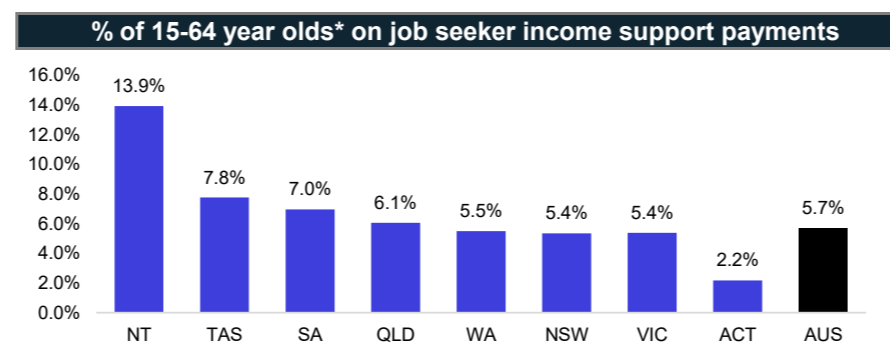

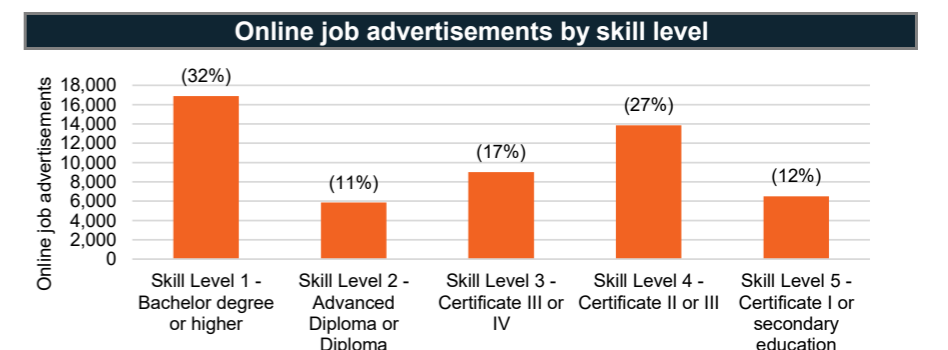

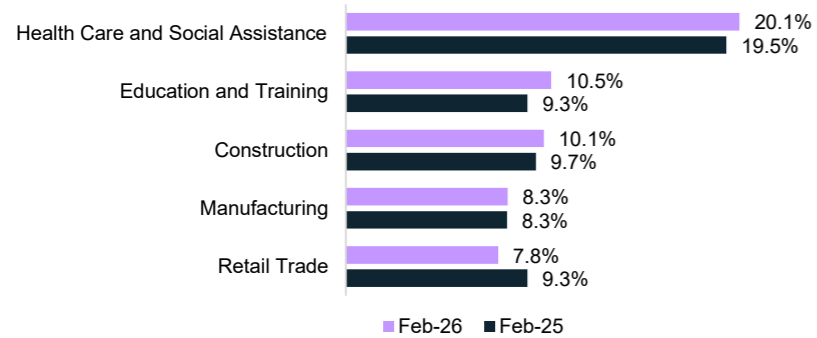

Working age employment rate (%)



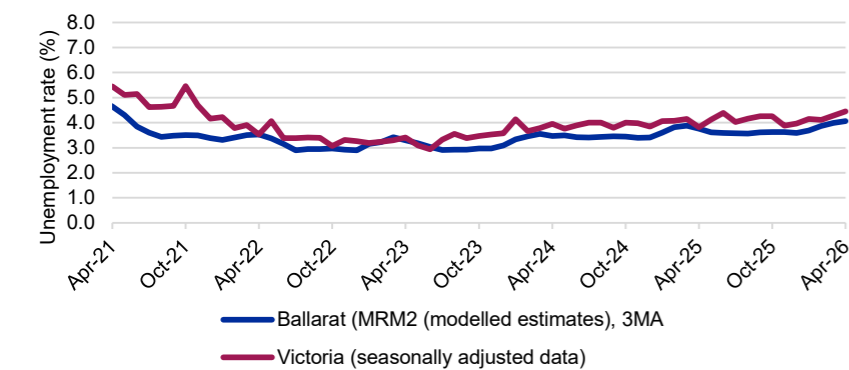

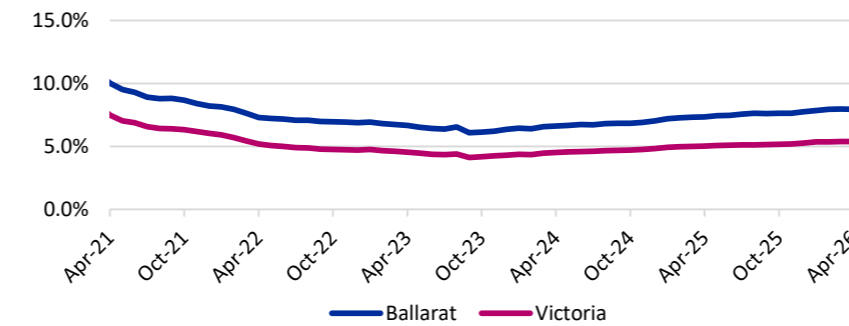

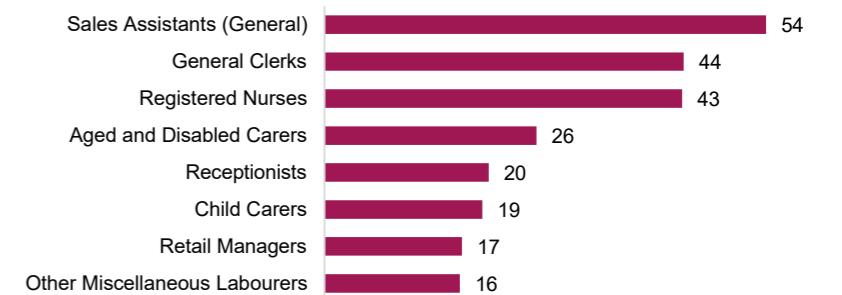

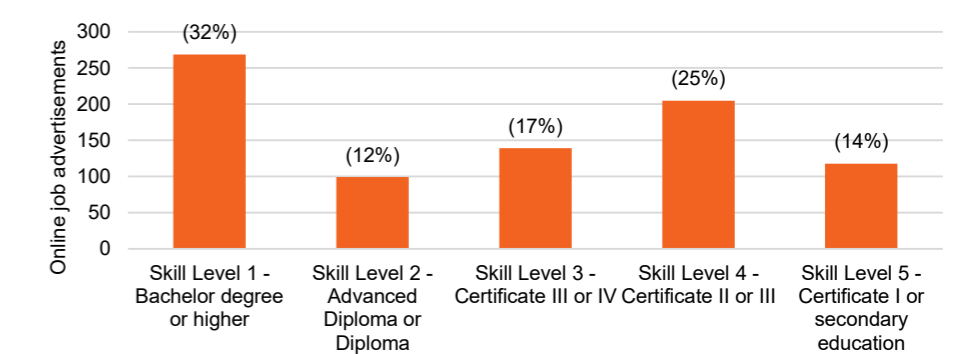

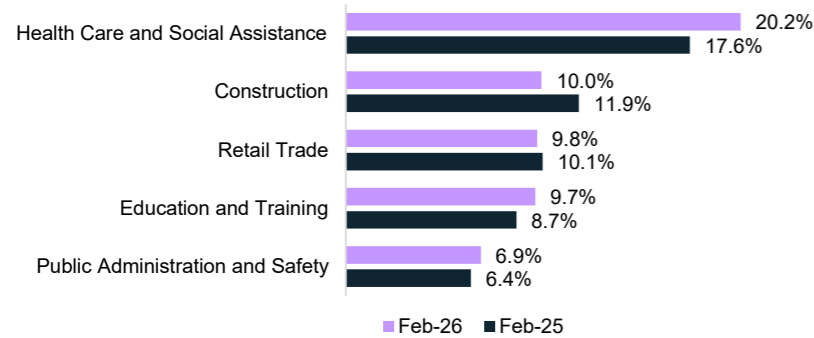

Working age employment rate (%)



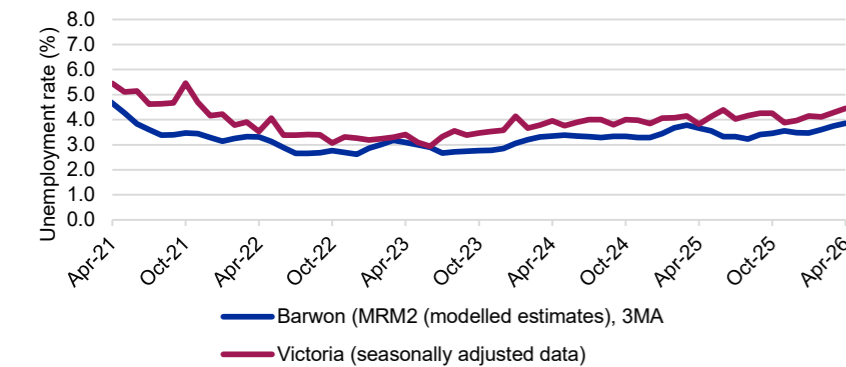

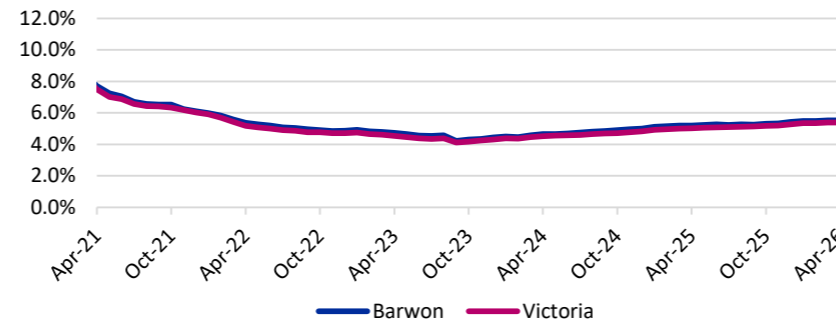

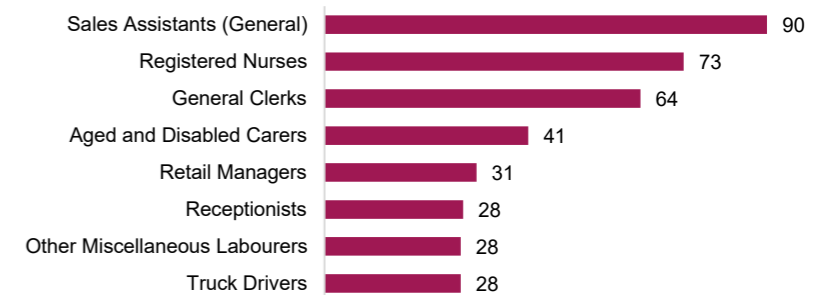

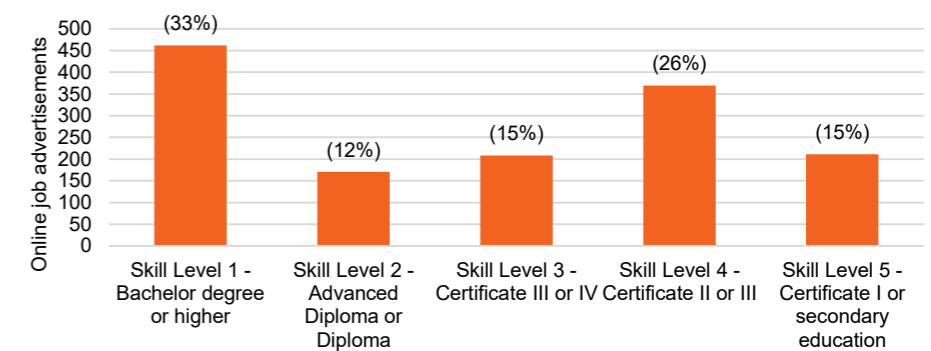

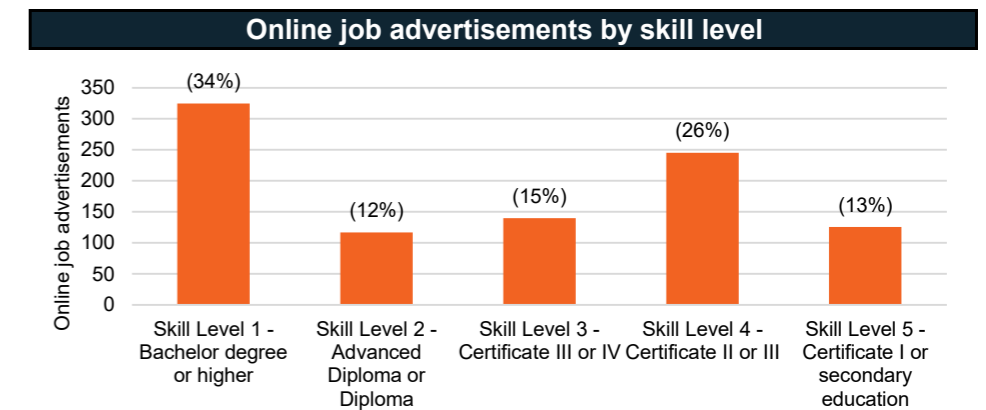

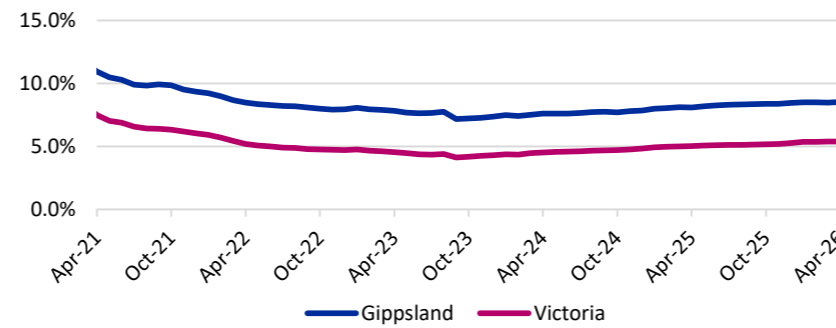

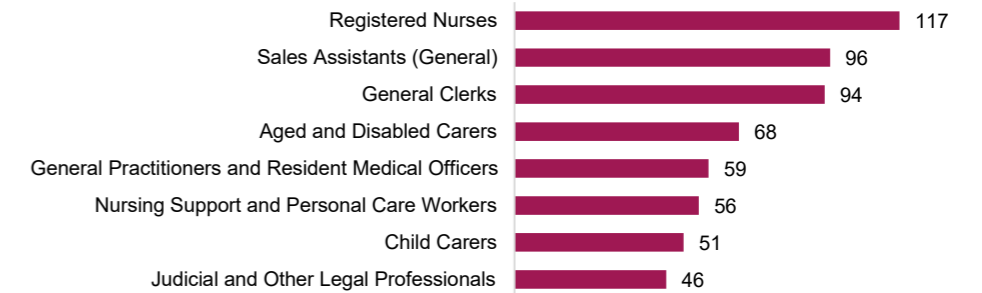

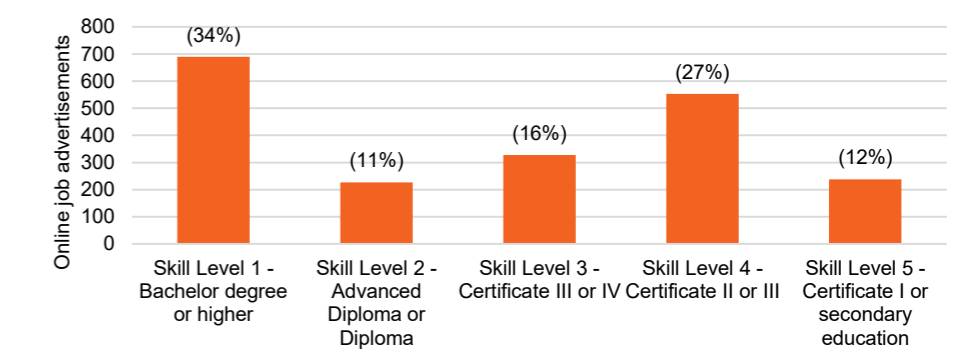

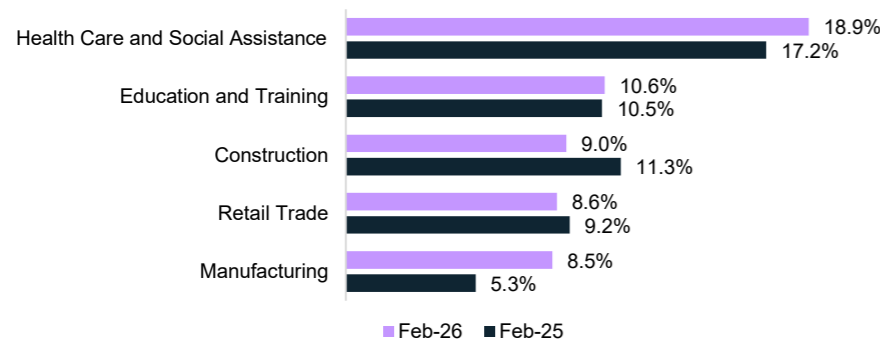

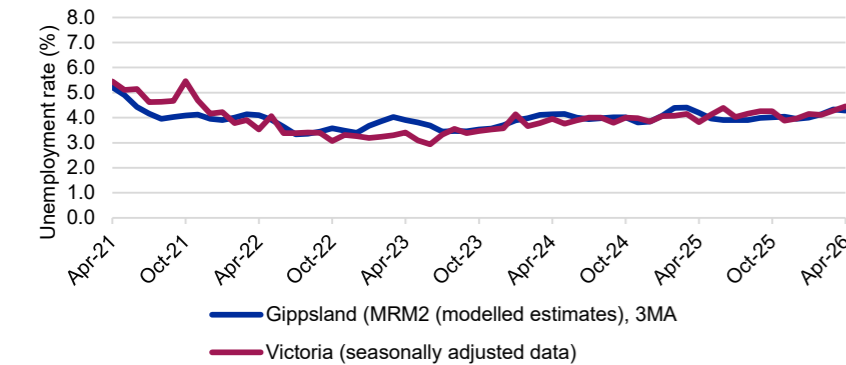

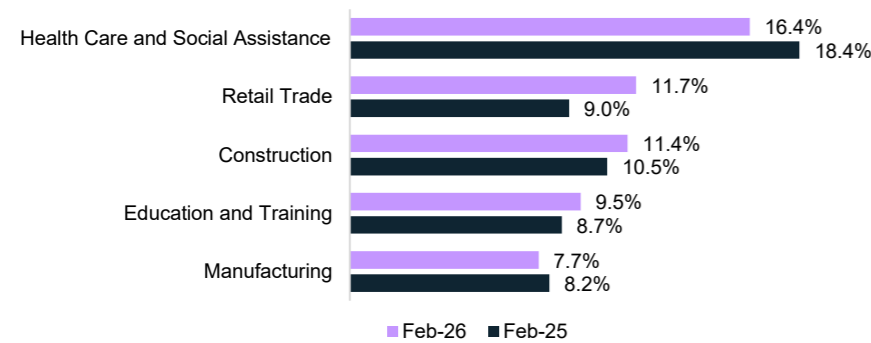

Working age employment rate (%)



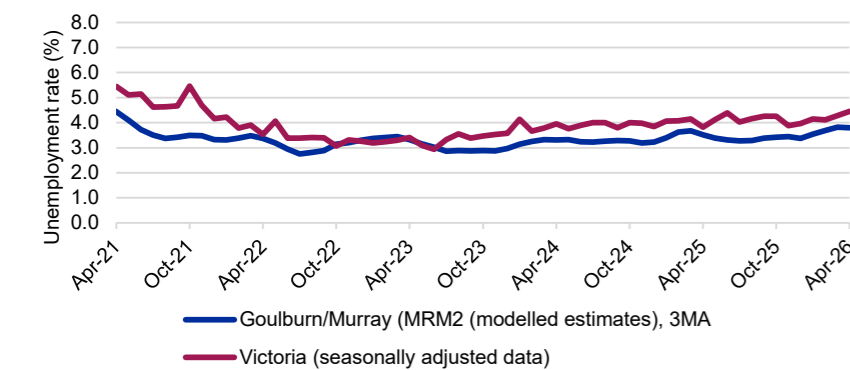

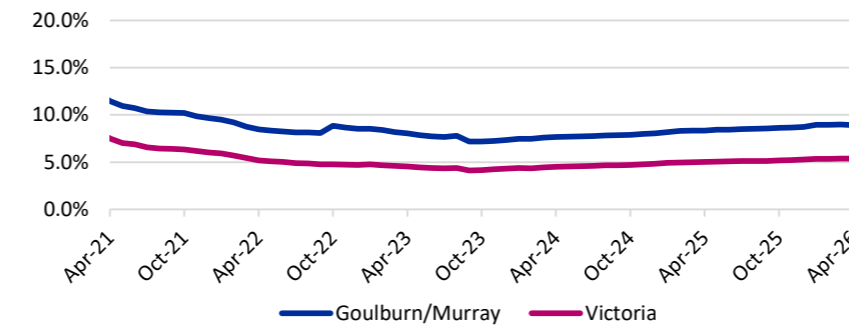

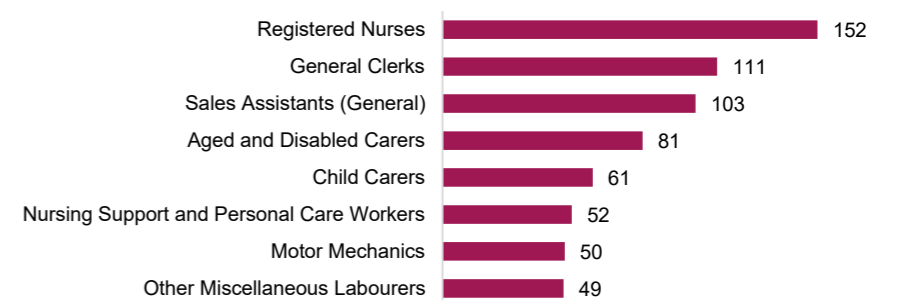

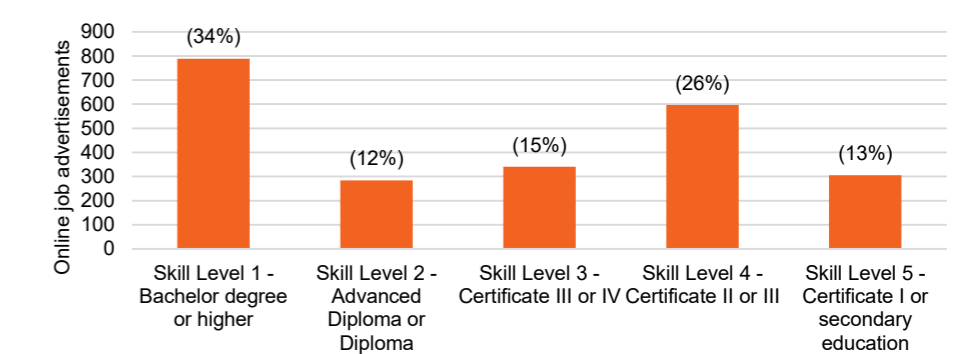

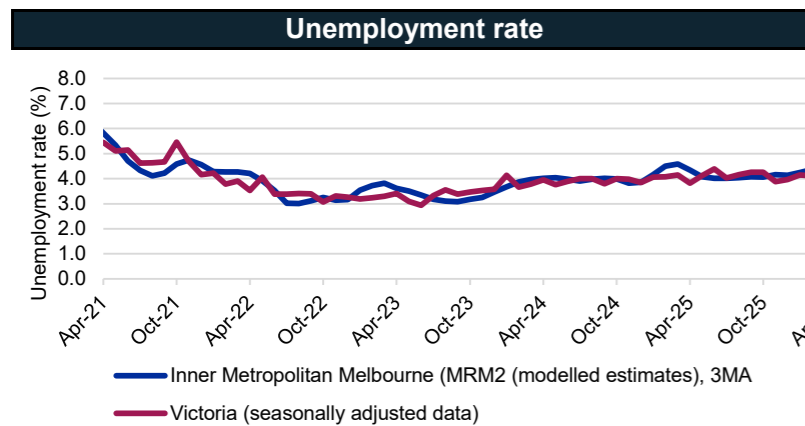

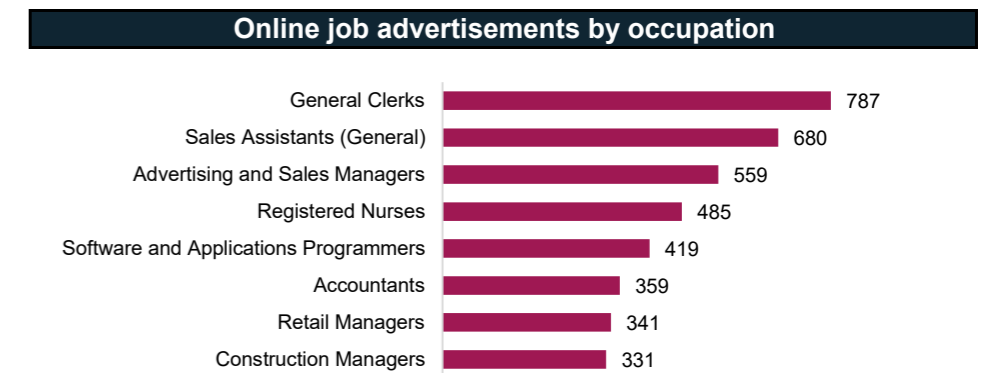

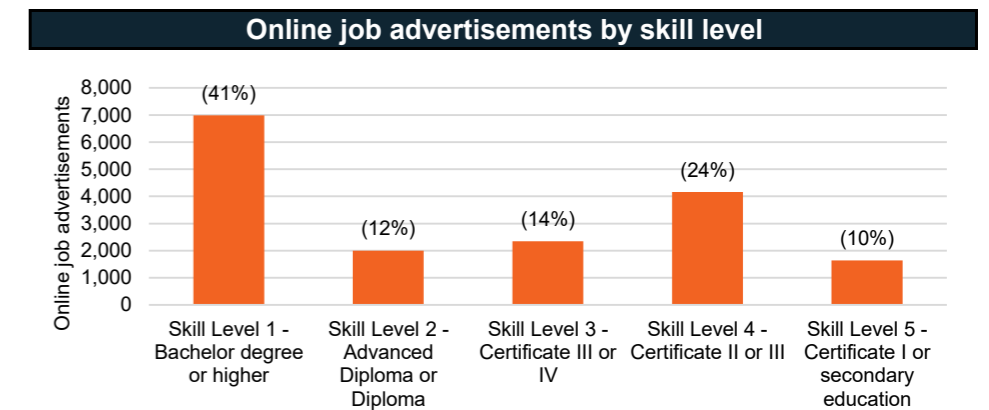

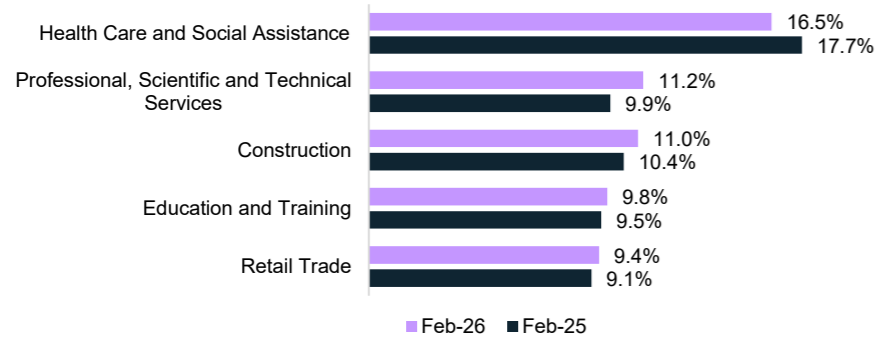

Working age employment rate (%)



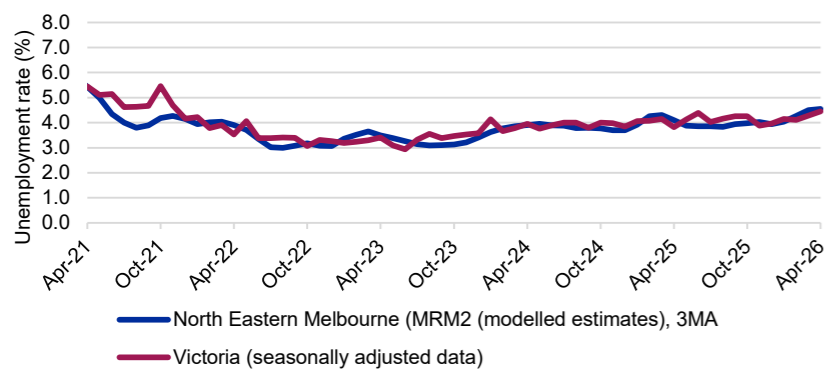

Largest employing industries



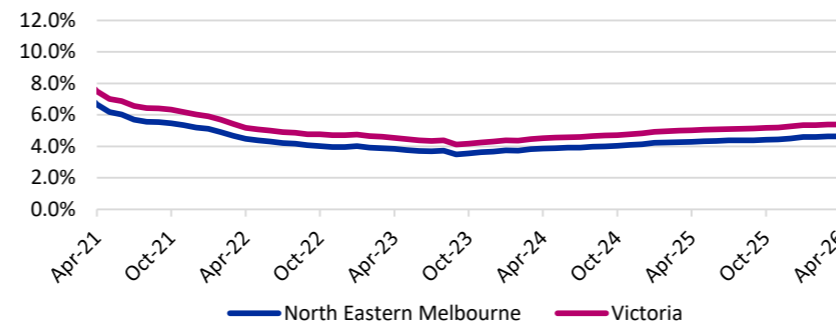

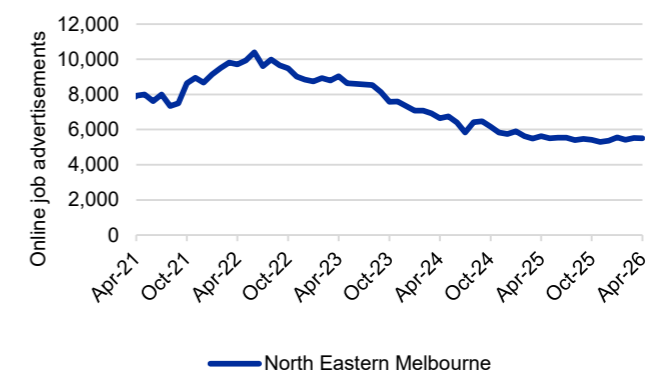

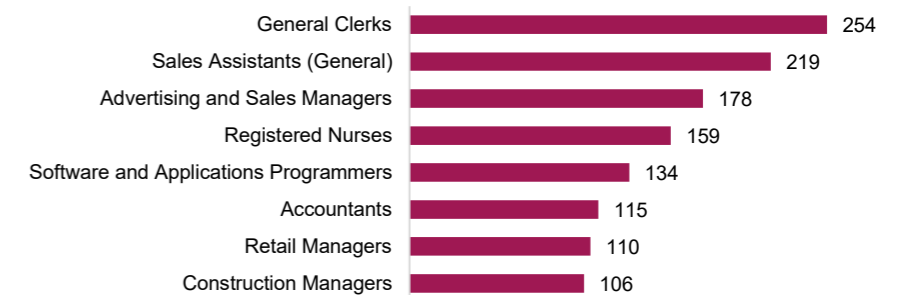

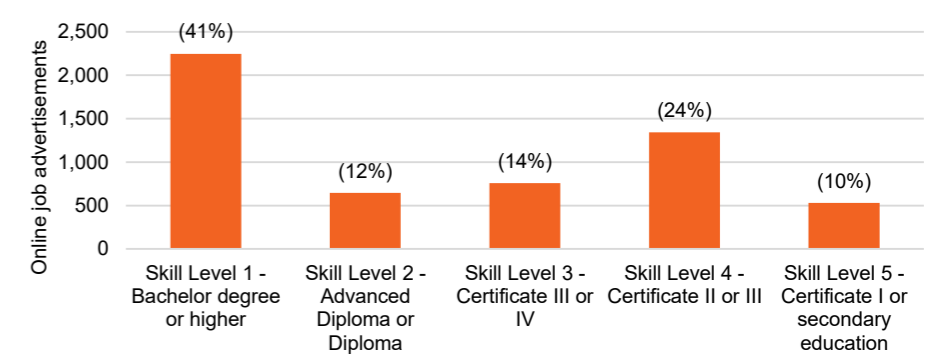

Online job advertisements by skill level



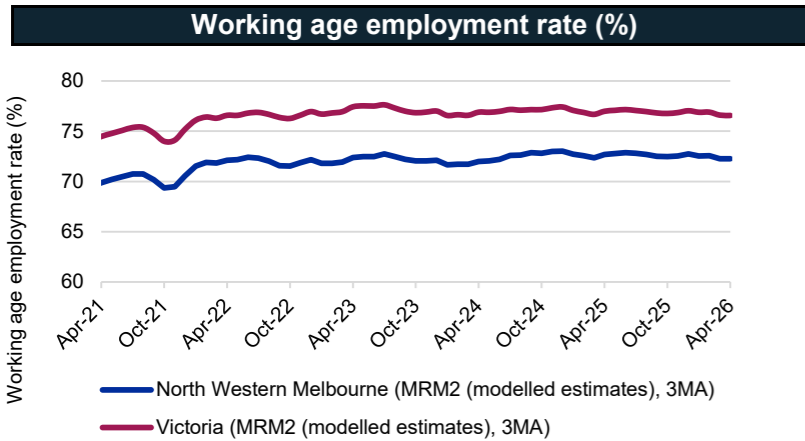

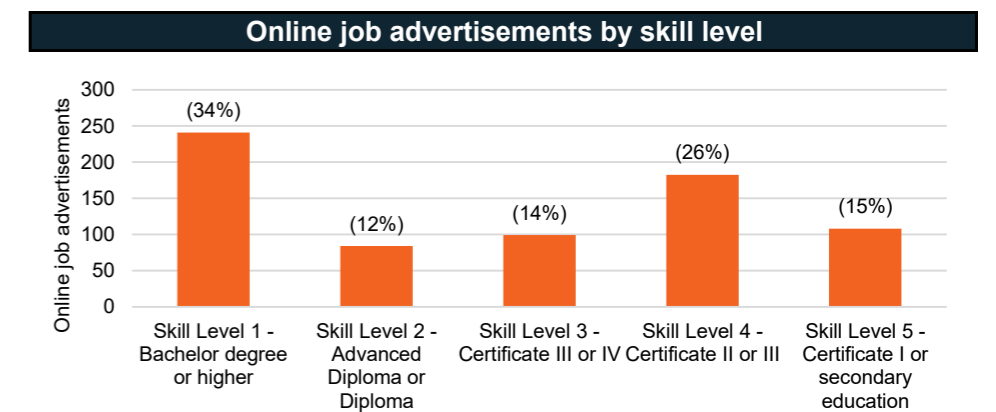

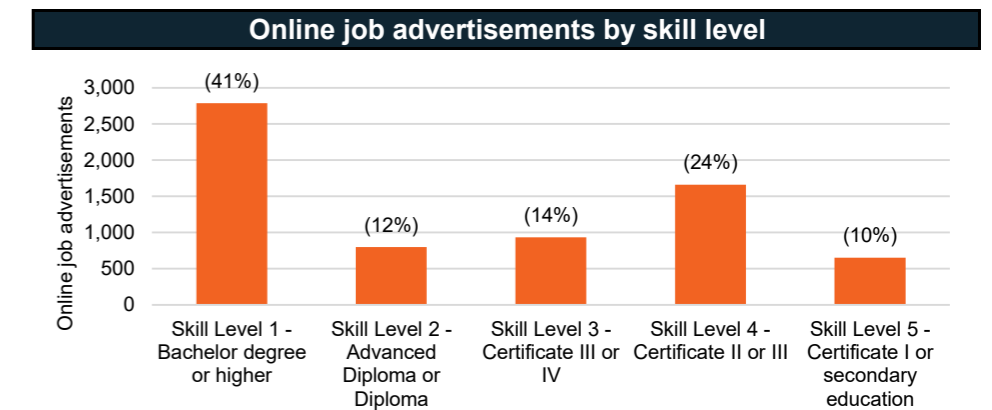

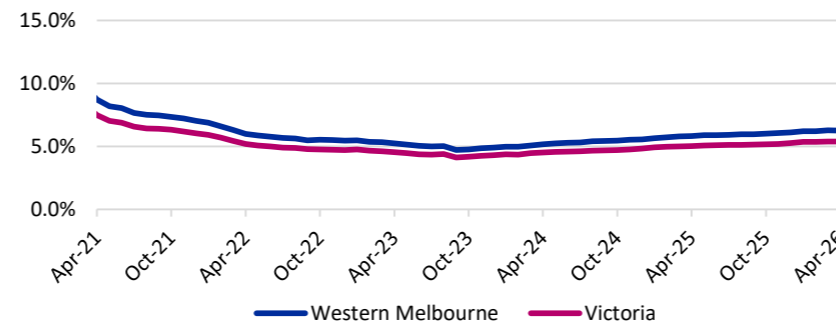

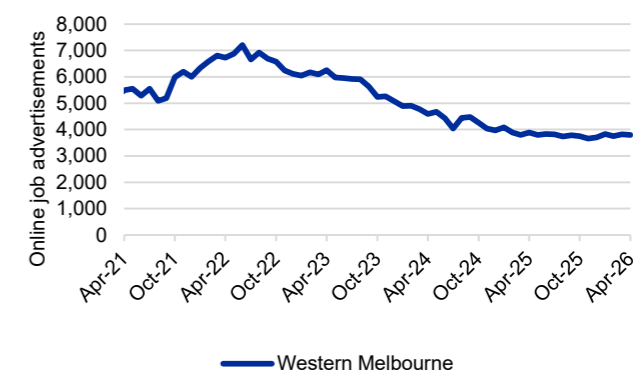

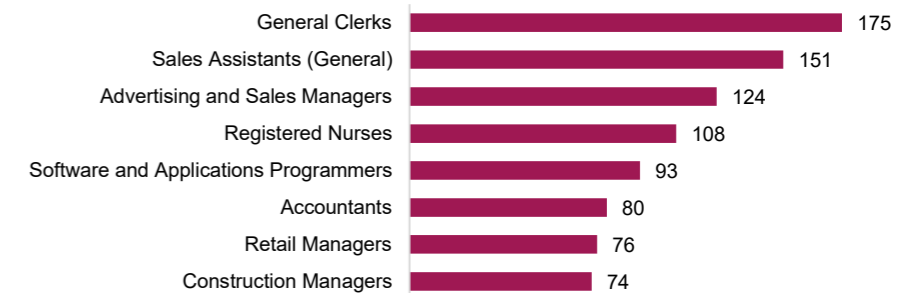

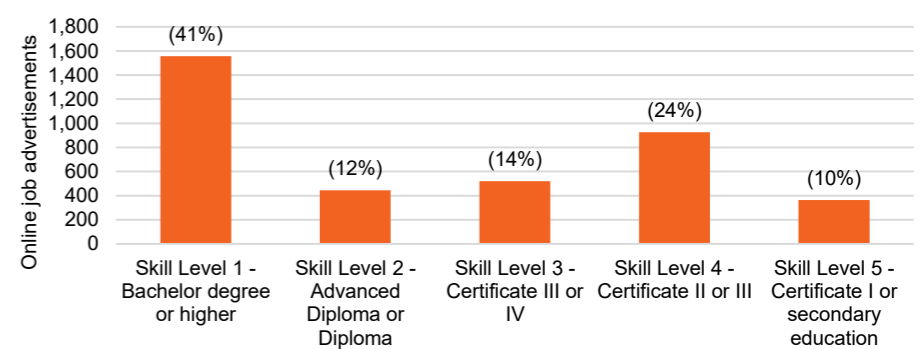

Online job advertisements by occupation



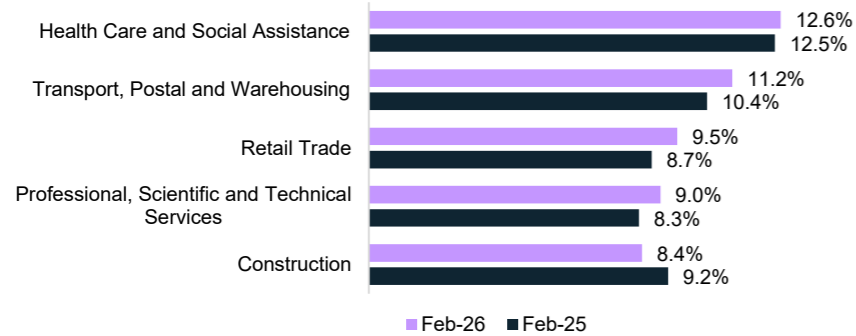

Online job advertisements by skill level



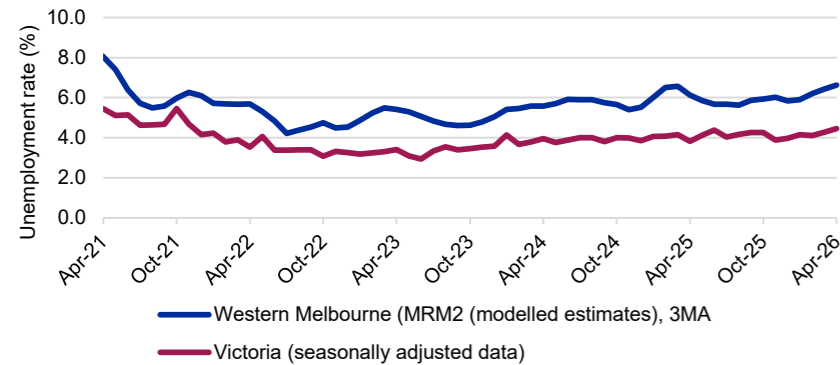

Unemployment rate



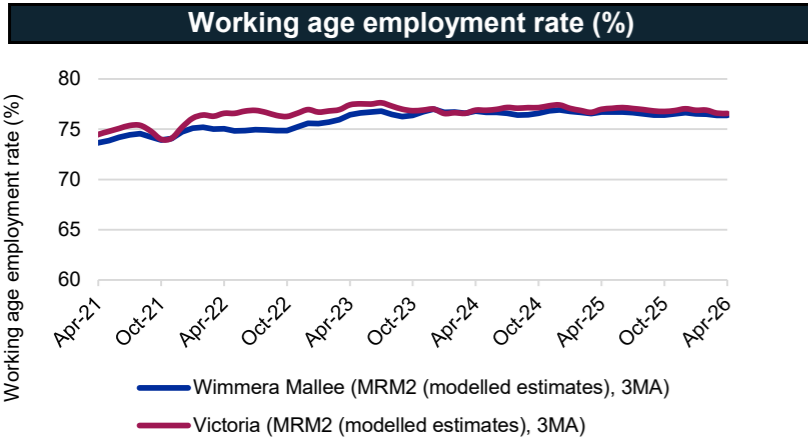

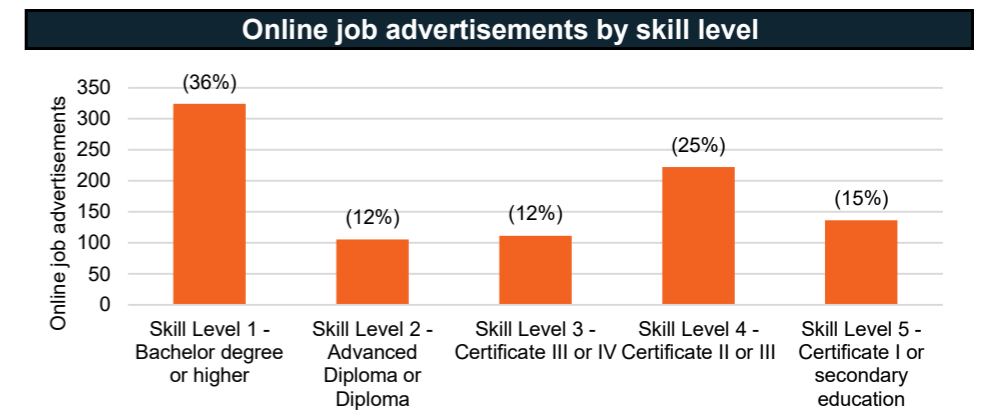
