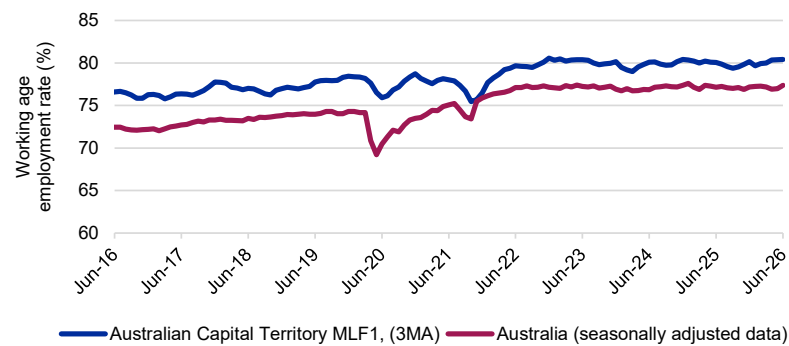

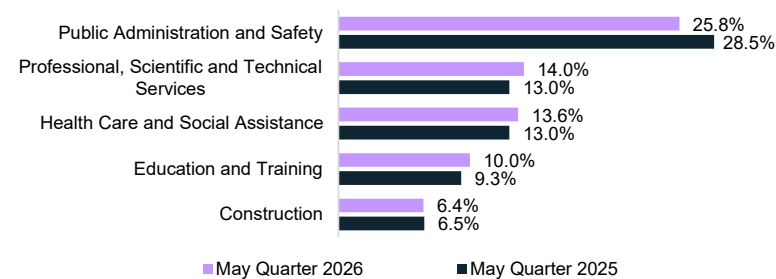

Working age employment rate



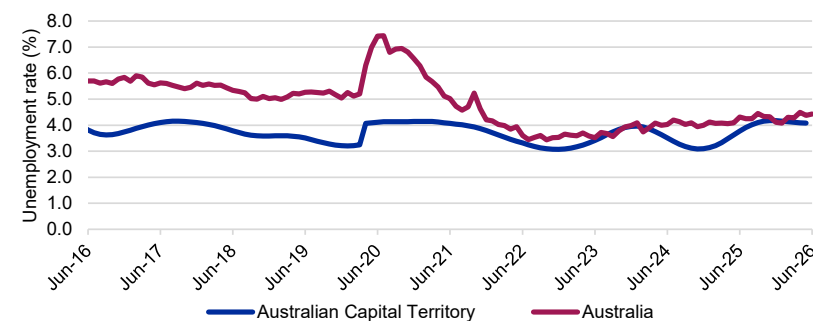

Largest employing industries



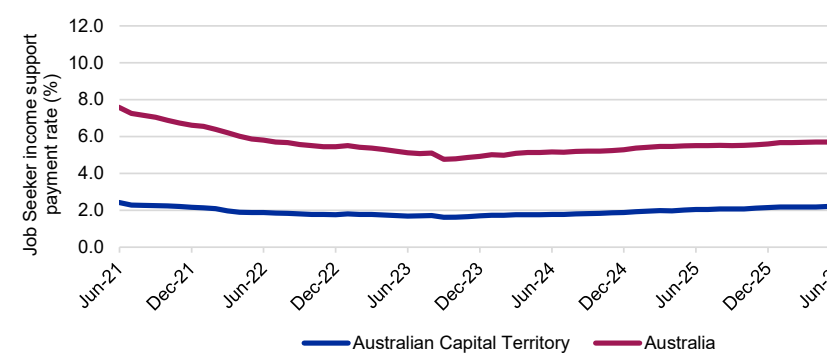

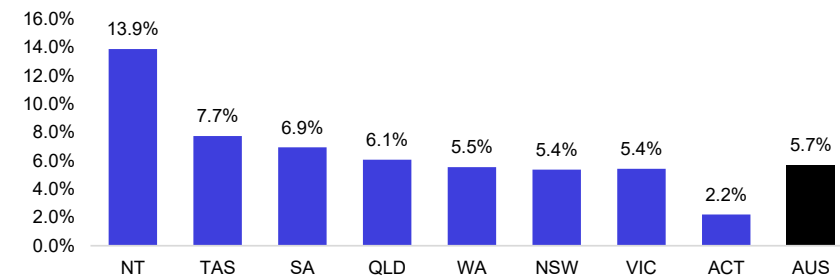
% of 15-64 year olds* on JobSeeker income support payments

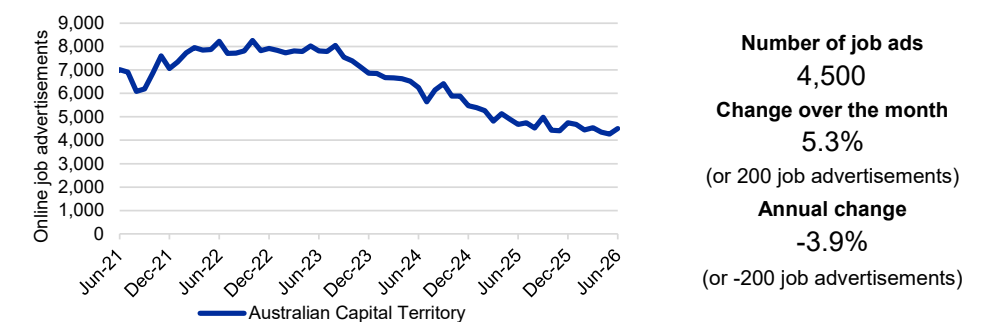

% of 15-64 year olds on JobSeeker income support payments



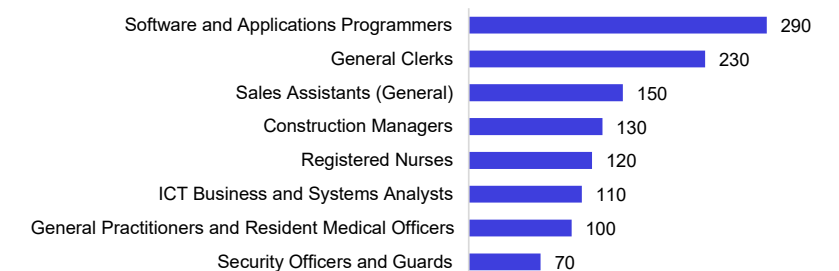

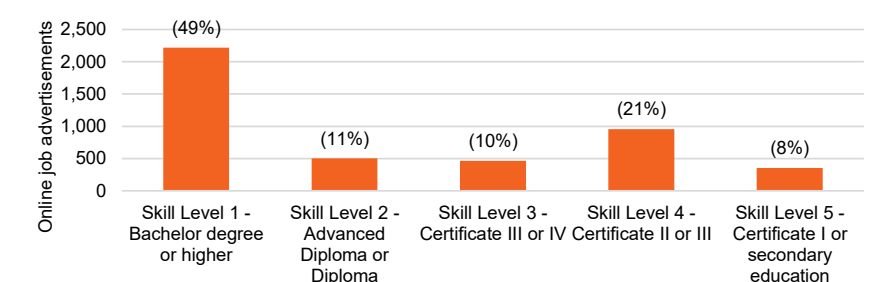

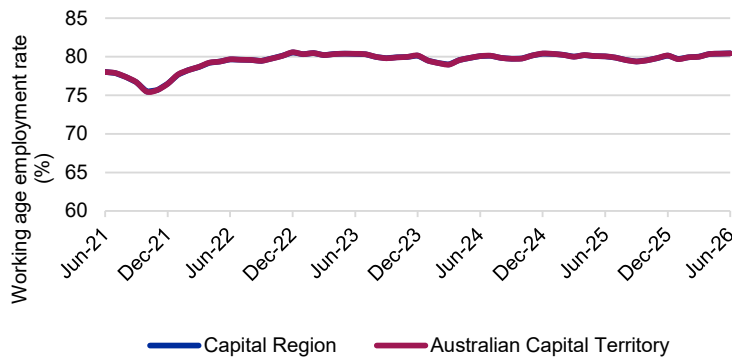

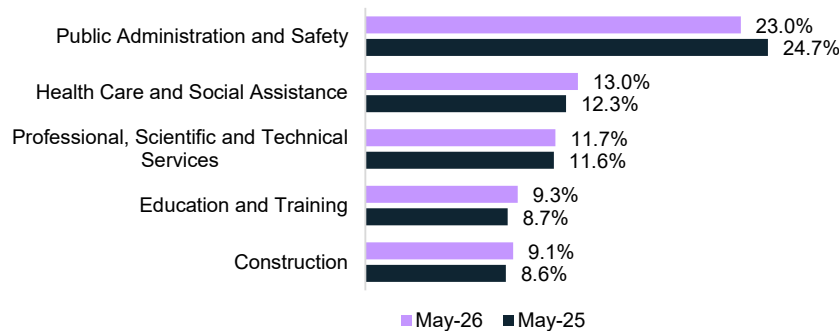

Working age employment rate (%)



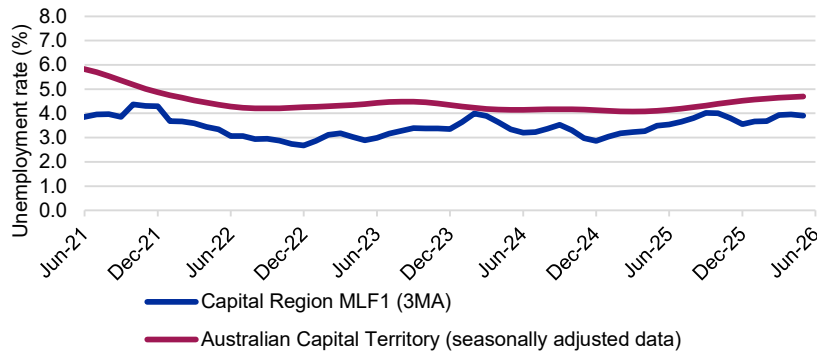

Largest employing industries



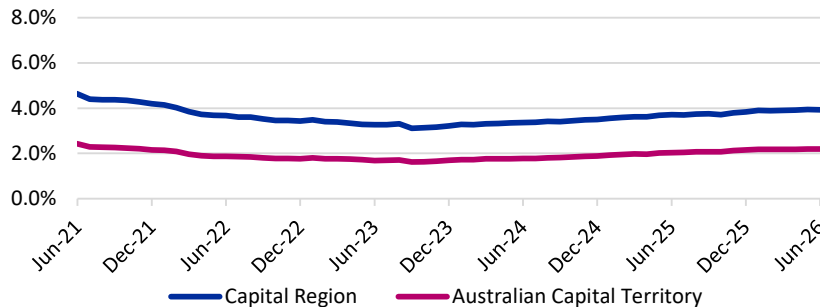

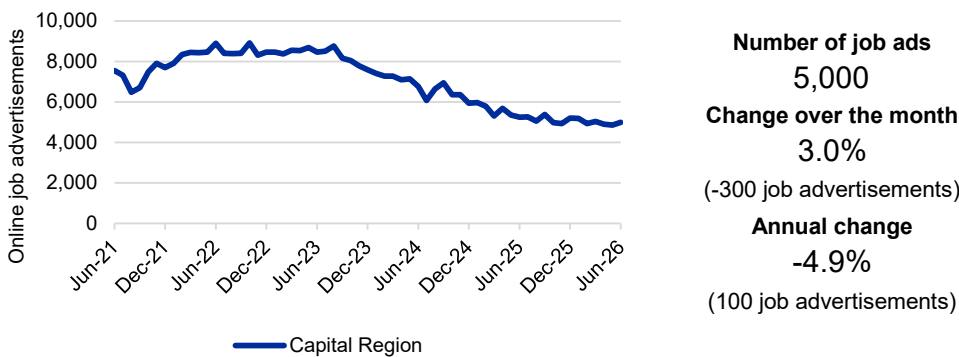

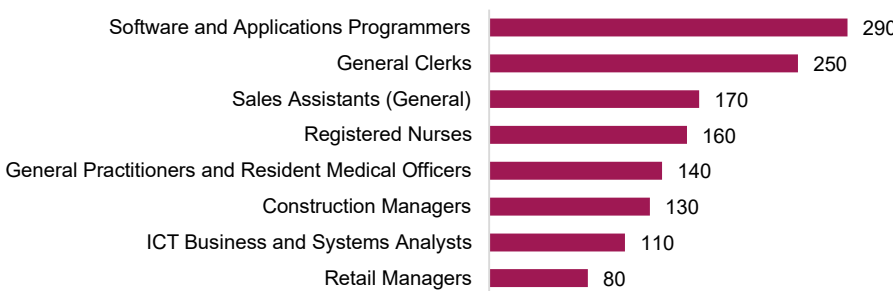

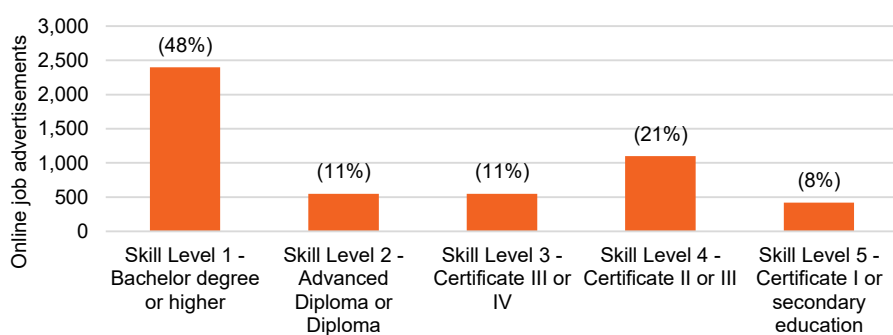
