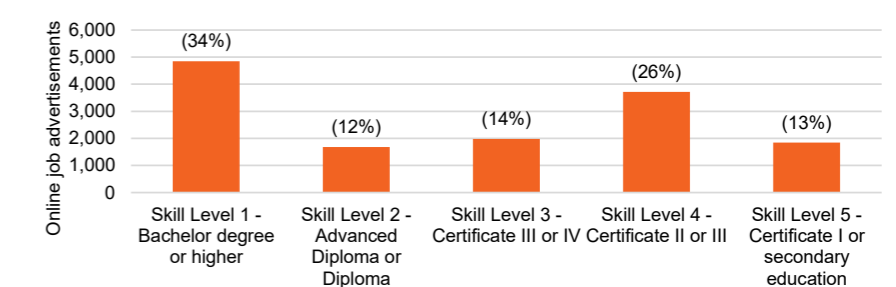

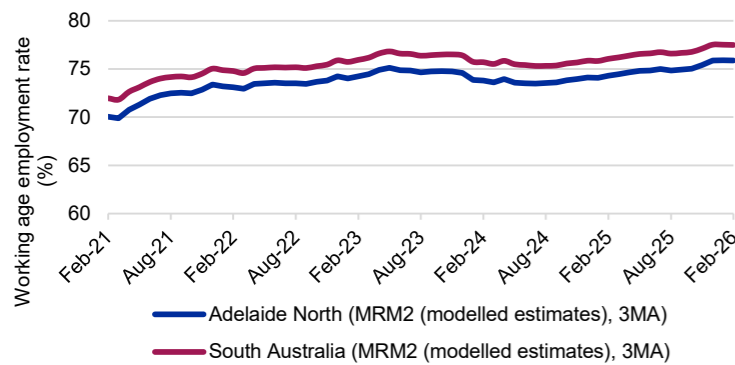

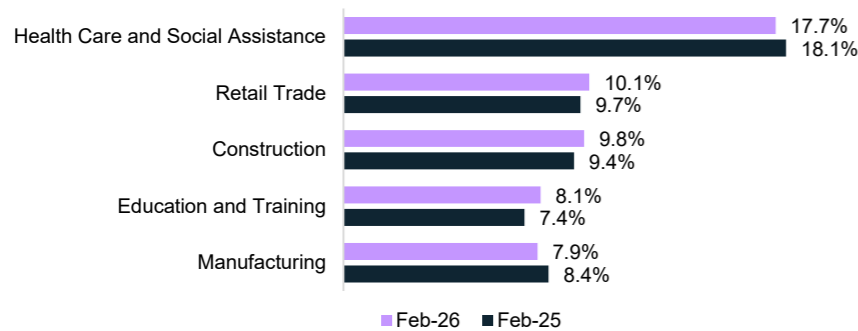

Working age employment rate (%)



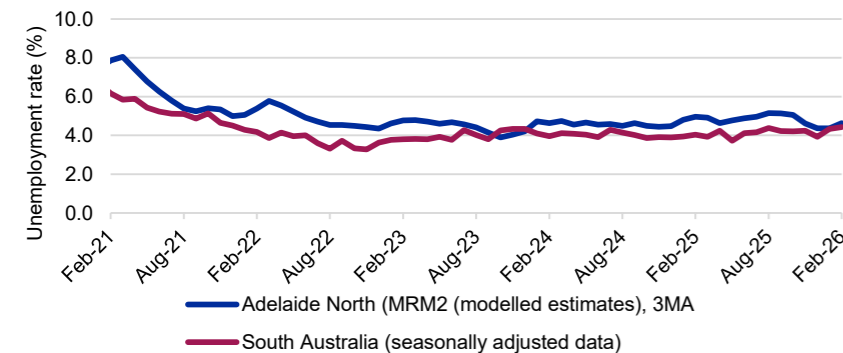

Largest employing industries



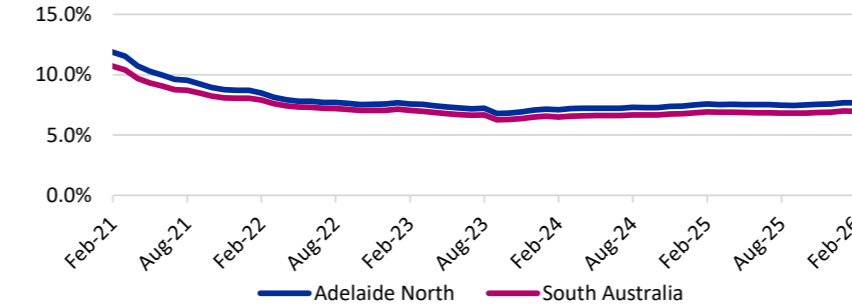

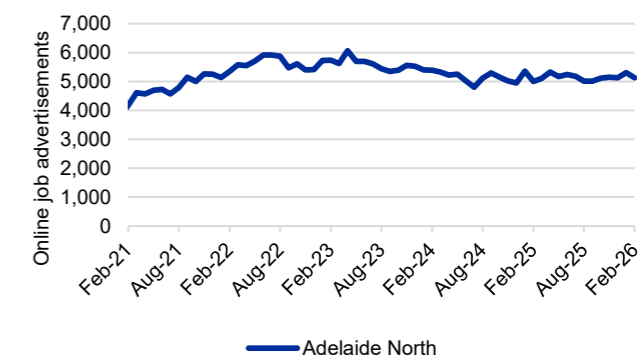

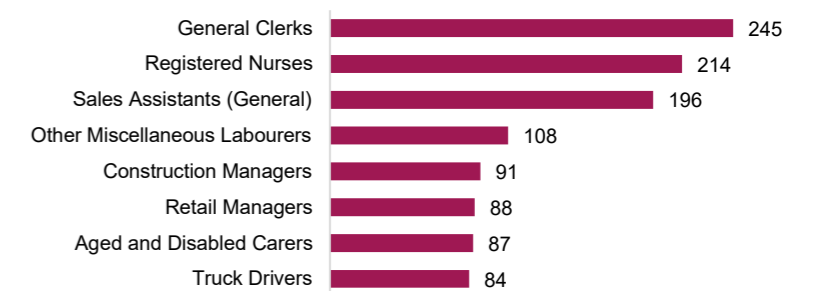

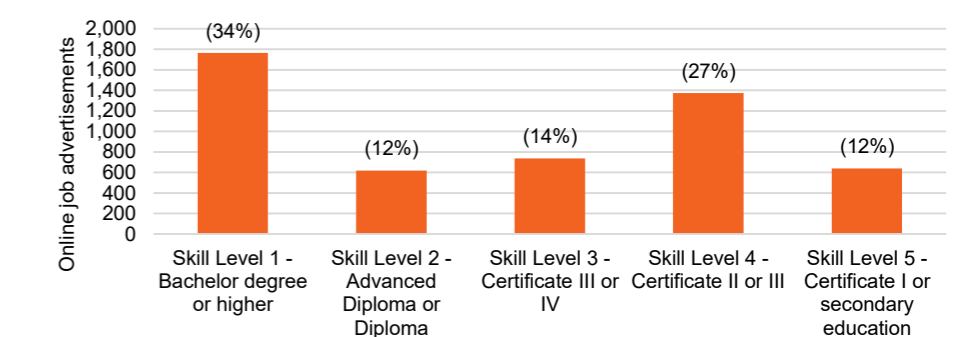

Online job advertisements by skill level



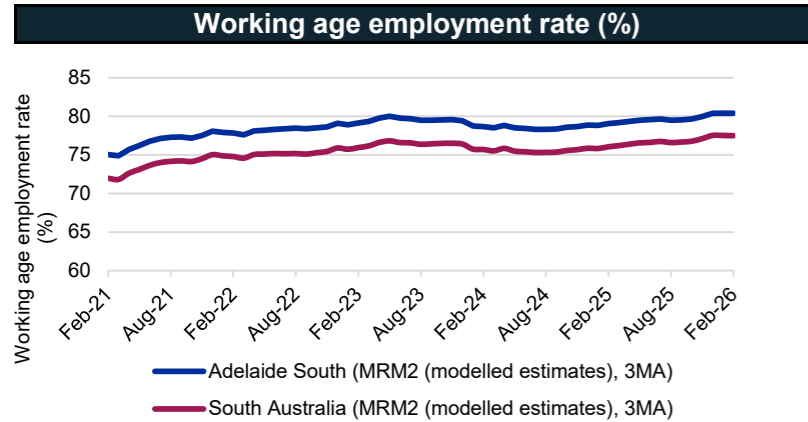

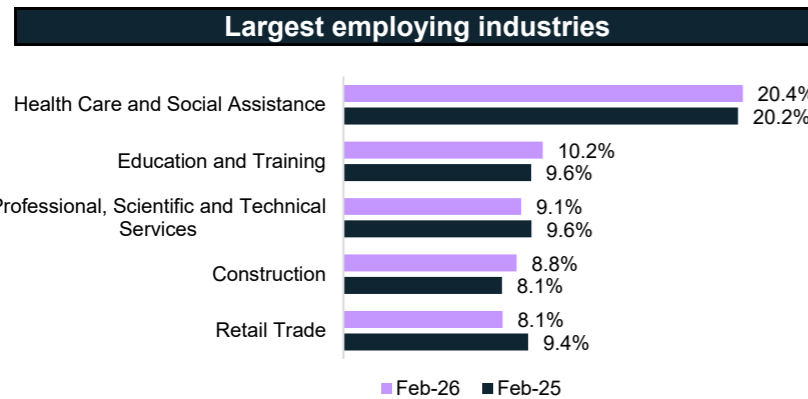

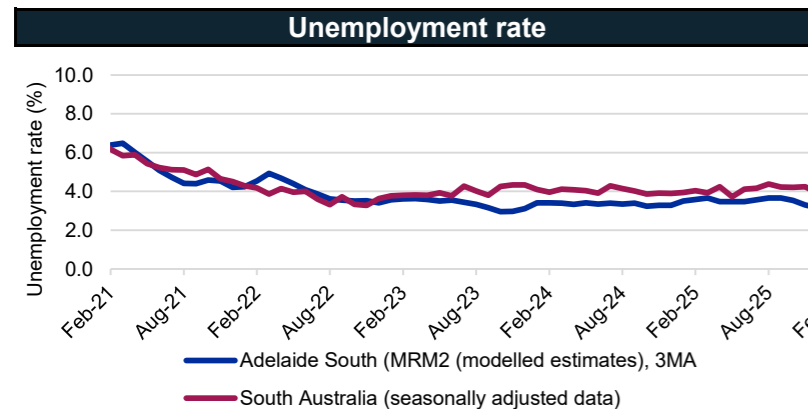

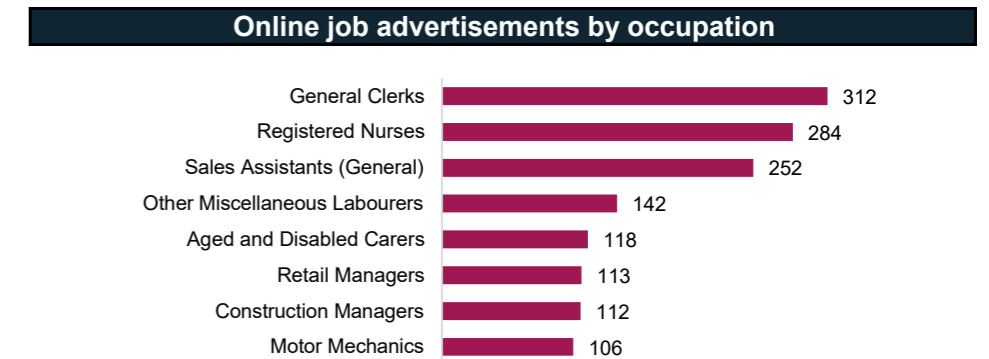

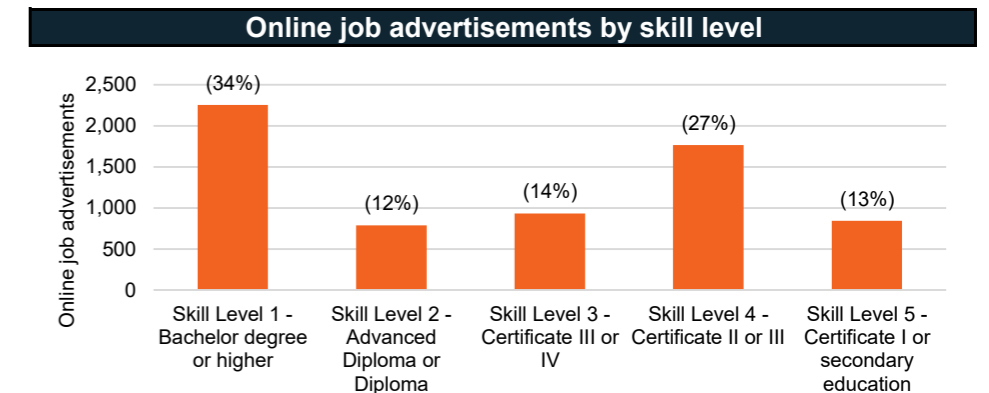

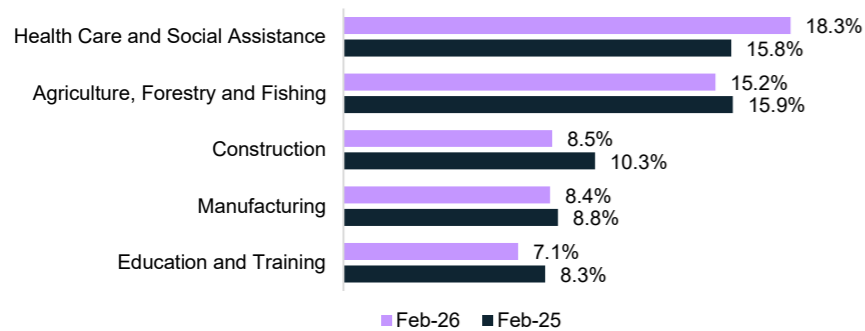

Working age employment rate (%)



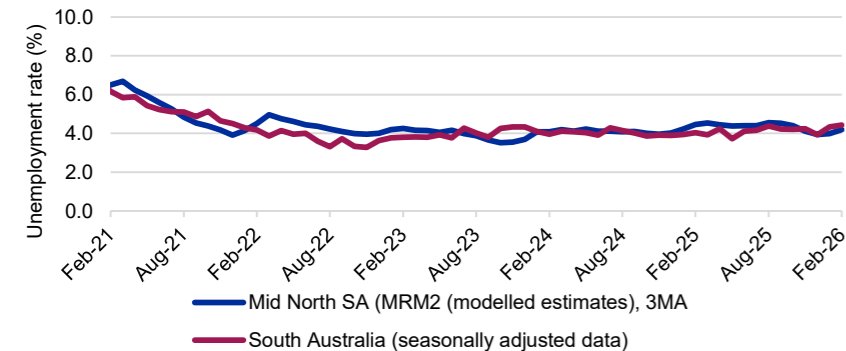

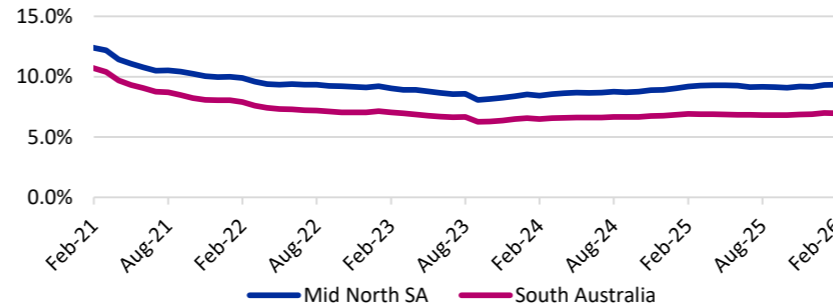

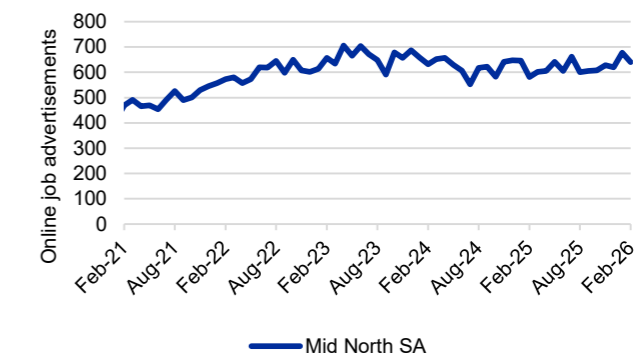

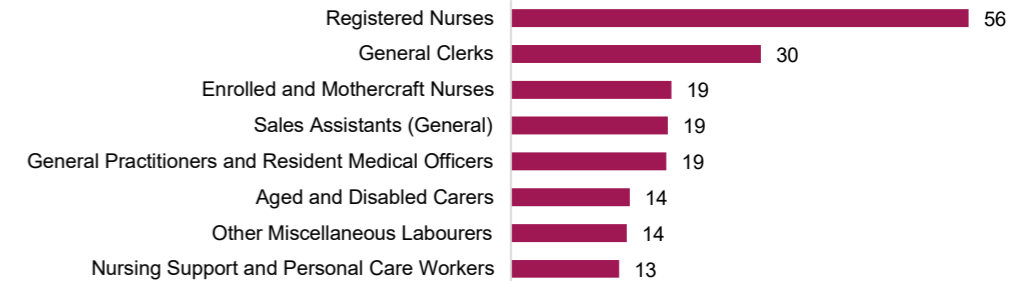

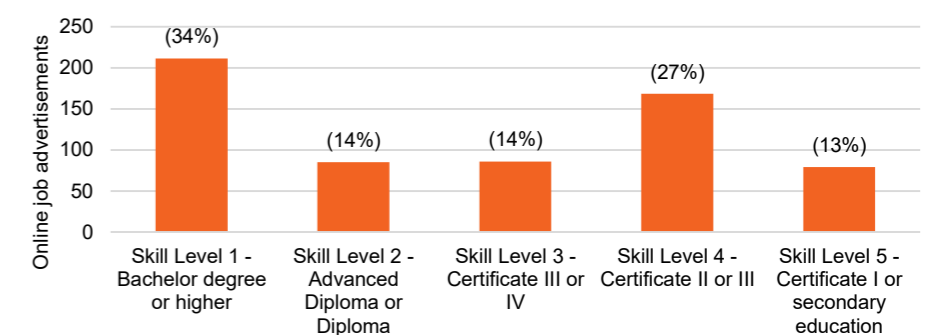

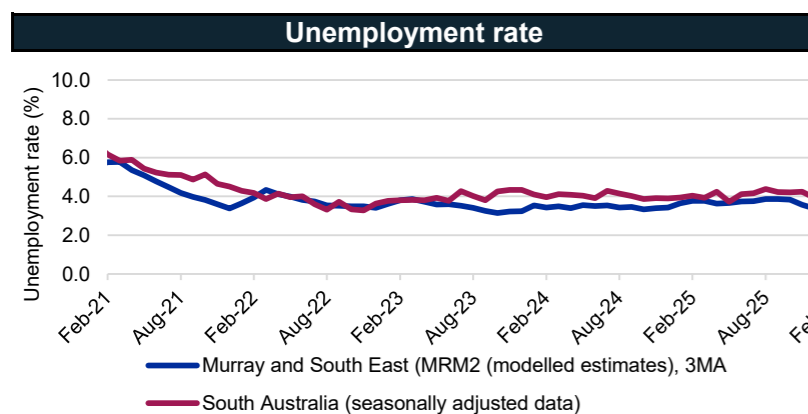

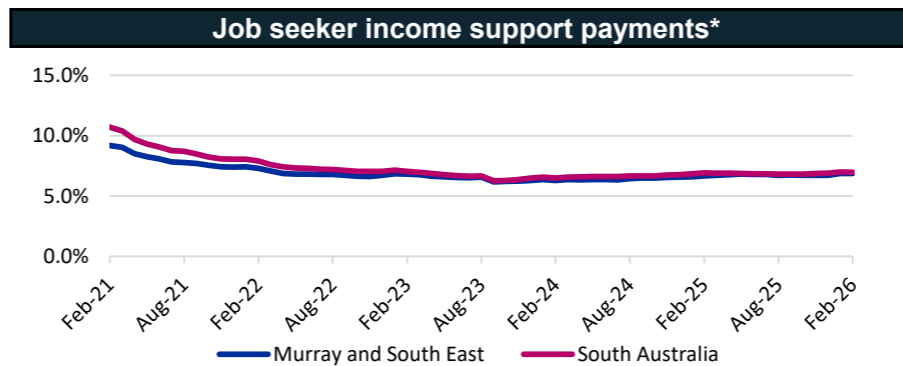

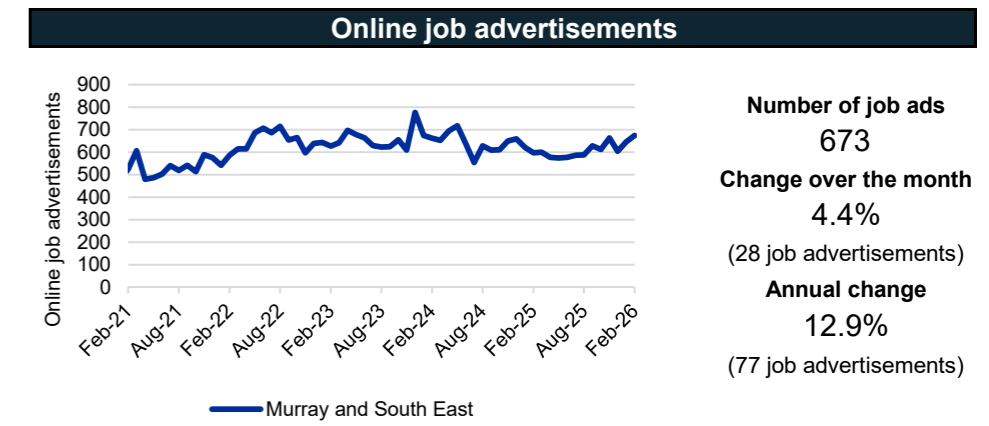

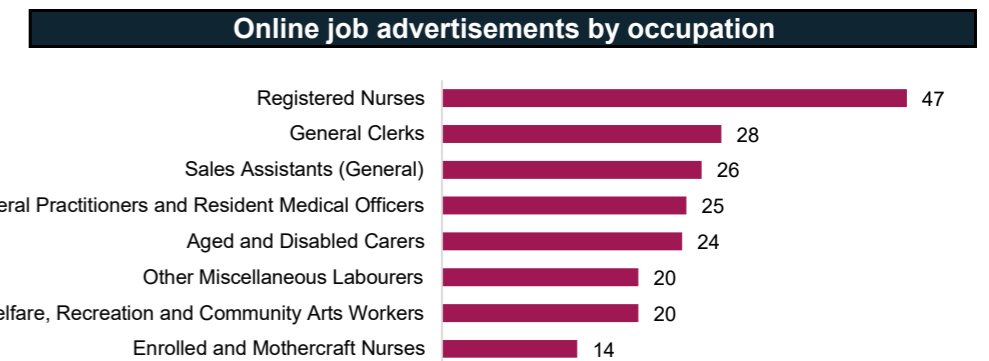

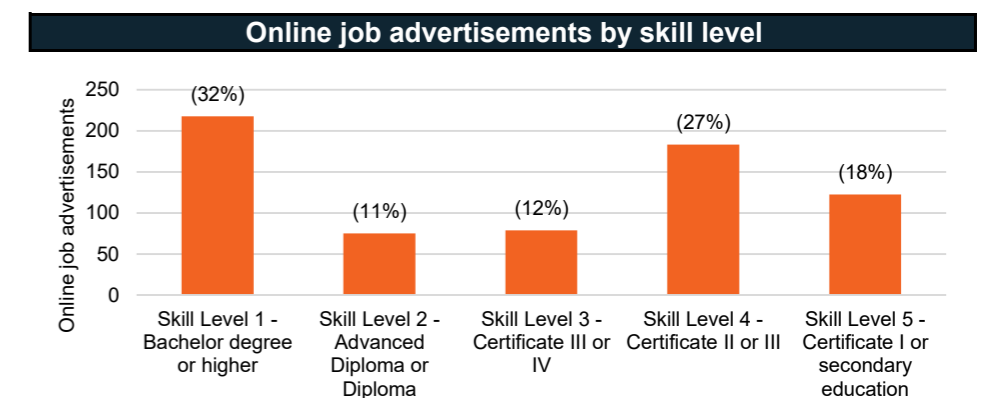
