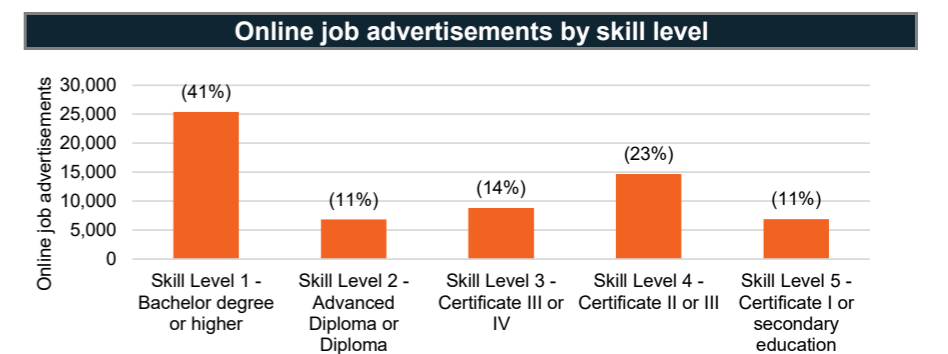

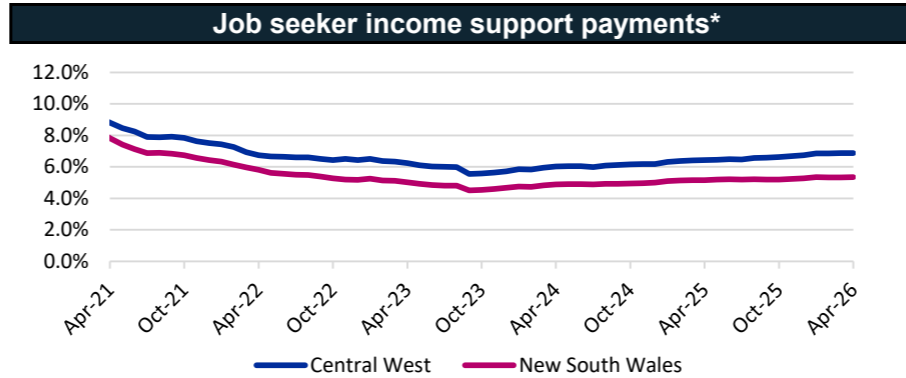

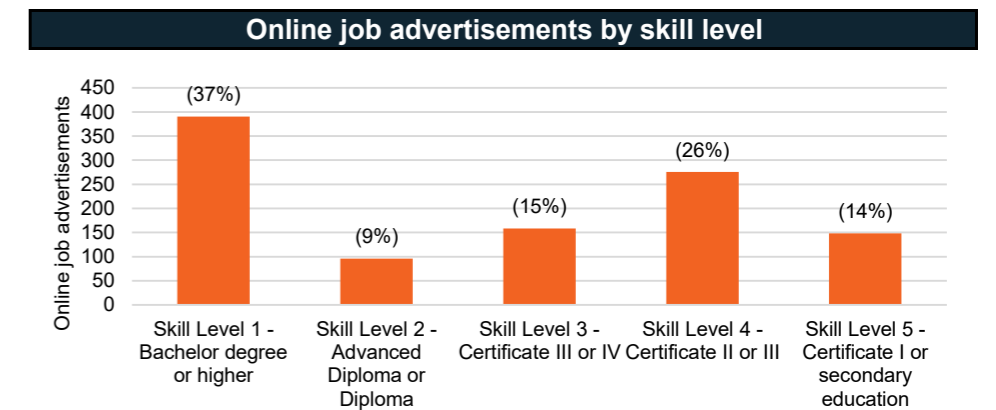

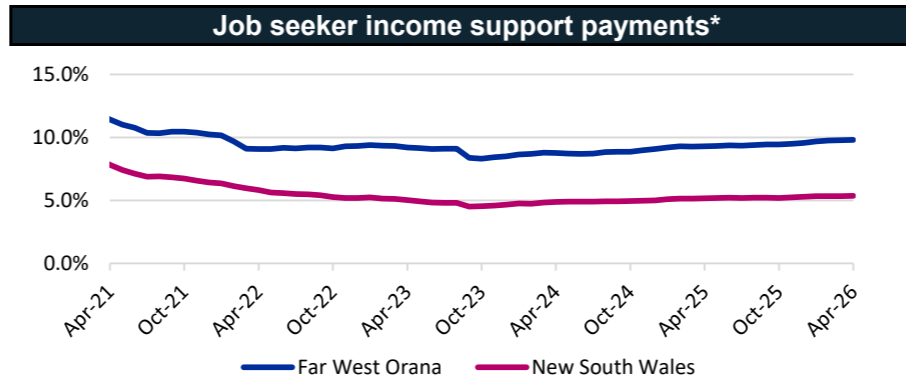

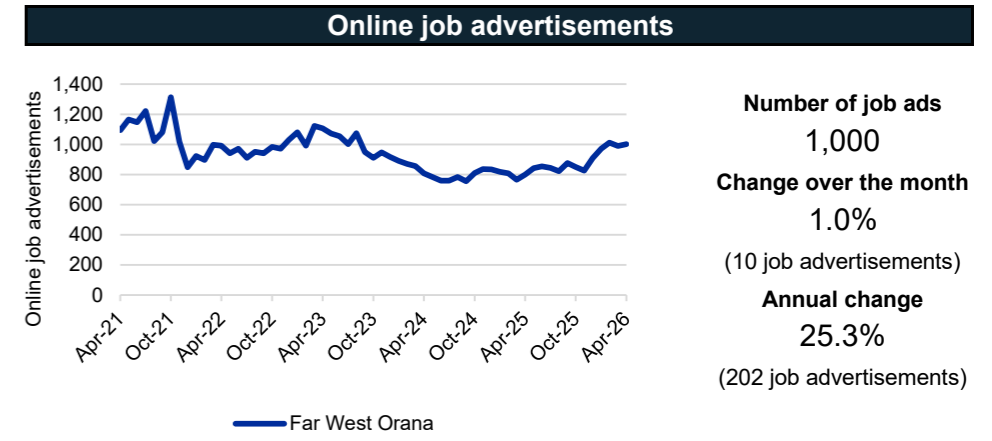

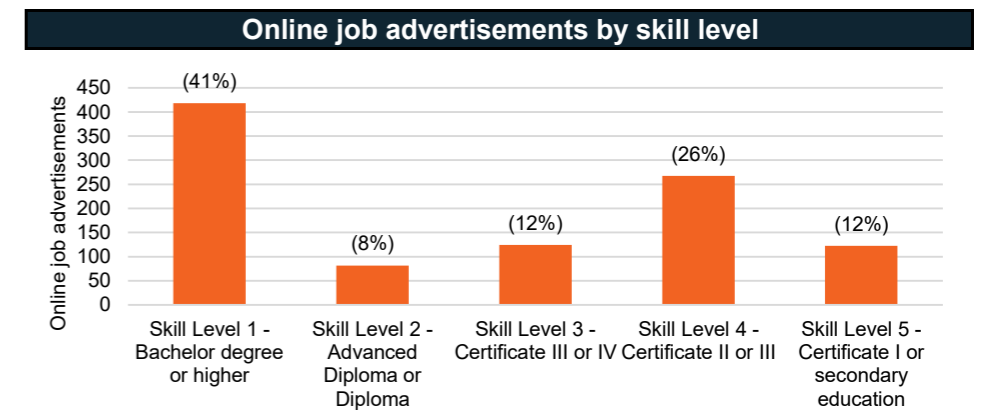

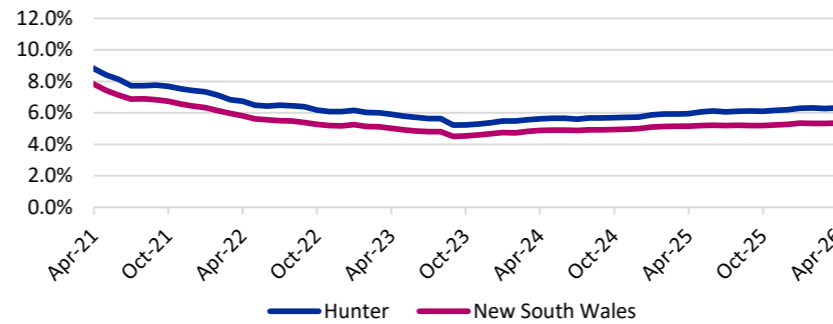

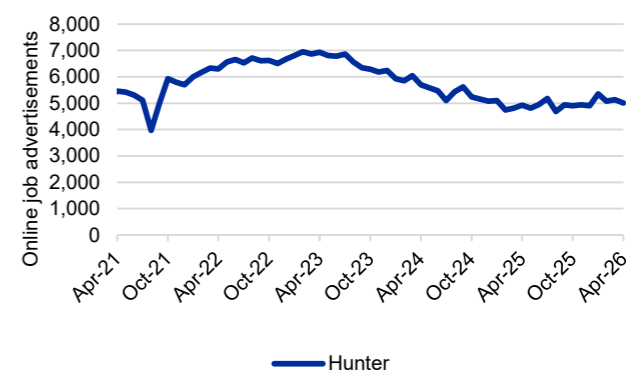

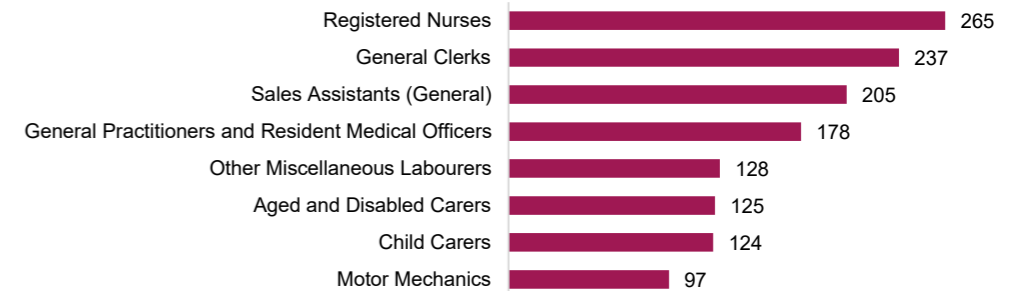

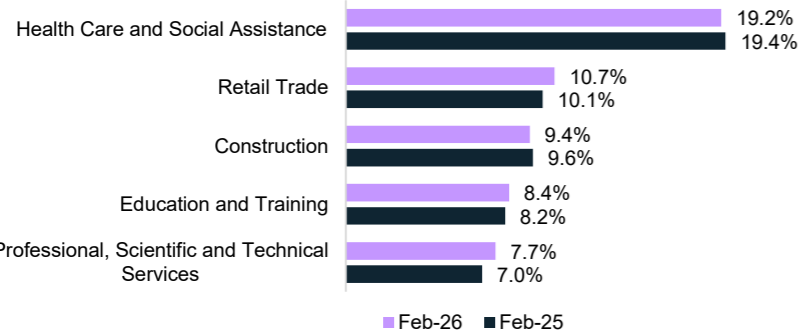

**Online job advertisements by occupation**



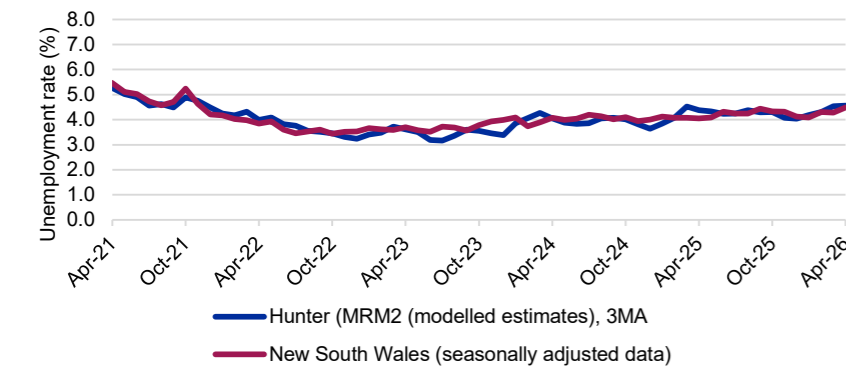

**Largest employing industries**



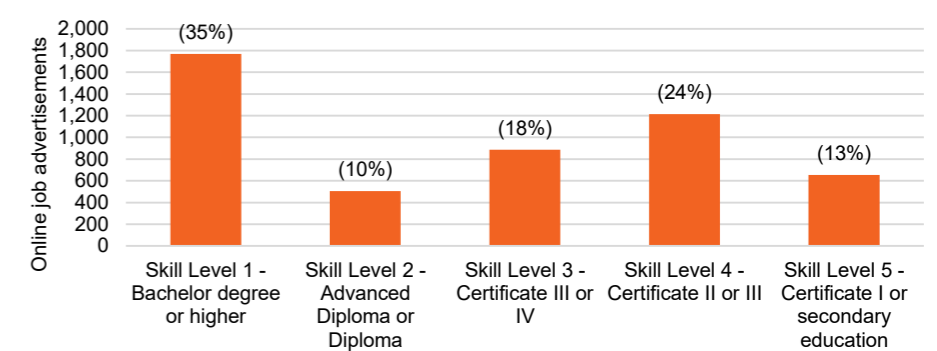

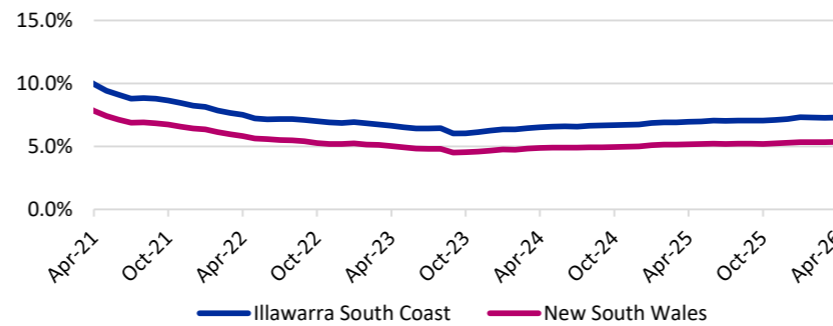

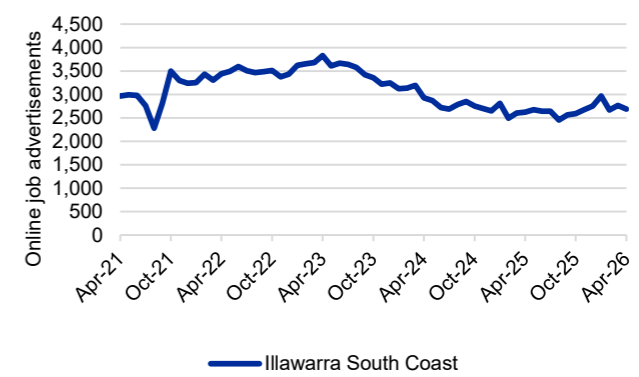

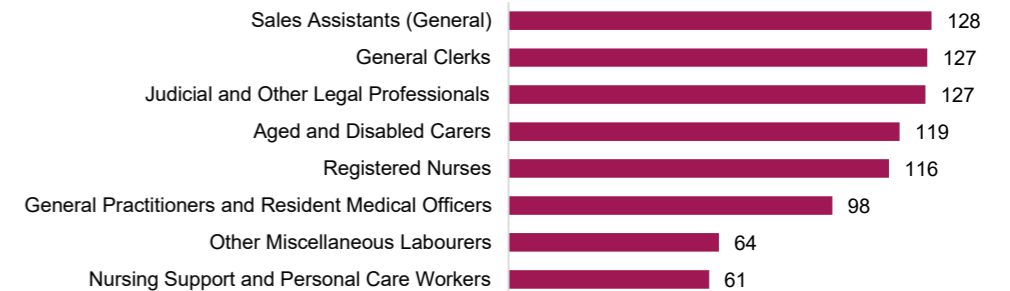

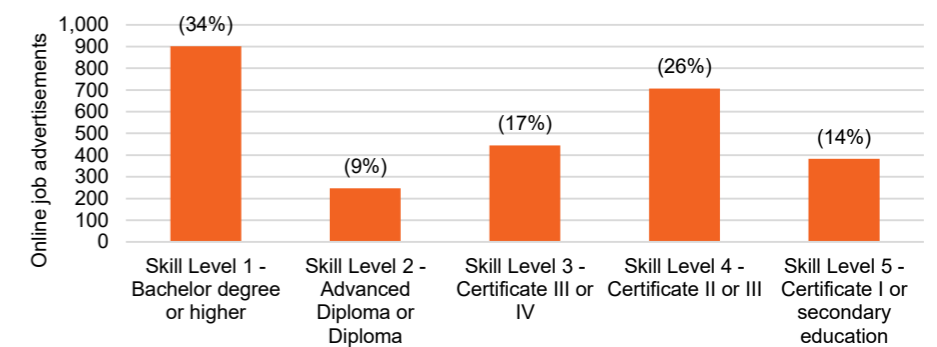

**Online job advertisements by occupation**



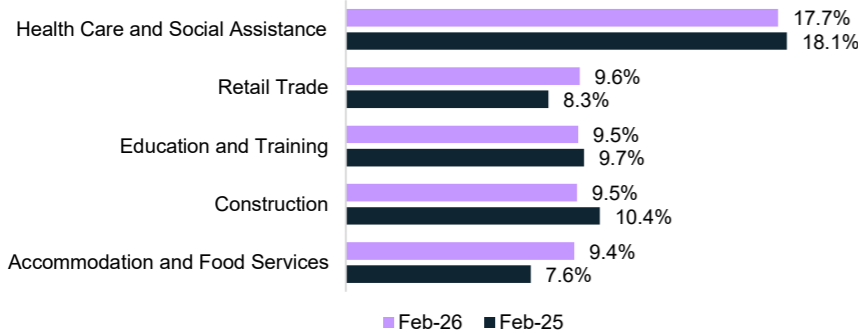

**Online job advertisements by skill level**



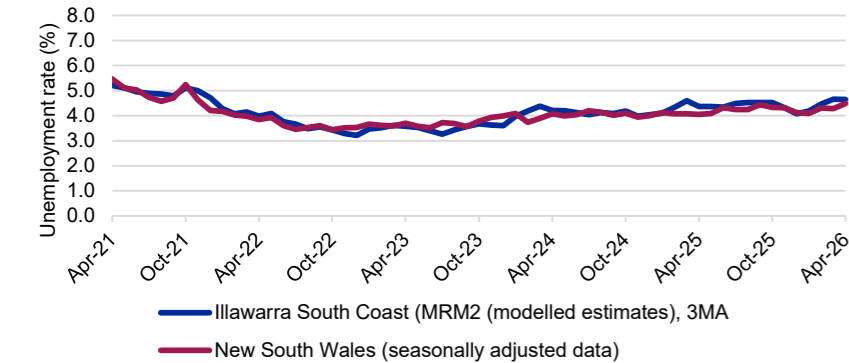

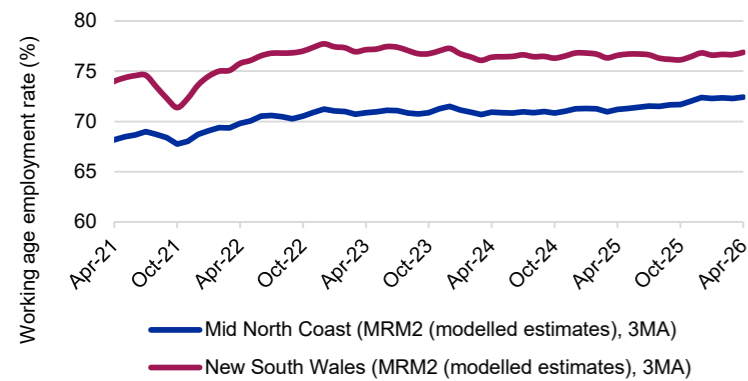

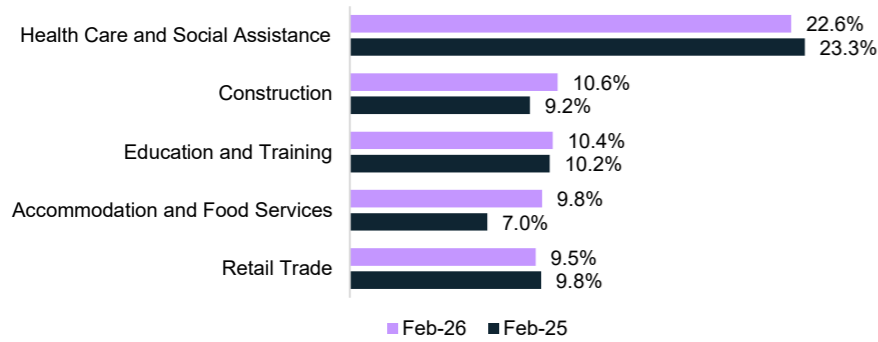

**Working age employment rate (%)**



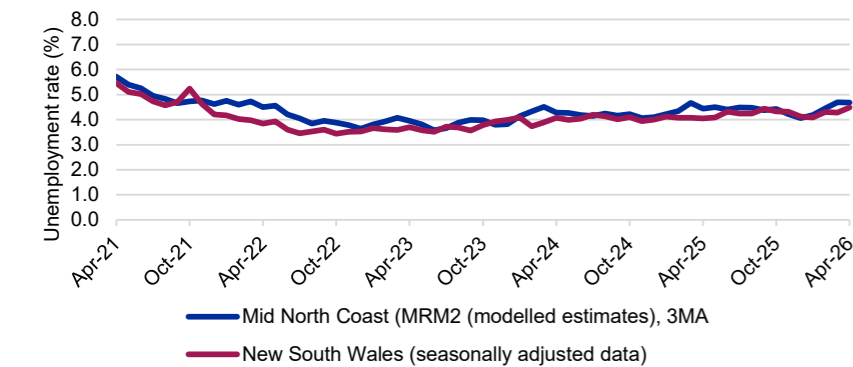

**Largest employing industries**



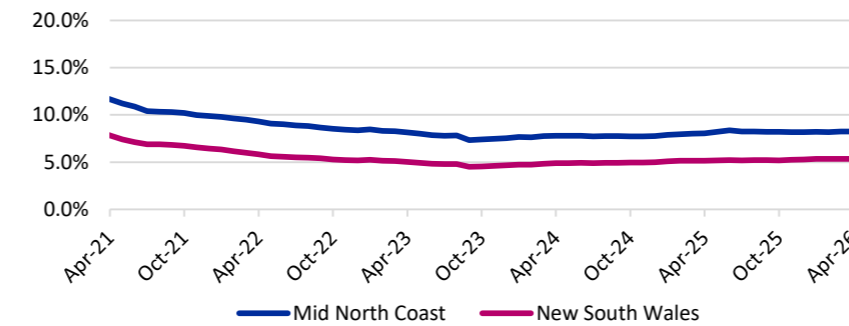

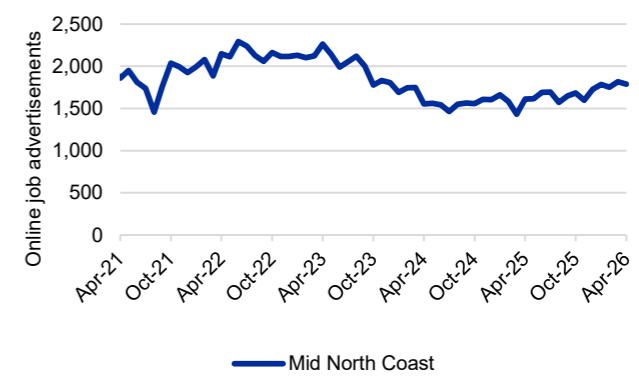

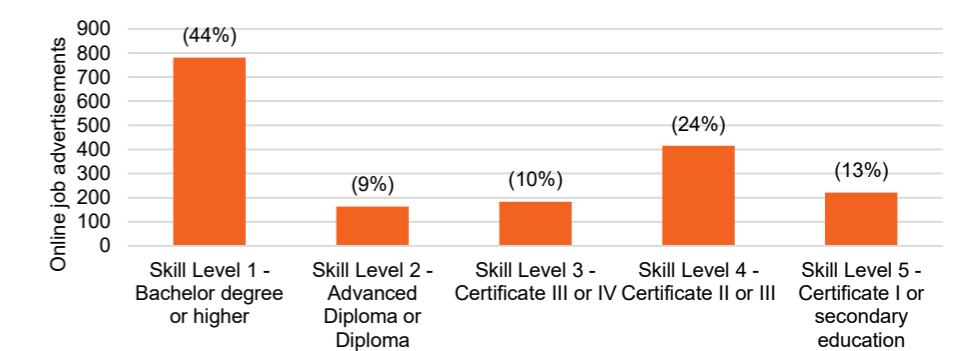

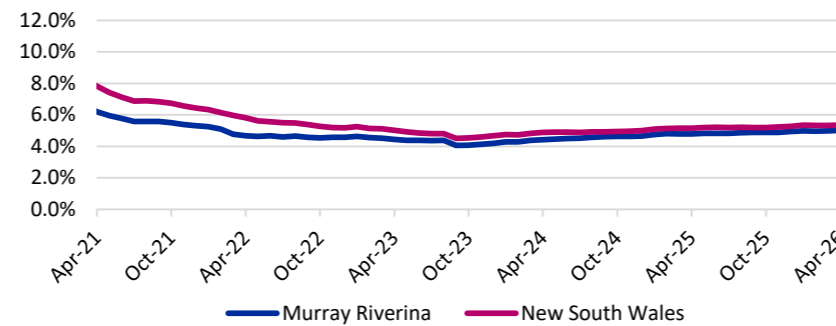

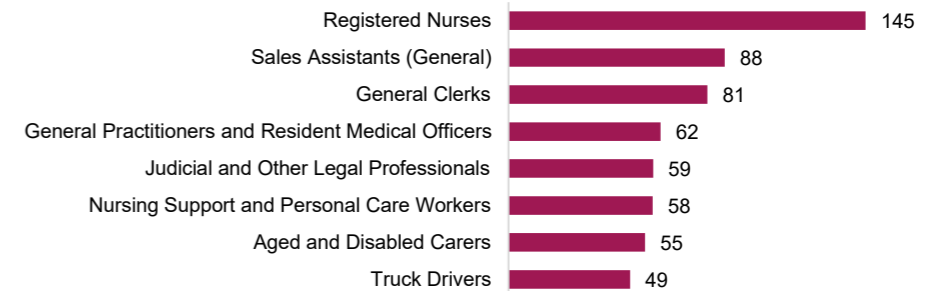

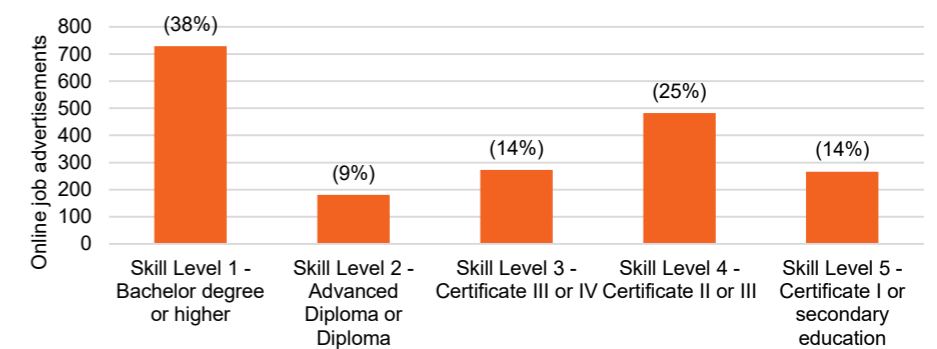

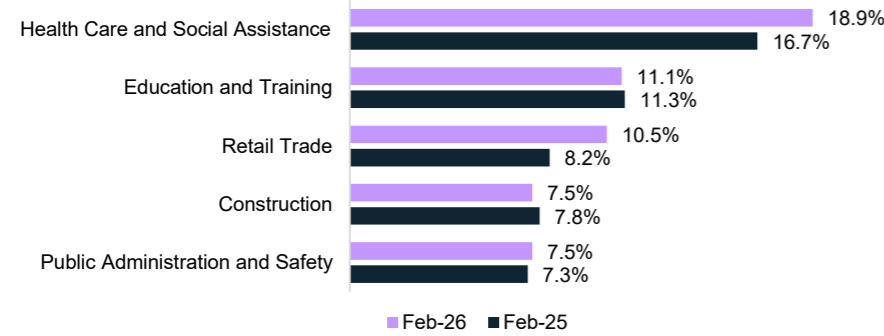

**Online job advertisements by skill level**



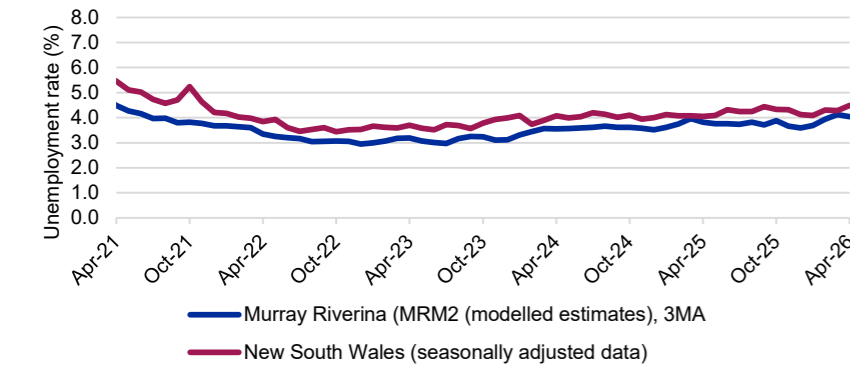

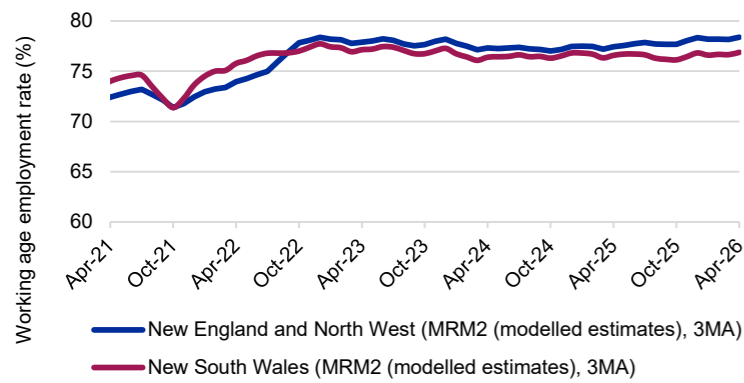

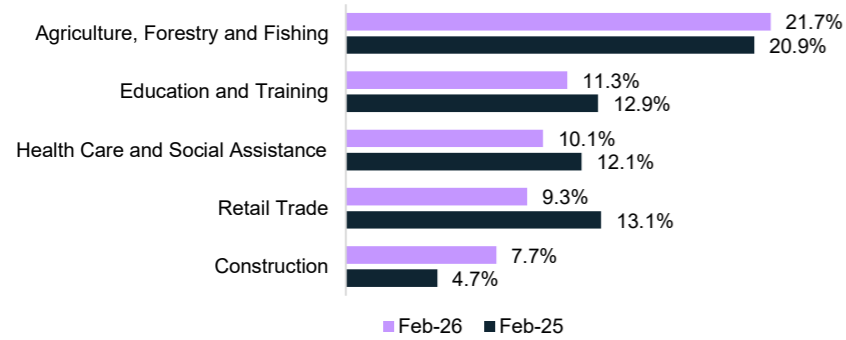

**Working age employment rate (%)**



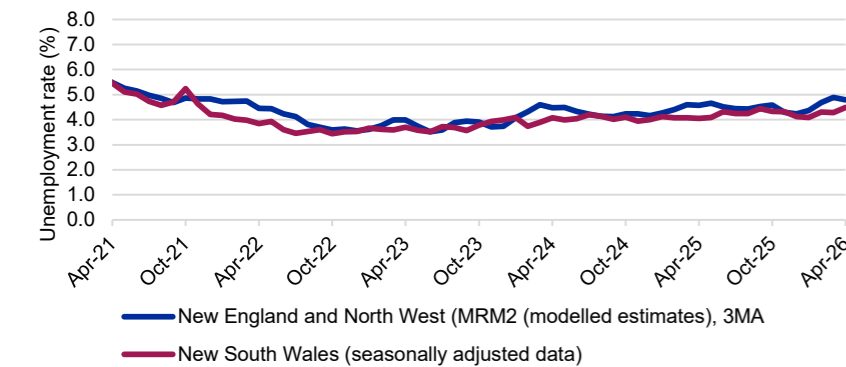

**Largest employing industries**



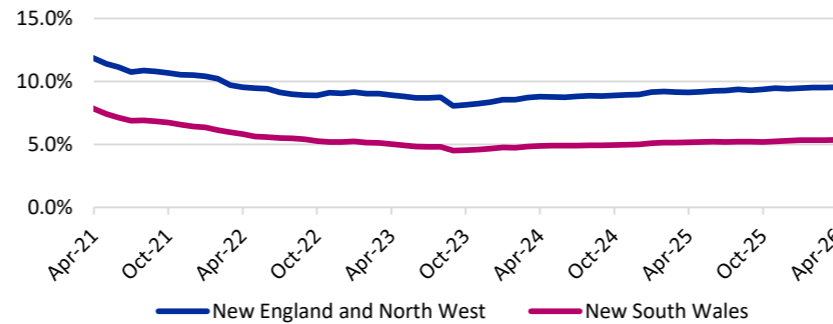

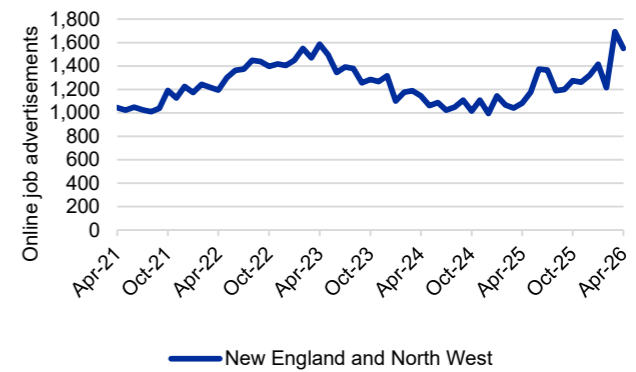

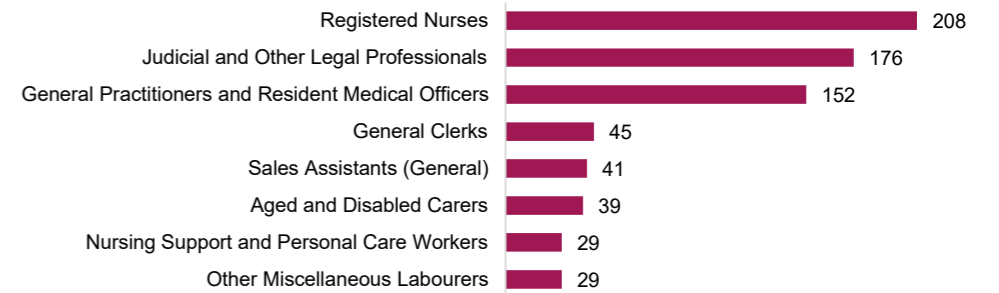

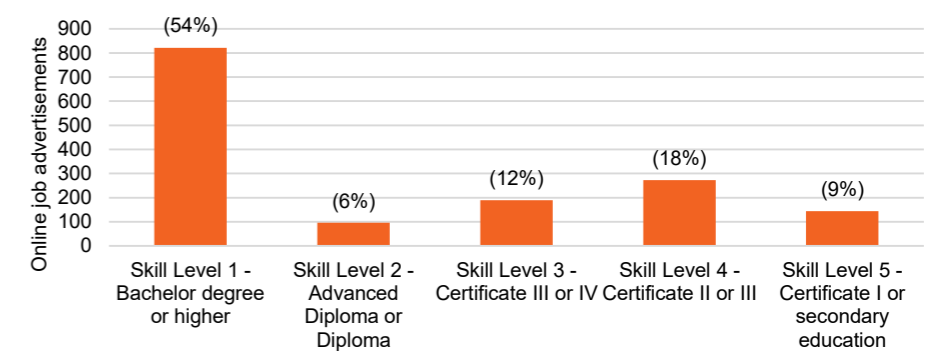

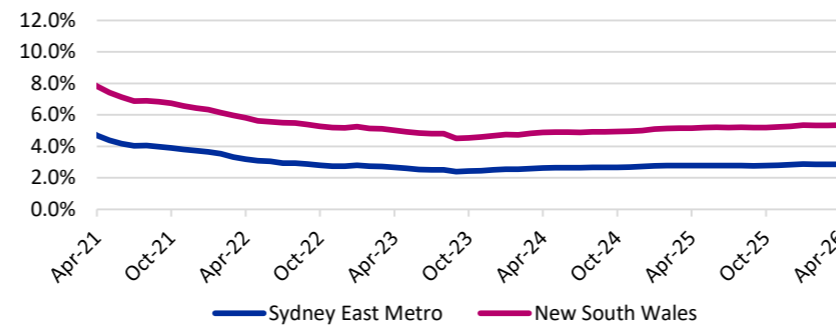

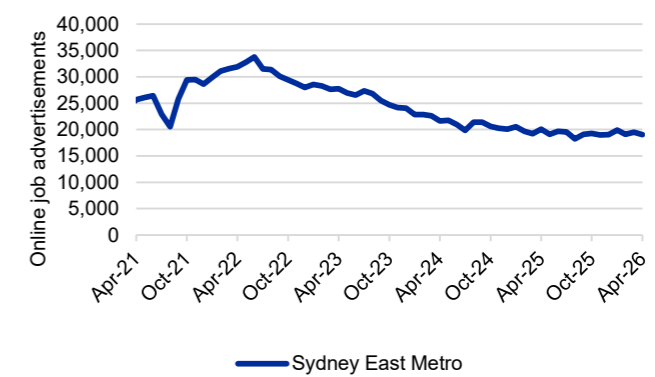

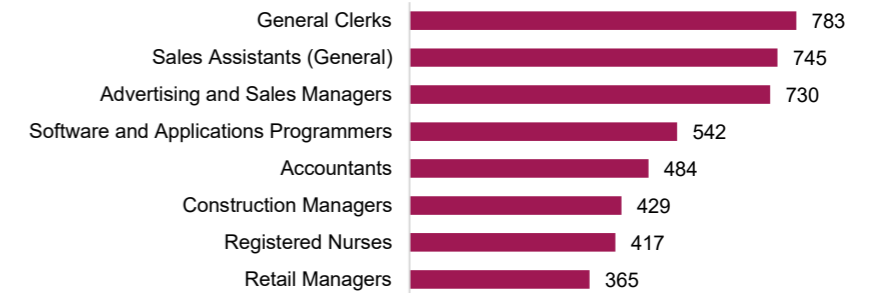

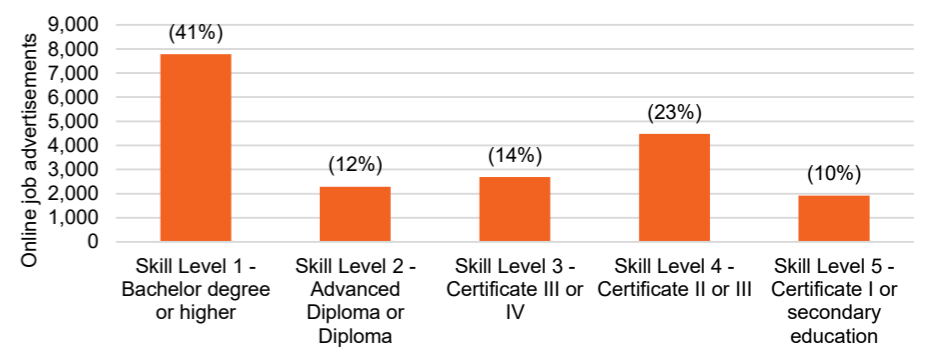

**Online job advertisements by occupation**



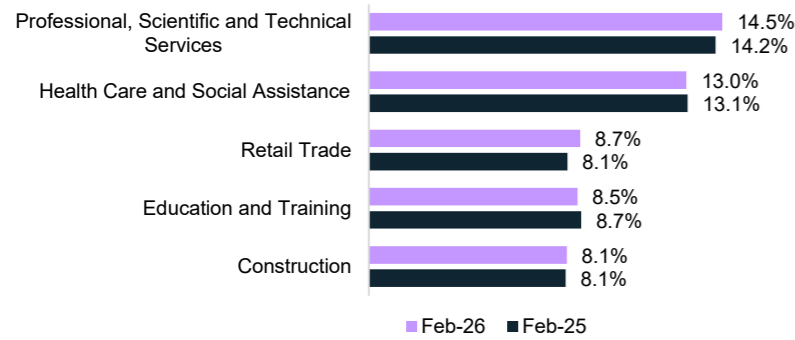

**Online job advertisements by skill level**



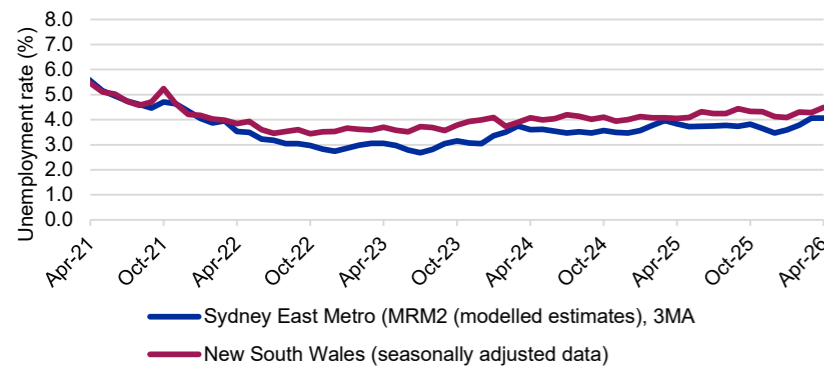

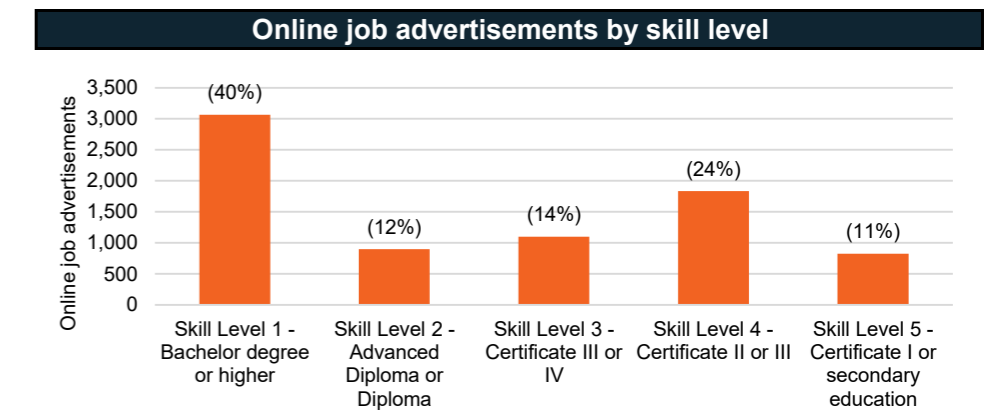

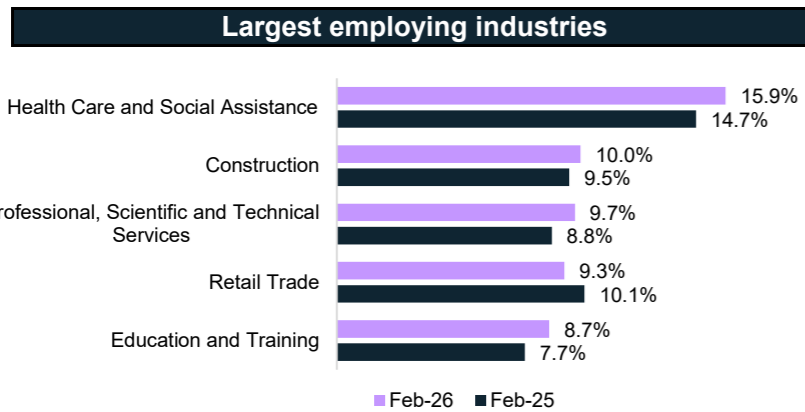

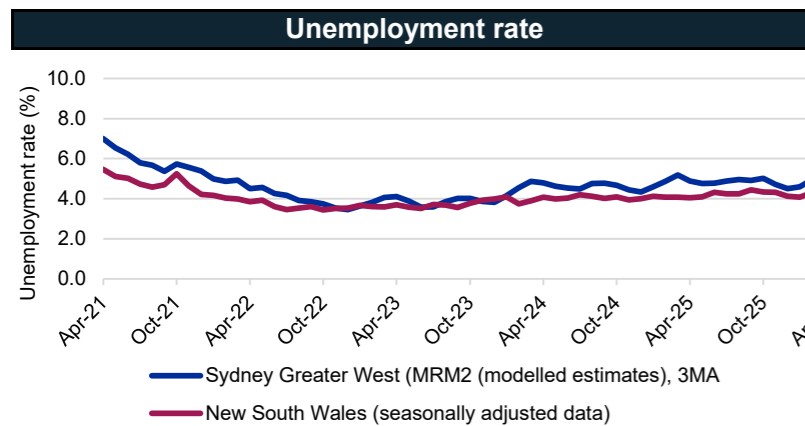

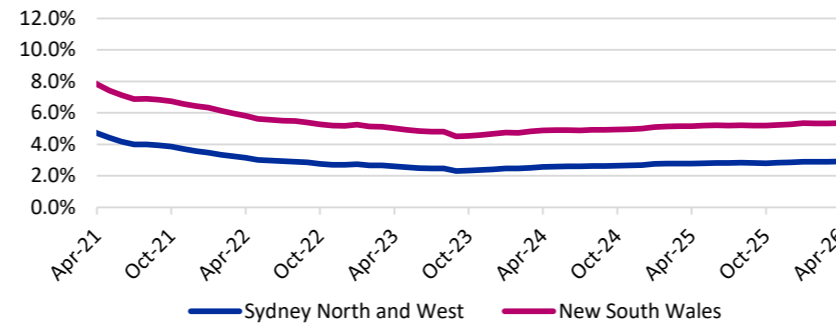

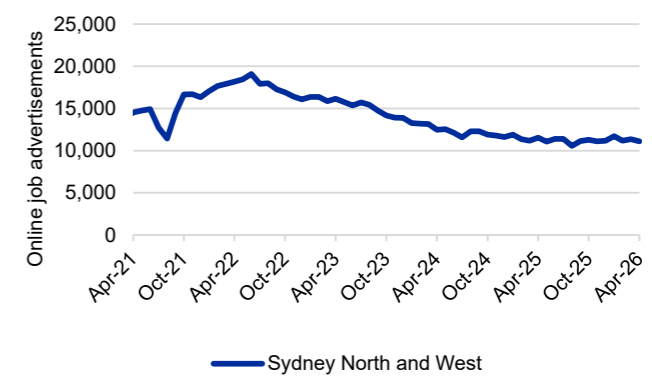

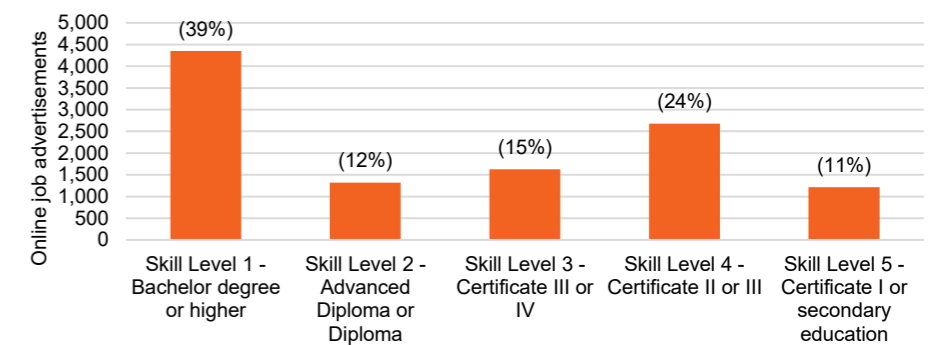

**Online job advertisements by occupation**



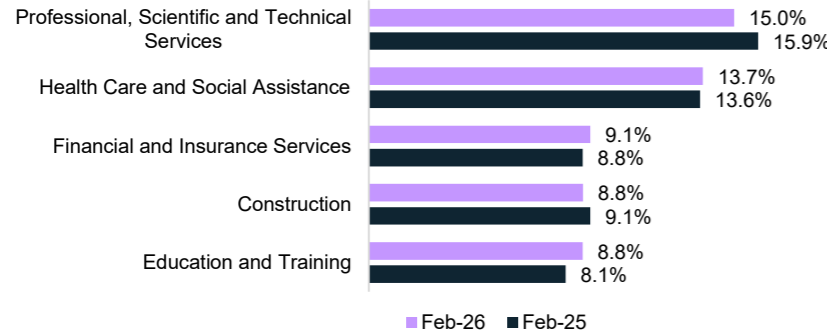

**Online job advertisements by skill level**



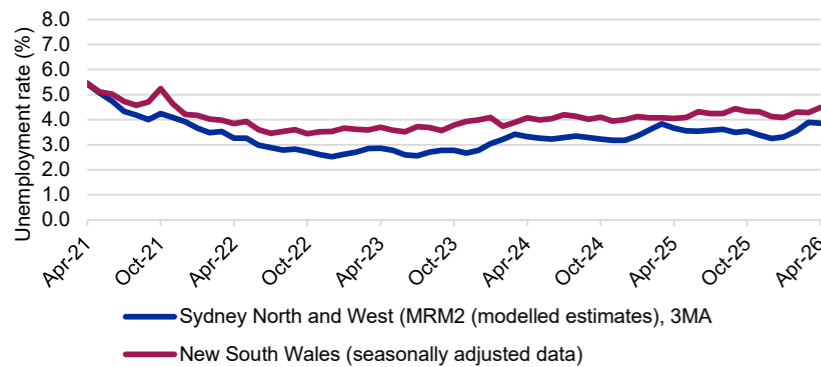

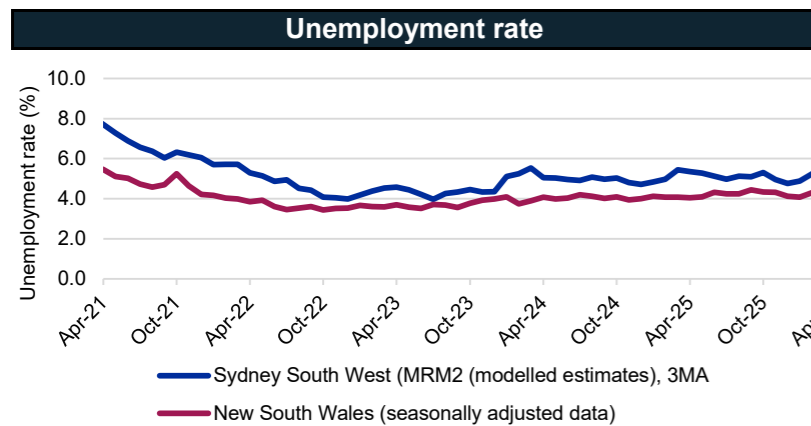

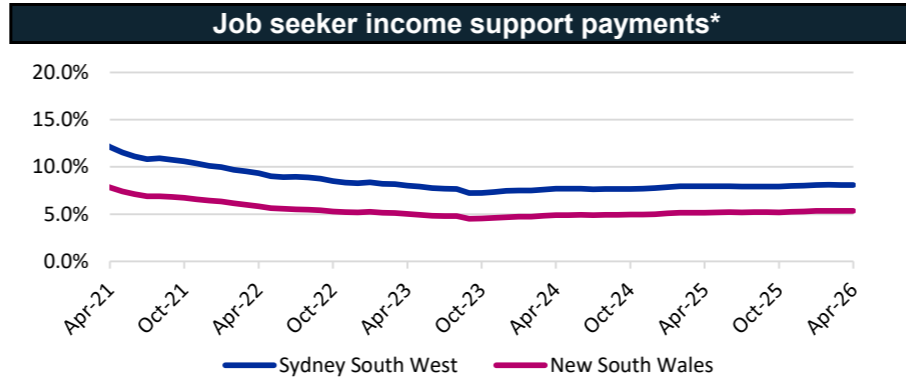

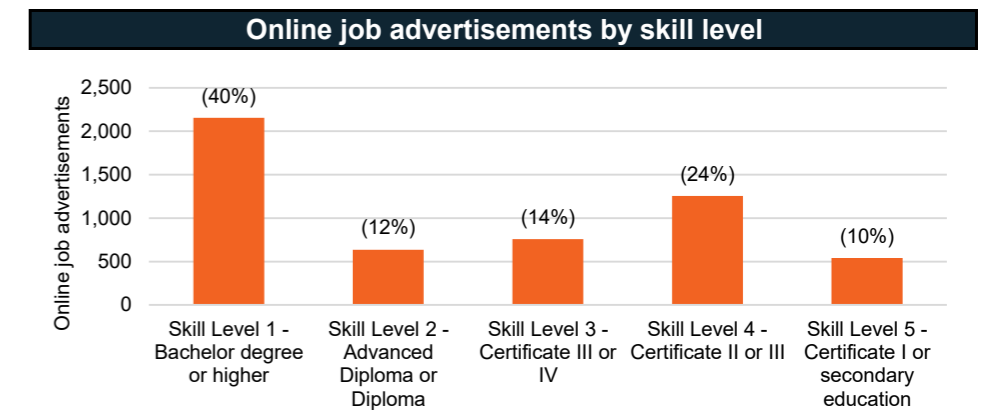
